- 1. Preference to Make In India products (For bids < 200 Crore):Preference shall be given to Class 1 local supplier as defined in public procurement (Preference to Make in India), Order 2017 as amended from time to time and its subsequent Orders/Notifications issued by concerned Nodal Ministry for specific Goods/Products. The minimum local content to qualify as a Class 1 local supplier is denoted in the bid document. 1. Generic

OPTION CLAUSE: The Purchaser reserves the right to increase or decrease the quantity to be ordered up to 25 percent of bid quantity at the time of placement of contract. The purchaser also reserves the right to increase the ordered quantity up to 25% of the contracted quantity during the currency of the contract at the contracted rates. The delivery period of quantity shall commence from the last date of original delivery order and in cases where option clause is exercised during the extended delivery period the additional time shall commence from the last date of extended delivery period. The additional delivery time shall be (Increased quantity ÷ Original quantity) × Original delivery period (in days), subject to minimum of 30 days. If the original delivery period is less than 30 days, the additional time equals the original delivery period. The Purchaser may extend this calculated delivery duration up to the original delivery period while exercising the option clause. Bidders must comply with these terms.

2. Warranty

Warranty period of the supplied products shall be 1 years from the date of final acceptance of goods or after completion of installation, commissioning & testing of goods (if included in the scope of supply), at consignee location. OEM Warranty certificates must be submitted by Successful Bidder at the time of delivery of Goods. The seller should guarantee the rectification of goods in case of any break down during the guarantee period. Seller should have well established Installation, Commissioning, Training, Troubleshooting and Maintenance Service group in INDIA for attending the after sales service. Details of Service Centres near consignee destinations are to be uploaded along with the bid.

- 1. PAYMENT TERM: 80% payment of Supply value shall be made within 45 days for MSE, 60 days for Medium Enterprises and 90 days for Non-MSE from the date of receipt of material at BHEL Haridwar.Balance 20% of S upply value plus 100% of E&C portion of PO value will be paid against E&C certificate issued by BHEL and su bmission of Performance Bank Guarantee (PBG) valid for 15 months (i.e. for Warrantee period + 90 days claim period, from the date of successful E&C at BHEL-Haridwar.) by Supplier from any of the Scheduled Banks for 05% of total PO Value in the prescribed Format.
- 2. ERECTION & COMMISSIONING Errection & Commissioning (E&C) value will include services to be rendere d at BHEL like Installation, job proving, performance tests, training to operators etc. (Whichever is applicable for this case).

The estimated percentage of Errection & commissioning value is: 10 % of total material cost.

- E&C value should be quoted separately by bidders. Only in case where quoted value is less than the value (in %) specified in the NIT or separate E&C values are not mentioned in the offer, value for E&C portion shall be deemed to be considered as the value indicated in NIT & accordingly supply value will be adjusted from that quoted value and balance will be released as I&C payment.
- 3. ERECTION & COMMISSIONING TIME PERIOD: Time period required for E&C: 30 days from the date of first i ntimation by BHEL.4. Reverse Auction shall be applicable in this tender and H1 bidder shall be eliminated as per GeM T&C.
- 5. CHARGES FOR SERVICES AT BHEL HARIDWAR: Prices offered on GeM portal shall be inclusive for complete scope of work, E&C, vendor to demonstrate all the function & features of the item being procured.
- 6. Liquidated Damages for Delay in 'SUPPLY' and 'E&C': For the purpose of Liquidated Damages for delay E&C of the equipment the duration will be reckoned from the date of intimation by BHEL to vendor for readiness of site.

Liquidated Damages on delay in 'Supply' and/or 'E&C' will be applicable to the delays attributed to vendor. L iquidated Damages will be considered separately for 'Supply' and 'E&C'.

- A. For delay in Supply:The rate of penalty for delayed Supply shall be @ 0.5% per week of delay of total PO v alue (Supply + E&C) in supply subject to a maximum of 10% of total PO value (Supply + E&C).
- B. Supply period indicated by bidder should include reasonable time required for approval of drawings and other inputs from BHEL. - 8. Date of Part-1 Opening shall be considered for Cost Evaluation Process.
- 9. The evaluation currency for this tender shall be INR.10. Delivery Basis: FOR BHEL Haridwar Basis.11. PRE-DISPATCH INSPECTION CLAUSE: Not required in this case.
- 12. Delivery Period: Delivery is required by within 90 Days from the date of placement of PO.
- 13. ATTENDING TO ANY COMPLAINT DURING WARRANTEE PERIOD: Vendor will have to ensure deputation of their people for attending to any complaint during Warrantee period within 6 days of intimation. In case of de lay BHEL will be within their rights to get the job completed at the risk and cost of the supplier.
- 14. Purchaser i.e. BHEL, Haridwar reserves the right to cancel this GEM custom Bid Tender Enquiry at any sta ge of Tender Enquiry but, before Purchase Order Placement on GeM Portal. BHEL Haridwar shall not be liable

to any of the bidder/or any other agencies to tell the reason for cancellation of this GEM custom Bid Tender E nquiry. In this matter the decision of Purchase which is BHEL Haridwar shall be final and can't be challenged in any court of Law.

15. PERFORMANCE BANK GUARANTEE (PBG): Performance Bank Guarantee (PBG) valid for 15 months (i.e. for Warrantee period + 90 days claim period) from the date of successful E&C at BHEL-Haridwar from any of the Scheduled Banks of BHEL for 05 % of total PO Value in the prescribed Format in the currency of order. The PB G confirmation charges shall be borne by vendor. This bank guarantee shall have to be submitted before rel ease of last balance payment.

16. Contract Execution Bank Guarantee (CEBG): Not Applicable in this case.

17. EARNEST MONEY DEPOSIT (EMD): EMD shall not be applicable for this tender.

18. SETTLEMENT OF DISPUTES: If any dispute or difference of any kind whatsoever shall arise between BHEL and the Supplier/Vendor, arising out of the contract for the performance of the work whether during the progress of contract termination, abandonment or breach of the contract, it shall in the first place referred to Desi gnated Engineer for amicable resolution by the parties. Designated Engineer (to be nominated by BHEL for s ettlement of disputes arising out of the contract) who within 60 days after being requested shall give written notice of his decision to the contractor. Save as hereinafter provided, such decision in respect of every matter so referred shall forthwith be given effect to by the Supplier/Vendor who shall proceed with the work with all due diligence, whether he or BHEL desires to resolve the dispute as hereinafter provided or not.

If after the Designated Engineer has given written notice of this decision to the party and no intention to purs ue the dispute has been communicated to him by the affected party within 30 days from the receipt of such notice, the said decision shall become final and binding on the parties. In the event the Supplier/Vendor bein g dissatisfied with any such decision or if amicable settlement cannot be reached then all such disputed issu es shall be resolved through conciliation in terms of the BHEL Conciliation Scheme 2018.19. CONCILIATION C LAUSE:Any dispute, difference or controversy of whatever nature howsoever arising under or out of or in relat ion to this Agreement (including its interpretation) between the Parties, and so notified in writing by either Party to the other Party (the "Dispute") shall, in the first instance, be attempted to be resolved amicably in accordance with the conciliation procedure as per BHEL Conciliation Scheme 2018. The proceedings of Conciliation shall broadly be governed by Part-III of the Arbitration and Conciliation Act 1996 or any statutory modification thereof and as provided in - "Procedure for conduct of conciliation proceedings" (as available in www.bhell.com.)

Note: Ministry of Finance has issued OM reference No. 1/2/24 dated 03.06.2024 regarding "Guidelines for Arb itration and Mediation in Contracts of Domestic Public Procurement. In the said OM it has been recommende d that Government departments/ Entities/agencies are to encourage mediation under the Mediation Act. 202 3. The said Act has not yet been notified by the Government. Therefore, the clause "Settlement of Disputes" shall be modified accordingly as and when the Mediation Act 2023 gets notified.

20. ARBITRATION CLAUSE:In case of any dispute arising out of or in connection with this contract, the same s hall be referred to arbitration under Arbitration & Conciliation Act 1996 of a sole arbitrator who shall be appointed by mutual consent of the parties. The seat & venue of arbitration shall be Haridwar. The proceedings shall be conducted in English. The governing law of the contract shall be the substantive Law of India.

21. BREACH OF CONTRACT, REMEDIES AND TERMINATION:

BREACH OF CONTRACT: The following shall amount to breach of contract:

i. Non-supply of material/ non-completion of work by the Supplier/Vendor within scheduled delivery/ completi on period as per contract or as extended from time to time. ii. The Supplier/Vendor fails to perform as per th e activity schedule and there are sufficient reasons even before expiry of the delivery/ completion period to j ustify that supplies shall be inordinately delayed beyond contractual delivery/ completion period. iii. The Sup plier/Vendor delivers equipment/ material not of the contracted quality. iv. The Supplier/Vendor fails to repla ce the defective equipment/ material/ component as per guarantee clause. v. Withdrawal from or abandonm ent of the work by the Supplier/Vendor before completion as per contract. vi. Assignment, transfer, sublettin g of Contract by the Supplier/Vendor without BHEL's written permission resulting in termination of Contract o r part thereof by BHEL. vii. Non-compliance to any contractual condition or any other default attributable to S upplier/Vendor. viii. Any other reason(s) attributable to Vendor towards failure of performance of contract. In case of breach of contract, BHEL shall have the right to terminate the Purchase Order/ Contract either in whol e or in part thereof without any compensation to the Supplier/Vendor. ix. Any of the declarations furnished b y the contractor at the time of bidding and/ or entering into the contract for supply are found untruthful and s uch declarations were of a nature that could have resulted in non-award of contract to the contractor or coul d expose BHEL and/ or Owner to adverse consequences, financial or otherwise. x. Supplier/Vendor is convicte d of any offence involving corrupt business practices, antinational activities or any such offence that compro mises the business ethics of BHEL, in violation of the Integrity Pact entered into with BHEL has the potential t o harm the overall business of BHEL/ Owner.Note- Once BHEL considers that a breach of contract has occurre d on the part of Supplier/Vendor, BHEL shall notify the Supplier/Vendor by way of notice in this regard. Contr actor shall be given an opportunity to rectify the reasons causing the breach of contract within a period of 14 days. In case the contractor fails to remedy the breach, as mentioned in the notice, to the satisfaction of BHE L, BHEL shall have the right to take recourse to any of the remedial actions available to it under the relevant

provisions of contract.

REMEDIES IN CASE OF BREACH OF CONTRACT. i. Wherein the period as stipulated in the notice issued has ex pired and Supplier/Vendor has failed to remedy the breach, BHEL will have the right to terminate the contrac t on the ground of "Breach of Contract" without any further notice to contractor. ii. Upon termination of contr act, BHEL shall be entitled to recover an amount equivalent to 10% of the Contract Value for the damages on account of breach of contract committed by the Supplier/Vendor. This amount shall be recovered by way of e ncashing the security instruments like performance bank guarantee etc available with BHEL against the said contract. In case the value of the security instruments available is less than 10% of the contract value, the ba lance amount shall be recovered from other financial remedies (i.e. available bills of the Supplier/Vendor, ret ention amount, from the money due to the Supplier/Vendor etc. with BHEL) or the other legal remedies shall be pursued. iii. wherever the value of security instruments like performance bank guarantee available with B HEL against the said contract is 10% of the contract value or more, such security instruments to the extent o f 10% contract value will be encashed. In case no security instruments are available or the value of the secur ity instruments available is less than 10% of the contract value, the 10% of the contract value or the balance amount, as the case may be, will be recovered in all or any of the following manners: iv. In case the amount r ecovered under sub clause (a) above is not sufficient to fulfil the amount recoverable then; a demand notice to deposit the balance amount within 30 days shall be issued to Supplier/Vendor. v. If Supplier/Vendor fails t o deposit the balance amount within the period as prescribed in demand notice, following action shall be tak en for recovery of the balance amount: a. from dues available in the form of Bills payable to defaulted Suppli er/Vendor against the same contract. b.
