3.1.3	Further for sustenance of these activities, safety culture needs to be built up by training of personnel and hand holding for a longer period.
3.2	BROAD SCOPE OF WORK
3.2.1	Major areas under purview of the work of the agency at Sagardighi site are Boiler, Turbine, ACC, Chimney, Electrical Systems, AHP, CHP, Misc BOP areas, FGD . However, based on site requirement / criticality and as per instruction of BHEL site engineer / HSE Dept. the agency may have to deploy their manpower in other areas also . The agency has to assess the gaps in execution pertaining to safety and advise BHEL site management on relevant improvement measures to be adopted and provide guidance on implementation.
3.2.2	Develop framework for safety improvement program

3.2.3	Deployment of safety specialists at site to drive safety initiatives which include developing & monitoring the implementation of comprehensive construction safety management at site.
3.2.4	Agency will use & train the safety manpower deployed by various agencies of BHEL at site to start & manage all safety initiatives at site via use of technology.
3.2.5	Agency will enable BHEL to strengthen the safety management systems at site and improve the safety culture at site.
3.2.6	Train BHEL personnel and those working with erection agencies through classroom and on-site training, for building capability for adopting proactive measures to prevent incidents. Conduct induction training for all persons joining the site including visitors. Training module shall be submitted to BHEL for review and approval.
3.2.7	Conducting regular audits at site for identifying weak areas and suggest corrective measures.
3.2.8	Administer/manage Construction Safety at the site
3.2.9	Evaluate the gaps in experience and capability of man-power deployed and provide support to ensure capabilities required for critical work by conducting Capacity building programs for safety supervisors of BHEL/Sub-contractor.
3.3	ROLES & RESPONSIBILITIES
3.3.1	Agency shall strengthen the safety management system by safety specialist deployment for strengthening high risk activities, competency building program through Contractor Incubation Centre (CIC), deploying safety engineers to monitor and facilitate safety implementation.
3.3.2	Agency shall conduct safety improvement programs by well-defined Management Information System (MIS). MIS should include lead and lag indicators, evaluating the progress of metrics, conducting review meetings, actions for continual improvement etc.
3.3.3	Organizing motivational & safety promotional activities like street plays, campaigns & safety communications shall be done by the agency.
3.3.4	Organizing HSE promotion activities like Tool Box talk, pep talks, Monthly HSE celebration, Periodic HSE review, putting up educative posters and banners, organizing house-keeping drive, walk-through by top officials, periodic health camps etc. Agency shall submit plans for tool Box Talks, Pep Talks, HSE Celebrations, HSE Review, House Keeping, safety walk-throughs, health camps and layouts for installation of posters/ banners etc.
3.3.5	Promotion of Safety culture at site by means of survey, trainings/workshops for management personnel as well as supervisory personnel of BHEL and its associates.
3.3.6	In contractor incubation centre (CIC), contractor selection, competency building-first time & periodical, contractor safety performance evaluation and intervention (through safety park, safety campaigns & safety passports) shall be done by the agency. Skill based training program should be done through CIC.
3.3.7	Job Specific Training: Agency shall regularly organize job specific training programs for workers involved in hazardous activities like height, Hot work, Radiography, Confined Space, Deep Excavation, Heavy Lifting, Chemical handling, Handling of Electrical and Electronic circuits including high voltage and also in hazardous condition like uneven mud road, water accumulation, strong wind etc. Training calendar shall be submitted to individual BHEL Site in well advance.

3.3.8	Imparting HSE related skill training (in Hindi or any language followed by majority of workers) with certification (like competency certification for Scaffolders, Scaffolding supervisor, Scaffolding inspectors, Riggers, Operators etc.) and organizing mock drills on rescue, fire, first-aid, trauma and emergency response. A competency certificate to be issued to each participant by the agency. Agency shall submit skilled certificate training calendar to BHEL.
3.3.9	Co-coordinating with Medical Centre for Pre-job and regular health check-up of personnel.
3.3.10	HSE Competency evaluation of skilled workmen to be performed before engagement in the job and also during execution whenever required. Documents like H eight-pass to be issued by the agency. Competency evaluation shall be done for skilled/semiskilled manpower before induction training. Plan and Procedure for competency evaluation shall be submitted to BHEL
3.3.11	Compliance with all HSE, occupational health, safety & environment rules and codes of the BHEL/owner, relevant provisions of applicable laws pertaining to the HSE of workmen, employees, plant and equipment as may be prescribed from time to time. In case of any non-conformity between statutory requirement and HSE Rules of the BHEL/owner referred above, the later shall be applicable unless the statutory provisions are more stringent.
3.3.12	Compliance with HSE (Health, Safety & Environment) requirements/procedure/practices of BHEL at site, as per Site HSE Plan / HSE Management system. Agency will also ensure that applicable Operational Control Procedures (OCPs) in respective areas are being followed by BHEL/Sub- contractor.
3.3.13	Support for maintenance, generation and retention of all documents and records pertaining to HSE as per BHEL HSE Management System.
3.3.14	Assist BHEL in coordinating with Local authority/ statutory authority/local facilities like hospitals, fire stations, disaster management agencies etc. as and when required.
3.3.15	Carrying out all routine works as specified in the Factories Act 1948/BOCW Act 1996 and its rules and as per other statutes applicable for construction sites.
3.3.16	Investigation of accidents including near miss, as per requirement of site management
3.3.17	Incident management and documentation for reporting and record including encouraging reporting of near misses besides other incidents, recording and analyzing them, planning & implementing corrective actions.
3.3.18	Administering First-aid or CPR to victim by agency's manpower expeditiously and take further course of action including taking victim to Medical Centre. In case of fire and other emergency, they will operate the fire extinguishers, if called for and help take appropriate corrective and preventive measures like fighting fire or evacuation of people or materials etc.
3.3.19	Inspection of all PPEs, safety equipment, T&Ps etc. and maintaining record. Agency shall submit the inspection plan and procedure to BHEL. Agency shall also coordinate with third Party competent persons for T&P certification as applicable.
3.3.20	Systematically conducting HSE inspection on daily basis, Recording and analysis of observations, categorization, reporting and finally following up closure of observations offline & online including observation raised by Customer. In addition , co-ordination of Internal/External audit. Preparation of weekly exception report and submitting to BHEL.

3.3.21	Close monitoring/inspection of all works carried out at height including lifting/ placement/erection of heavy structure/ equipment/ material at height and implementing control measures for safe execution of the same.
3.3.22	Drawing up monthly HSE activity plan in line with HSE plan and strictly following the same. The agency shall prepare supplementary documents of the HSE plan (including auxiliary documents), if necessary and suggest relevant changes of the plan for improvement. But this shall require approval of BHEL.
3.3.23	Generation of periodic report in prescribed format and sharing the same with competent authorities.
3.3.24	To Ensure risk assessment / hazard spotting exercises are carried out on regular basis Preparation/monitoring/approval of Permit-to-work, HIRA & Method statement, JSA, lifting plan and development of auxiliary documents/ formats related to HSE plan. The agency personnel shall sign the documents on behalf of BHEL. Issue, renewal, closing and extension of permit on behalf of BHEL Safety for concerned site activities. Random checking of all other PTW on sample basis will be done by the agency.
3.3.25	Coordinating along with BHEL closely with those responsible for Emergency Procedures within the organization to ensure, so far as possible, the prevention of fire and the safe evacuation of employees in emergency situations.
3.3.26	Guidance to agencies for labour welfare measures at site and at labour colony along with conductance of audits of these measures/ areas, monitoring closure of these issues.
3.3.27	Guidance to agencies in designing and implementation of appropriate scaffolding conforming to codes, imparting training and guidance to scaffolders, scaffolding supervisors and certification of scaffolding Supervisors and inspectors. Critical scaffoldings to be certified by the agency's scaffolding inspector by signing the scaffolding tag. Random checking of all other scaffoldings on sample basis will be done by the agency. Temporary platforms, walkways & fixtures used at sites shall also be part of scaffolding, for which regular inspection shall be carried out and corrective measures suggested.
3.3.28	Guidance to agencies in designing and implementation of Lift Plan, imparting training, certification and guidance to riggers, rigging foreman, crane operators and signalman. Inspection before Critical and ODC Lift. The approval of lifting plan, riggers, signalman, operators of T&Ps to be accorded by the agency's person. Collection and monitoring of T&P certification data centrally and issue of alert for renewal of certification.
3.3.29	Inspection of Excavation and guiding and implementing control measures for safe excavation.
3.3.30	Inspection of electrical installation and booths and coordination & implementation of statutory requirements as per acts and rules. Site specific LOTO system (both electrical and non-electrical) shall be developed by agency and managed during various stages of commissioning activities.
3.3.31	Daily Safety Clearance shall be given by the agency along with implementation of necessary PTW system.
3.3.32	All documents/ data including all presentations created/ used for this project shall be handed over to BHEL for future reference in soft form.
3.3.33	Bidder shall provide necessary support services to BHEL site management in preparation for ISO audits/ HSE activities. Inspection documents/ results shall be retained/stored by bidder in such a manner that the same can be produced during ISO/ HSE audits at site.

3.3.34	All roles and responsibilities defined in this clause 3.3 shall be discharged by the deployed HSE manpower of bidder.
4.0	SITE VISIT
4.1	The bidder may visit Sagardighi site, to acquaint themselves with the conditions prevailing at site and in & around the plant premises, together with all statutory, obligatory, mandatory requirements of various authorities before submission of bid.
5.0	SITE FACILITIES
5.1	ACCOMMODATION
5.1.1	Furnished Bachelor accommodation (single room basis) with free electricity and water supply, along with Mess facilities at one point shall be provided by BHEL free of any charges. However, food will be available on chargeable basis, either in BHEL mess or otherwise.
5.2	LOCAL CONVEYANCE
5.2.1	Local conveyance, as required, for to-and-fro movement between site and living accommodation shall be provided by BHEL on sharing basis, free of any charges.
5.3	SITE OFFICE
5.3.1	Reasonable office space for proper functioning of the deployed safety personnel will be provided by BHEL at site, free of any charges. BHEL shall also provide office furniture as per availability at site. Other infrastructure such as training room, training material, Projector, Video conferencing facilities etc. will be provided by BHEL free of cost, as per availability at site.
5.3.2	The bidder shall arrange unlimited mobile phone facility, camera and sufficient nos. of Laptop/ Desktop (each safety official should be having separate laptop/desktop) with provision of internet, Printer(s) along with cartridge, stationary etc. for the use of their personnel at site, at their own cost. Bidder shall ensure that safety personnel deployed by it, has smart phones (with 5G internet connectivity) so that they can take photos/videos promptly and also communicate immediately as per requirement of BHEL.
5.4	MISCELLANEOUS
5.4.1	The bidder has to arrange for medical facilities and necessary insurance facilities for his Safety Personnel posted at site at their own cost.
5.4.2	Bidder shall also nominate one of their senior personnel as site-in-charge for all contractual dealings/payment purpose etc. for the site and power of attorney shall be issued in his name.
5.4.3	Local conveyance during mobilization of manpower will be arranged by BHEL. It will be limited to nearest airport/ railway station as the case may be.
6.0	SPECIAL CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT

6.1	All data/findings obtained from this work shall become the property of BHEL. This cannot be published/utilized by bidder/bidder's representative without written permission of competent authority of BHEL. Safety personnel shall keep all business and technical /safety information/procedures received from the other Party in connection with this Agreement confidential and treat it with the same degree of care as their own similar trade or business secrets and not make it available to third parties, unless permitted in writing by competent authority of BHEL-PSER.
6.2	Sub-letting of jobs within the agreed scope of work, in any way is not permitted.
6.3	Bidder shall make available suitable personnel (personnel, other than those posted at site) for discussions/ interactions with BHEL, Customer and consultants, vendors / sub-contractors wherever need arises. Senior level personnel of bidder will visit sites periodically (at least once in a quarter) to ascertain the quality of jobs performed by their site personnel. Such visits of senior personnel will be free of any additional charges to BHEL.
6.4	BHEL reserves the right to make final decisions on rejections of the personnel deployed by the bidder in case of unsatisfactory performance and such decisions shall be binding on bidder and become conclusive.
6.5	BHEL reserves the right to terminate the above contract at any point of time without assigning any reason, upon giving 30 days' notice to the bidder. BHEL reserves the right to short close the contract/reduce the deployed safety personnel upon giving 30 days' notice, depending upon requirement. In such cases, the payment shall be made for the completed months and part thereof on pro-rata basis, based upon approved rate of contract and no other compensation will be granted by BHEL.

6.6	<p>Bidder's personnel posted at site shall not move outstation without the prior permission of Site in Charge of BHEL. For any exigencies during execution of the contract or against requirement of services at any location other than place of normal work, if desired and instructed by the Sagardighi site Project Director or Head-HSE-PSER, the bidder shall have to provide safety services by deputing its personnel at desired location. Expenses incurred by the visiting personnel in this regard will be reimbursed in the following manner.</p> <p>a) Travel expenses at actual shall be paid (limited to 2AC to and from train fare) with reservation / supplementary charges etc. subject to furnishing of details regarding ticket numbers, journey details, amount of fare etc. and submission of proof thereof.</p> <p>b) Local conveyance charges (Actual bus / cycle rickshaw/auto rickshaw/ taxi fare for local journeys at out station) as permitted by the BHEL Engineer.</p> <p>c) Cumulative Journey allowances & Daily allowances @ Rs.500/- per day</p> <p>d) Outstation lodging charges @ maximum Rs. 1500/- per day (Applicable with written instruction of BHEL Sagardighi site Project Director & on submission of lodging bill thereof)</p> <p>e) Postal / telegraphic / telephones charges, if any, subject to production of proof of having incurred such expenditure only in relation to the official work.</p> <p>The movement of Bidder's Safety Personnel outside site shall be subject to the prior approval of BHEL Sagardighi site Project Director or HOD-HSE/PSER, and the same shall be submitted with their bills/invoice for payment.</p>
6.7	<p>Bidder has to follow the holidays at site as per BHEL site holidays which may vary from site to site. Working hours and timing shall be as per BHEL site practice. However, work may continue round the clock including Sundays and holidays and safety officer / officers shall have to be at site along with BHEL personnel subject to requirement, for which no extra payment will be made. No compensatory off/leave will be granted in case of such working on Sundays/holidays/extended hours.</p>
6.8	<p>Casual leave will be admissible for personnel posted at any site on full time basis subject to maximum 10 days in a year or on pro rata basis. In addition, Sundays and other holidays observed by BHEL site will also be admissible. However, in case of exigencies, work may continue on Sunday / Holiday and bidder has to provide HSE manpower support for the same. BHEL shall not pay during the period of earned leave/sick leave to be availed by bidder's personnel. No further payment shall be made against deployment of unacceptable Safety Officer. Replacement of such persons will have to be arranged by bidder within 20 days.
7.0	MINIMUM QUALIFICATION OF SAFETY PERSONNEL

Also, if required by BHEL, verification of certificates of selected candidates from concerned institutions/board will be carried out by the agency at the cost of the agency, before their deployment at site. No claim for reimbursement in this regard will be entertained. Post deployment approval shall not be permitted nor any deviation accepted. The candidate shall be required to produce all original certificates at the site/ PSER HQ HSE Deptt. for verification. Any mismatch will render the approval rejected.</p>

8.1.2	<p>Each of these HSE personnel shall be deployed in specific area of erection and shall co-ordinate with all sub-agencies for facilitating implementation of HSE system. The HSE officers of various agencies of BHEL shall report to the Safety Manager deployed by the successful bidder. The HSE team shall report to BHEL site HSE Head or Site Project Director, as the case may be.</p>														

8.1.3	The agency shall deploy a team of Qualified HSE professionals as advised by BHEL from time to time in synchronization with the project requirement. Each of this category of manpower indicated above to be deployed by contractor within 15 days of written intimation from BHEL site.
8.1.4	The above-mentioned duration is tentative and actual man-month deployed may vary to any extent. The quoted Unit rate shall remain firm throughout contract duration including extensions if any, irrespective of any variation in quantities.
9.0	MOBILISATION
9.1	Bidder shall mobilize the manpower and start the work at site within 15 days from the date of written Intimation from site. Failure to mobilize the manpower within the mobilization period indicated above shall attract LD/Penalty indicated in LD clause. Start date of Work: Work start date will be certified by BHEL Sagardighi Site Project Director.
10.0	COMPLETION PERIOD OF CONTRACT
10.1	The contract period for the above scope of contract shall be valid for a period of 12 (Twelve months) from the date of Start of Work at Site.
10.2	The contract period may be extended further for a period of 12 (Twelve months) at the same rate, terms and conditions in phases of 03 (three) months each, at the sole discretion of BHEL as per site requirement.
10.3	BHEL reserves the right to terminate the service contract at any time, in case the service provided by the agency is found unsatisfactory.
11.0	EXTENSION OF TIME FOR COMPLETION/CONTRACT PERIOD
11.1	If the completion of work as detailed in the scope of work gets delayed beyond the contract/completion period, the successful bidder shall request for an extension of the contract and BHEL at its discretion may extend the contract.
11.2	Based on the reviews jointly signed, the works balance at the end of original contract period less the backlog attributable to the successful bidder shall be quantified, and the number of months of 'Time extension' required for completion of the same shall be jointly worked out. Within this period of 'Time extension', the successful bidder is bound to complete the portion of backlog attributable to the successful bidder. Any further 'Time extension' or 'Time extensions' at the end of the previous extension shall be worked out similarly.
11.3	However, if any 'Time extension' is granted to successful bidder to facilitate continuation of work & completion of contract, due to backlog attributable to successful bidder alone, then it shall be without prejudice to the rights of BHEL to impose penalty/ LD for the delays attributable to successful bidder, in addition to any other actions BHEL may take at the risk and cost of successful bidder.
11.4	A joint programme shall be drawn for the balance amount of work to be completed during the period of 'Time Extension', along with matching resources to be deployed by the successful bidder as per specified format. Review of the programme and record of shortfall shall be done.

11.6	At the end of total work completion as certified by BHEL engineer, and upon analysis of the total delay, the portion of time extensions attributable to (i) Successful bidder, (ii) Force majeure conditions, and (iii) BHEL, shall be worked out and shall be considered to be exhausted in the same order. The total period of time extensions shall be the sum of (i), (ii) and (iii) above and shall be equal to period between the scheduled date of completion and the actual date of completion of contract. 13.1	The bidder shall quote their total price in price schedule of GeM. Evaluation shall be in the form and manner prescribed in GeM. Break up of total quoted price in GeM shall be as per Schedule-2.
14.0	TERMS OF PAYMENT & PAYING AUTHORITY
14.1	Successful bidder shall submit RA bill at the end of each month as per billing break-up of the tender and in line with currency matrix. Bill shall be accompanied with list of services rendered during the month and attendance sheet (certified by BHEL Engr.).
14.2	Progressive payment shall be made by BHEL against bidder's RA bill, GST complied Invoice complete & correct in all respect accompanied by BHEL engineer's certified/ measurement sheet, jointly signed; requisite statutory certificates, certified by BHEL; within 45 days of submission of the bill.
14.3	However, no extra payment / interest charges shall be made in the event of deferment in payment.

However in case if any condition specified in General Terms and Conditions/सामान्य नियम और शर्तें is contradicted by the conditions stipulated in Service Level Agreement, then it will over ride the conditions in the General Terms and Conditions.

In terms of GeM GTC clause 26 regarding Restrictions on procurement from a bidder of a country which shares a land border with India, any bidder from a country which shares a land border with India will be eligible to bid in this tender only if the bidder is registered with the Competent Authority. While participating in bid, Bidder has to undertake compliance of this and any false declaration and non-compliance of this would be a ground for immediate termination of the contract and further legal action in accordance with the laws./जेम की सामान्य शर्तों के खंड 26 के संदर्भ में भारत के साथ भूमि सीमा साझा करने वाले देश के बिडर से खरीद पर प्रतिबंध के संबंध में भारत के साथ भूमि सीमा साझा करने वाले देश का कोई भी बिडर इस निविदा में बिड देने के लिए तभी पात्र होगा जब वह बिड देने वाला सक्षम प्राधिकारी के पास पंजीकृत हो। बिड में भाग लेते समय बिडर को इसका अनुपालन करना होगा और कोई भी गलत घोषणा किए जाने व इसका अनुपालन न करने पर अनुबंध को तत्काल समाप्त करने और कानून के अनुसार आगे की कानूनी कार्रवाई का आधार होगा।
