

Two-year doping ban on footballer

M e h r a will not particularly cherish. The Mumbai FC footballer has been handed a two-year ban by the National Anti-Doping Agency (NADA) for the unexplained use of the banned drug Tetrahydrocannabinol (THC), making him the first Indian footballer to be banned for drug abuse.

"We have received the report from NADA. He has been suspended for two years," a high-ranking AIFF official confirmed on Monday.

Mehra was provisionally suspended by the All India Football Federation (AIFF) for three months when his A sample had returned positive in February.

Since January, NADA have

been conducting in-competition checks in the I-League and Mehra was among the seven footballers who were tested in Pune. When Mehra's A sample returned positive, the AIFF suspended him provisionally but with the B sample — tested in front of the player — also testing positive, NADA were left with no choice but to hand the young footballer a two-year ban.

"Mehra was offered a chance by the NADA panel to explain how the substance (THC) got into his system. He offered an explanation saying he had suffered a bout of food poisoning. He also said either his food or drink could have been spiked but the panel was not convinced," said the source.

Had Mehra managed to convince the panel, chaired by Dinesh Dayal, he could have walked away with a milder ban, which could have been anything between three and six months.

Tetrahydrocannabinol, according to those in the know, is found in drugs like hashish and marijuana.

'We have India in our sights'

Despite Historical Constraints, Barcelona Have Plans To Enter The Subcontinent Market

Barcelona could be slowly overturning a fan base in India that has traditionally been held by Manchester United, Chelsea and other English clubs, and the club is aware of that. Javier Faus, vice president, Financial, Economic and Strategic Area, FC Barcelona reveals about plans to visit the country in September to understand the market, and develop the brand here.

Barcelona's show in the Champions League and the Spanish League over the past few years has been very impressive, but the club has not done enough to have an impact on the Indian viewer and market.

The Spanish clubs are behind the English clubs when it comes to exposure in India and Asia. The reason is that in the last 20 years we have concentrated on Europe, Latin America and the US. They have been our main focus markets. But it's changing now. We have started what we call 'Project China' and we are trying to strengthen our presence in the Chinese markets in the next ten years, in liaison with Nike, our main sponsor. We have signed a sponsorship contract with Qatar and we are going to enter the whole of the Middle-East in conjunction with Qatar. We are now analysing our strategic plan on how to tackle the Indian market and the president of the club and myself will probably travel to

India in September. We plan to spend a week there understanding the market dynamics and setting up strategy for our club in India for the next five years. We know that cricket is the number one sport, which makes a big, big difference. But what we have learnt is football is gaining popularity gradually, especially among children. We want to go to countries where football has a lot of potential, and I think India fulfils this condition.

What basically entails the traditional methods that FC Barcelona adopts to promote its brand?

We look at academies, schools and megastores. We also usually have sponsorship deals for each local market. It helps if there are Barcelona 'penyas' (registered fan clubs) in the region. Their presence makes our task easier.

Any plans of the team coming to India?

We go to the US one year and another year to either China or Japan. If after learning about the Indian market and its dynamics, we feel it has an interesting market for a team to come then we will play. But also, the climate plays a very important role in our training during a pre-season because it is in August. So the players need to train in a pre-season tour in conditions that are fit for them.

So, do we understand that India may not figure in Pep Guardiola's



team's plans in the next two years?

For the next two years, it's impossible, because all arrangements are made. Maybe, (it is possible) after 2013-14.

Does a brilliant Champions League victory influence the strategic plans for a club where an emerging market as ours wants a share of the club? Are you aware of these signals back home?

Yes, we definitely understand it. (But) Manchester United or Liverpool and Arsenal are ahead in the Indian market. You have to remember the English prominence in India, for over a hundred years. That's exactly the same thing that happened with us in Latin America. That's why we are so strong in Brazil, Mexico, Argentina, Colombia and Venezuela, where the first team is Barcelona. We understand that the Indian market is so important, and so we are trying to enter into the market even though we don't have the fairy-touch that the English clubs have. Taking into consideration the way Barca plays, and the stars we have, it is an advantage to enter the market, and we'll

definitely want to tap that potential.

There is a growing fear worldwide that the Barcelona's shirt sponsorship with Qatar Foundation may actually drive away the fans.

We must thank our philosophies, values and culture, symbolized by our academy and homegrown players, the way we play the sport which is unique in the world. I think that says a lot about our distinction as a club. As for sponsorship, we have to face the reality that if we want to have the best players in the world — and I remind you eight World Cup players play for our club, and even the best player in the world — you have to pay the world's best what they deserve, which is the best. We have to optimize our resources. That's why we want to go to India to tap the potential. The sustainability of our economy is priority number one.

The English Premiership games have far more favourable telecast timings. Do you think advancing the La Liga kick offs could help?

Both Real Madrid and Barcelona have the proposal on the league's table. It will be discussed not only with the league but also with the company that owns the TV rights in Spain. The number one revenue stream for the Spanish clubs is the local domestic TV rights. It is not the international TV rights. And it needs to be approved not only by the clubs but also the company that holds the TV rights. I think that it will not be easy but at least the good news is the debate is on and sometime in the near future it will happen. At least a few games.

Second-string France hammer Ukraine 4-1

Donetsk (Ukraine): Three late goals saw a second-string France side inflict a 4-1 humbling of joint Euro 2012 hosts Ukraine in a friendly here on Monday to extend their unbeaten run under coach Laurent Blanc to nine matches. All the goals came in the second-half as the French came from a goal down — scored by veteran Ukrainian Anatoly Tymoshchuk — with Kevin Gameiro levelling with his first goal in four appearances, a double from Marvin Martin on his debut and another from defender Younes Kaboul rounding off the victory.

Vieira may quit City for coaching job

London: Ace footballer Patrick Vieira may quit Manchester City for a coaching job at Arsenal. The Gunners legend, 34, had said he hoped to spend another season at City after helping them win the FA Cup and clinch a Champions League place. But the midfielder could now decide to hang up his boots, The Sun reports.

Fulham hires Jol as manager

London: Fulham has hired Martin Jol to replace Mark Hughes as manager of the English Premier League club. The 55-year-old Dutchman has agreed to an initial two-year contract with the west London side, with the option for a further year's extension. Hughes resigned as Fulham manager last week after one season in charge. Since being ditched by Tottenham in 2007, Jol has coached Hamburg and Ajax.

Chelsea joins race to snare Sneijder

London: Chelsea have joined the £30-million chase for Inter Milan midfielder star Wesley Sneijder — on the advice of Turkish national team coach Guus Hiddink. The Dutchman has told them to outbid rivals Manchester United and Manchester City for compatriot Sneijder, reports The Sun. The playmaker, 27 this week, looks certain to quit Inter this summer and is eager to move to England.

Churchill rope in HAL's Xavier

Panaji: After roping in Roberto Silva from Dempo SC, Churchill Brothers have now managed to convince HAL's midfielder Xavier Vijay Kumar to join them for the upcoming season. Following his exceptional performance against Dempo on the final match of the I-League in which he scored two classic goals, Churchill Brothers patron, Churchill Alemao, gave him a good offer to join the team. Xavier, who has a permanent job at HAL and played for them for the last 13 years, could not resist the tempting offer, and will now don Churchill colours in the next season.

Cruyff elected to Ajax board of directors

Amsterdam: Johan Cruyff has been elected to the board of directors of Ajax in a move the club hopes will help it return to the glory days he ushered in as a player in the 1970s. Cruyff and four other new board members replace directors who quit in March and accused Cruyff of strong-arm tactics in insisting that several key staff be fired as part of his master plan to rejuvenate the four-time European champion. Cruyff had no immediate comment on Tuesday and was not present for Monday's election. AGENCIES

HC steps in to check DDCA age fraud

New Delhi: The Delhi and District Cricket Association's (DDCA) age group tournaments have for years been rife with cases of scandal and age fraud, but now a new Delhi High Court judgment — in response to a petition filed by an NGO — may go a long way towards checking the inclusion of overage players at the under-16, under-19 and under-22 levels.

Taking cognizance of the "serious issue" of "unfair

practice" regarding misrepresentation of age at these levels, the HC has directed the DDCA not to rely blindly on age certificates supplied by players. It has, instead, instructed the association to set up a board of three doctors of Apollo Hospital to carry out radiological examinations and MRI or CT scans as applicable to determine the correct age. The norms for these examinations have also been specified. The board has also

been instructed to conduct dental examinations.

The DDCA will now also have to maintain a database of player ages post-examination which must be "strictly adhered to...throughout the entire career of the player", and take prompt action in case of age manipulation.

Incidentally, the HC said in its judgment that it expected and hoped the BCCI would also implement these norms all over the country to make it a "level playing field".
