

## Bid Corrigendum

Following terms and conditions supersede all existing "Buyer added Bid Specific Terms and conditions" given in the bid document or any previous corrigendum. Prospective bidders are advised to bid as per following Terms and Conditions:

### Buyer Added Bid Specific Additional Terms and Conditions

2. **Bidder financial standing:** The bidder should not be under liquidation, court receivership or similar proceedings, should not be bankrupt. Bidder to upload undertaking to this effect with bid.
3. Bidders are advised to check applicable GST on their own before quoting. Buyer will not take any responsibility in this regards. GST reimbursement will be as per actuals or as per applicable rates (whichever is lower), subject to the maximum of quoted GST %.
4. Bidder shall submit the following documents along with their bid for Vendor Code Creation:
  - a. Copy of PAN Card.
  - b. Copy of GSTIN.
  - c. Copy of Cancelled Cheque.
  - d. Copy of EFT Mandate duly certified by Bank.
5. Installation, Commissioning, Testing, Configuration, Training (if any - which ever is applicable as per scope of supply) is to be carried out by OEM / OEM Certified resource or OEM authorised Reseller.
6. **Manufacturer Authorization:**Wherever Authorised Distributors/service providers are submitting the bid, Authorisation Form /Certificate with OEM/Original Service Provider details such as name, designation, address, e-mail Id and Phone No. required to be furnished along with the bid
7. **OPTIONAL SITE VISIT:**
  1. The Bidder is advised to visit and examine the installation site and its surroundings and obtain for itself on its own responsibility all information that may be necessary for preparing the Bid. The costs of visiting the site shall be borne by the Bidder.

The Bidder representative shall be allowed entry upon consignee premises for such visits, only upon the express conditions that the Bidder will release and indemnify the Buyer and Consignee against all liabilities arising out of such visit including death or injury, loss or damage to property, and any other loss, damage, costs, and expenses incurred as a result of such visit.
  3. The Bidder shall not be entitled to hold any claim against Buyer for noncompliance due to lack of any kind of pre-requisite information as it is the sole responsibility of the Bidder to obtain all the necessary information with regard to site, surrounding, working conditions, weather etc. on its own before

submission of the bid.

9. Supplier shall ensure that the Invoice is raised in the name of Consignee with GSTIN of Consignee only.
10. The successful bidder has to supply all essential accessories required for the successful installation and commissioning of the goods supplied. Besides standard accessories as per normal industry practice, following accessories must be part of supply and cost should be included in bid price:

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11. 1. The Seller shall not assign the Contract in whole or part without obtaining the prior written consent of buyer.  
2. The Seller shall not sub-contract the Contract in whole or part to any entity without obtaining the prior written consent of buyer.  
3. The Seller shall, notwithstanding the consent and assignment/sub-contract, remain jointly and severally liable and responsible to buyer together with the assignee/ sub-contractor, for and in respect of the due performance of the Contract and the Sellers obligations there under.
12. While generating invoice in GeM portal, the seller must upload scanned copy of GST invoice and the screenshot of GST portal confirming payment of GST.
13. Scope of supply (Bid price to include all cost components) : Supply Installation Testing Commissioning of Goods and Training of operators and providing Statutory Clearances required (if any)
14. Bidder Turn Over Criteria: The minimum average annual financial turnover of the bidder during the last three years, ending on 31st March of the previous financial year, should be as indicated in the bid document. Documentary evidence in the form of certified Audited Balance Sheets of relevant periods or a certificate from the Chartered Accountant / Cost Accountant indicating the turnover details for the relevant period shall be uploaded with the bid. In case the date of constitution / incorporation of the bidder is less than 3 year old, the average turnover in respect of the completed financial years after the date of constitution shall be taken into account for this criteria.
15. OEM Turn Over Criteria: The minimum average annual financial turnover of the OEM of the offered product during the last three years, ending on 31st March of the previous financial year, should be as indicated in the bid document. Documentary evidence in the form of certified Audited Balance Sheets of relevant periods or a certificate from the Chartered Accountant / Cost Accountant indicating the turnover details for the relevant period shall be uploaded with the bid. In case the date of constitution / incorporation of the OEM is less than 3 year old, the average turnover in respect of the completed financial years after the date of constitution shall be taken into account for this criteria. In case of bunch bids, the OEM of CATEGORY RELATED TO primary product having highest bid value should meet this criterion.
16. Purchase preference to Micro and Small Enterprises (MSEs): Purchase preference will be given to MSEs as defined in Public Procurement Policy for Micro and Small Enterprises (MSEs) Order, 2012 dated 23.03.2012 issued by Ministry of Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises and its subsequent Orders/Notifications issued by concerned Ministry. If the bidder wants to avail the Purchase preference, the bidder must be the manufacturer of the offered product in case of bid for supply of goods. Traders are excluded from the purview of Public Procurement Policy for Micro and Small Enterprises. In respect of bid for Services, the bidder must be the Service provider of the offered Service. Relevant documentary evidence in this regard shall be uploaded along with the bid in respect of the offered product or service. If L-1 is not an MSE and MSE Seller (s) has/have quoted price within L-1+ 15% of margin of purchase preference /price band defined in relevant policy, such Seller shall be given opportunity to match L-1 price and contract will be awarded for percentage of 100% of total value.
17. Purchase Preference linked with Local Content (PP-LC) Policy:

The bid clause regarding "Preference to Make In India products" stands modified in this bid and shall be governed by the PPLC Policy No. FP-20013/2/2017-FP-PNG dated 17.11.2020 issued by MoP&NG as amended up to date. Accordingly, bidders with Local Content less than or equal to 20% will be treated as "Non Local Supplier". The prescribed LC shall be applicable on the date of Bid opening. Sanctions on the bidders for false / wrong declaration or not fulfilling the Local Content requirement shall be as per the PPLC policy. Further following additional provisions are added in the certification and verification of local content provision of the Preference to Make in India clause:

- i. In case of foreign bidder, certificate from the statutory auditor or cost auditor of their own office or subsidiary in India giving the percentage of local content is also acceptable. In case office or subsidiary in India does not exist or Indian office/subsidiary is not required to appoint statutory auditor or cost auditor, certificate from practicing cost accountant or practicing chartered accountant giving the percentage of local content is also acceptable.
  - ii. Along with Each Invoice: The local content certificate (issued by statutory auditor on behalf of procuring company) shall be submitted along with each invoice raised. However, the % of local content may vary with each invoice while maintaining the overall % of local content for the total work/purchase of the pro-rata local content requirement. In case, it is not satisfied cumulatively in the invoices raised up to that stage, the supplier shall indicate how the local content requirement would be met in the subsequent stages.
  - iii. The bidder shall submit an undertaking from the authorized signatory of bidder having the Power of Attorney along with the bid stating the bidder meets the mandatory minimum LC requirement and such undertaking shall become a part of the contract.
18. Availability of Service Centres: Bidder/OEM must have a Functional Service Centre in the State of each Consignee's Location in case of carry-in warranty. (Not applicable in case of goods having on-site warranty). If service center is not already there at the time of bidding, successful bidder / OEM shall have to establish one within 30 days of award of contract. Payment shall be released only after submission of documentary evidence of having Functional Service Centre.
  19. Dedicated /toll Free Telephone No. for Service Support : BIDDER/OEM must have Dedicated/toll Free Telephone No. for Service Support.
  20. Escalation Matrix For Service Support : Bidder/OEM must provide Escalation Matrix of Telephone Numbers for Service Support.
  21. **Nominated Inspection Agency:** On behalf of the Buyer organization, any one of the following Inspection Agency would be conducting inspection of stores before acceptance:  
Pre-dispatch Inspection at Seller Premises (applicable only if pre-dispatch inspection clause has been selected in ATC):

  22. Bidder's offer is liable to be rejected if they don't upload any of the certificates / documents sought in the Bid document, ATC and Corrigendum if any.
  23. The bidder is required to upload, along with the bid, all relevant certificates such as BIS licence, type test certificate, approval certificates and other certificates as prescribed in the Product Specification given in the bid document.
  24. Warranty period of the supplied products shall be as given in specifications from the date of final acceptance of goods or after completion of installation, commissioning & testing of goods (if included in the scope of supply), at consignee location. OEM Warranty certificates must be submitted by Successful Bidder at the time of delivery of Goods. The seller should guarantee the rectification of goods in case of any break down during the guarantee period. Seller should have well established Installation, Commissioning, Training, Troubleshooting and Maintenance Service group in INDIA for attending the after sales service. Details of Service Centres near consignee destinations are to be uploaded along with the bid.
  25. **NET WORTH:** Net Worth of the OEM should be positive as per the last audited financial statement.
  26. Buyer Added text based ATC clauses

1. Following payment terms shall be applicable:

**FOR SUPPLY OF ITEMS :**

(I) **80% of basic price of material supplied** , as per PO, along with 100% taxes & duties (as applicable) & freight charges, shall be paid on pro-rata basis within:

(i) 45 days for Micro & Small Enterprises (MSEs)

(ii) 60 days for Medium Enterprises

(iii) 90 days for Non-MSME

from the date of receipt of goods & receipt of complete documents as per order/contract subject t

o acceptance of materials.

(II) **Balance 20% of basic price of the materials** supplied shall be payable within:

(i) 45 days for Micro & Small Enterprises (MSEs)

(ii) 60 days for Medium Enterprises

(iii) 90 days for Non-MSME

from the date of successful installation/ commissioning and receipt of its joint certification by BHEL & Vendor.

2% of basic value shall be deducted from payment as TDS & TDS Certificate shall be issued by BHEL, as per amendment in GST Law. GOI has amended GST Law - Section 51 of the CGST Act 2017 wherein Government Agencies (PSU) has to deduct 2% GST TDS w.e.f. 01.10.2018. Kindly go through the latest amendment in GST Law.

#### **FOR INSTALLATION & COMMISSIONING INCLUDING TRAINING OF ITEMS :**

Hundred percent (100%) of installation/erection and commissioning charges shall be payable within

(i) 45 days for Micro & Small Enterprises (MSEs)

(ii) 60 days for Medium Enterprises

(iii) 90 days for Non-MSME

from the date of successful completion of the activity and receipt of invoice along with its certification by BHEL & Vendor.

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2. To get MSE preference, bidder to choose MSE purchase preference on GEM portal otherwise purchase preference shall not be applicable.

3. To get MII preference, bidder to choose MII purchase preference on GEM portal and bidder to submit signed local content declaration as attached otherwise purchase preference shall not be applicable.

4. Bidder to submit signed and stamped GEM Bidding document, Technical Specification, MII Declaration, Udyam Registration (if applicable).

#### **5. DELIVERY PERIOD:**

(a) For supply: 16 Weeks (112 days) from the Date of Purchase Order.

(b) For ICT: 4 weeks (28 days) allowed for ICT after site readiness communication to seller by BHEL.

#### **6. Warranty:**

(a) 24 months from the date of commissioning or 30 months from the date of supply whichever is earlier. During warranty period, equipment must work smoothly. In case of any issues, supplier must provide service and replacement of faulty parts free of cost.

(b) List of spares and consumables to be provided along with techno-commercial offer.

7. Bidder to submit contact details of concerned executive contact details (Name, Mobile number, email id) for Techno-commercial evaluation.

8. Documents to be submitted for payment as per below details:

(a) For Supply: GST Invoice, Packing List, Warranty Certificate, LR/DC

(b) For Balance 20% against Supply: Supplementary Invoice and

(c) For Services: GST Invoice, Completion certificate by BHEL & Vendor.

9. PURCHASE SPECIFICATION FOR CONE BLENDER: DOC No. EL-PS-PT-CB. TECHNICAL PRE QUALIFICATION CRITERIA FOR CONE-BLENDER: DOC No. EL-TPQ-PT-CB. PQR SHALL SUPERCEDE EXPERIENCE CRITERIA AND PAST PERFORMANCES MENTIONED IN THE BID.

10. LD as per GeM General T&C and all other T&C are as per GeM General T&C.

**11. Corrigendum-1 issued due to (1) PQR Rev-01 (refer Buyer uploaded document) and offer validity shall be 180 days from the date of technical bid opening.**

1. Definition of Class I and Class II suppliers in the bid not in line with the extant Order / Office Memorandum issued by DPIIT in this regard.
2. Seeking EMD submission from bidder(s), including via Additional Terms & Conditions, in contravention to exemption provided to such sellers under GeM GTC.
3. Publishing Custom / BOQ bids for items for which regular GeM categories are available without any Category item bunched with it.
4. Creating BoQ bid for single item.
5. Mentioning specific Brand or Make or Model or Manufacturer or Dealer name.
6. Mandating submission of documents in physical form as a pre-requisite to qualify bidders.
7. Floating / creation of work contracts as Custom Bids in Services.
8. Seeking sample with bid or approval of samples during bid evaluation process.
9. Mandating foreign / international certifications even in case of existence of Indian Standards without specifying equivalent Indian Certification / standards.
10. Seeking experience from specific organization / department / institute only or from foreign / export experience.
11. Creating bid for items from irrelevant categories.
12. Incorporating any clause against the MSME policy and Preference to Make in India Policy.
13. Reference of conditions published on any external site or reference to external documents/clauses.
14. Asking for any Tender fee / Bid Participation fee / Auction fee in case of Bids / Forward Auction, as the case may be.

Further, if any seller has any objection/grievance against these additional clauses or otherwise on any aspect of this bid, they can raise their representation against the same by using the Representation window provided in the bid details field in Seller dashboard after logging in as a seller within 4 days of bid publication on GeM. Buyer is duty bound to reply to all such representations and would not be allowed to open bids if he fails to reply to

such representations.
