7.1	The tenderer shall quote the rates in English Language and international numerals. The
	rates shall be entered in figures as well as in words. The metric system of units shall be
7.2	used.
7.2	If, in the price structure quoted for the required goods/ services/works, there is discrepancy between the unit price and the total price (which is obtained by multiplying
	the unit price by the quantity), the unit price shall prevail and the total price corrected
	accordingly, unless in the opinion of the purchaser there is an obvious misplacement of
	the decimal point in the unit price, in which case the total price as quoted shall govern
	and the unit price corrected accordingly.
7.3	If there is an error in a total corresponding to the addition or subtraction of subtotals,
7.0	the subtotals shall prevail and the total shall be corrected; and
7.4	If there is a discrepancy between words and figures, the amount in words shall prevail,
,,,	unless the amount expressed in words is related to an arithmetic error, in which case

	tender) authorizing him to sign on behalf of the tenderer before submission of tender.
10.0	ADDENDA/Corrigenda/Amendments
	ADDENDA/Corrigenda/Amendments to the tender documents may be issued prior to
	the date of opening of the tenders to clarify documents or to reflect modifications to the
	contract terms and conditions. All such ADDENDA/Corrigenda/Amendments when
11.0	issued shall form part of tender documents INFORMATION
11.0	The information given in the tender documents and the plans and drawings forming part
	thereof is merely intended as general information without undertaking on the part of
	BHEL as to their accuracy and without obligation relative thereto upon BHEL. Before
	tendering, the tenderers are advised to inspect the site of work and the environments
	and be well acquainted with the actual working and other prevalent conditions,
	facilities available, position of labour etc. No claim will be entertained later on the
	ground of lack of knowledge.
12.0	ENCLOSURES
12.1	The enclosures to be enclosed alongwith Part-I of the tender shall include the following
	besides other such enclosures which may have been specified elsewhere in the tender
	documents.
12.2	Power of Attorney: An attested copy of the Power of Attorney, in case an
	individual/authorized signatory other than the sole proprietor signs the tender shall be
	submitted along with the tenders. Authorized signatory shall be the person holding
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	'power of attorney' on behalf of the firm/company/bidder-concerned
	authorized/empowered to act on behalf for the specific purpose.
12.3	Any other documents required in terms of this notice.
13.0	GENERAL
13.1	The tender shall be completely filled in all respects and shall be tendered together with requisite information in the manner detailed above. Any tender incomplete in any respect and violating any of the instructions shall be liable to be rejected. If the space in the tender or any schedule or proforma is insufficient pages shall be separately added and numbered.
13.2	The acceptance of tender will rest with BHEL which does not bind itself to accept the lowest tender or any tender and reserves to itself full rights in this regard without assigning any reasons whatsoever.
14.0	Conditional and unwitnessed tenders, tenders containing absurd or unworkable rates and amounts and tenders which are incomplete and otherwise considered defective and
45.0	not in accordance with the tender conditions, specification, etc are liable to be rejected.
15.0	If a tenderer expires after his submission of the tender or after the acceptance of his tender BHEL may at their discretion cancel such tender. If a partner of a firm expires after the submission of the tender or after the acceptance of the tender, BHEL may cancel such tender at their discretion unless the firm retains its character.
16.0	BHEL will not be bound by any power of attorney/ granted by the tenderer or by changes in the composition of the firm made subsequent to the execution of the contract. They may however, recognize such power of attorney and changes after obtaining proper legal advice, the cost of which will be chargeable to the contractor, concerned.
17.0	If the tenderer deliberately gives wrong information in his tender, BHEL reserves the right to reject such tender at any stage or to cancel the contract, if awarded and forfeit Earnest Money Deposit/ Security Deposits.
18.0	Canvassing in any form in connection with the tenders is strictly prohibited and the tenders submitted by the contractor who resort to canvassing are liable to rejection.
19.0	Should a tenderer or contractor or in the case of a firm or Company one or more of its partners / shareholders / directors have a relation or relations employed in the capacity of an officer of BHEL, the authority inviting tender shall be informed of the fact alongwith detail of the officer. Failing this, BHEL may, at its sole discretion, reject the tender or cancel the contract and forfeit the Earnest Money /Security Deposit.
20.0	The tender submitted by a bidder shall become property of BHEL who shall have no obligation to return the same to the bidder.
21.0	BHEL shall not be liable for any expenses incurred by the bidder in the preparation of the tender irrespective of whether the tender is accepted or not.
22.0	In the event of any contradiction between the terms and conditions stipulated in the different volumes forming the tender documents, the order or precedence shall be Volume-II Technical specifications (for technical aspects); Special conditions of contract followed by General condition of contract (for commercial aspects).
23.0	Any submission of tender by the bidder shall be deemed to have done after careful study and examination of the tender papers with the full understanding of the implications thereof. The specifications and terms & conditions shall be deemed to have been accepted unless otherwise specifically commented upon by the tenderer in his offer. Non compliance of any tender instructions may result in the rejection of the tender offer.
24.0	The bidder shall closely peruse all the clauses, specifications and drawings indicated in the tender documents before quoting. Should the tenderer have any doubt about the meaning of any portion of the tender specification or find discrepancies or omissions in the drawings or the tender documents issued are incomplete or shall require clarifications on any of the technical aspect, scope of work etc, he shall at once contact the authority inviting the tender for clarification before the submission of the tender.

The bidder shall make independent enquiry as to the conditions and circumstance affecting his tender estimate and to the possibility of executing the supplies/ works as described. In assessing the tender it will be deemed that the bidder has inspected and examined the site and its surroundings and to have satisfied for the completion of the work and the means of transport and access to the site. The accommodation he may require, the general labour position at the site and to have fixed his prices taking into consideration the risk, contingencies and other circumstances which may influence or affect the execution of the contract.

GENERAL CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT

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1.0	APPLICATION
	Unless otherwise provided in the Contract Documents, these General Conditions shall govern the
	works accompanying technical details, if any. Special conditions of Contract shall be read in
	conjunction with these General Conditions and these conditions will form a part of the Contract
	Documents and contract agreement.
2.0	DEFINITION OF TERMS
	In construing these General Conditions, Special conditions and accompanying Specifications the
	following words shall have the meaning herein assigned to them except where the context otherwise
	requires.
2.0.1	"BHEL" shall mean Bharat Heavy Electricals Limited, a Company registered under the Indian
	Companies Act 1956, with its Registered Office at BHEL House, Siri Fort, New Delhi, or its
	Administrative Officers or its engineer or other employees authorized to deal with any matter with
	which these persons are concerned on its behalf.
2.0.2	Executive Director / General Manager shall mean the officer in administrative charge of BHEL's
	Unit/Region or other offices.
2.0.3	Head of Logistics/Head of the CDC shall mean the officer in administrative charge of Logistics/CDC
	Department of BHEL's Unit/Region or other offices.
2.0.3	The "Bidder / Tenderer/" shall mean financially sound, experienced and renowned
	companies/logistics service providers/ freight services providers/ transporters having requisite
	resources/ inventory, experience and technical manpower who can be engaged for providing the
	total logistics solutions i.e. safe and secure transportation of goods by mechanical vehicle or
	Hydraulic Trailer through road
2.0.4	"Goods" shall mean plants, equipment or materials to be transported under the Contract Documents
2.0.5	The "transporter/Contractor" shall mean the successful Bidder / Tenderer who is awarded the
	Contract and shall be deemed to include the Contractor's successors, assigns, heirs, executors,
	administrators.
2.0.6	The "Sub-contractor" shall mean individual or firm to whom any part of the work has been Subletted
	by the Contractor with the consent in writing of BHEL & shall include his /its heirs, executors,
	administrators, legal representative and permitted assigns.
2.0.7	"Acceptance of Tender" shall mean Telegraph /Telex /Telefax Letter of Intent or Notification
,	communicating to the Contractor the acceptance by BHEL of his tender.
2.0.8	"Contract Price" means the sum named in the tender subject to such additions thereto or deductions
	therefrom as may be made under the provisions hereinafter contained.
2.0.9	"Contract" shall mean the Agreement between the Contractor and BHEL for execution of the
	payment for the Work as defined in the Contract Documents.
2.0.10	The "Contract Documents" shall mean and include the General Conditions of Contract (GCC), Special
2.0.10	Conditions of the Contract (SCC) Specifications and Schedules, Drawings and Form of Tender,
	Covering Letters, Schedule of Prices and Quantities submitted by the successful Bidder, Letter of
	Intent of BHEL, Drawings, subsequent amendments mutually agreed upon and the Agreement to be
	entered in to between BHEL and the Contractor duly signed by them under the Clauses "Contract" of
	these General Conditions and other documents that may form part(s) of the Contract Documents.
2.0.11	"Transportation" shall mean the safe & secure movement of goods from one location to another

2.0.13	"Sea transportation" shall mean safe & secure movement of goods from one location to another by
	sea within India.
2.0.14	"Inland Water transportation" shall mean safe & secure movement of goods from one location to

2.0.15	"Air transportation" shall mean safe & secure movement of goods from one airport to another
	airport by air

5.1	The Contract Price is the agreed sum of money stated in the Contract Agreement to be paid to the				
	Contractor for the successful completion of the Works in accordance with the terms of the Contract				
	Documents. The Contract Price shall be for the entire scope of the Work with the break ups as				
	specified.				
	The individual item rates or lump sum price as the case may be in the schedule of this Contract shall				
	be deemed to be firm for the entire period of the Contract or extended period of Contract and no				
	escalation in the rates or price shall be permissible for any reason whatsoever unless otherwise				
	specified.				
	The Contract price shall not be varied in respect of the fluctuations in rate of wages or allowances				
	payable to the labor.				
5.2	The rates agreed shall be firm and valid for the contract period. The rates shall be inclusive of of all				
	taxes except GST, if payable by transporter. Additional charges as per 5.3 & 5.5 and Price Variation

5.4	The freight charges shall also include the cost of electrical works, civil works including providing

5.5	VARIABLE ADDITIONAL CHARGES			
5.5.1	CLEARANCE/PERMITS CHARGES			
3.3.1	Contractor shall obtain all required clearances / permits from all Governmental / non –			
	Governmental authorities e.g.: MoRTH/NHAI / PWD / CPWD, Sales Tax Department, RTA,			
	Commercial Tax, State Electricity Boards, Railways, Communication Department, P&T, Traffic, Police			
	Department etc, including Private Parties / persons for transportation of consignments through			
	inland road transport route identified by the contractor/BHEL at his cost. Some of the			
	clearance/permit charges will be reimbursed by BHEL in line with Clause 5.5.2, 5.5.3, 5.5.4 and 5.5.5.			
	Such permissions should be made available to BHEL for scrutiny as and when demanded.			
5.5.2	POWER BLOCK / HEIGHT GAUGE CHARGES			
5.5.2.1	The power block / height gauge charges at railway crossings shall be paid initially by the contractor.			
3.3.2.1	The Power Block Charges and applicable GST thereon shall be reimbursed along with freight charges			
	on submission of documentary evidence. The proof submitted shall contain the respective vehicle			
	Nos. against which the charges are paid and bill should contain BHEL GSTIN no and BHEL Bhopal			
	Address (In case transporter fails to produce the bill with BHEL GSTIN no. then GST amount shall not

<u>SPECIAL CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT (SCC) FOR TRANSPORTATION OF</u> CONSIGNMENTS BY TRUCKS (INCOMING AND ANYWHERE – TO- ANYWHERE).

S-1.0 **SCOPE OF WORK**

This transportation contract will cover transportation of incoming and anywhere to anywhere consignments of electrical equipment, plant & machinery and any other items (Goods upto 15 MT including ODC Consignments where dimensions of height & width are greater than as categories defined in Clause S-2.0) by trucks such as LCV (Light Commercial Vehicle; old name MINI), HCV (Heavy Commercial Vehicle; old name SUPER MINI), TRUCK (old name NORMAL), MAV (Multi-Axle Vehicle; old name TAURUS), OBT (Open Body Truck) etc. from suppliers', project sites, ports etc. spreading all over India to BHEL, Bhopal and anywhere to anywhere destinations within India. Heavy trucks under scope of this contract would cover non-articulated type trucks having 3 axles.

- The scope includes Transportation of goods from BHEL manufacturing units/service stations/Vendor Works/subcontractors/Airports/Sea Ports/ clearing go-downs / various sites / North —Eastern states / all hilly / mountainous areas etc. within India by Road to BHEL Bhopal .
- Jobs against specific project based contract, or contracts to be awarded on a different class of trucks transportation for development / establishment of new parties are excluded from the scope.

S-1.1 PRE - QUALIFYING REQUIREMENTS & CRITERIA (PQRC) – ANNEXURE-I

All tenderers shall ensure to comply with the PQRC Check -List as per **Annexure-I** to the full extent.

- a) **IBA**: Valid IBA (Indian Banker's Association) recommendation certificate as on the date of tender opening.
- b) <u>VEHICLE</u>: Ownership of a fleet of minimum twenty (20) trucks registered exclusively in the transporter's name duly substantiated by supporting documents for registration and other particulars. Audited Profit & Loss Account and Balance Sheet must be submitted as proof of Average Annual Turnover. The financial statements must be signed by the owner and the auditor. Auditors seal, Name, firm name, Membership No., FRN No., UDIN and the capacity in which he is signing (Proprietor/Partner), must be mentioned on the Profit & Loss A/c and Balance Sheet.

In case of proprietorship and partnership where Audited Profit & Loss A/c and Balance Sheet is not available, CA certificate certifying turnover for the required financial years must be submitted, which must be on his letter head mentioning his and his firm name, membership number, FRN no, UDIN, capacity in which he is signing (Proprietor/Partner), date and place of signing.



- d) <u>BRANCHES</u>: A minimum of **50** (Fifty) operative branches / authorized franchise offices for delivery / collection of consignments, covering atleast **10** (ten) states in India. The branch / authorized franchise details shall be a printed booklet giving the address, contact person and phone numbers of these branches / authorized franchise.

- 2. The bidder who intends to participate as "Startup" company should enclose the Certificate of Recognition issued by Department of Industrial Policy and Promotion, Ministry of Commerce & Industry, Govt. of India during submission of Technical bid.
- 3. Prequalification Criteria with respect to Valid IBA and Prior Turnover (Clause No. S-1.1 (a) and (c) of SCC) may be relaxed for Startups as per the GOI guidelines.



S-2.0 VEHICLES CATEGORIZATION:

Standard (Non-ODC) consignments having dimensions (maximum) and / or weight (maximum) shall be categorized as follows:

- 2.1 For classifying a truck as Open-body, dismantling of both sides of the truck body will be essential, justifying the width of the consignment.
- 2.2 Width is the main criteria for open-body truck irrespective of the weight of consignment to be dispatched and the same will be considered as full truck load (FTL).
- 2.3 Consignments not eligible strictly for dispatch on FTL basis justifying the weight and dimensions as above shall be dispatched as **Smalls/Part-load**.
- 2.4 In no case freight charges for lower category vehicle will be more than FTL freight charges for the next higher category of vehicle.
- 2.5 The "Smalls / Part-load" will be treated upto 1000 Kg (if not qualifying for Full Truck Load volumetrically) with maximum dimension upto 1.5 m*1.5 m*1.2 m (L*W*H).

S-3.0 Full Truck Load (FTL) Certification for all category

For the purpose of determining full truck load for any category of vehicle of the consignment due to reasons other than weight / volume (eg. urgency etc.) authorization by representative of concerned product commercial department / MM / CRX / BHEL sister unit / site in-charge / ROD shall be required.

In case, such consignment are not delivered within the normal transit time as mentioned in the clause 14 & 15 of GCC (Part-II) plus 2 (two) day's grace period, the freight bills of such dispatches will attract penalty of 2 % for the first week, 3% for the second week and 5% for subsequent weeks-delay subject to maximum of 25% (1 week = 7 days).

S-4.0 Door delivery/collection charges for smalls/part-loads shall be paid as under:

S-5.0 Go-down related expenses for smalls / part-load

For consignment that necessitate un-loading at transporter's go-down before final delivery to consignee, viz. consignments booked for self / go-down / door delivery / consignee copy attached / delivery against consignee copy etc, the following shall be applicable.

- a. Un-loading charges shall not be payable.
- b. Re-loading charges of cranable items (Min.250 Kg.per item / per box) upto 250 Kg @ Rs.1000/- and for additional weight shall be payable @ Rs.500/- per MT.
- c. Re-loading charges for non-cranable items @ Rs.300/- per MT shall be payable for loading in BHEL vehicle(s).
- d. Sorting-out charges @ Rs.200/- per MT for sorting smalls consignments at transporter's go-down shall be payable wherever certified by the BHEL representative.

S-5.1 Go-down related expenses for full truck load

Go-down related above expenses (Para S-5.0) will be applicable in following full truck load also:

- a. Self/Godown.
- b. Door delivery through bank.
- c. Door delivery against consignee copy.
- S-6.0 MINIMUM CHARGEABLE DISTANCE shall be 200 Km. However, for delivery of consignments to destinations within the municipal limits of Bhopal, the chargeable distance shall be 100 Km.
- S-6.1 Minimum charges for smalls / part-load consignment shall be Rs.500/- irrespective of weight & distance.

S-7.0 OVER DIMENSION CONSIGNMENT (ODC) CHARGES

Consignment having dimensions exceeding the standard length, width or height mentioned at S-2.0 shall be treated as ODC consignment. In respect of such consignments ODC charges on proportional basis over the standard width and height will be payable on pro-rata basis. However, ODC charges shall be permitted in one dimension only, whichever is having higher value.

Maximum width of consignments to be dispatched in OB shall be upto 2500mm.



Maximum height of consignments to be dispatched in Normal/ OB/ Super mini shall be upto 2600mm & in Taurus 2800mm.

S-7.1 MULTIPLE POINT COLLECTION AND PARKING CHARGES

Multiple point collection / loading at Mumbai Sea Ports / Air Ports / Bhiwandi / JNPT / CHA Godown etc shall be done on specific instructions / authorization by CRX division of BHEL / Bhopal @ Rs.5000/- per extra loading.

During waiting period for collection of consignments at Sea Ports / Air Ports etc the Parking charges, if any , shall be reimbursed on production of original parking receipt having the vehicle no. mentioned in it.

S-8.0 HILLY / MOUNTAINEOUS REGION CHARGES

For journey to / from / via / through hilly regions (destinations beyond Pathankot for Jammu & Kashmir , Rishikesh / Kashipur / Mohand in Uttarakhand and Parwanoo / Kiratpur in Himachal Pradesh) or any hilly regions in any part of the country as identified on case to case basis with the approval of BHEL, an additional 15% freight shall be paid over & above the applicable freight for the total journey.

S-9.0 <u>DIFFICULT TERRAIN CHARGES FOR J & K , NORTH-EASTERN, ODISHA AND CHHATTISGARH STATES</u>

For journey to / from / via / through North-Eastern states (destinations beyond Siliguri in North Eastern Sector) and movements within Jammu & Kashmir (applicable only for Anywhere to Anywhere Consignments) , an additional 60% freight over & above the basic freight for the total journey shall be paid.

For journey to / from / via / through Odisha State and Chhattisgarh State (For districts notified by government as Naxal affected as on Tender opening date) an additional 20% freight over & above the basic freight for the total journey shall be paid.

However, no additional hilly region charges are payable in such cases S-8.0.

S-10.0 KEPT BLANK

S-11.0 **INCENTIVE**

If the consignments are delivered in good condition before the normal transit time as mentioned in Cl.No.14.0 & 15.0 of GCC (Part-II), a lumpsum amount shall be paid @ Rs.1000/- per day saved in transit subject to maximum 10% of freight bill.

S-12.0 **SCHEDULE OF RATES**:

The tenderer shall quote rates in the "Schedule of Rates (Annexure-II)" for the freight for all categories / slabs, for transportation to destinations "upto 500 Km (Group-1)" and "above 500 Km (Group-2)". Tenderers are required to quote rates for all variants given in the Rate Schedule.

- S-12.1 Failure to strictly adhere to above would result in rejection of the bid.
- S-12.2 In case of failure to ensure compliance of any or all of the GCC and SCC, BHEL reserves the right to make alternative arrangements for hiring vehicles at transporter's risk & cost, besides suspending/reducing/stopping further business.

S-13.0 BUSINESS VOLUME:

13.1 The Estimated Volume of Consignments, expected to be dispatched during the one year (12 months) period of operation of the rate contract, will be tentatively as per the details given in Annexure-II (in terms of Business Quantity) and may vary by +/-15%.



13.2 The transporters shall lay no claim whatsoever on BHEL if no fixed volume of work is given to them during the currency of the contract.

S-14.0 EVALUATION & BUSINESS DISTRIBUTION:

- 14.1 The Business Quantity (BQ) is given in schedule of rates (Annexure-II) for Group-1 & Group-2 separately.
- 14.2 Transporters are required to quote for all categories group wise (Group-1 & Group-2), otherwise their tender will not be considered.
- 14.3 "Total quoted business value" of all categories shall be calculated by multiplication of rates and BQ of all categories, followed by summation of such value for all categories of both groups, which will be the basis for overall unique position of bidders, low to high L1, L2, L3 onwards. However, the lowest rate in each category (named as Picked-up L1 rates), shall be offered to overall L1 for acceptance in that particular category for arriving on final rates.
- 14.4 Business award shall be done at equated rates only based on L1 rates.
- 14.5 Business is proposed to be distributed on maximum 05 (Five) parties for both slab of transportation i.e. distance "upto 500 Km" (Group-1) & "above 500 Km" (Group -2) subject to acceptance of the L1 rates. The business percentage distribution shall be as per Cl. No. 10.0 of GCC (Part-II).
- 14.6 In an eventuality, the rate contract being finalized on less than the required number of transporter, the balance volume of business would be distributed on pro-rata basis among eligible transporters. BHEL may reschedule the volume of business and performance security deposit amount accordingly to eligible transporters on pro-rata basis.

S-15.0 ESCORT / TRACKING OF VEHICLE

- 15.1 If BHEL intends to depute an escort for certain important consignment, the transporter should allow him to travel in the same vehicle upto the destination free of cost.
- 15.2 Transporter shall install / permit installation of vehicle tracking system (VTS) on the transport vehicle and enable it (allow connecting with vehicle battery). In case the device is owned by BHEL, transporter will be responsible for its safe custody during his possession. In case of any loss on account of damage to the device, cost of device will be recovered from the transporter.
- 15.3 As and when requested by BHEL, transporter will provide mobile phone in working condition with trucks in order to have communication with the vehicle driver and shall e-mail/phone for the status of urgent and critical items to BHEL on daily basis.

S-16.0 **PERFORMANCE REVIEW:**

- 16.1 The Performance of transporters shall be reviewed periodically. Allotment of workload and continuance in contract will be related to performance.
- 16.2 In case the performance is not found upto the mark, BHEL reserves the right to terminate the contract without any further reference.
- S-17.0 In Case of failure to ensure compliance of any or all of the preceding clauses, BHEL reserves the right to make alternative arrangements for hiring vehicles from open market, at transporter's risk & cost.
- S-18.0 These SPECIAL CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT (SCC) shall be read in conjunction with GENERAL CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT (GCC), to the extent, applicable for truck transportation. In case of any conflict between the general conditions and special conditions, special conditions shall prevail.
