A. Scope of work

The scope of the work is given below:-

1. Receipts of finished Modules from shop format
2. Stacking of finished Modules at the shop floor.
3. Base frame loading and loading of Modules in trailer.
4. Crating of Modules.
5. Clearance for dispatch.

Sub: Receipt, unloading, stacking, loading crate forming and dispatching of Modules from Logistics area.

Logistics Receives Modules from production shops of BLDG-50 through EOT cranes and these are to be unloaded from the shop frame and Moved to identified location for stacking. Then these components are to be loaded on to assigned vehicle over the necessary base frame with necessary packing and forming crates as per the drawing for dispatch to various sites.

The scope of the work for this Tender comprises of the works as detailed below are to be carried in logistics area.

SCOPE OF WORK:

1. Receipt, unloading, stacking and loading of Modules in the identified vehicles as per the instructions of the shop supervisor/ area in-charge
2. Crating should be formed as per the drawing by necessary welding of the required transportation frame, Posts, angles, channels, Plates supplied by BHEL through outsourcings vendors for the respective projects. The contractor shall establish adequate work centers for carrying out the fit up of loose components with base frame to make the loaded components into single crate assembly. A minimum of one welding machine is to be provided for one work center.

RECEIPTS

1. Identification of modules, checking as per the delivery challan/ Shop handing over format documents.
2. Quantity checking as per the Delivery challan/Shop handing over format documents.
3. After verification, location details are to be mentioned with name and signature of receipts personnel on the DC/HO documents against each DUs and hand over the documents to the respective logistics area systems for stock Posting.

STACKING:

1. The modules are unloaded from the work station frame by EOT crane, stacking boiler wise in the identified locations as directed by the Shop/Logistics in-charge.

LOADING:

1. Loading of components in the dispatch vehicle over the base frame. Base frame shall be loaded in the assigned vehicles of logistics by Mobile crane (crane will be provide by BHEL at free of cost)
2. Loading the Modules one over another up to 5 to 7 Nos depends upon the Module length/weight and as directed by the area In-charge.
3. Required curved blocks and reapers are to be provided in between the Modules, wherever required to avoid metal to metal contact and damage of Modules during transportation (packing materials shall be supplied by the BHEL).

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CRATE FORMING:

1. Crate should be formed as per the drawing by necessary welding of Posts, Angles, Channels, Plates and arresting of components on trailers using contractor's welding machines, as directed by area in-charge.(structural items with required size, consumables for welding and power shall be supplied by BHEL).

SPECIFICATION OF FABRICATION

- A. The fabrication shall generally be in accordance with IS-800 (latest issue) and in conformity with approved drawing and to meet quality requirements. Welding shall be in accordance with IS-816(latest Issue). The contractor shall provide necessary splicing to suit the available length of raw material without extra cost. Gas cutting edges shall be dressed or ground. Welding shall be commence only after the dimensions, sizes, trueness, straightness etc., are checked and approved. Thickness of the weld and weld length shall be specified in drawing and or as instructed. Only qualified welders have to engaged. The jobs cannot be turned on sides to facilitate down hand welding. Hence the welder must have the capacity to do the vertical and overhead welding as such.
- B. The fabricated base frame, vertical posts, horizontal, vertical and diagonal bracings for forming the crates will be supplied by BHEL through its Outsourcing vendors. The successful Bidders has to
 - Load the base frame in trailer by means of cranes (as and when the trailer reaches for loading/dispatch) make the base frame as a single unit (in case the base frame supplied in two pieces).
 - Load the HRSG modules in the base frame with adequate wooden packing wherever required.
 - Fit up of vertical posts, horizontal and diagonal bracings (which will be supplied in loose pieces) as per the drawing given by the area in-charge at the time of loading
 - Full welding of vertical posts with the base frame, horizontal and diagonal bracings as per the drawing to make it as a single unit (crate).
 - Clearance by area in-charge after checking the fit up and welding of respective members.
 - No arc striking/ welding in any of the HRSG modules to be carried out at the time of crating.
- C. After fabrication is completed, the area official of BHEL will inspect the same for quality of welding, correctness of dimensions etc., therefore the contractor have to ensure that the fabrication work should be as per the drawing and specification and follow the best practice for the fabrication work.
- D. Cranes and other handling facilities shall be provided by BHEL at free of cost for fit up purpose.
- E. The contractor shall take care ensure that the Boiler components are not damaged during handling and crating.

All the above work shall be considered only as single package and entrusted to only one successful contractor. It may be noted that the above items shall not be split for ordering. The contractor shall also maintain log book / record for all the categories' of work carried out on the Du wise linking Dc's of the firms/Shop handing over format number, date etc.,

The contractor shall post suitable persons to complete the subject scope of work and the supervisor shall be very well conversant with these above mentioned jobs. And also with the good working knowledge in computer applications.

The contractor has to give periodical weekly report to the shipping in-charge for the work done. In case of urgent and more workload, the contractor will be required to redeploy the manpower to meet the requirement.

B. MAN POWER & MACHINES REQUIREMENT:-

1. The work under this contract is not a continual work. The contractor has to Deploy the man power as and when required by the user agencies, for this the contractor will be informed in advance of 24 Hours.

The indicative man power and Machine requirements for handling the modules less than 11M length.

- 4 unskilled workmen for loading and unloading
- 4 skilled workmen (qualified fitter/welder) for crate fit up and welding of crates.

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- 1 supervisor to monitor the above work.
- 1 Welding Machine set.

The indicative man power and Machine requirement for handling the Modules length greater than 11 M.

- 6 unskilled workmen for loading and unloading
- 4 skilled workmen (qualified fitter/welder) for crate fit up and welding of crates.
- 1 supervisor to monitor the above work.
- 1 Welding Machine set.

However depend upon the work load it is the total responsibility of the contractor to supply manpower and welding Machine set in order to meet the requirement of BHEL.

- 2 The Contractor has to deploy more manpower depends upon actual requirement. And if required the contract has to work extra hours in order to meet the dispatch requirements of BHEL for which BHEL will not pay any extra amount, (Rates are based on tonnage completion basis only). However, BHEL work should not get delayed due to any reasons on the part of Contractor.
- 3 Contractor has to work in two shift (8 Hrs each shift) i.e. General and Night Shift Whenever required from user agencies as per requirement of shop receipts.
- 4 Contractor has to provide required personal protective equipment to their workmen and supervisor at their own cost.

C. MATERIALS AND FACILITIES PROVIDED BY BHEL TO THE CONTRACTOR: -

- (A) BHEL will provide Gantry crane and assistance for operating the crane by operator / remote operation for unloading, stacking & loading of Modules.
- (B) BHEL shall arrange all structural materials for crating and all welding consumables for crates fabrication and mobile crane for supporting activates of crate fabrication if needed.

RATE BASIS

01. The quoted rate shall be firm throughout the currency of the contract.
02. The quoted rate should be excluding Service Tax and inclusive of any other taxes and duties levied or to be levied both by Central and State Government authorities from time to time.
03. The above mentioned quantity is approximate only and it is likely to vary.
04. As per BHEL Circular, Contractor will have to make an additional payment to the contract workmen as given below, over and above the minimum wages prescribed by the Government of Tamilnadu from time to time.

05. The Contractor will have cover their workmen under PF, ESI, Bonus Act etc. based on the above payment rate (Minimum Wage + Additional Wage).

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1. SPECIAL CONDITIONS – I

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The General Term & Conditions of the Contract shall be applicable to the extent that the condition therein does not supersede these special conditions given below:-

1. Following documents will be must for Technical Qualification of Vendor:-

- (i) Status of the Firm such as Public Limited/Private Limited/Partnership Firm/Single Ownership. Relevant documents to be submitted.
- (ii) Documents to prove financial soundness of the company/proprietor such as Profit and Loss account, Audited Balance Sheet, Annual Report, Income Tax submission acknowledgement for the last 3 Years.
- (iii) Contract Copy along with successful completion Certificate for Man Power Contract issued by any Central/State Govt. /PSU company.
- (iv) Documents in support of PF, ESI and Service Tax Registration to be enclosed with the Tender.
- (v) In the event of the contractors responding through BHEL web, NIC web and CPPP, the contractor should have an office at Trichy at the time of submission of offer itself for transaction of business. The proof for such office as evidenced by telephone bill payment, EB bill payment, or registration documents in the name of the company or its proprietor/partner.

Copy of all the documents must be submitted along with the offer. The original documents will be verified at the time of technical evaluation.

2. The contractor shall provide their employees with Personal protective Equipment such as Safety Shoes, Hand Glove, Goggles, Helmet, Mask etc. and shall comply all safety regulations under Factories Act. Contractor has to ensure proper use of these equipment.
3. As per the BHEL Circular BHE:HR:W:MW dt.16.08.2011, Contractor will have to make an additional payment to the contract workmen as given below, over and above the minimum wages prescribed by the Government of Tamilnadu from time to time.

Unskilled	: Rs.2000/- per month
Semiskilled	: Rs.2300/- per month
Skilled	: Rs.2500/- per month
4. The contractor will have to cover their workmen under PF, ESI, Bonus Act etc. based on the above payments rate (Minimum Wage + Additional Wage).
5. The Quoted Rate in the Price Bid should be exclusive of Service Tax and inclusive of any other taxes levied or to be levied by State or Central Government. Such levies should be borne by the Contractor. Service Tax will be paid extra on production of documentary evidence.
6. The Service Tax has to be paid to the statutory authority by the Contractor and proof should be submitted to BHEL along with the next month bill.
7. The rate will be Firm throughout the currency of the Contract period.

8. The quoted Rate is on Per MT basis irrespective of the number of days worked or number of men power deployed.
9. The Contractor must ensure that their workmen report for duty in time daily as per the instruction of BHEL Supervisor.
10. Loading is to be done in presence of our crane in-charge, along with time chart, LAL, loading details slip, etc.
11. Loading should be done as directed by the crane in-charge.
12. Unloading of receipt components as directed by the shift supervisor, verification of unloaded components with DCs.
13. Stacking to be done in the respective location, stacking of components are to be done in a steel frame to form a crate. Wooden logs are to be provided in between jobs to avoid rubbing / damage of components.
14. Duration of Contract will be One Year from the date of commencement of work.
15. Quotation should be valid for a period of three months from the last date for submission of Tender.
16. The Contractor shall ensure that components are not damaged during handling. If damage occurs to the components while handling, recovery will be made from the contractor's bill.
17. After issue of LOI/Contract, if the Contractor fails to commence the work within 7 Days and complete the work in total as per the term & condition of Tender and satisfaction to BHEL, EMD/SD deposited by the Contractor will be forfeited and Party will be barred from future all type of Tender for a period of Three Years.
18. Contract will be finalized through Price Bid Opening based on the Tender committee recommendation and approval of the competent authority.
19. The log-book for day-to-day work executed should be maintained by the Contractor and the signature should be obtained from the site in- charge/Authorized Executive of BHEL daily. The User Agency will certify the work as per the contract to enable CCC/LOGISTICS to forward the bill for payment to Accounts Department after verification.
20. Taxes, Duties if any will be recovered from the bills at sources and as well as ESI & PF if the same are not paid.
21. Statutory deduction like IT etc. will be deducted from Contractor payment as required by Law.
22. Tender can be cancelled at any stage due to unavoidable circumstances.
23. The contractor is directly responsible for injuries / death of any person employed by him. At any point of time, BHEL will not be responsible for any loss / damage to the person for performing the contractual obligations.
24. The manpower engaged under this contract should not be permitted to stay inside BHEL complex after completing their day's work. It will be the responsibility of the contractor to take the labourers out of BHEL Complex as soon as their day's work is over.

2. SPECIAL CONDITIONS –II**TENDER No: LOG/CCC/12/8006E Dt.01.09.2012****01. TERMS AND CONDITIONS REGARDING COMPLIANCE WITH VARIOUS LABOUR LAWS BY THE CONTRACTS: -**

1. The contractor shall not engage in connection with the work any person who has not completed 18 years of age.
2. The contractor shall in respect of labour employed by him either directly or through sub- contractors, comply with or cause to be complied with following statutory provisions and rules and in regard to all matters provided therein.
 - (a) The contract Labour (Regulation & Abolition) Act 1970 and the related Tamil Nadu Rules.
 - (b) The minimum wages Act 1948 and the related Tamil Nadu rules
 - (c) The payment of wages Act 1936 and the related Tamil Nadu rules.
 - (d) The Factories Act 1948 and related Tamil Nadu Rules.
 - (e) The Employees' Provident Fund & Miscellaneous provisions Act 1952.
 - (f) The Employees State Insurance Act 1948.
 - (g) Payment of Bonus Act 1965
 - (h) The workmen's Compensation Act 1923
 - (i) The Industrial Disputes Act 1947 and any other law, or modifications to the above or to the rules made there under from time to time.

02. REGISTRATIONS AND LICENCING

Every contractor shall register his name with the Personnel & Administration Department of BHEL Trichy-14 before taking up the work awarded to him by giving the following information and getting a code Number.

- (a) Name of the Contractor
- (b) Nature of Work
- (c) Period of Work
- (d) Number of maximum labour employed by him on anyone day.
- (e) License No. & Date (Applicable in case of contractors employing 20 or more workers)
- (f) The labourer should be enrolled with PF, ESI and enrolment No should be furnished on finalization of contract.

03. The contractor employing 20 or more workmen shall obtain a license from the authorities (The Deputy Chief Inspector of Factories / Assistant Commissioner of Labour as the case may be). This license shall be amended and / or renewed wherever there is an increase in the workmen employed by him or in the event of contract being extended or renewed. The contractor shall inform the license number to the BHEL Management before taking up the work.

04. The Contractor (Licensed or unlicensed) shall promptly furnish every information and document required by BHEL Authorities.

05. WAGES

The contractor shall pay wages to the workmen employed by him at the rate, which shall not be less than the minimum wages declared by Tamilnadu Government from time to time plus additional wages prescribed by BHEL.

07. The Contractor shall ensure the disbursement of wages in the presence of such authorized representatives of BHEL Management.

- 08.** A certificate of payment shall be furnished in duplicate by the contractor to the Engineer In charge for each month.
- 09.** The contractor shall inform the BHEL Management every month the details of contract labour engaged for each contract in the following forms:-
- a. Serial Number
 - b. Location
 - c. Period of Work
 - d. No. of Contract labour engaged during the month
 - e. No. of days worked
 - f. No. of Man – days worked
 - g. Wages paid to his workers.

The above statement shall be furnished to BHEL Management at the end of every month.

REGISTERS AND RECORDS

- 10.** The contractor shall maintain necessary documents I Formats and Registers and submit returns as required under the Contract Labour (Regulation and Abolition) Act 1970 periodically to BHEL Management and to the Licensing Authority.
- 11.** All registers and records shall be preserved in original for a period of three years. All the registers, records and notice maintained under the Act and rules shall be produced on demand by inspector or any authority under The Act.

WORKING CONDITIONS

- 12.** The contractor shall provide all safety devices and personal protective equipment to his workmen at his own cost and shall ensure that his workmen wear / use such device or equipment provided to them while doing the work and there should not be any relaxation on this.
- 13.** The contractor shall ensure that his workmen vacate the premises after shift is over

NOTICES OF ACCIDENTS

- 14.** In the event of an accident the contractor shall be required to fill injury report and submit to the Engineer In charge immediately and ensure compliance of ESI / Workmen's Compensation of accident as per the Act.
- 15.** The contractor shall get the contract labour engaged by him insured under workmen's compensation policy from General Insurance Corporation of India before actually starting the work of contract. The Insurance Coverage should be for the entire period of contract. The contractor shall comply with the provisions of the Workmen's Compensation Act 1923. (This should be read in connection with the provisions of ESI Act.)

COVERAGE UNDER THE ESI / PF ACT MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS ACT

- 16.** The contractor shall ensure that all his workmen are covered under the Employee's Sate Insurance Act and produce to BHEL such Registration number/ Enrolment Number before executing the contract work.
- 17.** The contractor shall regularly pay the amount by contribution i.e. employers contribution as well as employee's contribution in pursuance of the above scheme as fixed from time to time.

- 19.** The Contractor shall within seven days of the close of every month submit to BHEL a statement showing the amount of contribution payable / paid for employees engaged by him or through him and shall also furnish to BHEL such information, as Principal Employer is required to furnish under the provisions of the ESI Act PF as well as the schemes made there under to the authorities concerned.
- 20.** Whenever any sum of money is found to be recoverable from or payable by the contractor, the same shall be deducted from any sum that may be due or which at any time thereafter may become due to the contractor under this contract or under any other contract or from his security deposit. In case the

recoveries are not sufficient to satisfy the claims, the contractor shall pay the balance thereof on demand. In case any recoveries are made under this clause from the security deposit, the contractor shall immediately thereafter pay such further sum as may be required to replenish the shortage caused by such recoveries in the amount of security deposit.

- 22.** In case of non-compliance of the provisions of the Acts and in case BHEL having complied with the same BHEL will be entitled to recover the same from the contractor / sub-contractor.
- 21.** The contractor shall abide by all the labour and other laws applicable to contract labour / worker under this contract and shall at all-time keep BHEL Indemnified against all losses, claims, prosecutions under any law.
- 23.** Non exercise of any of the powers or rights available under any law, shall not in any way operate as waiver thereof.

3. SAFETY CONDITIONS

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The Factories Act, 1948:

Section 32: Floors, stairs and means of access shall be properly maintained to ensure safety. Every place of working should have safe access. When any person has to work at a height from which he is likely to fall, provision shall be made, so far as is reasonably practicable, by fencing or otherwise, to ensure the safety of person so working.

Tamil Nadu Factories Rules, 1950

Rule 55: Hoists and Lifts & Rule 55A. Lifting machines, chains, ropes and lifting tackles: Shall be maintained in good condition, thoroughly inspected and examined by competent persons and records to be maintained.

Rule 57: Excessive Weights: No person shall, unaided by another person, lift, carry or move by hand or on head, any material, article, tool or appliance exceeding the maximum limit in weight set out in the schedule (50 kg for adult male and 30 kg for adult female).

Rule 61E: Machinery and plant: No machinery, plant or equipment shall be constructed, situated, operated or maintained in any factory in such a manner as to cause risk of bodily injury.

Rule 61F: Methods of Work: No process or work shall be carried on in any factory in such a manner as to cause risk of bodily injury.

Rule 61G: Stacking and storing of materials etc.: No materials or equipment shall be stacked or stored in such a manner as to cause risk of bodily injury.

Rule 61-K. Examination of eye sight of certain workers: No person shall be employed to operate a crane or to give signals to crane operator unless his eye sight and colour vision have been examined and declared fit by a qualified ophthalmologist.

Rule 61-N and Rule 61- O: Workers to be provided with Personal Protective equipment suitable for the hazards and should be of good quality / have certification by Indian Standard Institute.

Note: For the type of work envisaged, personal protective equipment such as helmet, safety shoes and gloves are essential.

Rule 96: Notification of accidents: Shall be complied with as required in the Factories Act (Section 88 and Section 88A) and Tamil Nadu Factories Rules.

4. CONDITIONS RELATED TO THE WELFARE OF LABOURS

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1. The Minimum Wages as prescribed by the State Government from time to time and additional payment as per BHEL circular should be paid to the contract Workers and the Wage and Attendance Registers should be produced to Welfare Section every month.
2. If the contractor employs more than twenty employees, he has to obtain Licence to this effect from the Factory Inspectorate and renew the same periodically.
3. He has to have his own PF and ESI Codes and comply with the relevant Acts.
4. The Contractor has to remit PF for his workers for the same amount which he paid as total wages to the employees on monthly basis. He has to remit 13.61% from his side and deduct 12% of Wages from the monthly wages of the employees and a total of 25.61% of monthly wages should be remitted as PF i.r.o. each employee.
5. ESI Payment should be at the rate of 6.5% of monthly wages of the employee. This comprises the contribution at 1.75% of wages from the employee and 4.75% of wages from the contractor.
6. The Contract workers should be fully aware of safety measures and observe all safety precautions during work. The contractor should also make his own arrangements to provide requisite safety devices to the workers, based on the nature of work. Any accident/incident occurring to his workers in Company's premises should be reported in writing by the Contractor to Safety, Welfare and Line Executive concerned.

1. **DEFINITION :-** In these General Conditions of Contract, the following terms shall have the meaning hereby assigned to them, except where the context otherwise requires:-
 - (a) The "**Contract**" means, the documents forming the Tender and acceptance thereof, together with all the documents referred to therein including general and special conditions to contract. All these documents as applicable taken together shall be deemed to form one contract and shall be complementary to one another.
 - (b) The "**work**" means, the work described in the Tender documents in individual work-orders as may be issued from time to time to the contractor by the Officer In-charge within the power conferred upon him including all notified or additional items of works and obligations to be carried out as required for the performance of contract.

- (c) The "**contractor**" means, the individual Firm or Company whether incorporated or not, undertaking the work and shall include the legal personal representatives of such individuals or the persons composing the firm or Company or the successors of the firm or company and the permitted assigns of such individual or firm or Company.
- (d) "The **Officer-In charge**" means, the Officer deputed by the AGM/CCC/LOGISTICS, to supervise the work or part of the work.
- (e) "**Approved**" and "**Directed**" means, the approval or direction of AGM/CCC/LOGISTICS, or person deputed by him for the particular purposes.
- (f) "BHARAT HEAVY ELECTRICALS LIMITED" (herein after referred to as BHEL) shall mean the Board of Directors, Chairman, Executive Director, General Manager or other Administrative Officer of the said Company including Sr.Manager/CCC/LOGISTICS authorised to invite Tenders and enter into contract for works on behalf of the Company.
- (g) The "**Contract sum**" means, the sum accepted or the sum calculated in accordance with the prices accepted in Tender and / or the contract rates as payable to the contractor for the execution of the work during the currency of the contract.
- (h) A "**week**" means, Seven Days, without regard to the number of hours worked or not worked in any day in that week.
- (i) A "**day**" means, the day of 24 hours (TWENTY FOUR) irrespective of the number of hours worked or not worked in that day.
- (j) A "**working day**" means, any day other than that prescribed by the NEGOTIABLE INSTRUMENTS ACT as being a Holiday, and consists of the number of hours of labour as commonly recognised by good employers in the trade in the district where the work is carried out or as laid down in the BHEL regulations.

2. **HEADING TO THE CONTRACT CONDITIONS:** - The heading to these conditions shall not affect the interpretations thereof.

3. **WORK TO BE CARRIED OUT:-** The Contract shall, include all labour, materials, tools, plant, equipment and transport which may be required for the execution of the work. The Contractor will be deemed to have satisfied himself as to the nature of the site, local facilities of access and all matters affecting the execution of the work. No extra charges consequent on any misunderstanding in these respects or otherwise will be allowed.

4. **DEVIATIONS:** - The contractor shall not carry out any work not covered by schedule except in pursuance of the written instructions of AGM/CCC/LOGISTICS. No such work shall be valid unless the same has been specifically confirmed and accepted by BHEL in writing and incorporated in the Contract.

5. **ASSIGNMENT OF TRANSFER OF CONTRACT:-** The Contractor shall not without the prior written approval of the BHEL, assign or transfer the contract or any part thereof, or any share, or interest thereon to any other persons. No sum of money which may become payable under the contract shall be payable to any person, other than the contractor unless the prior written approval of the BHEL to the assignment or transfer of such money is given.

SUB-CONTRACT: - The Contractor shall not sub-let any portion of the contract without the prior written approval of the BHEL.

6. **COMPLIANCE TO REGULATIONS AND BY-LAWS:** - The Contractor shall confirm to the provisions of any statute relating to the work and regulations and Bye-Laws of any local authority. The Contractor shall be bound to give all notices required by statute regulations or By-Laws as aforesaid and to pay all fees and taxes payable to any authority in respect thereof.

7. **SECURITY DEPOSIT:-**

(a) Security Deposit should be paid by the contractor. Security Deposit shall be collected from the successful Tenderer as shown below:

Up-to Rs.10 Lakhs : 10%

Above Rs.10 lakhs up to Rs.50 Lakhs : 1 Lakh + 7.5% of the amount exceeding Rs.10 Lakhs

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with seal and full address

Above Rs.50 Lakhs : 4 Lakhs + 5% of the amount exceeding Rs.50 Lakhs.
The Security Deposit shall be collected before start of the Work.

- (b) You may furnish the Security Deposit any one of the following forms:
- i) Cash (as permissible under the Income Tax Act)
 - ii) Pay Order, Demand Draft in favour of BHEL
 - iii) Local cheques of scheduled banks, subject to realization.
- iv) Securities available from Post Offices such as National Savings Certificates, Kisan Vikas Patras etc. (Certificates should be held in the name of Contractor furnishing the security and duly pledged in favour of BHEL and discharged on the back).
- v) Bank Guarantee from Scheduled Banks/ Public Financial Institutions as defined in the Companies Act. The Bank Guarantee format should have the approval of BHEL and with minimum 15 months validity.
- vi) In order to ensure the genuineness of BG's, the BG's are to be sent directly by the concerned bank through registered post to The Senior Manager, CCC/Logistics, Near East Gate, BHEL Trichy-620014.
- vii) Fixed Deposit Receipt issued by Scheduled Banks/ Public Financial Institutions as defined in the Companies Act. The FDR should be in the name of the contractor, A/C BHEL, duly discharged on the back and with minimum 15 months validity.
- viii) Security deposit can also be recovered at the rate of 10% from the running bills. However in such cases at least 50% of the Security Deposit should be collected (any of the above form) and the balance 50% may be recovered from the running bills.

The security deposit shall not carry any interest.

The Earnest Money paid at the time of Tender will be adjusted as part of the Security Deposit and the balance amount will be collected from the contractor as mentioned above.

Security Deposit shall not be refunded except in accordance with the terms of Security Bond or Agreement. No interest shall be allowed on Security Deposits. BHEL shall not be responsible for any loss of securities, due to liquidation for any other reasons, what-so-ever or any depreciation in the value of the securities while in their charge or for any loss of interest there on.

All compensation or other sums of money payable by the Contractor to BHEL under the terms of this contract or under any other contract with BHEL may be deducted from the Security Deposit or realised by the sale of the securities or from the interest arising therefrom or from any sums which may be due or may become due to the contractor by BHEL and in the event of this Security Deposit being deducted by reason of such deductions or sale, as aforesaid, the Contractor shall within 7 days thereafter, make good in cash or in securities endorsed as aforesaid, any sum by which the Security Deposit has been reduced.

8. REFUND OF SECURITY DEPOSIT:- The Security Deposit mentioned above may be refunded to the Contractor after a period of 6 months on termination or expiry of the contract provided always that the Contractor shall first have been paid the last and final bill and have rendered a "NO DEMAND CERTIFICATE".

9. ORDERS UNDER THE CONTRACT:- All orders, notices etc. to be given under the contract shall be in writing, type-script or printed and if sent by registered post to the address given in the Tender of the Contract, shall be deemed to have been served on the date, when in the ordinary course they would have been delivered to him. The Contractor shall carry out without delay all orders given to him.

- 10. CONTRACTOR'S SUPERVISION:** - The Contractor shall either himself supervise the execution of the contract or shall appoint a competent agent acceptable to the AGM/CCC/LOGISTICS., to act in his stead.

Orders given to the Contractor's agent shall be considered to have the same force as if they have been given to the Contractor himself.

The Contractor or his accredited agent shall attend when required without making any claim for doing so, either the office of the SR.MANAGER/CCC/LOGISTICS, or the OFFICER-INCHARGE, to receive instructions.

The AGM/CCC/LOGISTICS., shall have full powers and without assigning any reason, require the Contractor to immediately cease to employ in connection with this contract, any agent, servant or employee where continued employment is, in his opinion undesirable. The Contractor shall not be allowed any compensation on this account.

- 11. LABOUR:** - The Contractor shall remain liable for the payment of all wages or other moneys to his work-people or employees under the payment of Wages Act 1936, Employees Liability Act. 1938, Workmen's Compensation Act 1923 or any other Act or enactment, relating thereto and rules framed, there under from time to time.
- 12. PRECAUTIONS AGAINST RISK:** - The Contractor shall be responsible for providing at his own expense for all precautions to prevent loss or damage from any and all risks and to minimize the amount of any such loss or damage and for the necessary steps to be taken for the said purpose.
- 13. DAMAGE & LOSS TO PRIVATE PROPERTY & INJURY TO WORKMEN :-** The Contractor shall at his own expense reinstate and make good to the satisfaction of the AGM/CCC/LOGISTICS., and pay compensation for any injury, loss or damage occurred to any property or rights whatever including property and rights of BHEL (or agents) servants or employee of BHEL, the injury loss or damage arising out of or in any way in connection with the execution or purported execution of the contract and further the contractor shall indemnify, the BHEL against all claims enforceable against BHEL (or any agent, servant or employee of BHEL) or which would be so enforceable against BHEL where BHEL is a private person, in respect of any such injury (including injury resulting in death) loss or damage to any person whomsoever or property including all claims which may arise under the Workmen's Compensation Act or otherwise.
- 14. LAWS GOVERNING THE CONTRACT:-** The contract shall be governed by the Indian Laws for time being in force.
- 15. (i)** Should a Tenderer or a contractor has a dependent/relative or in the case of a partnership firm, any of its partners or dependents of partners employed in BHEL, the authority inviting Tenders should be informed of this fact at the time of submission of the Tender failing which Tender may be disqualified or if such fact subsequently come to light, the contract may be cancelled.
- (ii)** No BHEL employee and their dependents are eligible to submit their offer against this Tender.
- 16. CANCELLATION OF CONTRACT FOR CORRUPT ACTS:** - BHEL, whose decision shall be final and conclusive, shall without prejudice to any other right or remedy which shall have accrued shall accrue thereafter to BHEL cancel the contract in any of the following cases and the Contractor shall be liable to make payment to BHEL for any loss or damage resulting from any such cancellation to the same extend as provided in the case of cancellation for default.

If the Contractor shall: -

- (a) Offer or give or agree to give to any person in BHEL service any gift or consideration of any kind, as an inducement or reward for doing or for bearing to do or for having done or for borne to do any act, in relation to the obtaining or execution of this or any other contract for BHEL service,
OR
- (b) Enter in to a contract with BHEL in connection with which commission has been paid or agreed to be paid by him or with his knowledge, unless the particulars of any such commission and the terms of payment thereof have previously been disclosed in writing to BHEL.
OR
- (c) Obtain a contract with BHEL as a result of ring Tendering or by non-bonafide methods of competitive Tendering, without first disclosing the fact in writing to BHEL.

17. CANCELLATION OF CONTRACT FOR INSOLVENCY ASSIGNMENT OF TRANSFER OR SUB-LETTING OF CONTRACT :-

BHEL, without prejudice to any other right or remedy which shall have accrued or shall accrue thereafter to BHEL shall cancel the contract in any of the following cases:

If the Contractor,

- (a) being an individual or if a firm any partner thereof shall at any time be adjudged bankrupt or have a receiving order for administration of his estate, made against him or shall take any proceedings for liquidation or composition under any bankruptcy Act or assignment of his effects of composition or arrangement for the benefit of his creditors or purport to do so, or if any application made under any Bankruptcy Act for the time being in force for the sequestration of his estate or if a trust deed be granted by him on behalf of his creditors
OR
- (b) being a Company, shall pass a resolution or the Court shall make an order for the liquidation of its affairs, or a receiver or Manager on-behalf of the debenture holders shall be appointed or circumstances shall arise which entitle the Court or debenture holders to appoint a receiver or Manager,
OR
- (c) Assigns, Transfers, Sub-lets or attempts to assign, transfer or sub-let any portion of the work without the prior written approval of the BHEL.
- (d) Whenever BHEL exercise the authority to cancel the contract under this conditions, BHEL may have the work done by any means at the Contractor's risks and expenses provided always that in the event of the cost of the work so done (as certified by SR.MANAGER/CCC/LOGISTICS which is final and conclusive) being less than the contract cost, the advantage shall accrue to the BHEL and if the cost exceeds the money due to Contractor under the contract, the Contractor shall either pay the excess amount ordered by AGM/CCC/LOGISTICS., or the same shall be recovered from the Contractor by other means.
- (e) In case the BHEL carries-out the work under the provisions of this condition the cost to be taken into account in determining the excess cost to be charged to the Contractor under this condition shall consist of the cost of the materials, hire charges of tools and plants and/or labour provided by the BHEL with an addition of such percentage to cover superintendence and establishment charges as may be decided by the AGM/CCC/LOGISTICS., whose decision shall be final and conclusive.

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18. CANCELLATION OF CONTRACT IN PART OF FULL FOR CONTRACATOR'S DEFAULT:**If the Contractor: -**

- (a) makes default in carrying out the work as directed and continues in that state after a reasonable notice from AGM/CCC/LOGISTICS., or his authorised representative ;
- (b) fails to comply with any of the Terms and Conditions of the contract or after reasonable notice in writing with orders properly issued there under ;
- (c) BHEL, may without prejudice to any other right or remedy which shall have accrued or shall accrue thereafter to BHEL CANCEL the contract as whole or in part thereof or only such work order or items of work in default from the contract. Whenever BHEL exercise the authority to cancel the contract as whole or part under this condition BHEL may complete the work at the contractor's risk and cost (as certified by AGM/CCC/LOGISTICS., which is final and conclusive) being less than the contract cost, the advantage shall accrue to the BHEL. If the cost exceeds the moneys due to the Contractor under this contract the Contractor shall either pay the excess amount ordered by SR.MANAGER/CCC/LOGISTICS or the same shall be recovered from the Contractor by other means. In case the BHEL carries out the work or any part thereof under the provisions of the conditions the cost to be taken into account in determining the excess cost to be charged to the Contractor under this condition shall consist of the cost of the materials, hire charges of tools and plant and/or labour provided by the BHEL with an addition of such percentage to cover the superintendence and establishment charges as may be decided by the AGM/CCC/LOGISTICS., whose decision shall be final and conclusive.

19. TERMINATION OF CONTRACT ON DEATH OF CONTRACTOR. :-

Without prejudice to any of the rights or remedies under this contract, if the Contractor dies, or if the firm is dissolved or the company is liquidated BHEL shall have the option of terminating the contract without compensation to the Contractor.

- 20. SPECIAL POWER TO TERMINATION:-** If at any time after the award of contract, BHEL shall for any reason whatsoever not require whole or any part of the work to be carried out the AGM/CCC/LOGISTICS., shall give notice in writing of the fact to the Contractor who shall have no claim to any payment of compensation or otherwise howsoever on account of any profit or advantage which he might have derived from the execution of the work in full but which he did not derive in consequence of the fore-closing of the work.

- 21. SUBMISSION OF BILLS BY CONTRACTOR:-** The Contractor at the end of each month shall submit a bill in triplicate detailing the various items of work done during the month supported by the requisitions issued from time to time. The Contractor shall, once in every month, submit to the AGM/CCC/LOGISTICS, separately details of his claims for the work done by him up-to and including the previous month which are not covered by his contract agreement in any of the following respects:

- (a) Deviation from the items provided in the contract documents.
- (b) Extra items / new items of work.
- (c) Items in-respect of which rates have not been settled. He should in addition furnish a clear certificate to the effect that the claims submitted by him as aforesaid cover all his claims and that no further claims shall be raised by him in respect of the work done up-to and including the period under report.

- 22. PAYMENT OF BILLS:-** All payments to be made to the Contractor, under this contract shall be through Electronic Fund Transfer within a reasonable time after the certification of bills by the SM/CCC/LOGISTICS.

- 23. RECOVERY FROM CONTRACTOR: -** Whenever under the contract, any sum of money, shall be recoverable from or payable by the Contractors, the same may be deducted from or any sum then due or which at any time thereafter may become due to Contractor under the contract or under any other contract with BHEL or from his Security Deposit or he shall pay the claim on demand.

- 24. POST TECHNICAL AUDIT OF WORK AND BILLS:-** BHEL reserves the right to carry out the post-payment Audit and technical examination of the work and final bill including all supporting vouchers, abstracts etc., and enforce recovery of any sum becoming due as a result thereof in the manner provided in the presiding sub-paragraphs. However no such recovery shall be enforced after three years of passing the final bill.
- 25. FORCE MEJEURE CLAUSE:-** If, at any time during the continuance of this Contract the performance in whole or in part by either party of any obligations under this Contract shall be prevented or delayed by reason of any War, Hostile acts of the public enemy Civil Commotion, Epidemics, or Acts of God (Floods, Storm/Cyclone, Hurricane, Earth Quake etc.) then provided notice of happening of any such event is given by either party to other within 7 days from the date of occurrence therefore neither party shall by reason of such event be entitled to terminate this Contract nor shall either party have any claim for damages against the other in respect of such non-performance and delay in performance under the contract shall be resumed as soon as practicable after such event has come to an end or ceased to exist. If the performance in whole or part of any obligation under this Contract is prevented or delayed by reason of any such event, claims for extension of time shall be granted for periods considered reasonable by the Manager/CCC/LOGISTICS subject to prompt notification by the contractor.
- 26. ARBITRATION: -** All disputes between the parties to the contract, arising out-of or relating to the contract, other than those for which the decision of the AGM/CCC/LOGISTICS., or Accepting Officer or any other person is by the contract expressed to be final and conclusive shall after written notice by either party to the contract to the other party be referred to the sole Arbitration of Executive Director or other Officers of BHEL appointed as Arbitrator, by the Executive Director of BHEL in his sole discretion. Unless the parties otherwise agree, such reference shall not take place until after the completion, alleged completion or abandonment of the work of the determination of the contract.
- The venue of Arbitration shall be such a place or places as may be fixed by the Arbitrator in his sole discretion. The award of the Arbitrator shall be final, conclusive and binding on both parties to the contract.
- 27. SIGNING OF CONTRACT:-** Each contract document shall be signed by the Contractor with his usual signature. Contract by partnership of Hindu Joint Family firm, may be signed in the FIRM'S name by one of the Partners or the Karta or Manager as the case may be or by any other duly authorised representative followed by the name and designation of the persons so signing. Contracts by a Company shall be signed with the name of the Company by a person authorised in this behalf and a power of attorney or other satisfactory proof showing that the persons signing the Contract documents on behalf of the Company is duly authorised to do so, shall accompany the contract.
- 28. STATUTORY REQUIREMENTS:**
- (a) All statutory requirements under Minimum Wages Act,1948, Factories Act 1948, Workmen Compensation Act 1923,Employees Provident Fund and Miscellaneous Provisions Act, 1952,Payment of Gratuity Act 1972, Employee State Insurance Act 1948, Contract Labour (R&A) Act 1970, Payment of Bonus Act 1965, Income Tax Act, Service Tax Act and all other applicable Acts shall be complied with by the Contractor.
 - (b) Contractor shall comply with all statutory requirements, rules, regulations, notifications in relation to employment of his employees issued from time to time by the concerned authorities.
 - (c) Contractor shall indemnify BHEL against all claims and losses under various Labour Laws, statutes or any civil or criminal law in connection with employees deployed by him.
 - (d) Contractor wherever applicable shall maintain proper records prescribed by the concerned statutory authorities and provide a copy of the same to BHEL.
 - (e) Contractor shall furnish proper returns to the concerned statutory authorities and provide a copy of the same to BHEL.

- 29. REGISTERS & RECORDS:** - The Contractor shall maintain all registers and records in the proper manner and as required by the regulations of the various authorities concerned and indemnify the Employer from the consequences due to any inaccurate or faulty documentation on the part of the Contractor.
- 30. REMOTE TRANSACTIONS:-** The Contractor shall agree to and comply with all such terms and conditions as BHEL may prescribe from time to time and shall confirm that all transactions effected by or through facilities for conducting remote transactions including the Internet, World Wide Web, electronic data interchange, call centres, teleservice operations (whether voice, video, data or combination thereof) or by means of electronic, computer, automated machines network or through other means of telecommunication established by BHEL shall constitute legally binding and valid transactions when done.
- 31. CHANGE IN CONSTITUTION OF FIRM:-** Changes in constitution of firm whenever it is made after submission of application or during currency of the contract, the existing firm has to duly inform the proposed changes to contracting department of BHEL at the appropriate time before the changes in the constitution are made. In case the absence of any such information BHEL is not responsible for the consequences arising out of the absence or suppression of information and the issue / dispute arising out of these changes and the firm is responsible for settling the issue or dispute among themselves (Partners etc.) or with the bankers or with any third party. Under the above circumstances when dispute arises and the firm does not inform the change in the constitution of the firm BHEL has the right for suspending or terminating the contract.
- 32. LIEN OF CONSIGNMENTS:-** The Contractor shall have no 'lien' of any kind over the consignments entrusted for transportation.
