Preference to Make In India products (For bids < 200 Crore):Preference shall be given to Class 1 local supplier as defined in public procurement (Preference to Make in India), Order 2017 as amended from time to time and its subsequent Orders/Notifications issued by concerned Nodal Ministry for specific Goods/Products. The minimum local content to qualify as a Class 1 local supplier is denoted in the bid document. If the bidder wants to avail the Purchase preference, the bidder must upload a certificate from the OEM regarding the percentage of the local content and the details of locations at which the local value addition is made along with their bid, failing which no purchase preference shall be granted. 1. Generic

OPTION CLAUSE: The Purchaser reserves the right to increase or decrease the quantity to be ordered up to 25 percent of bid quantity at the time of placement of contract. The purchaser also reserves the right to increase the ordered quantity up to 25% of the contracted quantity during the currency of the contract at the contracted rates. The delivery period of quantity shall commence from the last date of original delivery order and in cases where option clause is exercised during the extended delivery period the additional time shall commence from the last date of extended delivery period. The additional delivery time shall be (Increased quantity \div Original quantity) \times Original delivery period (in days), subject to minimum of 30 days. If the original delivery period is less than 30 days, the additional time equals the original delivery period. The Purchaser may extend this calculated delivery duration up to the original delivery period while exercising the option clause. Bidders must comply with these terms.

2. Generic

Bidders are advised to check applicable GST on their own before quoting. Buyer will not take any responsibility in this regards. GST reimbursement will be as per actuals or as per applicable rates (whichever is lower), subject to the maximum of quoted GST %.

3. Generic

Bidder shall submit the following documents along with their bid for Vendor Code Creation:

- a. Copy of PAN Card.
- b. Copy of GSTIN.
- c. Copy of Cancelled Cheque.
- d. Copy of EFT Mandate duly certified by Bank.

4. Generic

Supplier shall ensure that the Invoice is raised in the name of Consignee with GSTIN of Consignee only.

5. Purchase Preference (Centre)

Purchase Preference linked with Local Content (PP-LC) Policy:

The bid clause regarding "Preference to Make In India products" stands modified in this bid and shall be governed by the PPLC Policy No. FP-20013/2/2017-FP-PNG dated 17.11.2020 issued by MoP&NG as amended up to date. Accordingly, bidders with Local Content less than or equal to 20% will be treated as "Non Local Supplier". The prescribed LC shall be applicable on the date of Bid opening. Sanctions on the bidders for false / wrong declaration or not fulfilling the Local Content requirement shall be as per the PPLC policy. 4 TAXES & DUTIES:

4.1 The Supplier/Vendor shall pay all (save the specific exclusions as enumerated in this clause) taxes, fees, license, charges, deposits, duti es, tools, royalty, commissions, other charges, etc. which may be levi ed on the input goods & services consumed and output goods & services delivered in course of his operations in executing the contract. In case BHEL is forced to pay any of such taxes/duties, BHEL shall have the right to recover the same from his bills or otherwise as deemed fit along with the applicable overheads @5% and interest on the total value (i. e. amount paid by BHEL + overhead)

However, provisions regarding **GST** on output supply (goods/service) a nd TDS/TCS as per Income Tax Act shall be as per following clauses.

4.2 GST (Goods and Services Tax)

- **4.2.1** Supplier/Vendor price/rates shall be **inclusive** of GST. Reimburs ement of GST is subject to compliance of following terms and conditions. BHEL shall have the right to deny payment of GST and to recover a ny loss to BHEL on account of tax, interest, penalty etc. for non-compliance of any of the following condition.
- **4.2.2** The admissibility of GST, taxes and duties referred in this chapt er or elsewhere in the contract shall be limited to direct transactions between BHEL & its Supplier/Vendor. BHEL shall not consider GST on any transaction other than the direct transaction between BHEL & its Supplier/Vendor.
- **4.2.3** Supplier/Vendor shall obtain prior written consent of BHEL befor e billing the amount towards such taxes. Where the GST laws permit m ore than one option or methodology for discharging the liability of tax/l evy/duty, BHEL shall have the right to adopt the appropriate one consi dering the amount of tax liability on BHEL/Client as well as procedural simplicity with regard to assessment of the liability. The option chosen by BHEL shall be binding on the Contractor for discharging the obligation of BHEL in respect of the tax liability to the Supplier/Vendor.
- **4.2.4** Supplier/Vendor has to submit GST registration certificate of the concerned state. Supplier/Vendor also needs to ensure that the submitted GST registration certificate should be in active status durin g the entire contract period.
- **4.2.5** Supplier/Vendor has to issue Invoice/Debit Note/Credit Note indicating HSN/SAC code, Description, Value, Rate, applicable tax and oth er particulars in compliance with the provisions of relevant GST Act and Rules made thereunder.
- **4.2.6** Supplier/Vendor has to submit GST compliant invoice within the due date of invoice as per GST Law. In case of delay, BHEL reserves the right of denial of GST payment if there occurs any hardship to BHEL in claiming the input thereof. In case of goods, Supplier/Vendor has to provide scan copy of invoice & GR/LR/RR to BHEL before movement of goods starts to enable BHEL to meet its GST related compliances. Special care should be taken in case of month end transactions.
- **4.2.7** Supplier/Vendor has to ensure that invoice in respect of such se rvices which have been provided/completed on or before end of the m onth should not bear the date later than last working day of the month in which services are performed.
- **4.2.8** Subject to other provisions of the contract, GST amount claimed in the invoice shall be released on fulfilment of all the following conditions by the Supplier/Vendor:
 - a) Supply of goods and/or services have been received by BHEL.
 - b) Original Tax Invoice has been submitted to BHEL.
 - c) Supplier/Vendor has submitted all the documents required for processing of bill as per contract/ purchase order/ work order.
 - d) In cases where e-invoicing provision is applicable, Supplier/Vend or is required to submit invoice in compliance with e-invoicing provisions of GST Act and Rules made thereunder.
 - e) Supplier/Vendor has filed all the relevant GST return (e.g. GSTR-1, GSTR-3B, etc.) pertaining to the invoice submitted and submit

- the proof of such return along with immediate subsequent invoic e. In case of final invoice/ bill, contractor has to submit proof of s uch return within fifteen days from the due date of relevant return.
- f) Respective invoice has appeared in BHEL's GSTR 2A for the month corresponding to the month of invoice and in GSTR-2B of the month in which such invoices has been reported by the contract or along with status of ITC availability as "YES" in GSTR-2B. Alter natively, BG of appropriate value may be furnished which shall be valid at least one month beyond the due date of confirmation of relevant payment of GST on GSTN portal or sufficient security is available to adjust the financial impact in case of any default by the Supplier/Vendor.

Supplier/Vendor has to submit an undertaking confirming the payment of all due GST in respect of invoices pertaining to BHEL.

- **4.2.9** Any financial loss arises to BHEL on account of failure or delay in submission of any document as per contract/purchase order/work order at the time of submission of Tax invoice to BHEL, shall be deducted from Supplier/Vendor's bill or otherwise as deemed fit.
- **4.2.10** TDS as applicable under GST law shall be deducted from Suppli er/Vendor's bill.
- **4.2.11** Supplier/Vendor shall comply with the provisions of e-way bill wherever applicable. Further wherever provisions of GST Act permits, all the e-way bills, road permits etc. required for transportation of goods needs to be arranged by the contractor.
- **4.2.12** Supplier/Vendor shall be solely responsible for discharging his GST liability according to the provisions of GST Law and BHEL will not entertain any claim of GST/interest/penalty or any other liability on acc ount of failure of Supplier/Vendor in complying the provisions of GST L aw or discharging the GST liability in a manner laid down thereunder.
- **4.2.13** In case declaration of any invoice is delayed by the vendor in his GST return or any invoice is subsequently amended/altered/delete d on GSTN portal which results in any adverse financial implication on BHEL, the financial impact thereof including interest/penalty shall be r ecovered from the Supplier/Vendor's due payment.

Designated Engineer (to be nominated by BHEL for settlement of disputes arising out of the contract) who within 60 days after being requested shall give written notice of his decision to the contractor. Save as hereinafter provided, such decision in respect of every matter so referred shall forthwith be given effect to by the Supplier/Vendor who shall proceed with the work with all due diligence, whether he or BHEL desires to resolve the dispute as hereinafter provided or not.

If after the Designated Engineer has given written notice of this decision to the party and no intention to pursue the dispute has been communicated to him by the affected party within 30 days from the receipt of such notice, the said decision shall become final and bindin g on the parties. In the event the Supplier/Vendor being dissatisfied with any such decision or if amicable settlement cannot be reached then all such disputed issues shall be resolved through conciliation in

terms of the BHEL Conciliation Scheme 2018 as per Clause 23.1

23.1 Conciliation:

Any dispute, difference or controversy of whatever nature howsoever a rising under or out of or in relation to this Agreement (including its inte rpretation) between the Parties, and so notified in writing by either Party to the other Party (the "Dispute") shall, in the first instance, be attempted to be resolved amicably in accordance with the conciliation procedure as per BHEL Conciliation Scheme 2018. The proceedings of Conciliation shall broadly be governed by PartIII of the Arbitration and Conciliation Act 1996 or any statutory modification thereof and as provide d in - "Procedure for conduct of conciliation proceedings" (as available in www.bhel.com)).

Note: Ministry of Finance has issued OM reference No. 1/2/24 dated 0 3.06.2024 regarding "Guidelines for Arbitration and Mediation in Contracts of Domestic Public Procurement. In the said OM it has been recommended that Government departments/

Entities/agencies are to encourage mediation under the Mediation Act. 2023. The said Act has not yet been notified by the Government. Ther efore, the clause "Settlement of Disputes" shall be modified accordingly as and when the Mediation Act 2023 gets notified.

23.2 ARBITRATION:

- 23.2.1 Except as provided elsewhere in this Contract, in case Parties a re unable to reach amicable settlement (whether by Conciliation to be conducted as provided in Clause 21.1 herein above or othe rwise) in respect of any dispute or difference; arising out of the formation, breach, termination, validity or execution of the Contract; or, the respective rights and liabilities of the Parties; or, in relation to interpretation of any provision of the Contract; or. in any manner touching upon the Contract (hereinafter referred to as the 'Dispute'), then, either Party may, refer the disputes to Arbitra I Institution (to be identified by the contract issuing agency (eg. "IIAC" (India International Arbitration Centre) for Delhi/NCR office s) and such dispute to be adjudicated by Sole Arbitrator appoint ed in accordance with the Rules of said Arbitral Institution.
- 23.2.2 A party willing to commence arbitration proceeding shall invok e Arbitration Clause by giving notice to the other party in terms of section 21 of the Arbitration & Conciliation Act, 1996 (hereinaf ter referred to as the 'Notice') before referring the matter to arbitral institution. The Notice shall be addressed to the Head of the Region, Power Sector/ Unit, BHEL, executing the Contract and shall contain the particulars of all claims to be referred to arbitration with sufficient detail and shall also indicate the monetary amount of such claim including interest, if any.
- 23.2.3 After expiry of 30 days from the date of receipt of aforesaid notice, the party invoking the Arbitration shall submit that disput e to the Arbitral Institutions New Delhi and that dispute shall be adjudicated in accordance with their respective Arbitration Rules . The matter shall be adjudicated by a Sole Arbitrator who shall n ecessarily be a Retd Judge having considerable experience in commercial matters to be appointed/nominated by the respective institution. The cost/expenses pertaining to the said Arbitration shall also be governed in accordance with the Rules of the respective Arbitral Institution. The decision of the party invoking the Arbitration for reference of dispute to a specific Arbitral institution

for adjudication of that dispute shall be final and binding on both the parties and shall not be subject to any change thereafter. Th e institution once selected at the time of invocation of dispute sh all remain unchanged.

- 23.2.4 The fee and expenses shall be borne by the parties as per the Arbitral Institutional rules.
- 23.2.5 The Arbitration proceedings shall be in English language and the seat and venue of Arbitration shall be (to be identified by the contract issuing agency) New Delhi
- 23.2.6 Subject to the above, the provisions of Arbitration & Conciliati on Act 1996 and any amendment thereof shall be applicable. All matters relating to this Contract and arising out of invocation of Arbitration clause are subject to the exclusive jurisdiction of the Court(s) situated at New Delhi.
- 23.2.7 Notwithstanding any reference to the Designated Engineer or C onciliation or Arbitration herein, a. the parties shall continue to p erform their respective obligations under the Contract unless th ey otherwise agree. Settlement of Dispute clause cannot be invoked by the Contractor, if the Contract has been mutually closed or 'No Demand Certificate' has been furnished by the Contractor or any Settlement Agreement has been signed between the Employer and the Contractor.
 - 23.2.8 It is agreed that Mechanism of resolution of disputes through a rbitration shall be available only in the cases where the value of the dispute is less than Rs. 10 Crores.
- 23.2.9 In case the disputed amount (Claim, Counter claim including . i nterest is Rs. 10 crores and above, the parties shall be within th eir rights to take recourse to remedies other than Arbitration, as may be available to them under the applicable laws after prior intimation to the other party. Subject to the aforesaid conditions, provisions of the Arbitration and Conciliation Act, 1996 and any s tatutory modifications or re-enactment thereof as amended from time to time, shall apply to the arbitration proceedings under this clause.

Disputes having cumulative value of less than 10 crores shall be resolved through arbitration and any additional dispute shall be adjudicated by the court of competent jurisdiction.

- **25.1** "Force Majeure" shall mean circumstance which is:
 - a) beyond control of either of the parties to contract,
 - b) either of the parties could not reasonably have provided against the event before entering into the contract,
 - having arisen, either of the parties could not reasonably have avoided or overcome, and
 - d) is not substantially attributable to either of the parties And Prevents the performance of the contract, Such circumstances in clude but shall not be limited to:
 - i. War, hostilities, invasion, act of foreign enemies.
 - ii. Rebellion, terrorism, revolution, insurrection, military or usur ped power, or civil war. iii. Riot, commotion or disorder by pe rsons other than the contractor's personnel and other employ ees of the contractor and sub-contractors. iv. Strike or lockou t not solely involving the contractor's personnel and other employees of the contractor and sub-contractors.
 - iii. Encountering munitions of war, explosive materials, ionizing radiation or contamination by radio-activity, except as may be attributable to the contractor's use of such munitions, ex plosives, radiation or radio- activity. vi. Natural catastrophes such as earthquake, tsunami, volcanic activity, hurricane or typhoon, flood, fire, cyclones etc.
 - iv. Epidemic, pandemic etc.
- 25.2 The following events are explicitly excluded from Force Majeure a nd are solely the responsibilities of the non-performing party: a) an y strike, work-to-rule action, go-slow or similar labour difficulty (b) I ate delivery of equipment or material (unless caused by Force Majeure event) and (c) economic hardship.
- 25.3 If either party is prevented, hindered or delayed from or in performing any of its obligations under the Contract by an event of Force Majeure, then it shall notify the other in writing of the occurrence of such event and the circumstances thereof within 15 (fifteen) days after the occurrence of such event.
- 25.4 The party who has given such notice shall be excused from the performance or punctual performance of its obligations under the Contract for so long as the relevant event of Force Majeure continues and to the extent that such party's performance is prevented, hindered or delayed. The Time for Completion shall be extended by a period of time equal to period of delay caused due to such Force Majeure event.
- 25.5 Delay or non-performance by either party hereto caused by the occurrence of any event of Force Majeure shall not
 - i) Constitute a default or breach of the Contract.
 - ii) Give rise to any claim for damages or additional cost expense o ccasioned thereby, if and to the extent that such delay or non-perf ormance is caused by the occurrence of an event of Force Majeure.
- 25.6 BHEL at its discretion may consider short closure of contract after 1 year of imposition of Force Majeure in line with extant g uidelines. In any case, Supplier/Vendor cannot consider deeme d short-closure after 1 year of imposition of Force Majeure.
