- 1. Experience Criteria: In respect of the filter applied for experience criteria, the Bidder or its OEM of the product offered in the bid {themselves or through reseller(s)} should have regularly, manufactured and supplied same or similar Category Products to any Central / State Govt Organization / PSU for number of Financial years as indicated above in the bid document before the bid opening date. 19. SETTLEMENT OF DISPUTES: If any dispute or difference of any kind whatsoever shall arise between BHEL and the Supplier/Vendor, arising out of the contract for the performance of the work whether during the progres of contract termination, abandonment or breach of the contract, it shall in the first place referred to Designated Engineer for amicable resolution by the parties. Designated Engineer (to be nominated by BHEL for settle ment of disputes arising out of the contract) who within 60 days after being requested shall give written notic of his decision to the contractor. Save as hereinafter provided, such decision in respect of every matter so referred shall forthwith be given effect to by the Supplier/Vendor who shall proceed with the work with all due digence, whether he or BHEL desires to resolve the dispute as hereinafter provided or not.

If after the Designated Engineer has given written notice of this decision to the party and no intention to pursi e the dispute has been communicated to him by the affected party within 30 days from the receipt of such no ice, the said decision shall become final and binding on the parties. In the event the Supplier/Vendor being dis atisfied with any such decision or if amicable settlement cannot be reached then all such disputed issues shal be resolved through conciliation in terms of the BHEL Conciliation Scheme 2018.20. CONCILIATION CLAUSE:Ar y dispute, difference or controversy of whatever nature howsoever arising under or out of or in relation to this Agreement (including its interpretation) between the Parties, and so notified in writing by either Party to the c her Party (the "Dispute") shall, in the first instance, be attempted to be resolved amicably in accordance with the conciliation procedure as per BHEL Conciliation Scheme 2018. The proceedings of Conciliation shall broad y be governed by Part-III of the Arbitration and Conciliation Act 1996 or any statutory modification thereof and as provided in - "Procedure for conduct of conciliation proceedings" (as available in www.bhel.com).

Note: Ministry of Finance has issued OM reference No. 1/2/24 dated 03.06.2024 regarding "Guidelines for Arbi ration and Mediation in Contracts of Domestic Public Procurement. In the said OM it has been recommended t hat Government departments/ Entities/agencies are to encourage mediation under the Mediation Act. 2023. T he said Act has not yet been notified by the Government. Therefore, the clause "Settlement of Disputes" shall be modified accordingly as and when the Mediation Act 2023 gets notified.

21. ARBITRATION CLAUSE:

Except as provided elsewhere in this Contract, in case Parties are unable to reach amicable settlement (wheth er by Conciliation to be conducted as provided in Clause herein above or otherwise) in respect of any dispute or difference; arising out of the formation, breach, termination, validity or execution of the Contract; or, the repective rights and liabilities of the Parties; or, in relation to interpretation of any provision of the Contract; or, n any manner touching upon the Contract (hereinafter referred to as the 'Dispute'), then, either Party may, re er the disputes to Delhi International Arbitration Centre (DIAC) and such dispute to be adjudicated by Sole Ark itrator appointed in accordance with the Rules of said Arbitral Institution.

A party willing to commence arbitration proceeding shall invoke Arbitration Clause by giving notice to the other party in terms of section 21 of the Arbitration & Conciliation Act, 1996 (hereinafter referred to as the 'Notice before referring the matter to arbitral institution. The Notice shall be addressed to the Head of the Region, Power Sector/ Unit, BHEL, executing the Contract and shall contain the particulars of all claims to be referred to rbitration with sufficient detail and shall also indicate the monetary amount of such claim including interest, if any.

After expiry of 30 days from the date of receipt of aforesaid notice, the party invoking the Arbitration shall submit that dispute to the Delhi International Arbitration Centre (DIAC) and that dispute shall be adjudicated in accordance with their respective Arbitration Rules. The matter shall be adjudicated by a Sole Arbitrator who shall necessarily be a Retd Judge having considerable experience in commercial matters to be appointed/nominated by the respective institution. The cost/expenses pertaining to the said Arbitration shall also be governed in accordance with the Rules of the respective Arbitral Institution. The decision of the party invoking the Arbitration for reference of dispute to a specific Arbitral institution for adjudication of that dispute shall be final and binding on both the parties and shall not be subject to any change thereafter. The institution once selected at the time of invocation of dispute shall remain unchanged.

The fee and expenses shall be borne by the parties as per the Arbitral Institutional rules.

The Arbitration proceedings shall be in English language and the seat and venue of Arbitration shall be Haridv ar.

Subject to the above, the provisions of Arbitration & Conciliation Act 1996 and any amendment thereof shall ke applicable. All matters relating to this Contract and arising out of invocation of Arbitration clause are subject to the exclusive jurisdiction of the Court(s) situated at Haridwar.

Notwithstanding any reference to the Designated Engineer or Conciliation or Arbitration herein, a. the parties hall continue to perform their respective obligations under the Contract unless they otherwise agree. Settlement of Dispute clause cannot be invoked by the Contractor, if the Contract has been mutually closed or 'No Der and Certificate' has been furnished by the Contractor or any Settlement Agreement has been signed between the Employer and the Contractor.

It is agreed that Mechanism of resolution of disputes through arbitration shall be available only in the cases w here the value of the dispute is less than Rs. 10 Crores.

In case the disputed amount Claim, Counter claim including interest is Rs. 10 crores and above, the parties sh II be within their rights to take recourse to remedies other than Arbitration, as may be available to them unde the applicable laws after prior intimation to the other party. Subject to the aforesaid conditions, provisions of the Arbitration and Conciliation Act, 1996 and any statutory modifications or re-enactment thereof as amended from time to time, shall apply to the arbitration proceedings under this clause.

In case, multiple arbitrations are invoked (whether sub-judice or arbitral award passed) by any party to under this contract, then the cumulative value of claims (including interest claimed or awarded) in all such arbitratic ns shall be taken in account while arriving at the total claim in dispute for the subject contract for the purpose of above clause. Disputes having cumulative value of less than 10 crores shall be resolved through arbitration and any additional dispute shall be adjudicated by the court of competent jurisdiction.

In case of Contract with Public Sector Enterprise (PSE) or a Government Department, the following shall be ap plicable:

In the event of any dispute or difference relating to the interpretation and application of the provisions of com mercial contract(s) between Central Public Sector Enterprises (CPSEs)/ Port Trusts inter se and also between C PSEs and Government Departments/Organizations (excluding disputes concerning Railways, Income Tax, Cust oms & Excise Departments), such dispute or difference shall be taken up by either party for resolution througl AMRCD (Administrative Mechanism for Resolution of CPSEs Disputes) as mentioned in DPE OM No. 05/0003/2(19-FTS-10937 dated 14-12-2022 as amended from time to time.

22. BREACH OF CONTRACT, REMEDIES AND TERMINATION:

Assignment, transfer, subletting of Contract t by the Supplier/Vendor without BHEL's written permission resulting in termination of Contract or part thereo by BHEL. vii. Non-compliance to any contractual condition or any other default attributable to Supplier/Vendor viii. Any other reason(s) attributable to Vendor towards failure of performance of contract. In case of breach (f contract, BHEL shall have the right to terminate the Purchase Order/ Contract either in whole or in part there of without any compensation to the Supplier/Vendor. ix. Any of the declarations furnished by the contractor at the time of bidding and/ or entering into the contract for supply are found untruthful and such declarations we re of a nature that could have resulted in non-award of contract to the contractor or could expose BHEL and/ c r Owner to adverse consequences, financial or otherwise. x. Supplier/Vendor is convicted of any offence involving corrupt business practices, antinational activities or any such offence that compromises the busines ethics of BHEL, in violation of the Integrity Pact entered into with BHEL has the potential to harm the overall b usiness of BHEL/ Owner.Note- Once BHEL considers that a breach of contract has occurred on the part of Supr ier/Vendor, BHEL shall notify the Supplier/Vendor by way of notice in this regard. Contractor shall be given an opportunity to rectify the reasons causing the breach of contract within a period of 14 days. In case the contract ctor fails to remedy the breach, as mentioned in the notice, to the satisfaction of BHEL, BHEL shall have the ri ht to take recourse to any of the remedial actions available to it under the relevant provisions of contract.

REMEDIES IN CASE OF BREACH OF CONTRACT. i. It is an agreed term of contract that this amount shall be a genuine pre-es imate of damages that BHEL would incur in completion of balance contractual obligation of the contract throu h any other agency and BHEL will not be required to furnish any other evidence to the Supplier/Vendor for the purpose of estimation of damages, vii. In addition to the above, imposition of liquidated damages, debarment termination, de-scoping, short-closure, etc., shall be applied as per provisions of the contract. Note:1) The def aulting Supplier/Vendor shall not be eligible for participation in any of the future enquiries floated by BHEL to omplete the balance work. The defaulting contractor shall mean and include:(a) In case defaulted Supplier/Ve ndor is the Sole Proprietorship Firm, any Sole Proprietorship Firm owned by same Sole Proprietor. (b) In case c efaulted Supplier/Vendor is The Partnership Firm, any firm comprising of same partners/ some of the same pa tners; or sole proprietorship firm owned by any partner(s) as a sole proprietor.

Delay or non-performance by either party hereto caused by the occurrence of any event of Force Majeure shall not. Constitute a default or breach of the Contract.II. Give rise to any claim for damages or additional cost expense occasioned thereby, if and to the extent that such delay or non-performance is caused by the occurrence of an event of Force Majeure. BHEL at its discretion may consider short closure of contract after 1 year of imposition of Force Majeure in line with extant guidelines. In any case, Suppier/Vendor cannot consider deemed short-closure after 1 year of imposition of Force Majeure.
