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CHAPTER 1

PRE- QUALIFYING REQUIREMENTS (PQR):

An essential qualification requirement of the bidders for tender submission shall be as under:

1) The contractors should have experience of successfully execution of similar works viz., "Material handling work involving loading or unloading or handling of materials using mobile crane" during the last 7 years ending as on last day of month previous to the one in which applications are invited. The qualification criteria are applicable to individual schedule alone as per below table:

- 2) The bidder should provide minimum one (01) crane of same or higher capacity mobile crane (pick and carry type) against any schedule in which the bidder wishes to participate. In case of proprietorship firm/Partnership firm the vehicle should be in the name of the firm or in the name of the partners or leased. In case of Company (Private or Public Limited) vehicle in the name of the director or Company. The registration or ownership should be on or before date of tender opening. In case of the leased vehicle(s), a valid lease agreement till the end of the proposed contract period shall be available in the name of the bidder. All bidders including MSE and all startups recognized by Department for Promotion of Industry & Internal Trade have to fulfil the above condition.
- 3) Average annual financial turnover of any 3 financial years out of last 5 financial years beginning from 01.04.2019 to 31.03.2024, should not be less than the values as stated against each schedule as mentioned in the above tabulation (Sl. No. 1).
- 4) The document proof (Work order, Completion certificate with executed value or any relevant supporting documents) to be submitted. If the bidder is executing similar works in any unit of BHEL, then the consolidated value of bills can be considered for eligibility criteria for PQR as stated above.
- 5) The bidders have to submit mobile crane documents like RC, Lease agreement in case of leased crane, Fitness Certificate, Insurance, Road Tax, lifting machine test certificate, Lifting Tackles Certificate, Pollution certificate, mobile crane specification etc. along with technical bid.



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- 6) The mobile crane shall be capable of handling the material of individual weight up to 12 MT or 20 MT as per defined schedules. For leased crane(s), the lease agreement for **minimum 24 months** in the name of bidder to be submitted along with technical bid.
- 7) The year of manufacture for crane(s) should be **2017 or above** & shall be equipped with all safety attachments for all three schedules.
- 8) All bidders (including MSE and Start-ups) have to provide mobile crane(s) for physical/virtual inspection pertains to checking of technical specification and relevant documents etc.
- 9) The bidder has to offer crane for physical inspection as stated by BHEL if located within 30KM radius from BHEL BAP, Ranipet. For the same crane, BHEL may inspect on virtual mode considering the request from bidder and at the discretion of BHEL. If any bidder is located outside the 30 KM radius of BHEL BAP, Ranipet, the respective crane(s) will be inspected on virtual mode along with documents as stated above. The bidder has to be made necessary arrangements for virtual inspection. BHEL will not bear any cost incurred by bidder in order to offer the crane for physical/virtual inspection.
- 10) The bidders have to offer the cranes in good physical condition, free from defects like worn out tyres, damaged hook/rope, meeting all safety requirements & statutory norms etc. to satisfy safety norms & the requirement of executing agency.
- 11) For all offered mobile crane(s), physical/virtual inspection will be carried out which includes Lifting of Dead weight as per crane specification, working of hydraulic system, Boom Extension and related function as per specification etc.
- 12) If any bidder has not produced the vehicle(s) for inspection within the specified time, the offered vehicle(s) as per techno-commercial bid (which is not inspected) shall be liable for rejection. Only qualified mobile crane(s) after inspection will be considered for further proceedings. BHEL's decision regarding acceptance or rejection of offered crane(s) is final. In case of not meeting the technical specification (inclusive of non-submission of documents), the bidder will be permitted to submit alternative vehicle (with necessary valid documents) to meet the PQR within 3 days' time.

Note: MSE/Start-up exemption of prior experience and prior turnover is not applicable for this tender. All the bidders have to ensure to meet the above PQR, failing which offer may be liable for rejection

- 2. The Capacity of the Crane(s) should be minimum 12MT & 20MT for respective Schedules and should be in good operating condition. Contractor can offer higher capacity Crane(s) for respective Schedules without demanding any additional charges.
- 3. Supply of mobile crane with its EXPRIENCE crew which consists of one crane operator cum driver (Skilled Manpower) and Two riggers (Semi-Skilled Manpower). Relevant document supporting their experience to be submitted before commencement of contract for allowing them to work in the factory. The crane will be permitted only with its crew members. A Supervisor may be posted to maintain the overall activities of crane operations and billing.
- 4. **Tools, Tackles and other equipment's** Contractor shall bring their own Lifting tackles and tools (wire ropes and chain slings etc.) duly certified by the competent authority. Each mobile crane should have equipped with Four (04) Nos. of Traffic cones as a safety measure.
- 5. The supplied mobile cranes shall be maintained in good working condition. All the lifting tackles (for 12MT & 20MT Capacity respective to the mobile crane capacity) required for each crane for handling various types of load, are to be arranged by the contractor. The equipment provided shall be fit in all respect. The certificate from competent person for crane (including Lifting tools and tackles) shall be produced along with the RC and insurance of equipment. All the documents shall be valid and updated.
- 6. **Crane operator cum Driver** The operator shall have valid License to operate the commercial lifting mobile crane and experienced in mobile crane operation. Operator has to keep the original documents during the execution and a copy of same shall be submitted to area in-charge. The medical fitness certificate (including vision test) shall be submitted at the time of commencement of work. The medical test is for crane operator cum driver and riggers, which shall be renewed within 1 year from the date of issue.
- 7. Copy of crane specification details shall be submitted along with the offer.
- 8. Following provisions for/on mobile cranes shall be ensured:
 - a) Horn, reverse horn, Light and turning indicator.
 - b) Mirror and reflector.
 - c) Certificate from competent authority of crane and Lifting Tackles.



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- d) Adequate size and capacity of tools and tackles, certified from competent authority.
- 9. The working shift for the cranes shall be tentatively from 08:00 Hrs. to 16:30 Hrs.(A-Shift), 16:30 hrs. to 01:00 hrs. (B-Shift)., and 08:30 hrs. to 17:00 hrs., (General Shift). The working shift (any shift at any time) and number of cranes per shift can be modified according to BHEL requirements & workloads. Though bidder quoted for 8 hours excluding 30-minute food break, if BHEL shift timing permit to work for less than 8 hours excluding food break of 30-minute, payment will be made on pro-rata basis.
 - If these cranes are required to work in extended hours beyond the shift, payment will be on prorate basis.
- 10. The rate per hour will be arrived at by dividing the awarded rate per crane per shift by 8 in case of single shift crane operation and by dividing the awarded rate per crane for two shifts by 16 in case of double shift crane operation.
- 11. For Break-down / Non-supply of the crane, deduction will be made on pro-rata basis. (Fraction hour will be ignored up to 30 minutes and for more than 30 minutes' amount will be deducted for one hour).
- 12. The quoted rate should be inclusive of the hire charges for the crane to be deployed, cost of fuel/lubricants, standard tools and tackles required for material handling work, repair and maintenance expenditure, road tax, insurance, pollution certificate, statutory payment (Wages, PF, ESI etc.) for crane crew i.e. One Operator cum driver (Skilled manpower) and Two Riggers (Semi-Skilled manpower) for each crane, personal protective equipment's for deployed manpower, Group Personal Accident insurance of deployed manpower etc.
 - No claim for extra payment shall be admitted. GST will be reimbursed as applicable on production of relevant documents along with the bills.

13. Contractor's Scopes:

- (i) The unloading and loading of jobs from/to loading vehicle as per directions of in charges where the respective crane is allocated.
- (ii) Aid in packing of DUs in boxes viz., steel and wooden boxes.
- (iii) Unloading and movement of packing boxes to desired location.
- (iv) Render services in other areas/departments other than allocated as per instructions.
- (v) Maintaining log book containing data of IN, OUT and any inter yard/area movement.
- (vi) Proper stacking of components during loading and unloading by keeping wooden blocks/battens/scantlings which will be provided by BHEL.
- (vii) Loading and unloading of jobs in a safe way and the rigger/operator to ensure visibility of WOs.
- (viii) Apart from above, the crane has to render the services where is vital.

14. BHEL's SCOPE OF WORK:

a) For any special type of jobs/materials handling, BHEL at their discretion will provide standard wire ropes, lifting tackles, tools etc. under acknowledgement, on returnable basis. Recovery will be made in case of non-returning/damages. The tools and tackles of Contractor shall not be mixed with BHEL's tools and tackles.



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- b) **Workmen Gate Pass**: Necessary gate entry pass will be issued by BHEL BAP, Ranipet Security Department for Contract Workmen based on your application duly forwarded by the Contract Executing Department and approved by HR/ Welfare/ Contract Cell on fulfilment of the Statutory Obligation by the Contractor.
- c) Vehicle Gate pass: Necessary vehicle gate entry pass will be issued by BHEL BAP, Ranipet Security Department based on your application with necessary vehicle documents like RC Copy, Lease agreement in case of leased crane, Road Tax, Insurance, pollution certificate, fitness certificate, driver license (Heavy Vehicle License), Mobile crane load certificate and respective lifting tools and tackles certificate duly certified by competent person etc., after duly forwarded by the Contract Executing Department.
- 15. As BHEL requires mobile cranes immediately, the successful bidder should deploy the cranes within <u>Seven days from the date of issue of Work order/ Purchase order.</u>



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CHAPTER 4

INSTRUCTIONS TO BIDDER

1.1 **DESPATCH INSTRUCTION**

- i) The General Conditions of Contract form part of the Tender specifications. Bidders shall upload sealed and signed bid documents along with other supporting documents in the BHEL GePNIC portal. The information furnished shall be complete by itself. The tenderer is required to furnish all the details and other documents as required in the following pages.
- ii) Tenderers are advised to study all the tender documents carefully. Any submission of tender by the tenderer shall be deemed to have been done after careful study and examination of the tender documents and with the full understanding of the implications thereof. Should the tenderers have any doubt about the meaning of any portion of the Tender Specification or find discrepancies or omissions in the drawings or the tender documents issued are incomplete or shall require clarification on any of the technical aspect, the scope of work etc., he shall at once, contact the authority inviting the tender well in time (so as not to affect last date of submission) for clarification before the submission of the tender. Tenderer's request for clarifications shall be with reference to Sections and Clause numbers given in the tender documents. The specifications and terms and conditions shall be deemed to have been accepted by the tenderer in his offer. Non-compliance with any of the requirements and instructions of the tender enquiry may result in the rejection of the tender. The tenderers can visit BHEL Ranipet on working days during office working hours for any clarifications before submitting their offer.
- iii) Integrity pact (IP) is applicable for this tender. This IP has to be submitted by the bidder along with Techno-commercial bid duly filled, signed and stamped by the authorized signatory who signs the bid. Entering into this pact is a preliminary qualification.

1.2 **SUBMISSION OF TENDERS**

- 1.2.1 The tenderers must submit their tenders to Officer inviting tender as per instructions in the NIT.
- 1.2.2 Tenders shall be submitted through E-Procurement portal (BHEL GePNIC: https://eprocurebhel.co.in/nicgep/app) as per instruction in NIT. Tenderers to upload offers well in advance in order to avoid last minute congestion in e-procurement website (BHEL GePNIC). However, after submission of the tender, the tenderer can re-submit revised tender but before due date and time of submission of tender as notified.
- 1.2.3 The offer should be submitted along with the duly filled Questionnaire (Page No. 05 & 06 of NIT) and Annexure-A (Page No. 07, 08 & 09 of NIT).
- 1.2.4 Tenders shall be opened by Officer of BHEL at the time and date as specified in the NIT. For this tender, bidders may attend through online mode, if provisions are available in e-procurement portal.
- 1.2.5 Tenderers whose bids are found techno commercially qualified shall be notified through eprocurement system about the date and time of opening of the Price Bids. BHEL's decision in this regard shall be final and binding.
- 1.2.6 The information given in the tender documents is for general guidance and shall not be construed as contractually binding on BHEL/ Owner. All relevant site data/ information as may be necessary for bidding shall have to be obtained/ collected by the Tenderer.
- 1.2.7 The Tenderers are advised to physically visit the site to acquaint and satisfy themselves about the weather conditions, working culture in the area, socio-political environment, safety & security aspects, law & order situation, law of the land, transportation routes, various distances, surroundings of plant/ project premises together with all statutory, obligatory, mandatory requirements of various authorities and obtain for themselves all necessary information as to the risks, contingencies and all



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other circumstances, which may influence or affect the discharge of various obligations under the Contract during contract period including extended period (if any).

- 1.2.8 The submission of bid will tantamount to due diligence having been done and it shall be deemed that:
 - a) the Tenderer has obtained all necessary information as to risks, contingencies and other circumstances which may influence or affect the Works
 - b) the Tenderer accepts total responsibility for having foreseen all difficulties and costs of successfully completing the Works
 - c) the Tenderer accepts that, the Contract Price shall not be adjusted to take account of any unforeseeable or unforeseen difficulties or costs and the Tenderer shall not raise any claims/ disputes against BHEL and/ or Owner at later date in any manner whatsoever.

1.3 **LANGUAGE**

- 1.3.1 The tenderer shall quote the rates in English language and international numerals. For the purpose of the tenders, the metric system of units shall be used.
- 1.3.2 All entries in the tender shall either be typed or written legibly in ink. Erasing and over-writing is not permitted and may render such tenders liable for rejection. All cancellations and insertions shall be duly attested by the tenderer.

1.4 **QUALIFICATION OF TENDERERS**

- i) Only tenderers who have previous experience in the work of the nature and description detailed in the Notice Inviting Tender and/or tender specification are expected to quote for this work duly detailing their experience along with offer.
- ii) Offers from tenderers who do not have proven and established experience in the field shall not be considered.
- iii) The offers of the bidders who are on the debarred list shall be rejected. Further, offer of the bidders, who engage the services of the debarred firms or associated with the debarred firm, for present bid, shall also be rejected. The list of debarred firms is available on BHEL web site www.bhel.com.
- iv) Offers from tenderers who do not comply with the latest guidelines of Ministry/Commissions of Govt. of India shall not be considered.

1.5 **EVALUATION OF BIDS**

- i) Technical Bids submitted by the tenderer will be opened first and evaluated for fulfilling the Pre- Qualification criteria and other conditions in NIT/Tender documents, based on documentary evidences submitted along with the offer.
- ii) In case the same qualifying experience is claimed by more than one agency, then:
 - a. The agency who has executed the work as per documentary evidence submitted shall only be qualified. Scope of qualifying work should be totally with the agency who has executed and in case it is only labour and consumables without T&P, then the credentials of execution is assigned to the first agency and not to the agency who has executed only as labour supply contractor. Further, BHEL reserves the right to ask for any other proof for the said job.
 - b. However, if the same is on account of subletting, part of scope by one agency to another agency in a project of BHEL, experience of both the agencies may be considered for the sublet portion of the work provided subletting has been done with the approval of BHEL.
- iii) In case the qualifying experience is claimed by bidder is based on 'Work Order' and 'Experience Certificates' from any organization other than BHEL (main agency), then it shall be the responsibility of the bidder to submit (in addition to the experience certificate from main



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agency) relevant certificate regarding qualifying experience from the end Customer or the Turnkey-Contractor (if any) who has awarded the work to main agency, as a proof for having executed subject qualifying work. BHEL reserves the right to ask for any other proof for the said iob.

- iv) Assessing Bidder's Capacity for executing the current tender shall be as per Notice Inviting Tender.
- v) Price Bids of shortlisted bidders shall only be opened through the electronic price bid opening. Unless specified otherwise in the tender, the L1 bidder amongst all the shortlisted bidders shall be considered for award. However, the L1 bidder shall have no claim on the award & BHEL reserves the right to award the tender at its sole discretion.
- vi) Price Bids of unqualified bidders shall not be opened. Reasons for rejection shall be intimated in due course either through system generated e-mail or through letter/e-mail after award to successful bidder.

1.6 DATA TO BE ENCLOSED

Full information shall be given by the tenderer in respect of the following. Non-submission of this information may lead to rejection of the offer.

- i) INCOME TAX PERMANENT ACCOUNT NUMBER Certified copies of Permanent Account Numbers as allotted by Income Tax Department for the Company/Firm/Individual Partners etc. shall be furnished along with tender.
- ii) ORGANIZATION CHART
 - The organization chart of the tenderer's organization, including the names, addresses and contact information of the Directors/Partners shall be furnished along with the offer.
- iii) An attested copy of the Power of Attorney, in case the tender is signed by an individual other than the sole proprietor.
- iv) IN CASE OF INDIVIDUAL TENDERER:
 - His / her full name, address, PAN and place & nature of business
- v) IN CASE OF PARTNERSHIP FIRM:
 - The names of all the partners and their addresses, copy of the partnership deed/instrument of partnership dully certified by the Notary Public shall be enclosed.
- vi) IN CASE OF COMPANIES:
 - a) Date and place of registration including date of commencement certificate in case of Public Companies (certified copies of Memorandum and articles of Association are also to be furnished).
 - b) Nature of business carried on by the Company and the provisions of the Memorandum relating thereof.

1.7 **AUTHORIZATION AND ATTESTATION**

Tenders shall be signed by a person duly authorized/empowered to do so, for which a Power of Attorney is to be submitted along with the tender offer. For company, a Power of Attorney (as per format in Annexure) shall be submitted.

1.8 **EARNEST MONEY DEPOSIT**

- 1.8.1 Every tender must be accompanied by the prescribed amount of Earnest Money Deposit (EMD) in the manner described herein.
 - i) EMD shall be furnished before tender opening / along with the offer in full as per the amount indicated in the NIT.
 - ii) The EMD up to an amount of Rs. 2 Lakh is to be paid only in the following forms:
 - a) Cash deposit as permissible under the extant Income Tax Act (before tender opening).

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- b) Electronic Fund Transfer credited in BHEL account (before tender opening).

- e) Insurance Surety Bonds
- f) In case EMD amount is more than Rs. Two Lakhs, Tenderer has the option to submit the amount in excess of Rs. Two lakhs in the forms described above in clause no. 1.8.1. ii) (a) to (e) or in the form of Bank Guarantee from Scheduled Bank (along with the Offer). The Bank Guarantee in such cases shall be valid for at least six months from the due date of tender submission. The Bank Guarantee format for EMD shall be in the prescribed formats.
- iii) No other form of EMD remittance shall be acceptable to BHEL.
- iv) Proof of EMD: Bidder shall upload the scanned copy of EMD along with bid submission through e-procurement Portal (GeM). However, for the purpose of realization, the bidder shall send the demand draft/ banker's cheque/ pay order/ Bank Guarantee/ FDR/ Insurance Surety Bonds, in original, to the designated officer through post/courier or by hand within tender submission due date.

- 1.8.2 EMD by the Tenderer will be forfeited as per NIT conditions, if:
 - i) After opening the tender and within the offer validity period, the tenderer revokes his tender or makes any modification in his tender which is not acceptable to BHEL. **OR**
 - ii) The successful Contractor, on whom the work has been awarded, fails to deposit the required Security deposit or commence the work within the period as per LOI/ LOA/ Contract or refuse to accept the LIO/LOA/Contract.
 - EMD by the tenderer shall be withheld in case any action on the tenderer is envisaged under the provisions of extant "Guidelines on Suspension of business dealings with suppliers/ contractors" of BHEL and forfeited/ released based on the action as determined under these guidelines.
- 1.8.3 EMD shall not carry any interest.
- 1.8.4 EMD given by all unsuccessful tenderers shall be refunded normally within fifteen days of award of work.
- 1.8.5 Cash portion of EMD of successful tenderer will be retained as part of Security Deposit. EMD submitted in the form of Bank Guarantee/ FDR shall be retained by BHEL until the receipt of the Security Deposit.



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1.9 **SECURITY DEPOSIT**

- 1.9.1 Upon acceptance of Tender, the successful bidder shall be required to deposit the 5% of the contract value (total hire charges for the 07 taxis) as Security Deposit towards fulfilment of any obligations in terms of the provisions of the contract.
- 1.9.2 The Security Deposit shall be furnished before start of the work by the contractor.
- 1.9.3 The required Security Deposit may be accepted in the following forms.
 - i) Cash (as permissible under the extant Income Tax Act).
 - ii) Local cheques of Scheduled Banks (subject to realization)/ Pay Order/ Demand Draft/ Electronic Fund Transfer in favour of BHEL.
 - iii) Securities available from Indian Post offices such as National Savings Certificates, Kisan Vikas Patras etc. (held in the name of Contractor furnishing the security and duly endorsed/hypothecated/ pledged, as applicable, in favour of BHEL).
 - iv) Bank Guarantee from Scheduled Banks/ Public Financial Institutions as defined in the Companies Act. The Bank Guarantee format for Security Deposit shall be in the prescribed formats.
 - v) Fixed Deposit Receipt issued by Scheduled Banks/ Public Financial Institutions as defined in the Companies Act (FDR should be in the name of the Contractor, a/c BHEL). Specific lien in favour of BHEL on the FDR shall be marked and letter from the Bank having created such lien in the format shall be submitted along with FDR.
 - vi) Insurance Surety Bonds.

Note:

- i) BHEL will not be liable or responsible in any manner for the collection of interest or renewal of the documents or in any other matter connected therewith.
- ii) In case of delay in submission of Security Deposit, enhanced security deposit which would include interest (Repo rate + 4%) for the delayed period, shall be submitted by the bidder before submission of first bill.
- 1.9.4 The Security Deposit shall not carry any interest.
- 1.9.5 In case the value of work exceeds the awarded / accepted value, the Security Deposit shall be correspondingly enhanced as given below:
 - i) The enhanced part of the Security Deposit shall be immediately deposited by the Contractor or adjusted against payments due to the Contractor.
 - ii) Contract value for the purpose of operating the increased value of Security Deposit due to Quantity Variation, shall be exclusive of Price Variation Clause, Over Run Compensation and Extra works done on man-day rates.
 - iii) The recoveries made from running bills can be released against submission of equivalent Bank Guarantee in acceptable form, but only once, before completion of work, with the approval of competent authority of BHEL.
- 1.9.6 The validity of Bank Guarantees towards Security Deposit shall be valid till actual completion of work + Guarantee Period + 3 months.
- 1.9.7 BHEL reserves the right of forfeiture of Security Deposit in addition to other claims, damages and remedies in the event of the Contractor's failure to fulfil any of the contractual obligations or in the event of termination of contract as per terms and conditions of contract. BHEL reserves the right to set off the Security Deposit against any claims of other contracts with BHEL by giving prior notice to the contractor.



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1.10 **RETURN OF SECURITY DEPOSIT:**

Security Deposit shall be released to the contractor upon fulfilment of contractual obligations as per terms of the contract including completion of Guarantee Period after deducting all expenses / other amounts due to BHEL under the contract.

1.11 BANK GUARANTEES

Where ever Bank Guarantees are to be furnished/submitted by the contractor, the following shall be complied with

- Bank Guarantees shall be from Scheduled Banks / Public Financial Institutions as defined in the Companies Act. Bank Guarantees issued by Co-Operative Banks/ Financial Institutions shall not be accepted.
- ii) The Bank Guarantees shall be as per prescribed formats.
- iii) It is the responsibility of the bidder to get the Bank Guarantees revalidated/extended for the required period as per the advice of BHEL concerned officials. BHEL shall not be liable for issue of any reminders regarding expiry of the Bank Guarantees.
- iv) In case extension/further extensions of any Bank Guarantees are not required, the bidders shall ensure that the same is explicitly endorsed by the concerned BHEL officials and submitted to the dept. issuing the LOI/LOA.
- v) In case the Bank Guarantees are not extended before the expiry date, BHEL reserves the right to invoke the same by informing the concerned Bank in writing, without any advance notice/communication to the concerned bidder.
- vi) Bidders to note that any corrections to Bank Guarantees shall be done by the issuing Bank, only through an amendment in an appropriate non-judicial stamp paper.
- vii) The Original Bank Guarantee shall be submitted to contracting department of BHEL Ranipet unless specified otherwise in TCC.

1.12 VALIDITY OF OFFER

The rates in the Tender shall be kept open for acceptance for a minimum period of THREE MONTHS from latest due date of offer submission (including extension, if any). In case BHEL (Bharat Heavy Electricals Ltd) calls for negotiations, such negotiations shall not amount to cancellation or withdrawal of the original offer which shall be binding on the tenderers.

1.13 EXECUTION OF CONTRACT AGREEMENT

The successful tenderer's responsibility under this contract commences from the date of issue of the Letter of Award by Bharat Heavy Electricals Limited.

The successful tenderer shall be required to execute an agreement in the prescribed form, with BHEL, within a reasonable time after the acceptance of the Letter of Award, and in any case before releasing the first running bill. The contract agreement shall be signed by a person duly authorized/empowered by the tenderer. The expenses for preparation of agreement document shall be borne by Vendor.

Value of Non-judicial Stamp Paper for Bank Guarantees and for Contract Agreement shall be not less than Rs 100/- unless otherwise required under relevant statutes.

1.14 REJECTION OF TENDER AND OTHER CONDITIONS

- 1.14.1 The acceptance of tender will rest with BHEL which does not bind itself to accept the lowest tender nor any tender and reserves to itself full rights for the following without assigning any reasons whatsoever:
 - a) To reject any or all of the tenders.
 - b) To split up the work amongst two or more tenderers as per NIT.
 - c) To award the work in part if specified in NIT.



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- d) In case of either of the contingencies stated in (b) and (c) above, the time for completion as stipulated in the tender shall be applicable
- 1.14.2 Conditional tenders, tender containing absurd rates and amounts, unsolicited tenders, tenders which are incomplete or not in the form specified or defective or have been materially altered or not in accordance with the tender conditions, specifications etc. are liable to be rejected.
- 1.14.3 Tenders are liable to be rejected in case of unsatisfactory performance of the tenderer with BHEL or tenderer under suspension (debarred) by any unit / region / division of BHEL or tenderers who do not comply with the latest guidelines of Ministry/Commissions of Govt of India. BHEL reserves the right to not consider a bidder for further processing of tender in case it is observed that they are overloaded and may not be in a position to execute this job as per the required schedule. The decision of BHEL will be final in this regard.
- 1.14.4 If a tenderer who is a proprietor expires after the submission of his tender or after the acceptance of his tender, BHEL may at their discretion, cancel such tender. If a partner of a firm expires after the submission of tender or after the acceptance of the tender, BHEL may then cancel such tender at their discretion, unless the firm retains its character. In case BHEL resolves to cancel the tender under this clause, BHEL will issue a notice in this regard containing reasons as to the cancellation of tender. The contractor shall be required to furnish his response to such notice within a period of 14 days from the date of receipt of such notice through any means (BHEL reserves the right to decrease the period upto 05 days). BHEL after due consideration of the representation made by contractor shall communicate its final decision within a reasonable period.
 - In case contractor fails to submit any response to the notice issued by BHEL within the period stipulated in the notice, BHEL at its discretion may proceed to cancel the contract.
 - Contractor shall not be eligible for any compensation whatsoever for the cancellation of contract under this clause.
- 1.14.5 BHEL will not be bound by any Power of Attorney granted by changes in the composition of the firm made subsequent to the execution of the contract. BHEL may, however, recognize such power of Attorney and changes after obtaining proper legal advice, the cost of which will be chargeable to the contractor concerned.
- 1.14.6 If the tenderer deliberately gives wrong information in his tender, BHEL reserves the right to reject such tender at any stage or to cancel the contract if awarded and forfeit the Earnest Money/Security Deposit/any other money due.
- 1.14.7 If at any stage, the document(s) submitted by contractor is/are found incorrect/ false/ manipulated, the necessary action will be taken by BHEL against contractor as per the "Guidelines for suspension of Business dealings".
- 1.14.8 Canvassing in any form in connection with the tenders submitted by the Tenderer shall make his offer liable to rejection.
- 1.14.9 In case the Proprietor, Partner or Director of the Company/Firm submitting the Tender, has any relative or relation employed in BHEL, the authority inviting the Tender shall be informed of the fact as per specified format, along with the Offer. Failing to do so, BHEL may, at its sole discretion, reject the tender or cancel the contract and forfeit the Earnest Money/Security Deposit.
- 1.14.10 The successful tenderer (Contractor) shall not sub-contract any portion of work (either part or complete work) detailed in the tender specification undertaken by him without written permission of BHEL's concerned officials. BHEL, at its discretion, may consider the written request from the Contractor and permit subletting of part scope. However, the Contractor is solely responsible to BHEL for the work awarded to him.



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- 1.14.11 The Tender submitted by a techno commercially qualified tenderer shall become the property of BHEL who shall be under no obligation to return the same to the bidder.
- 1.14.12 Unsolicited discount received after the due date and time of Bid Submission shall not be considered for evaluation. However, if the party who has submitted the unsolicited discount/rebate becomes the L-1 party, then the awarded price i.e. contract value shall be worked out after considering the discount so offered.
- 1.14.13 BHEL shall not be liable for any expenses incurred by the bidder in the preparation of the tender irrespective of whether the tender is accepted or not.

1.15 INTIMATION OF CHANGE OF NAME/ RE-CONSTITUTION OF THE ORGANIZATION

In the event of the organization (Proprietorship/Partnership/Company) undergoing any change of name or reconstitution, prior intimation of the same shall be given to BHEL. Upon such changes coming into effect, the same is to be intimated to BHEL immediately with supporting documents as applicable.

- 1.16 The bidder in his own interest shall submit only one id. If a bidder submits multiple bids, all the bids are liable for rejection. Bids shall be considered "Multiple" in the following circumstances:
 - i) Two bids by the same party
 - ii) If one bidder is the affiliate of another bidder.

For the purpose of this clause "Affiliate" shall mean with respect to any person, any other person that directly or indirectly, controls, is controlled by, or is under direct or indirect common control with, such person, or is a director/ member/ office/ employee of such person or of any person who would otherwise qualify as an affiliate of such person pursuant to this definition.

"Person" for the purposes of this definition shall mean any natural person, individual, corporation, limited partnership, co-operative, general partnership, joint stock company, joint venture, association, company, trust bank, trust company, land trust, business trust, corporate body or other organization, whether or not a legal entity.

1.17 CLAUSE IN CASE OF TIE:

"In the course of evaluation, if more than one bidder happens to occupy L-1 status, effective L-1 will be decided by soliciting discounts from the respective L-1 bidders. In case more than one bidder happens to occupy L-1 status even after soliciting discounts, L-1 bidder shall be decided by a toss / draw of lots, in the presence of the respective L-1 bidder(s) or their representative(s) - If available, otherwise the same procedures will be carried out to arrive for L1 ranking) Ranking will be done accordingly. BHEL's decision in such situations shall be final and binding.'

- 1.18 In the event of tie in L2 /L3...... Ln offers, Ranking shall be decided by a toss / draw of lots. BHEL's decision in such situations shall be final and binding.
- 1.19 The evaluation currency for this tender shall be INR.
- 1.20 Bidders may participate more than one schedule. They have to offer different Mobile cranes with respect to different schedules.

1.21 Award Criteria for Rate Schedules:

The L1 bidder for each rate schedule shall be determined based on the lowest quoted rate for the respective individual rate schedule. Only those mobile cranes that are offered by technically qualified bidders and are accepted by BHEL shall be considered for award.

a) If BHEL's entire requirement under a particular rate schedule is met by the L1 bidder, no counter-offering shall be applicable for that rate schedule.

If BHEL's requirement is not fully met by the L1 bidder under any rate schedule, the balance requirement shall be fulfilled by extending counter-offers at the L1 rates to other technically qualified and eligible bidders under the same rate schedule, in the order of their ranking (seriatim). This process shall continue until BHEL's full requirement is met.



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- b) In the event that BHEL's total requirement of mobile cranes under any specific rate schedule remains unfulfilled after the completion of the counter-offer process as detailed in Sl. No. (a), the L1 bidder for that particular rate schedule shall be given the opportunity to arrange & supply the remaining quantity of cranes at the originally quoted L1 rates.
- c) If BHEL's total requirement of mobile cranes under any specific rate schedule still remains unfulfilled after completion of process detailed in Sl. No. (a) & (b), the respective L1 rate shall then be counter-offered to all eligible bidders of the respective schedules in the order of their ranking (seriatim), for the arranging & supply of additional cranes until the requirement is completely met.
- d) If BHEL requirements for Schedule-1 & 2 is still not fulfilled through above process {SI. No. (a), (b) & (c)}, The following process is proposed to fulfil the mobile crane requirements of BHEL Ranipet:

SCHEDULE-1 (12 MT mobile Crane for Single Shift Operation):

Eligible bidders from schedule-2 (who are technically qualified) will be approached for seeking acceptance of counteroffered L1 rate of schedule-1, in the order of their ranking (seriatim). Based on their acceptance, work order will be issued to schedule-2 bidders for providing 12MT mobile crane for singe shift operation.

SCHEDULE-2 (12 MT mobile Crane for Two Shifts Operation):

Eligible bidders from schedule-1 (who are technically qualified) will be approached for seeking acceptance of counteroffered L1 rate of schedule-1, in the order of their ranking (seriatim). Based on their acceptance, work order will be issued to schedule-1 bidders for providing 12MT mobile crane for Two shifts operation.

The provisions stated under SI. No. (d) shall apply only to Schedule-1 and Schedule-2, as the technical specifications for both schedules are identical.

- 1.22 Taxpayers with ₹ 5 crore plus turnover in any financial year from 2017-18 shall issue e-invoices w.e.f 1st August 2023.
- 1.23 BHEL may negotiate the L1 rate, if not meeting our budget / estimated cost. BHEL may re-float the tender opened, if L1 price is not acceptable to BHEL even after negotiation. In case, the tenderer's authorized person is attending the negotiation such person should have the authorization letter and he should be capable of taking spot decisions.
- 1.24 Tenderers shall not increase their quoted rates in case BHEL negotiate for reduction of rates, such negotiations shall not amount to cancellation or withdrawn of the original offer and the rates originally quoted shall be binding on the tenderers for a period of three months from the date of opening of tenders
- 1.25 Possession of PF registration number is not mandatory. However, the successful tenderer has to register with PF authorities and furnish the registration number before first Running Account Bill. (For Contracts where manpower is involved).
- 1.26 Tenderer has to put sign and seal at the bottom right side in all the pages of tender documents.
- 1.27 **COST EVALUATION**

Evaluation will be on the basis of delivered cost (i.e. "total cost to BHEL").

1.28 QUOTING: The tenderer has to quote the rate in BHEL price bid format only. Bidder has to quote for those schedule(s) only for which they will supply mobile crane(s). Minimum wage to be paid for one operator cum driver (Skilled Manpower) and Two Riggers (Semi-skilled manpower) for each mobile crane per shift works out to Rs. 2,452/- (rounded off to next higher integer). Bidder cannot quote less



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than the Minimum wage of Rs. 2,452/- & Rs. 4,904/- for single shift crane and double shift crane respectively.

The quoted rate shall be inclusive of the hire charges for the crane to be deployed, cost of fuel/lubricants, standard tools and tackles required for material handling work, repair and maintenance expenditure, road tax, insurance, pollution certificate, statutory payment (Wages, PF, ESI etc.) for crane crew i.e. One Operator cum driver (Skilled manpower) and Two Riggers (Semi-Skilled manpower) for each crane, personal protective equipment's for deployed manpower, Group Personal Accident insurance of deployed manpower etc. No claim for extra payment shall be admitted. GST will be reimbursed on production of relevant documents along with the bills.

1.29 The bidder has to quote in "column 13 of price bid" (which is excluding GST), against those schedule(s) only for which they will provide mobile cranes. GST percentage to be mentioned separately in "column 14 of price bid". The L1 will be decided based on the lowest quoted rate in respective Schedule.

For Schedule-1, bidder has to quote rate in Rupees per crane per shift operation.

For Schedule-2, bidder has to quote rate in Rupees per crane for two shifts operation with different crew in each shift.

For Schedule-3, bidder has to quote rate in Rupees per crane per shift operation and (As mentioned in column no. 5 of price bid)

- 1.30 Contract will be finalised by opening e-price bid in NIC portal only and reverse auction will not be conducted. Hence, bidders are requested to quote their best price in first instance.
- 1.31 Services offered by the bidder must meet the requirements of contract as detailed in the Scope of supply

1.32 **MSE CLAUSE: -**

Any Bidder falling under MSE category shall furnish the following details & submit documentary evidence/ Govt. Certificate etc. in support of the same along with their techno-commercial offer.

i) IP is a tool to ensure that activities and transactions between the Company and its Bidders/ Supplier/Vendor are handled in a fair, transparent and corruption free manner. Following Independent External Monitors (IEMs) on the present panel have been appointed by BHEL with the approval of CVC to oversee implementation of IP in BHEL.

1.43 **SUSPENSION OF BUSINESS DEALINGS**

BHEL reserves the right to take action against Contractors who either fail to perform or Tenderers/Contractor who indulge in malpractices, by suspending business dealings with them in line with BHEL guidelines issued from time to time.

The offers of the bidders who are under suspension and also the offers of the bidders, who engage the services of the banned firms / principal / agents, shall be rejected. The list of banned firms is available on BHEL web site www.bhel.com.

If any bidder / supplier / contractor during pre-tendering / tendering / post tendering / award / execution / post-execution stage indulges in any act, including but not limited to, mal-practices, cheating, bribery, fraud or and other misconduct or formation of cartel so as to influence the bidding process or influence the price or tampers the tendering process or acts or omits in any manner which tantamount to an offence punishable under any provision of the Indian Penal Code, 1860 (Bhartiya Nyaya Samhita 2023) or any other law in force in India, or does anything which is actionable under the Guidelines for Suspension of Business dealings, action may be taken against such bidder / supplier / contractor as per extant guidelines of the company available on www.bhel.com and / or under applicable legal provisions. Guidelines for suspension of business dealings is available in the webpage: http://www.bhel.com/vender_registration/vender.php

- 1.44 <u>CARTEL FORMATION:</u> The Bidder declares that they will not enter into any illegal or undisclosed agreement or understanding, whether formal or informal with other Bidder(s). This applies in particular to prices, specifications, certifications, subsidiary contracts, submission or non-submission of bids or any other actions to restrict competitiveness or to introduce cartelization in the bidding process. In case, the Bidder is found having indulged in above activities, suitable action shall be taken by BHEL as per extant policies/ guidelines
- 1.45 **FRAUD PREVENTION POLICY**: Bidder/ Contractor's along with its associate /collaborators /sub-contractors /sub-vendors / consultants / service providers/ consultants associated with the scope of work shall strictly adhere to BHEL Fraud Prevention Policy displayed on BHEL website http://www.bhel.com and shall immediately bring to the notice of BHEL Management about any fraud or suspected fraud as soon as it comes to their notice.
- 1.46 If a ring formation is suspected, BHEL may reject all offers or retender or call new sources who have not been contacted or responded against this tender.



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- 1.47 In case of any conflict between the General Conditions of Contract and Special Conditions of Contract, provisions contained in the Special Conditions of Contract shall prevail.
- 1.48 Unless otherwise specified in NIT, offers from consortium/ JVs shall not be considered.
- 1.49 In the event of our customer order covering this tender being cancelled /placed on hold /otherwise modified, BHEL would be constrained to accordingly cancel / hold / modify the tender at any stage of execution.
- 1.50 BHEL may negotiate the L1 rate, if not meeting our budget / estimated cost. BHEL may re-float the tender opened, if L1 price is not acceptable to BHEL even after negotiation.
- 1.51 Any deviation to this tender terms & conditions and schedules of this tender will lead to total rejection of the offer submitted.
- 1.52 Any change in applicable rates of Tax or any other statutory levies (Direct / Indirect) or any new introduction of any levy by means of statute and its corresponding liability for the deliveries beyond the agreed delivery date for reasons not attributable to BHEL will be to vendors account. BHEL will not reimburse the same and any subsequent claim in this respect will be summarily rejected.
- 1.53 BHEL reserves its right to reject an offer due to unsatisfactory past performance by the respective Vendor in the execution of any contract to any BHEL project / Unit.
- 1.54 Recovery / deduction as applicable as per Direct and Indirect taxes as notified by Govt. Of India from time to time will be made and information/certificate for such deduction/recoveries shall be provided by BHEL to the vendor.
- 1.55 Offers received with any deviation or without relevant information are liable to be rejected.
- 1.56 "BHEL shall have the right to recover any money due from the contractor from any money due to the contractor under this contract or any other contract or from the security deposit".
- 1.57 All the information as called for in the various clauses and annexure of tender specification should be furnished. The details so furnished should be complete in all respects and as per the formats prescribed in the Tender specification (Statutory requirement of Contract). The bidder may have to produce original documents for verification, if so decided by BHEL.
- 1.58 The following points shall be taken note while quoting the rates:
 - PPE & Uniform to be provided (under contractor's scope) to all contract employees and must be ensured employees are working with PPE only.
 - Contractor has to provide the Personal Accidental Insurance policy/ Group Personal Accidental Insurance policy covering all employees to be engaged by the vendor under this contract for the following
 - a) In the event of death or permanent disability resulting from loss of both limbs Rs.10.00 Lakhs (Rupees Ten Lakhs).
 - b) In the event of other permanent disability Rs.7.00 Lakhs (Rupees Seven lakhs)
 - Personal Accidental Insurance policy/ Group Personal Accidental Insurance policy of workmen to be submitted before commencement of work. Contract workmen will be allowed in Factory Premises only after submission of valid Personal Accidental Insurance policy/ Group Personal Accidental Insurance policy.
- 1.59 WCM is arranging this contract as a nodal agency. Execution of work, Bill Certification, Bill passing, Payment, Penalty, Contract closing etc., is the responsibility of end user.



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CHAPTER 5

SPECIAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF THE CONTRACT

- 1. The Mobile crane(s) offered shall be in good and safe working condition.
- 2. BHEL's decision regarding acceptance or rejections of any mobile crane(s) is final.
- 3. Photostat copies of the latest documents shall be uploaded along with the offer like RC, Lease agreement in case of leased mobile crane, Road Tax, Insurance, Fitness certificate of mobile crane(s), Mobile crane load test certificate, lifting tackle certificate, pollution certificate, heavy vehicle license of driver(s) etc. Contractor has to keep all above documents valid, during the contract period.
- 4. Crane documents/ other documents should be in the name of company/ Managing Director/ Partner(s)/ Proprietor. In case of leased vehicle, the vehicle should be in the name of lessor, and lessee should be the company/ Managing Director/ Partner(s)/ Proprietor. In case of award of contract, the lease agreement should be valid throughout the contract period and extended period also in case of contract extension.
- 5. The Driver should possess currently valid heavy vehicle license as per the norms of Regional Transport Authority.
- 6. The contractor shall pay necessary taxes and keep the fitness certificate for the crane valid, during the contract period.
- 7. The contractor shall check for exhaust emission test and obtain fitness of their crane once in 6 months to meet the statutory norms laid by TNPCB, without which crane will not be allowed inside the factory.
- 8. Allocation of mobile cranes to various department will be discretion of BHEL and irrespective of ranking order.
- 9. The reporting and releasing time for the crane is likely to vary as per the requirements of BHEL.
- 10. The crane shall be reported in full readiness for the entire day's operation with sufficient fuel & other consumables with fitting crew. The crane & crew should be made available continuously throughout the contract period including Holidays and Sundays to meet BHEL requirements.
- 11. The contractor should not sell/lease /sublet /release the crane & crew engaged under this contract for the entire contract period without prior written permission of BHEL. If the crane is put into use through lease, the same shall not be cancelled or allowed to be expired throughout the currency of the contract.
- 12. The contractor should carry out the work at the place identified by the authority concerned.
- 13. "Workmen shall be permitted entry into the factory premises only upon submission of the Personal Accidental Insurance policy/ Group Personal Accidental Insurance policy for the engaged manpower".
- 14. Work Instructions are to be obtained from respective concerned Department Officials in written/oral. Log Sheets/Log Register/Measurement Book to be maintained (Already certified by the executing authority as and when the works are carried out) and it shall form the part of the payment documents. BHEL dispatch documents shall not be enclosed as a proof of carrying out the jobs.
- 15. The Contractor to bring resources as specified in scope of work for carrying out and completion of the daily activities/works that are assigned by the concerned department officials specified in the Tender Schedule. If the Contractor is not completing the assigned work in time as specified by BHEL, the same will be completed by BHEL engaging alternate resources and the difference in rate of payment with BHEL overheads will be debited/recovered from the Contractor. If such instance repeats frequently it will be viewed seriously. Whenever there is an additional requirement is communicated by the BHEL Officials, as per the need, the contractor should provide the additional manpower to carry out the work in time.
- 16. The contractor has to bring lifting tackles for handling 12MT & 20MT load (respective to the mobile crane of capacity 12MT & 20MT). Lifting tackles required for handling BHEL typical jobs shall be



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provided by BHEL on free of cost. In case of damage / loss to the special lifting tackles & tools issued by BHEL, cost of the same will be recovered from the contractor as per BHEL norms & policy.

17. Special conditions:

- (i) After allocation of mobile cranes to respective departments, the mobile cranes can shuffle, deployed to any other department on temporary basis to meet BHEL BAP, Ranipet requirement.
- (ii) Performance of each crane will be evaluated on monthly basis as per following criteria and suitable action including suspension/termination of the contract will be initiated after serving the notice.

Note: The performance of any crane vendor is evaluated based on score issued by executing department every month. Final performance factor will be derived from normal average obtained from all evaluating months in contract tenure. If performance evaluation of any vendor is less than 3 will not be considered in future crane contracts of BAP, Ranipet. The final scores evaluated by BHEL is absolute and considering the score in future contract is also at the discretion of BHEL.

- 18. The Contractor shall be present at the work spot daily and the work shall be carried out under direct supervision of the contractor. However, in his absence, authorized representatives/agent shall be available for receiving instructions and to carry out the work under proper supervision. The work shall not be sub-contracted / delegated.
- 19. Inspection shall be carried out by area in-charge after completion of work.
- 20. BHEL reserves the right to increase or decrease the tendered quantity.



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- 21. Work carried out by BHEL on overlapping areas shall not be included in the claim and any deviations to this will be viewed seriously and treated as a violation to the contract.
- 22. The contractor shall provide their employees with Personal Protective Equipment such as Safety Shoes, Hand Glove, Helmet etc. (whatever applicable) and shall comply all safety regulations under Factories Act. It is the responsibility of the contractor not only to provide the work force with such safety equipment at their cost as may be considered necessary for the execution of the work but also to ensure their wearing the above safety appliances, failing which corrective action will be taken by withholding the amount recommended by concerned official / Safety Officials for each violation, which may be released only after compliance of the same. The work shall not be commenced without wearing the above safety appliances. The contractor has to give declaration that BHEL Safety Rules and Regulations as stipulated from time to time would be followed strictly. This undertaking shall be given prior to the execution of the contract.
- 23. Contractor has to provide the Group Personal Accident Insurance policy covering all employees to be engaged by the contractor under this contract for the following

 a) In the event of death or permanent disability resulting from loss of both limbs Rs.10.00/- Lakhs (Rupees Ten Lakhs).
 b) In the event of other permanent disability Rs. 7.00/- Lakhs (Rupees Seven lakhs)
 Group Personal Accident Insurance policy to be provided before the start of the work. Contract workmen will be allowed in Factory Premises only after submission of valid Group Personal Accident Insurance policy.
- 24. COMMENCEMENT OF WORK: Minimum 50% of the Security Deposit shall be paid and Group Personal Accident insurance shall be submitted within 15 days of issuance of Letter of Intent. Commencement of work shall take place only after submission of the above documents and must be carried out in accordance with the work instructions issued by the work execution department.
- 25. "BHEL does not guarantee ordering of any minimum quantity on any contractor, or does not guarantee more share for the lowest tenderers."
- 26. Daily work progress shall be reported to the person in-charge before leaving the work spot.
- 27. Usage of mobile phones and internet during working hours is strictly prohibited.
- 28. All contract personnel shall come in a decent, formal dress code.
- 29. This work shall be in force for **Two Years** from the date of commencement of work. The period of contract may likely to be extended subject to mutual agreement between BHEL and the Contractor. In case of such extension, the terms and conditions and hiring charges agreed already will remain same for the extended period also.
- 30. Should any error or ambiguity be discovered in the specification or information, the contractor shall forthwith bring the same to the notice of Bharat Heavy Electricals Limited before commencement of work. The BHEL's interpretation in such cases shall be final and binding on the contractor.
- 31. Bharat Heavy Electricals Limited reserves the right to decide the suitability of the man-power and other personnel who may be employed by the contractor.

32. LD/Penalty:

- i. Any absenteeism of mobile crane(s) on any shift on any working day shall attract penalty of Rs.2000 per shift per crane will be levied as penalty apart from non-payment of crane charges for that particular day/shift.
- **ii.** In case if the Crane/crew absent more than three hours (03 Hrs.) in a shift, then the penalty will be deducted as stated in sl. no. (i) of LD/Penalty Clause.
- **iii.** If mobile crane break-down is due to lack of fuel, full day penalty as stated in point (i) of LD/Penalty Clause will be levied at the discretion of executing agency.
- iv. If any Crane(s) stopped continuously for more than Three (03) days affecting BAP, Ranipet operations, the respective contractor has to arrange same/ alternative crane(s) failing which BHEL reserve the right to hire alternative crane from available contract or from market for further non-



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supplying period with the approval of head of executing agency. During period of absenteeism, penalty as stated in point (i) of LD/Penalty Clause will be levied along with differential amount for hiring alternate crane(s) and overhead charges of 5% of differential value.

33. Deployment of Mobile Cranes Post-Award:

Upon finalization of the contract, the awarded contractor shall deploy only those mobile crane(s) that were offered in the bid and approved during the inspection. These crane(s) must be used throughout the duration of the contract.

- In the event that the contractor is unable to provide the originally offered crane(s), alternate mobile crane(s) of the same or higher capacity may be permitted by Head of Nodal agency i.e. Head of Stores dept., provided they meet the Pre-Qualification Requirements (PQR) as specified in the Notice Inviting Tender (NIT). In this regard contractor has to request the user department for engaging other crane(s) in lieu of the earlier offered crane(s) with valid mobile crane documents along with physical inspection of mobile crane(s). After certification by user department only mobile crane can be replaced.
- No Purchase Order (PO) amendment is required for such substitution. Billing will be processed based on the user department's certification and in accordance with the agreed payment terms.
- 34. During execution of contract if any contractor failed to supply mobile crane(s) as per contract condition, the contract will be short closed and balance contract portion will be counteroffered to all eligible bidders (irrespective of contract awardee) of that particular rate schedule with same rate, terms and condition of contract as per their ranking in seriatim basis. Other condition as stated in SI. No. 1.21 of "Instruction to Bidders" are applicable accordingly.
- 35. In case of extra mobile crane requirement w.r.t. any schedule, L1 rate of that particular schedule will be counteroffered to all eligible bidders (irrespective of contract awardee) of that particular rate schedule with same rate, terms and condition of contract as per their ranking in seriatim basis. Other condition as stated in SI. No. 1.21 of "Instruction to Bidders" are applicable accordingly.
- 36. In case of short closing of contract due to administrative reason, contract of least ranked contractor will be short closed with 30 days' notice period. Re-allocation of cranes after short closing will be taken suitably and at discretion of BHEL.
- 37. At the time of rain or any situation where there is no work load, the area in-charges has the right to not avail the crane services and for the same penalty will not be imposed. However, prior intimation shall be provided to the contractor by the Execution Department.
- 38. The mobile crane awarded under this contract shall be deployed across various user departments of BHEL. The deployment shall be on a rotational basis, with each user department being allotted the crane by nodal agency i.e. Stores department for a period of one month/ three months at a time, or as otherwise decided by BHEL at its sole discretion.
 - A suitable roster for the mobile crane rotation may be prepared and issued by nodal agency i.e. Stores department, and the contractor shall adhere to the schedule as communicated. The contractor shall ensure uninterrupted service and readiness of the crane for use in accordance with the rotation plan issued.
- 39. Crane(s) will be allowed one day adjacent to Sunday or any holiday in a month for preventive maintenance, for that one day neither penalty will be levied nor payment will be made. However, it is subjected to prior permission from executing department and not mandatory.
- 40. During the contract period the contractor shall maintain the crane always in good working condition to the fullest satisfaction of BHEL. BHEL reserves the right to terminate the contract in case they are not so maintained to the satisfaction of BHEL.
- 41. The contractor shall be responsible for obtaining appropriate driving license etc., and complying with all the statutory requirements including labour laws that may be necessary in this respect.



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- 42. Proper trip register for crane as required by BHEL shall be maintained by the contractor's driver and the same shall be submitted to BHEL daily and all the time.
- 43. It is the responsibility of driver to get filled the entire column in the trip register and got signed by the user and certified by the concerned department in charge. In case of loss of original trip register, BHEL reserves the right as not to entertain the claim. The Crew shall maintain discipline & good conduct. They shall keep conducive relationship with BHEL personal or their authorized representatives.
- 44. BHEL Security personnel shall check the cranes engaged as and when required.
- 45. **TERMS OF PAYMENT**: 100% of the item rate shall be paid progressively on monthly basis as per bills raised by the contractor and certified by area in-charge.
- 46. MODE OF PAYMENT: All payments for the works completed shall be paid based on bills raised by the contractor as per payment terms and certified by area in-charge. Payment will be made within a reasonable time period for MSE vendors within 45 days, Medium Enterprise vendors within 60 days and for Non MSME vendors within 90 days from the date of submission of error free bills along with all the enclosures as called for by BHEL. Payment will be only through e-payment (through electronic fund transfer (EFT) / RTGS) only after deducting Bank charges as per BHEL terms of payment.
- 47. In case of any loss to Bharat Heavy Electricals Limited, caused due to stoppage of work without sufficient reason or damage to any equipment or components or any property thereof, due to the negligence and carelessness of the contractor's men, the responsibility shall rest with the contractor. The actual cost of the loss or damage together with the overhead will be recovered from the contractor's bill. The decision of BHEL regarding the cost of loss as well as the extent of cost of damage shall be final and conclusive.
- 48. Under no circumstances shall BHEL be liable to compensate for any loss or damage that may be caused to the Vehicle by accidents or complications arising out of such contingencies like fire, theft, riots, strikes and terrorism damage whether inside or outside BHEL premises while being engaged.
- 49. The contractor is directly responsible for injuries/ death of vehicle driver or any person employed by him as well as to the third-party occupants or other users arising due to accident or otherwise of vehicle during the contractual period. At any point of time, BHEL will not be responsible for any loss / damage either to the person or to the vehicle arising out of accident of the vehicle for performing the contractual obligations.
- 50. Any damage to BHEL materials due to rough and faulty handling by the contractor's men will have to be made good by the contractor to BHEL. Similarly, if any damage caused to BHEL equipment/installation, property of third party in the course of work by the contractor's men, the same shall be made good by the contractor.
- 51. "The Contractor shall be liable for the loss or damage to such property from whatever cause, including but not limited to theft, fire, destruction or damage of property due to reasons beyond the control of the Contractor, happening while such property is in the possession or under the control of the Contractor, their employees, workmen or agents or any other person connected with the Contractor."
- 52. BHEL will not be responsible for any consequences arising out of any violation of rules or acts by the contractor. If BHEL is liable to pay any such amount due to violation of the relevant laws by the contractor the amount so paid would be recovered from the contractor or adjusted from his pending hills
- 53. The contractor should possess necessary licenses, Permanent PF A/c No, and should take Insurance for his workers and produce them before commencement of work.
- 54. COMPLIANCE TO REGULATIONS AND BY-LAWS:
 - The Contractor shall conform to the provisions of any statute relating to the work and regulations and By-laws of any local authority. The Contractor shall be bound to give all notices required by statute regulations or By-Laws as aforesaid and to pay all fees and taxes payable to any authority in respect thereof.



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- 55. "In case of any internal dispute of the Contractor, such as but not limited to disputes between partners of the Contractor, dispute between Contractor and its employees, the same shall be intimated to BHEL within one (1) month from the date of dispute. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary, BHEL shall not be made a party any suit or legal proceeding in respect of such internal dispute. In case BHEL is made a party to the same, the Contractor and other party(ies) to the dispute, if signatories to this Agreement, shall indemnity BHEL for (a) all direct and indirect costs expended towards such legal proceedings immediately on the issue of a claim notice to that effect from BHEL and (b) any liability that may be imposed in such legal proceedings against BHEL."
- 56. Contractor has to ensure strict compliance of biometric recording through fingerprint for their laborer's. Contractor also has to ensure that all their laborer's record their attendance while entering/exiting factory premises.
- 57. Mobile phone/any electronic gadgets will not be allowed inside factory for crane crew member to ensure safety during work. However, mobile phone will be allowed for supervisor of respective mobile crane contractor for communication.
- 58. The liability for any compensation on account of injury sustained by an employee of the contractor will be exclusively that of the contractor.
- 59. "BHEL reserves the right to suspend the work or part thereof put a hold on further loading to the Contractor at any time for any reason at its discretion and no claim whatsoever on this account will be entertained".
- 60. "Notwithstanding anything to the contrary, BHEL shall have the full rights to exclude the Contractor or any of its employees/ vendors, etc. from the BHEL premises".
- 61. "The Contractor hereby understands and agrees that BHEL BAP Ranipet is a prohibited place under the Official Secrets Act and undertakes to comply with all legal and other provisions, and directions as may be issued from time to time by the concerned authorities including the Security Department of BHEL".
- 62. As required under the Tamilnadu contract Labour (Regulation and abolition) rules 1975, the contractor will have to obtain the License in advance. This should be produced as and when demanded, if not, appropriate action will be taken against the contractor.
- 63. Since with effect from 01.11.1990 Provident Fund becomes applicable for engagement of a worker even for a single day, deduction of PF by the contractor has to be ensured. All such contractors have to apply to the PF Commissioner and get a separate code number allotted to them if they have not already been allotted a number or registered elsewhere or they are an exempted establishment having their own PF Trust etc. Proof of deduction as well as remittance of the PF dues to the appropriate authorities has also to be shown and proper records maintained.
- 64. The Contractor has to apply and provide ESI facilities to all his employees concern. Similarly, the contractor shall cover all his workers under ESI scheme and produce the enrolment/Code number allotted by ESI Authorities. The contractor shall be asked to furnish along with the bill each month for having effected payment of both deduction/contribution towards PF/ESI to the concerned statutory authorities.
- 65. The workmen engaged under this contract shall be covered by a comprehensive insurance scheme in the joint names of the contractor and BHEL. A copy of the attested policy along with premium receipt shall be deposited with BHEL before commencement of work.
- 66. The contractor shall pay the minimum wages to his workers not less than the wages that are being notified by the Tamilnadu Government under the minimum wages Act effective from 01.04.2025 applicable for Engineering and Fabrication industry from time to time.
- 67. The contractor has to ensure payment of the statutory prescribed minimum wages as applicable from time to time and maintain proper records of their timely disbursement. These records would need to be preserved and made available even after the contract is over for any verification by the various statutory authorities.



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68. **GST: -**

Registration & GST Rate:

- a) Bidder should indicate GSTIN No. (Copy of GST registration to be enclosed) and PAN No. (copy of PAN to be enclosed).
- b) Tender will be considered/accepted, if & only if the vendor has a valid GST Registration No.
- c) Central Tax/ State Tax/ Integrated Tax/ Union Territory tax to be quoted as extra in %.
- d) Bidders to ensure correct applicability of Central Tax/ State Tax/ Integrated Tax/ Union Territory tax based on the Inter / Intra state movement Supply of goods and provision services or both.

Invoicing & Payment:

- a) The Tax Invoice for supply of Goods & Services should be raised as per the provision of GST Act & Rules and must compulsorily mention the following:
 - i. BHEL-RANIPET GSTIN: 33AAACB4146P2ZL or GSTIN of BHEL Nodal Agency as mentioned in NIT or informed subsequently.
 - ii. HSN Code or Service Accounting Code for supply of goods or services.
 - iii. Name & address of supplier
 - iv. GSTIN of Supplier
 - v. Consecutive Serial Number & date of issue
 - vi. Description of goods or services
 - vii. Total value of supply
 - viii. Taxable value of supply
 - ix. Tax Rate Central Tax & State Tax or Integrated Tax, Cess
 - x. Amount of Tax charged
 - xi. Place of supply
 - xii. Address of delivery if different from place of supply
 - xiii. Signature of authorized signatory
- b) Reimbursement of GST to the vendor is contingent upon complying with the following condition by the service provider:
 - i. Uploading the onward GST Return (GSTR-1) in GSTN Network portal within the statutory time period.
 - ii. Discharging the GST tax liability to the Government.
 - iii. Submission of Tax Invoice to BHEL.
 - iv. Submission of proof of payment of GST to BHEL.
 - v. Availing of Input Tax Credit by BHEL.

Input tax credit:

- a) In case GST credit is delayed/ denied to BHEL, due to non/delayed receipt of goods and/or services and/or tax invoice or expiry of timeline prescribed in GST Law for availing such ITC, or any other reason not attributable to BHEL, GST amount shall be recoverable from Vendor along with interest & penalty levied/ leviable.
- b) In case vendor delays declaring such invoice in his return and GST credit availed by BHEL is denied or reversed subsequently as per GST law, GST amount paid by BHEL towards such ITC reversal as per GST law shall be recoverable from vendor/contractor along with interest & penalty levied/ leviable on BHEL.
- c) In case of discrepancy in the data uploaded by supplier in the GSTN portal or in case of any incomplete work/service, then BHEL will not be able to avail the tax credit and will notify the supplier of the same. Supplier has to rectify the data discrepancy in the GSTN portal or issue credit note (details to be uploaded in GSTN portal).



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d) For any such delay in availing of tax credit for reasons attributable to vendor (as mentioned above), interest as per the GST Act & Rules, along with penalty, if any will be deducted for the delayed period i.e. from the month of receipt till the month tax credit is availed, from the running bills.

Penalty for Non-compliance of GST Act:

Penalty amount so determined along with GST if applicable thereon shall be recovered from the contractor.

Anti-profiteering Measure:

Any reduction in rate of Tax on any supply of goods or services or the benefit of input tax credit shall be passed on to the recipient by way of commensurate reduction in prices.

Other Provisions:

- a) All the terms & conditions of the contract with respect to Taxes & Duties are subject to the new taxation laws introduced from time to time (e.g., GST). The terms & conditions will be modified in accordance with the provisions of new laws (e.g., GST).
- b) In case any changes in taxes and duties as per Gov. Notification (including GST), the same shall be applicable from time to time.
- c) If the Contractor is not registered for any statutory obligation and not liable there to, then a declaration shall be submitted along with offer that they are within the threshold limit.
- d) If any changes in GST (statuary variation) will be to the account of BHEL. But if the variation is effective during the delayed/extended period of execution for reasons attributable to the vendor, the same shall be borne by the contractor only. The required compliance under relevant statue shall be carried out.
- 69. <u>TAXES & DUTIES:</u> The tenderer shall not include GST in their quoted rates. The GST rates and its working shall be indicated separately in the price bid. The successful tenderer shall register themselves with the GST authority in the state of Tamilnadu or any other state. The GST shall be reimbursed against documentary evidence. The current rate of GST is @ 18% of taxable service rendered

70. TERMS AND CONDITIONS WITH REGARD TO COMPLIANCE OF VARIOUS LABOUR LAWS BY THE CONTRACTORS FOR BHEL.

- a) The contractor shall not employ in connection with the work any person who has not completed 18 years of age.
- b) The contractor shall in respect of labour employed by him either directly or through subcontractors, comply with or cause to be complied with the following statutory provisions and rules and in regard to all matters provided therein.
 - The contract labour (Regulation and abolition Act 1970) and the related Central Rules 1971.
 - ii. The minimum wages Act1948 and the related Tamilnadu Rules.
 - iii. The payment of wages Act 1936 and the related Tamilnadu Rules.
 - iv. The Factories Act 1948 and the related Tamilnadu Rules.
 - v. The Employees Provident Fund and Miscellaneous Provisions Act 1952.
 - vi. The Employees State Insurance Act 1948.
 - vii. The workmen's Compensation Act 1923.
 - viii. The Industrial Dispute Act 1947, and any other law, or modifications to the above or to the rules made there under from time to time.

c) **REGISTRATION AND LICENSING**:

Every contractor shall register his/her name with the welfare section of BHEL before taking up the work awarded to him/her by giving the following information and getting a code number:

- i. The name of the contractor.
- ii. Nature of contract work.

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- iii. Period of work.
- iv. Number of maximum labours employed by him on any one day.
- v. License No. and date (applicable in case of contractors employing 20 or more worker)
- vi. Whether enrolled for PF, ESI etc., and enrolment No. (contractor shall obtain their own PF code)

This information is called for the purpose of informing the inspector of Factories wherever they call for information regarding contracts.

- d) The contractor employing 20 or more workmen is required to obtain license from the authorities {The Deputy Chief Labour Commissioner (Central) Chennai}. This license shall be amended and/or renewed wherever there is an increase in the workmen employed by him/her or in the event of contract being extended or renewed. The contractor shall inform the license number to the BHEL management before taking up the work.
- e) The contractor (Licensed or unlicensed) shall promptly furnish every information and document required by BHEL authorities for the purpose of fulfilling their obligations as principal employer and/or occupier of the factory and shall render all necessary assistance for the same.
- f) The contractor shall ensure that all his workmen are covered under the Employees State Insurance Act and produce the registration number/enrolment number to the welfare section before executing the contract.
- g) The contractor shall also ensure that all his/her workmen are covered under Employees Provident Fund and Misc. Provisions Act 1952.

h) Minimum daily wages to be paid by the contractor (in INR)

i) "BHEL Adhoc for contract workmen will be subsumed with any future increase in Dearness Allowance / Basic wages (as notified by the Tamil Nadu Government under the minimum wages Act applicable for Engineering and Fabrication industry from time to time). After subsuming BHEL Adhoc, any further increase in Dearness Allowance / Basic wages as notified by the Tamil Nadu Government under the



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minimum wages Act applicable for Engineering and Fabrication industry from time to time, will have to be borne by the contractor".

- j) Payment of Bonus to be ensured as per Bonus act. Further, Payment of Bonus should be made once in a year (with final bill). Document evidence of bonus payment shall be enclosed along with the final Bill.
- k) Encashment of EL is to be regularize based on the balance leave available at the time of final bill only.
- 1) The contractor has to pay the wages to their workers through worker's Bank account only. no hand payment will be acceptable.
- m) The statutory requirements like PF (with ceiling of Rs. 15,000), ESI will be applicable for the actual total wage per month. Contractor quoted rate shall be inclusive of all the above payments including statutory payments thereon.
- n) The contractor shall ensure payment of wages to the contract labour employed by him/her within three days from the end of wage period in case the wage period is one week or a fortnight & in all other cases before 10th day of the following month.
- o) All payment of wages shall be made on working days at the work site and during the working time and on dates notified in advance. In case the work is completed before the expiry of the wage period final payment shall be made within 48 hours of the last working day.
- p) Where the employment of any worker is terminated by or on behalf of the contractor, the wages earned by him shall be paid before the expiry of the second working day from the day on which his employment is terminated.
- q) Notices showing the rates of wages, weekly rest days, hours of work, wage period, date of payment of wages, names and addresses of the inspectors having jurisdiction, the date of unpaid wages shall be displayed in Tamil and English in conspicuous places at the establishment and working by the contractor. The contractor shall inform the BHEL management every month the details of contract labour engaged for each contact in the following form.
 - Serial Number
 - ii. Location
 - iii. Period of work
 - iv. No. of contract labour engaged during the month
 - v. No. of days worked
 - vi. No. of man days worked
 - vii. Wages paid to his/her workers

The above statement shall be furnished to BHEL management at the end of every month

r) REGISTERS RECORDS AND COLLECTION OF STATISTICS.

The following documents/formats under Contract Labour (Regulation and Abolition) Act 1970 and related Central Rules 1971 shall be maintained by each contractor.

- 1. Form A Employee Register
- 2. Form B Wage Register
- 3. Form C Register of Loan / Advance / Fine / Damage / Loss.
- 4. Form D Register of Attendance.
- 5. Form E Register of Leave / Rest / Compensatory off.
- 6. Employment Card
- 7. One-month notice of all the contract workmen before completion of work.
- s) The contractor shall display the abstract of the contract labour (Regulation and application) Act and the rules there under both English and Tamil.

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- t) Half yearly return shall be sent by the contractor in duplicate to the licensing officer.
- u) The contractor shall submit the returns required under the Contract Labour (Regulation and Abolition) Act 1970 periodically to BHEL management.
- v) The contractor shall without fail give up to date information in writing of the attendance of the workers employed by him/her.
- w) The contractor shall ensure that his/her workers keep and produce their employment card when coming to duty and take them back when leaving duty.
- x) All the above registers and records shall be preserved in original for a period of three years. All the registers, records and notice maintained under the Act and Rules shall be produced on demand by Inspector or any Authority under the Act.
- y) No workers shall be required or allowed to work on Sunday unless he has or will have a Holiday or any one of the three days before or after the said day.
- z) The contractor shall inform BHEL Management in the prescribed form details or the contract workers scheduled to work on Sunday, the day of rest and also indicate the substituted holiday in lieu thereof. This shall be intimated two days in advance before his/her workmen are booked for work on Sunday.
- aa) The contract labour working for more than nine hours in any day or for more than 48 hours in any week shall be paid wages at the rate of twice the ordinary rates of wages in accordance with the provisions of section 59 of the Factories Act 1948 and any amendment thereof.
- bb) The contractor shall provide all safety devices and personal protective equipment to his workmen at his/her own cost and shall ensure that his workmen wear/use such devices or equipment provided to them while doing the work and there should not be any relaxation on this.
- cc) The contractor shall give four paid national holidays to his workers, viz. 26th January, 1st May, 15th August and 2nd October. The contractor shall ensure that his/her workmen vacate the premises after the shift is over.
- dd) The contractor shall give leave with wages to his/her workmen who have worked for a period of 240 days or more in the factory premises during a calendar year. This leave shall be allowed during the subsequent calendar year at the rate of one day for every 20 days or work performed by the worker during the previous calendar year. The worker whose service commences on a day other than the first of January shall be entitled to leave with wages at the above rate (one day for every 20 days or work) only if he had worked for a minimum of 2/3 of the total number of days in the reminder of the calendar year. This leave will be admissible only during the subsequent calendar year.
- ee) The contractor shall comply with the provisions relating to welfare and health facilities as provided to the Contract Labour (Regulation and Abolition) Act 1970 read with the Tamilnadu contract labour Rules.
- ff) Notwithstanding anything contrary to this, in the event of accident the contractor shall be required to fill injury report and submit the Engineer In-charge immediately and ensure the compliance of ESI/Workmen's Compensation Act, Factories Act and Rules made there under. He shall also maintain a register of accident as per the Act.
- gg) The contractor shall get the contract labour engaged by him insured under Workmen's Compensation Policy from General Insurance Corporation of India before actually starting the work of contract. The insurance coverage should be for the entire period of contract. The contractor shall comply with the provisions of the Workmen's Compensation Act 1923 (This should be read in connection with the provisions of ESI Act).
- hh) The contractor shall ensure that all his workmen are covered under the Employees State Insurance Act and produce to BHEL such Registration number/Enrolment number before executing the contract work.



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- ii) The contractor shall regularly pay the amount of contribution i.e., employer's contribution as well as employees' contribution in pursuance of the above scheme as fixed from time to time. The contribution payable presently is **0.75%** of wages to be recovered from his/her workmen and **3.25%** of wages to be contributed by the contractor. Contribution recovered from employee and contribution made by the contractor may be rounded to the next higher multiples of five paisa.
- jj) The contractor shall take note of any amendment that may be brought forth in the above contribution rate and act accordingly.
- kk) The contractor shall ensure that his/her workmen are covered under the EPF and miscellaneous Provisions Act 1952 and accordingly produce to the BHEL Management the registration/enrolment number before award of contract work.
- II) All employees are eligible to become a member of provident fund from the date of joining the establishment and the worker and contractor contributions are 12% and 13% respectively. The contractor is also liable to pay any administrative charges in this behalf that may be decided from time to time. It will be the responsibility of the contractor to ensure such contribution payable in respect of workmen employed through sub-contractors also.
- mm) The contractor shall take note of any amendment in the rate of contribution payable under the scheme from time to time.
 - nn) The contractor shall within seven days of the close of every month submit to BHEL a statement showing the amount of contribution payable/paid for employees engaged by him or through him and shall also furnish to BHEL such information, as principal employer is required to furnish under the provisions of the ESI Act and PF as well as the scheme made there under to the authorities concerned.
- oo) Whenever any sum of money is found to be recoverable from or payable by the contractor under the above acts, the same shall be deducted from any sum that may be due or which at any time thereafter may become due to the contractor under this contract or under any other contract or from his security deposit. In case the recoveries are not sufficient to satisfy the claims, the contractor shall pay the balance thereof on demand. In case any recoveries are made under this clause from the security deposit the contractor shall immediately thereafter pay such further sums as may be required to recoup the shortage caused by such recoveries in the amount of security deposit.
- pp) The contractor shall abide by all the labour and other laws applicable to contract labour/worker under this contract and shall at all times keep BHEL, indemnified against all losses, claims, prosecution under any law.
- qq) In case of noncompliance of any of the provisions of the acts and in case BHEL having complied with the same, BHEL will be entitled to recover the same from the contractor/sub-contractor.
- rr) Non-exercise of any of the powers or rights available to BHEL hereunder or under any law, shall not in any way operate as waiver thereof.
- ss) Contractor should follow all the provisions of labour legislation and statutory obligations. Provisions as and when amended will also apply.
- 71. WCM is arranging this contract as a nodal agency. Execution of work, Bill Certification, Bill passing, Payment, Penalty, Contract closing etc. is the responsibility of end user.
- 72. The contractor should have to arrange police verification certificate of concern workers (whom they are going to be engaged for these works) for obtaining entry pass.



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73. SAFETY PRECAUTIONS TO BE TAKEN BY THE CONTRACTOR

- a) The Contractor must inspect the area of work to decide the safety precautions necessary for executing this contract.
- b) Whenever people work at height more than six feet, platform shall be provided or the workers shall wear safety belt to avoid fall from the height.
- c) Wherever any area declared as dangerous, the workers shall not be allowed to work till a written clearance is obtained from appropriate authorities.
- d) No material of any kind shall be dropped or allowed to be dropped from any height.
- e) Defective ladders shall not be used at all.
- f) Inflammable materials shall not be stored near places where the sparks are likely to occur.
- g) The necessary safety equipment must be issued to the workmen at contractor's cost and strictly to be used while carrying out the work.
- h) Appropriate safety equipment's are to be supplied by the contractor for his workers from day one onwards and should be used during all processes. If the contractor's workers found violating the safety precautions, punitive action will be taken and or a penalty of Rs.500/- to Rs.1000/- will be imposed and deducted from the contractor bill for each violation.
- i) The working area shall be kept clean and free from all obstructions.
- j) All temporary electrical connections shall be properly earthed, insulated and periodically checked.
- k) All safety precautions are to be taken by the contractor at his cost.
- 74. The contractor's responsibility for this contract shall commence from the date of issue of order of acceptance of his tender.
- 75. BHEL will not bound by any power of Attorney granted by the tenderer or changes in the composition of the firm made subsequent to the execution of the contract. They may, however, recognize such power of attorney and changes after obtaining proper legal advice, the cost of which will be chargeable to the contract concerned.
- 76. Words imparting the singular number shall have deemed to include the plural number and vice versa where the context so require.
- 77. The expenses for completing and stamping the agreement shall be to the contractor's account.
- 78. The general and special conditions of contract are complementary to each other and where they are in conflict, the special conditions shall prevail. In regard to matters not covered by the General or Special conditions of contract, those contained in the specifications approved by BHEL, shall apply.
- 79. The "GENERAL CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT" and "SPECIAL CONDITIONS OF THE CONTRACT" shall be deemed to form an integral part of contract for the work to be entered into.
- 80. The filled ESI declaration forms shall be submitted to the Executive of HRM Dept. In the Declaration Form full address of the contractor shall be mentioned. Whenever a fresh and unregistered worker is engaged during the operation of contract, declaration form in respect of that workman which should be submitted to Human Resources Department within two days of such engagement.
- 81. ESI contributions (0.75% employee's contribution + 3.25% employer contribution of the total monthly wages) before 20th day of every following month. Prescribed challans are available at ESI local office, Ranipet (near Sipcot). Contractors who have got their own code number can remit the contributions on that number. Along with the challan copy, the details of remittance shall be submitted to the concerned HRM Executive in the ESI compliance form.
- 82. The contractor should deduct Provident Fund and ESI amount as per the provisions and amount so deducted along with the matching contribution of the contractor shall be remitted to the authorities concerned within the stipulated time. The statement of deduction along with the challans evidencing remittance shall be submitted to Officer-in- charge. If the evidences are not shown, further bills of the contractor will not be paid. BHEL have the right to withhold the payment of his bills. Submission of



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statutory returns such as Half Yearly returns of ESI (Form 6), P.F. return (Form 12A), Form 5 and Form 10, Form 3A & Form 6A should be send to the concerned officers in time.

- 83. The workers" particulars such as Name, Age, Father's name, address, Phone no, etc., and their daily attendance have to be maintained by the contractor. The details of Provident Fund and ESI compliance have to be maintained by the contractor in the prescribed format/register.
- 84. The contractor shall maintain the following Registers and Records and make them available for inspection at any time. (The list is only for example, but not exhaustive).
 - a) Muster Roll
 - b) Register of Wages
 - c) Register of Deductions
 - d) Register of Overtime
 - e) Register of Fine
 - f) Register of Advance
 - g) Wage slips
 - h) Register of Accidents
 - i) Register of Leave with Wages
 - j) ESI Register in Form-7

All registers are required to be maintained as above and shall be produced as and when Government Officials and Statutory Authorities to make inspection from time to time.

- 85. In case a contract labourer meets with an accident while on duty, the contractor shall immediately intimate the information to Safety Department, Contracting Agency and Human Resources Department and submit the Accident Report duly filled in all respect and send a copy to ESI local office, ESI Dispensary and Inspector of Factories (for major accidents) within 24 hours of accident through Safety and Human Resources Departments. All assistance for the injured workman such as to taking him to ESI Dispensary for treatment must be rendered by the contractor.
- 86. Compliance of the above provisions does not absolve the obligation of contractor arising out of other statutory obligations.
- 87. Contractor should employ only persons having sound health and not above the age of 60 years, and not below the age of 18 years.
- 88. The Contractor agrees that no claim for interest or damages will be entertained or be payable by BHEL in respect of any money or balances or amounts of whatsoever nature which may be lying with BHEL owing to any disputes or differences between the parties irrespective of whether the same is decided by any authority to be paid or returned to the Contractor."
- 89. Certificate by the executing department that all statutory requirements including PF, ESI, Minimum wages, Insurance, GST, etc. are complied with by the Contractor. This should be duly backed by the relevant documents".
- 90. If the contractor is not able to provide the sufficient resources for the execution of work for a period of continuous 15 days, BHEL reserves the right to terminate the contract and to take appropriate action against the contactor. In the event of contact termination, security deposit paid by the contractor will be forfeited.
- 91. In case of breach of any or whole of the above terms and conditions by the contractor BHEL will have the liberty to cancel the registration and contract either in part or in full.



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CHAPTER 6

GENERAL CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT

1. **DEFINITION**: -

In these General Conditions of Contract, the following terms shall have the meaning hereby assigned to them, except where the context otherwise requires: -

- a) The "Contract" means, the documents forming the tender and acceptance thereof, together with all the documents referred to therein including general and special conditions to contract. All these documents as applicable taken together shall be deemed to form one contract and shall be complementary to one another.
- b) The "Work" means, the work described in the tender documents in individual work-orders as may be issued from time to time to the contractor by the officer-in charge with in the power conferred upon him including all notified or additional items of works and obligations to be carried out as required for the performance of contract.
- c) The "Contractor" means, the individual firm or company whether incorporated or not, undertaking the work and shall include the legal personal representatives of such individuals or the persons composing the firm or company or the successors of the form or company and the permitted assigns of such individual or firm or company.
- d) "The officer-in charge" means, the officer deputed by the HOD/WCM to supervise the work or part of the work.
- e) "Approved" and "Directed" means, the approval or direction of HOD/WCM, or person deputed by him for the particular purposes.
- f) "BHARAT HEAVY ELECTRICAL LIMITED" (herein after referred to as BHEL) shall mean the Board of Directors, Chairman, Executive Director, General Manager or other administrative office of the sad company including HOD/WCM authorized to invite tenders and enter into contract for works on behalf of the company.
- g) The "Contract sum" means, the sum accepted or the sun calculated in accordance with the prices accepted in tender and / or the contract rates as payable to the contractor for the execution of work during the currency of the contract.
- h) A "week" means, seven days, without regard to the number of hours worked or not worked in ay day in that week.
- i) A "day" means, the day of 24 hours (Twenty-Four) irrespective of the number of hours worked or not worked in that day.
- j) A "working day" means, any day other than that prescribed by the NEGOTIABLE INSTRUMENTS ACT as being a holiday, and consists of the number of hours of labour as commonly recognized by good employers in the trade in the district where the work is carried out or as laid down in the BHEL regulation.

2. HEADING TO THE CONTRACT CONDITIONS: -

The heading to these conditions shall not affect the interpretations thereof.

3. WORK TO BE CARRIED OUT: -

The contract shall, include all labour, materials, tools, plant, equipment and transport which may be required for the execution of work. The contractor will be deemed to have satisfied himself as to the nature of the site, local facilities of access and all matters affecting the execution of work. No extra charges consequent on any misunderstanding in these resects or otherwise will be allowed.



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4. **DEVIATIONS**: -

The contractor shall not carry out any work not covered by schedule except in the pursuance of the written instructions of HOD/WCM. No such work shall be valid unless the same has been specifically confirmed and accepted by the BHEL in writing and incorporated in the contract.

5. OCTROI AND OTHER DUTIES: -

All charges on account of octroi terminal or sales tax or other duties on materials obtained for the work shall be borne by the contractor.

6. PLANT AND EQUIMENT: -

The contractor shall at his own expense, supply all tools, plant and equipment (herein after referred to as T&P) required for the execution of the contract.

7. ASSIGNMENT OF TRANSFER OF CONTRACT: -

The contractor shall not without the prior written approval of the BHEL, assign or transfer the contract or any part thereof, or any share, or interest thereon to any other persons. No sum of money which may become payable under the contract shall be payable to any person, other than the contractor unless the prior written approval of the BHEL to the assignment or transfer of such money is given.

8. SUB-CONTRACT: -

The contractor shall not sub-let any portion of the contract without the prior written approval of the

9. COMPLIANCE TO REGULATIONS AND BYE-LAWS: -

The contractor shall confirm to the provisions of any statute relating to the work and regulations and bye-laws of any local authority. The contractor shall be bound to give all notices required by statute regulations or by-laws as aforesaid and to pay all fees and taxes payable to any authority in respect thereof.

10. SECURITY DEPOSIT: -

SECURITY DEPOSIT shall be collected from the successful tenderer. The total amount of security deposit will be 5% of the contract value (total hire charges for the 07 taxis).

Mode of Deposit:

- 1) Cash (as permissible under the extant Income Tax Act)
- 2) Local cheques of Scheduled Banks (subject to realization)/ Pay Order/ Demand Draft/ Electronic Fund Transfer in favour of BHEL.

Following are the steps for online submission of Security Deposit-

a) Pay online (SBI Collect)

- 3) Bank Guarantee from Scheduled Banks/ Public Financial Institutions as defined in the Companies Act. The Bank Guarantee format should have the approval of BHEL
- 4) Fixed Deposit Receipt issued by Scheduled Banks/ Public Financial Institutions as defined in the Companies Act (FDR should be in the name of the Contractor, a/c BHEL)
- 5) Securities available from Indian Post offices such as National Savings Certificates, Kisan Vikas Patras etc. (held in the name of Contractor furnishing the security and duly endorsed/hypothecated/ pledged, as applicable, in favour of BHEL)
- 6) Insurance Surety Bonds

(Note: BHEL will not be liable or responsible in any manner for the collection of interest or renewal of the documents or in any other matter connected therewith)

At least 50% of the required Security Deposit, should be collected before start of the work. Balance of the Security Deposit can be collected by deducting 10% of the gross amount progressively from each of the running bills of the Contractor till the total amount of the required Security Deposit is collected.

In case of delay in submission of performance security, enhanced performance security which would include interest (Repo rate + 4%) for the delayed period, shall be submitted by the bidder.

If the value of work done at any time exceeds the contract value, the amount of Security Deposit shall be correspondingly enhanced and the additional Security Deposit shall be immediately deposited by the Contractor or recovered from payment/s due to the Contractor.

The recoveries made from running bills (cash deduction towards balance SD amount) can be released against submission of equivalent Bank Guarantee in acceptable form, but only once, before completion of work, with the approval of the authority competent to award the work.

Security deposit shall not carry any interest.

11. Security deposit shall be refunded only after successful completion of the contract to BHEL's satisfaction and presents an absolute "No Demand Certificate" in the prescribed form and returns properties belonging to BHEL handed over, lent or hired by him for carrying out the said works, Security Deposit will be released to the Contractor after deducting all cost of expenses or other amounts that are to be paid to BHEL under this or other contracts entered into with the Contractor. It



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may be noted that in no case the Security Deposit shall be refunded/released prior to passing of final bill.

- 12. Should a tenderer or a contractor has a relative or in the case of a firm or company of contractors, any of its shareholder's relative, employed in Bharat Heavy Electricals Ltd, the authority inviting tenders shall be informed of this fact at the time of submission of the offer, failing which the offer may be disqualified or if such fact subsequently come to light, the contract may be cancelled.
- 13. BHEL shall not be responsible for any loss of securities, due to liquidation for any other reasons, whatso-ever or any depreciation in the value of the securities while in their charge or for any loss of interest there on.
- 14. All compensation or other sums of money payable by the Contractor to BHEL under the terms of this contract or under any other contract with BHEL may be deducted from the Security Deposit or realised by the sale of the securities or from the interest arising therefrom or from any sums which may be due or may become due to the contractor by BHEL and in the event of this Security Deposit being deducted by reason of such deductions or sale, as aforesaid, the Contractor shall within 7 days thereafter, make good in cash or in securities endorsed as aforesaid, any sum by which the Security Deposit has been reduced.

15. ORDERS UNDER THE CONTRACT: -

All orders, notices etc. to be given under the contract shall be in writing, type-script or printed and if sent by registered post to the address given in the tender of the contract, shall be deemed to have been served on the date, when in the ordinary course they would have been delivered to him.

16. CONTRACTOR'S SUPERVISION: -

The contractor shall either himself supervise the execution of the contract or shall appoint a complement agent acceptable to the HOD/WCM to act in his stead. Orders given to the contractor's agent shall be considered to have the same force as if they have been given to the contractor himself. The contractor or his accredited agent shall attend when required without making any claim for doing so, either the office of the HOD/WCM or the OFFICE-IN CHARGE, to received instructions.

17. The HOD/WCM shall have full powers and without assigning any reason, required the contractor to immediately cease to employ in connection with this contract, any agent, servant or employee where continued employment is in his opinion undesirable. The contractor shall not be allowed any compensation on this account.

18. **LABOUR**: -

The contractor shall remain liable for the payment of all wages or other moneys to his work people or employees under the payment of wages act 1936, Employees Liability Act 1938, Workmen Compensation Act 1923 or any other Act or enactment, relating thereto and rules framed, thereunder from time to time.

19. PRECAUTIONS UNDER RISK: -

The contractor shall be responsible for providing at his own expense for all precautions to prevent loss or damage from any and all risks and to minimize the amount of any such loss or damage and for the necessary steps to be taken for the said purposes.



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20. DAMAGE & LOSS TO PRIVATE PROPOERTY & INJURY TO WORKMEN: -

The contractor shall at his own expenses reinstate and make good to the satisfaction of the HOD/WCM and pay compensation for any injury, loss or damage occurred to any property or rights whatever including property and rights of BHEL (or agents) servants or employee of BHEL, the injury loss or damage arising out of or in any way in connection with the execution or purported execution of the contract and further the contractor shall indemnify, the BHEL against all claims enforceable against BHEL (or any agent, servant or employee of BHEL) or which would be so enforceable against BHEL where BHEL is a private person, in respect of any such injury (including injury resulting I death) loss or damage to any person whomsoever or property including all claims which may arise under the workmen's compensation act or otherwise.

21. LAWS GOVERNING THE CONTRACT: -

The contract shall be governed by the India laws for time being in force.

22. CANCELLATION OF CONTRACT FOR CORRUPT ACTS: -

BHEL, whose decision shall be final and conclusive, shall without prejudice to any other right or remedy which shall have accrued shall accrue thereafter to BHEL cancel the contract in any if the following cases and the contractor shall be liable to make payment to BHEL for any loss or damage resulting from any such cancellation to the same extend as provided in the case of cancellation for default. If the contractor shall: -

a) Offer or give or agree to give to any person in BHEL service any gift or consideration of any kind, as an inducement or reward for doing or for bearing to do or for having done or for borne to do any act, in relation to the obtaining or execution of this or any other contract for BHEL service.

(OR)

b) enter in to a contract with BHEL in connection with which commission has been paid or agreed to be paid by him or with his knowledge, unless the particulars of any such commission and the terms of payment thereof have previously been disclosed in writing to BHEL.

(OR)

c) obtain a contract with BHEL as a result of ring tendering or by non-bonfire methods of competitive tendering, without first disclosing the fact in writing to BHEL.

23. CANCELLATION OF CONTRACT FOR INSOLVENCY ASSIGNMENT OF TRANSFER OR SUBLETTING OF CONTRACT: -

BHEL, without prejudice to any other right or remedy, which shall have accrued or shall accrue thereafter to BHEL shall cancel the contract in any of the following cases:

If the contractor:

a) being an individual or if a firm any partner thereof shall at any time be adjudged bankrupt or have a receiving order for administration of his estate, made against him or shall take any proceedings for liquidation or composition under any bankruptcy Act or assignment of his effects of composition or arrangement for the benefit of his creditors or purport to do so, or if any application made under any Bankruptcy Act for the time being in force for the sequestration of his estate or if a trust deed be granted by him on behalf of his creditors

(OR)

b) being a Company, shall pass a resolution or the Court shall make an order for the liquidation of its affairs, or a receiver or Manager on-behalf of the debenture holders shall be appointed or



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circumstances shall arise which entitle the Court or debenture holders to appoint a receiver or Manager,

(OR)

c) Assigns, Transfers, Sub-lets or attempts to assign, transfer or sub-let any portion of the work without the prior written approval of the BHEL.

24. CANCELLATION OF CONTRACT IN PART OF FULL FOR CONTRACTOR'S DEFAULT: -

If the contractor,

- a) makes default in carrying out the work as directed and continues in that state after a reasonable notice from HOD/WCM or his authorised representative.
- b) fails to comply with any of the Terms and Conditions of the contract or after reasonable notice in writing with orders properly issued thereunder.
- 25. BHEL, may without prejudice to any other right or remedy which shall have accrued or shall accrue thereafter to BHEL CANCEL the contract as whole or in part thereof or only such work order or items of work in default from the contract.

26. TERMINATION OF CONTRACT ON THE DEATH OF CONTRACTOR: -

Without prejudice to any of the rights or remedies under this contract, if the Contractor dies, or if the firm is dissolved or the company is liquidated BHEL shall have the option of terminating the contract without compensation to the Contractor.

27. SPECIAL POWER TO TERMINATION: -

If at any time after the award of contract, BHEL shall for any reason whatsoever not require whole or any part of the work to be carried out the HOD/WCM shall give notice in writing of the fact to the Contractor who shall have no claim to any payment of compensation or otherwise howsoever on account of any profit or advantage which he might have derived from the execution of the work in full but which he did not derive in consequence of the fore-closing of the work.

"If any employee/labourer working in the contract is found involved in corruption activities, the contract will be terminated and the contractor will be banned for applying for any future contract for 3 years."

28. RECOVERY FROM CONTRACTOR: -

Whenever under the contract, any sum of money, shall be recoverable from or payable by the Contractors, the same may be deducted from or any sum then due or which at any time thereafter may become due to Contractor under the contract or under any other contract with BHEL or from his Security Deposit or he shall pay the claim on demand.

29. BREACH OF CONTRACT, REMEDIES AND TERMINATION:

If the Contractor fails to provide the required services as per the Contract / fails to deliver the goods or materials or any instalment thereof within the period(s) fixed for such delivery or delivers goods or services not of the contracted quality and failing to adhere to the contract specifications or at any time repudiates or otherwise abandons the contract before expiry of such period or refuses or is unable to supply / provide goods / services or materials covered by the Order/Contract either in whole or in part or otherwise fails to perform the Order/Contract or commits any breach of the Order/Contract not herein specifically provided for, the contractor agrees that BHEL would be entitled to recover 10% of the contract value as damages for breach. Such compensation may be recovered from the security instruments like performance/security bank guarantee available with BHEL. In case the value of the security instruments available is less than 10% of the contract value, the balance amount shall be



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recovered from other financial remedies (i.e. available bills of the contractor, retention amount, etc. with BHEL) under the contract or other legal remedies.

The balance scope shall be got done independently without Risk & Cost of the failed supplier/contractor. Further, levy of liquidated damages, debarment, termination, de-scoping, short-closure, etc., shall be applied as per provisions of the contract.

30. POST TECHNICAL AUDIT OF WORK AND BILLS: -

BHEL reserves the right to carry out the post-payment Audit and technical examination of the work and final bill including all supporting vouchers, abstracts etc., and enforce recovery of any sum becoming due as a result thereof in the manner provided in the presiding sub-paragraphs. However, no such recovery shall be enforced after three years of passing the final bill.

31. SIGNING OF CONTRACT: -

Each contract document shall be signed by the Contractor with his usual signature. Contract by partnership of Hindu Joint Family firm, may be signed in the FIRM'S name by one of the Partners or the Karta or Manager as the case may be or by any other duly authorised representative followed by the name and designation of the persons so signing. Contracts by a Company shall be signed with the name of the Company by a person authorised in this behalf and a power of attorney or other satisfactory proof showing that the persons signing the Contract documents on behalf of the Company is duly authorised to do so, shall accompany the contract.

32. FORCE MAJEURE CLAUSE: -

"Force Majeure" shall mean any event beyond the reasonable control of the BHEL or of the Contractor, as the case may be, and which is unavoidable notwithstanding the reasonable care of the party affected, and shall include, without limitation, the following:

- i. war, hostilities, or warlike operations whether a state of war be declared or not, invasion, act of foreign enemy and civil war;
- ii. rebellion, revolution, insurrection, mutiny, usurpation of civil or military government, conspiracy, riot, civil commotion, and terrorist acts;
- iii. epidemics, quarantine, and plague;
- iv. earthquake, landslide, volcanic activity, fire, flood or inundation, tidal wave, typhoon or cyclone, hurricane, storm or other natural or physical disaster.

If either party is prevented, hindered, or delayed from or in performing any of its obligations under the Contract by an event of Force Majeure, then it shall notify the other in writing of the occurrence of such event and the circumstances thereof within 14 days after the occurrence of such event.

- i. If the contractor issues a notice under this clause, BHEL shall examine the existence of such force majeure and may excuse the contractor from performance of the contract during the existence of such force majeure.
- ii. The party or parties affected by the event of Force Majeure shall use reasonable efforts to mitigate the effect thereof upon its or their performance of the Contract and to fulfil its or their obligations under the Contract.
- iii. No delay or non-performance by either party hereto caused by the force majeure shall
- (a) constitute a default or breach of the Contract; or (b) give rise to any claim for damages or additional cost or expense occasioned thereby.
- iv. If the performance of the Contract is substantially prevented, hindered, or delayed for a single period of more than 60 days or an aggregate period of more than 120 days on account of one or more

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events of Force Majeure during the currency of the Contract, the parties will attempt to develop a mutually satisfactory solution, failing which either party may terminate the Contract by giving a notice to the other.

33. ARBITRATION: -

All disputes between the parties to the contract, arising out of or relating to the contract, other than those for which the decision of the HOD/WCM or Accepting Officer or any other person is by the contract expressed to be final and conclusive. All disputes between the parties to the Contract, arising out of or relation to the Contract shall after written notice by either party to the Contract to the other party be referred and resolved by an Arbitrator nominated by the Unit Head of BHEL, Ranipet.

Unless the parties otherwise agree, such reference shall not take place until after the completion, alleged completion or abandonment of the work of the determination of the contract. The venue of Arbitration shall be such a place or places as may be fixed by the Arbitrator in his sole discretion. The award of the Arbitrator shall be final, conclusive and binding on both parties to the contract. Subject to the above, Courts at Ranipet alone shall have exclusive jurisdiction of any matter arising in connection with this Agreement.

34. ARBITRATION AND JURISDICTION:

- a) The jurisdiction for any arbitration/settlement of contractual/ legal issues between contractee and contractor, shall only be at the court of Ranipet. Any dispute between BHEL and the Contractor arising out of or in connection with this Contract, other than those for which BHEL decision is final, shall be referred to arbitration by a sole arbitrator to be appointed by BHEL, BAP Ranipet.
- b) The place of Arbitration shall be Ranipet, Tamil Nadu. The arbitrator may hold meetings for convenience at such places as per his discretion.
- c) The award of the Arbitrator shall be final, conclusive and binding on both parties to the contract
- d) Subject to the above, the courts at Ranipet alone have the jurisdiction to decide any dispute arising out of or in respect of the Contract."
- 35. CHANGE IN CONSTITUTION OF FIRM: Changes in constitution of firm whenever it is made after submission of application or during currency of the contract, the existing firm has to duly inform the proposed changes to contracting department of BHEL at the appropriate time before the changes in the constitution are made. In case the absence of any such information BHEL is not responsible for the consequences arising out of the absence or suppression of information and the issue / dispute arising out of these changes and the firm is responsible for settling the issue or dispute among themselves (Partners etc.) or with the bankers or with any third party. Under the above circumstances when dispute arises and the firm does not inform the change in the constitution of the firm BHEL has the right for suspending or terminating the contract.

36. FRAUD PREVENTION POLICY: -

The Bidder along with its associate/ collaborators/ sub-contractors/ sub-vendors/ consultants/ service providers shall strictly adhere to BHEL Fraud Prevention Policy displayed on BHEL website http://www.bhel.com and shall immediately bring to the notice of BHEL Management about any fraud or suspected fraud as soon as it comes to their notice.

37. SECRECY OF CONFIDENTIAL INFORMATION:

The Contractor agrees & acknowledges that in the course of their discussions and interactions, BHEL may disclose information of confidential proprietary nature relating to its business, products, knowhow, technology, customers, employees and financial. Such information shall be considered as confidential. The contractor agrees to keep it confidential & secret at all times and not directly or



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indirectly disclose to any party other than its employees and authorized personnel's strictly on a need know basis, without the prior written permission of BHEL.

The above condition shall however not apply to that information, which –

- i. now or hereafter enters the public domain through no fault of that party;
- ii. can be proven to have been possessed by that party at the time of disclosure and which was not previously obtained, directly or indirectly, from the other party hereto; and
- iii. otherwise lawfully becomes available to that party from a third party that has no obligation of confidentiality.

The provisions of this Clause shall survive termination for a period of minimum five years, for whatever reason, of the Contract.

BHEL reserves the right to initiate appropriate action including legal proceeds / termination of contract, recovery of damages, penalties etc., if the contractor is found guilty / wrong usage of the documents given by BHEL for any unauthorised activity.

38. SETOFF CLAUSE: -

"BHEL shall have the right to recover any money which in the sole opinion or BHEL is due from the Contractor from any money due to the Contractor under this Contract or any other contract or from the Security Deposit furnished by the Contractor under this Contract or any other contract."

- 39. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary, including, but not limited to, provisions relating to extension of time and compensation/ or delay, time shall be the essence of the contract.
- 40. "Where the Contractor (whether a proprietorship, partnership, company, Hindus Undivided Family or otherwise) commits a default or breaches the Contract and the proprietor/ partner/director/ member of such entity is also a proprietor/ partner/ director/ member of another entity that is registered with BHEL (in Ranipet or any other unit of BHEL), BHEL shall have the right to recover losses due to the default or breach, whether direct, indirect or consequential, either from the defaulting/ breaching entity or the other said entity or both. Such right shall also include the right to encash any security (in any form such as but not limited to bank guarantee, demand draft, FD, etc.) _ furnished by either or both entities. Without limiting the applicability of the foregoing, it shall not be a defence to the other said entity for enforcement of such a right that:
 - entities, (a) both entities are legally distinct/ separate or (b) the management of the entity/ partners/ directors/ members of such other proprietor/ not aware that the partner/ director/ member defaulting/ also proprietor/ partner/ director/ breaching entity was member of the other said entity."
- 41. The Successful Tenderer shall agree to the following conditions:

Contractor shall indemnify and keep indemnified BHEL, its other contractors and/or sub-contractors and its/their employees from all actions, proceedings, suits, claims, demands, liabilities, damages, losses, costs, charges, expenses judgments and fines arising out of or in the course of, or caused by the execution of work under the Contract or other obligations hereunder directly or indirectly associated herewith which may arise due to:

- breach of law by the Contractor, or any of its sub-contractor, or any of their respective employees.
- ii) negligence or wilful default by the Contractor, or any of its sub-contractor, or any of their respective employees.
- iii) failure by Contractor to proceed with Project in accordance with the determinations, instructions and clarifications of Company pending disagreement, dispute, protest, request for arbitration/court proceedings.
- iv) loss of property or death of any employee of BHEL or of its other contractors/ sub-contractors.



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The above shall be without prejudice to any other remedy that may be available to BHEL whether as per law, contract, equity or otherwise. The quantum of work/ nature of work to be carried out by the hired crane will be decided by BHEL from time to time and the availability of the combination of work.

- 42. All statutory requirements under Minimum Wages Act,1948, Factories Act 1948, Workmen Compensation Act 1923, Employees Provident Fund and Miscellaneous Provisions Act, 1952, Payment of Gratuity Act 1972, Employee State Insurance Act 1948, Contract Labour (R&A) Act 1970, Payment of Bonus Act 1965, Income Tax Act, Service Tax Act and all other applicable Acts shall be complied with by the Contractor.
- 43. **MOTOR VEHICLE ACT**: The contractor should comply the relevant Motor Vehicle Act and other statutory requirement, if applicable.
- 44. Contractor shall comply with all statutory requirements, rules, regulations, notifications in relation to employment of his employees issued from time to time by the concerned authorities.
- 45. Contractor shall indemnify BHEL against all claims and losses under various Labour Laws, statutes or any civil or criminal law in connection with employees deployed by him.
- 46. Contractor wherever applicable shall maintain proper records prescribed by the concerned statutory authorities and provides a copy of the same to BHEL.
- 47. Contractor shall furnish proper returns to the concerned statutory authorities and provide a copy of the same to BHEL.
- 48. No interest shall be payable by BHEL on Security Deposit/ or any money due to the Contractor by BHEL.
- 49. Time is the essence of contract and hence any delay in Execution of contract will attract penal action by BHEL by deduction of such amounts as may be fixed by BHEL as compensation for the delay of work. This is without prejudice to conditions of contract mentioned elsewhere regarding deduction for taking alternative action / cancellation of contract.
- 50. **BHEL shall recover the amount of compensation paid to victim(s)** by BHEL towards loss of life/permanent disability due to an accident which is attributable to the negligence of contractor, agency or firm or any of its employees as detailed below.
 - a). Victim: Any person who suffers permanent disablement or dies in an accident as defined below.
 - b). Accident: Any death or permanent disability resulting solely and directly from any unintended and unforeseen injurious occurrence caused during the manufacturing/operation and works incidental thereto at BHEL factories/offices and precincts thereof, project execution, erection and commissioning, services, repairs and maintenance, trouble shooting, serving, overhaul, renovation and retrofitting, trial operation, performance guarantee testing undertaken by the company or during any works/ during working at BHEL units/officers/townships and premises/ project sites.
 - c). Compensation in respect of each of the victims:
 - (i) In the event of death or permanent disability resulting from Loss of both limbs: **Rs.10,00,000/- (**Rs. Ten lakh)
 - (ii) In the event of other permanent disability: Rs.7,00,000/- (Rs. Seven lakh)
 - d). Permanent Disablement: A disablement that is classified as a permanent total disablement under the proviso to section 2 (I) of the Employee's Compensation Act, 1923.
- 51. For every month, the contractor shall prepare & submit bill in the succeeding month within one week from the date of certification of quantity by concerned department officials.



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- 52. Any billing related query, clarification, document requirement, etc. shall be resolved in one go by the Contractor within one week from the date of intimation.
- 53. **SUBMISSION OF BILLS BY CONTRACTOR:** The Contractor at the end of each month shall submit a bill in triplicate detailing the various items of work done during the month supported by the requisitions issued from time to time. The Contractor shall, once in every month, submit to the concerned department officials separately details of his claims for the work done by him up to and including the previous month which are not covered by his contract agreement in any of the following respects:
 - a. Deviation from the items provided in the contract documents.
 - b. Extra items / new items of work.
 - c. Items in-respect of which rates have not been settled. He should in addition furnish a clear certificate to the effect that the claims submitted by him as aforesaid cover all his claims and that no further claims shall be raised by him in respect of the work done up to and including the period under report.
- 54. **PAYMENT OF BILLS:** All payments to be made to the Contractor, under this contract shall be by "CHEQUE" crossed "A/C PAYEE ONLY" OR by NEFT / RTGS payment within a reasonable time after the certification of bills by the authorized officials of BHEL.
- 55. SUSPENSION OF BUSINESS DEALINGS: -

BHEL reserves the right to take action against Contractors who either fail to perform or Tenderers/Contractor who indulge in malpractices, by suspending business dealings with them in line with BHEL guidelines issued from time to time.

The offers of the bidders who are under suspension and also the offers of the bidders, who engage the services of the banned firms / principal / agents, shall be rejected. The list of banned firms is available on BHEL web site www.bhel.com.

If any bidder / supplier / contractor during pre-tendering / tendering / post tendering / award / execution / post-execution stage indulges in any act, including but not limited to, mal-practices, cheating, bribery, fraud or and other misconduct or formation of cartel so as to influence the bidding process or influence the price or tampers the tendering process or acts or omits in any manner which tantamount to an offence punishable under any provision of the Indian Penal Code, 1860 (Bhartiya Nyaya Samhita 2023) or any other law in force in India, or does anything which is actionable under the Guidelines for Suspension of Business dealings, action may be taken against such bidder / supplier / contractor as per extant guidelines of the company available on www.bhel.com and / or under applicable legal provisions.

- 56. BHEL reserves the right to reduce the contract period (pre-close the contract), with 30 days' notice period depends on the requirement / without assigning any reason. Security Deposit will be refunded, if the contract is pre-closed for non-requirement by BHEL.
- 57. LIMITATION ON LIABILITY:

Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in this Contract or LOA or Work Order or any other mutually agreed document between the parties, the maximum liability, for damages, of the contractor, its servants or agents, shall under no circumstances exceed an amount equal to the Price of the Contract or the Work Order. Neither party shall be liable to the other for any indirect or consequential loss or damage, including but not limited to loss of use, loss of profits, or loss of contracts, or special, punitive,



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exemplary losses whatsoever, arising out of or in connection with this contract. This shall not be applicable on the recoveries made by Customer from BHEL on account of Contractor, any other type of recoveries for workmanship, material, T&P etc. due from the contractor.

58. NO EMPLOYER EMPLOYEE RELATIONSHIP

The workforce deployed by the Contractor shall be the employees of the Contractor and there shall not be any employer – employee relationship between BHEL and the said workforce of Contractor on any ground whatsoever. BHEL will not issue any experience certificate to the workforces of the Contractor.

59. In case of breach of any or whole of the above terms and conditions by the contractor BHEL will have the liberty to cancel the registration and contract either in part or in full.

(BHEL), a company registered under the Companies Act 1956 and having its registered office at "BHEL House", Siri Fort, New Delhi - 110049 (India) hereinafter referred to as "The Principal", which expression unless repugnant to the context or meaning hereof shall include its successors or assigns of the ONE PART and
Preamble
The Principal intends to award, under laid-down organizational procedures, contract/s for
, The Principal values full compliance with all relevant laws of the land, rules and regulations, and the principles of economic use of resources, and of fairness and transparency in its relations with its Bidder(s)/ Contractor(s).
In order to achieve these goals, the Principal will appoint Independent External Monitor(s), who will monitor the tender process and the execution of the contract for compliance with the principles mentioned above.
Section 1- Commitments of the Principal
1.1 The Principal commits itself to take all measures necessary to prevent corruption and to observe

- the following principles: -
- 1.1.1 No employee of the Principal, personally or through family members, will in connection with the tender for, or the execution of a contract, demand, take a promise for or accept, for self or third person, any material or immaterial benefit which the person is not legally entitled to.
- 1.1.2 The Principal will, during the tender process treat all Bidder(s) with equity and reason. The Principal will in particular, before and during the tender process, provide to all Bidder(s) the same information and will not provide to any Bidder(s) confidential/ additional information through which the Bidder(s) could obtain an advantage in relation to the tender process or the contract execution.



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- 1.1.3 The Principal will exclude from the process all known prejudiced persons.
- 1.2 If the Principal obtains information on the conduct of any of its employees which is a penal offence under the Indian Penal Code 1860 and Prevention of Corruption Act 1988 or any other statutory penal enactment, or if there be a substantive suspicion in this regard, the Principal will inform its Vigilance Office and in addition can initiate disciplinary actions.

<u>Section 2 - Commitments of the Bidder(s)/ Contractor(s)</u>

- 2.1 The Bidder(s)/ Contractor(s) commit himself to take all measures necessary to prevent corruption. He commits himself to observe the following principles during his participation in the tender process and during the contract execution.
- 2.1.1 The Bidder(s)/ Contractor(s) will not, directly or through any other person or firm, offer, promise or give to the Principal or to any of the Principal's employees involved in the tender process or the execution of the contract or to any third person any material, immaterial or any other benefit which he/ she is not legally entitled to, in order to obtain in exchange any advantage of any kind whatsoever during the tender process or during the execution of the contract.
- 2.1.2 The Bidder(s)/ Contractor(s) will not enter with other Bidder(s) into any illegal or undisclosed agreement or understanding, whether formal or informal. This applies in particular to prices, specifications, certifications, subsidiary contracts, submission or non-submission of bids or any other actions to restrict competitiveness or to introduce cartelization in the bidding process.
- 2.1.3 The Bidder(s)/ Contractor(s) will not commit any penal offence under the relevant Indian Penal Code (IPC) and Prevention of Corruption Act; further the Bidder(s)/ Contractor(s) will not use improperly, for purposes of competition or personal gain, or pass on to others, any information or document provided by the Principal as part of the business relationship, regarding plans, technical proposals and business details, including information contained or transmitted electronically.
- 2.1.4 Foreign Bidder(s)/ Contractor(s) shall disclose the name and address of agents and representatives in India and Indian Bidder(s)/ Contractor(s) to disclose their foreign principals or associates. The Bidder(s)/ Contractor(s) will, when presenting his bid, disclose any and all payments he has made, and is committed to or intends to make to agents, brokers or any other intermediaries in connection with the award of the contract.
- 2.2 The Bidder(s)/ Contractor(s) will not instigate third persons to commit offences outlined above or be an accessory to such offences.



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2.3 The Bidder(s)/ Contractor(s) shall not approach the Courts while representing the matters to IEMs and will await their decision in the matter.

<u>Section 3 - Disqualification from tender process and exclusion from future contracts</u>

If the Bidder(s)/ Contractor(s), before award or during execution has committed a transgression through a violation of Section 2 above, or acts in any other manner such as to put his reliability or credibility in question, the Principal is entitled to disqualify the Bidder(s)/ Contractor(s) from the tender process or take action as per the separate "Guidelines on Banning of Business dealings with Suppliers/ Contractors", framed by the Principal.

Section 4 - Compensation for Damages

- 4.1 If the Principal has disqualified the Bidder from the tender process prior to the award according to Section 3, the Principal is entitled to demand and recover the damages equivalent Earnest Money Deposit/ Bid Security.
- 4.2 If the Principal has terminated the contract according to Section 3, or if the Principal is entitled to terminate the contract according to section 3, the Principal shall be entitled to demand and recover from the Contractor liquidated damages equivalent to 5% of the contract value or the amount equivalent to Security Deposit/ Performance Bank Guarantee, whichever is higher.

<u>Section 5 - Previous Transgression</u>

- 5.1 The Bidder declares that no previous transgressions occurred in the last 3 years with any other company in any country conforming to the anti-corruption approach or with any other Public Sector Enterprise in India that could justify his exclusion from the tender process.
- 5.2 If the Bidder makes incorrect statement on this subject, he can be disqualified from the tender process or the contract, if already awarded, can be terminated for such reason.

Section 6 - Equal treatment of all Bidders/ Contractors / Sub-contractors

- 6.1 The Principal will enter into agreements with identical conditions as this one with all Bidders and Contractors. In case of sub-contracting, the Principal contractor shall be responsible for the adoption of IP by his sub-contractors and shall continue to remain responsible for any default by his subcontractors.
- 6.2 The Principal will disqualify from the tender process all bidders who do not sign this pact or violate its provisions.

<u>Section 7 - Criminal Charges against violating Bidders/ Contractors / Subcontractors</u>

If the Principal obtains knowledge of conduct of a Bidder, Contractor or Subcontractor, or of an employee or a representative or an associate of a Bidder, Contractor or Subcontractor which constitutes corruption, or if the Principal has substantive suspicion in this regard, the Principal will inform the Vigilance Office.



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<u>Section 8 -Independent External Monitor(s)</u>

- 8.1 The Principal appoints competent and credible Independent External Monitor for this Pact. The task of the Monitor is to review independently and objectively, whether and to what extent the parties comply with the obligations under this agreement.
- 8.2 The Monitor is not subject to instructions by the representatives of the parties and performs his functions neutrally and independently. He reports to the CMD, BHEL.
- 8.3 The Bidder(s)/ Contractor(s) accepts that the Monitor has the right to access without restriction to all contract documentation of the Principal including that provided by the Bidder(s)/ Contractor(s). The Bidder(s)/ Contractor(s) will grant the monitor, upon his request and demonstration of a valid interest, unrestricted and unconditional access to his contract documentation. The same is applicable to Sub-contractor(s). The Monitor is under contractual obligation to treat the information and documents of the Bidder(s)/ Contractor(s) / Sub-contractor(s) with confidentiality in line with Non- disclosure agreement.
- 8.4 The Principal will provide to the Monitor sufficient information about all meetings among the parties related to the contract provided such meetings could have an impact on the contractual relations between the Principal and the Contractor. The parties offer to the Monitor the option to participate in such meetings.
- 8.5 The role of IEMs is advisory, would not be legally binding and it is restricted to resolving issues raised by an intending bidder regarding any aspect of the tender which allegedly restricts competition or bias towards some bidders. At the same time, it must be understood that IEMs are not consultants to the Management. Their role is independent in nature and the advice once tendered would not be subject to review at the request of the organization.
- 8.6 For ensuring the desired transparency and objectivity in dealing with the complaints arising out of any tendering process, the matter should be examined by the full panel of IEMs jointly as far as possible, who would look into the records, conduct an investigation, and submit their joint recommendations to the Management.
- 8.7 The IEMs would examine all complaints received by them and give their recommendations/ views to CMD, BHEL, at the earliest. They may also send their report directly to the CVO and the Commission, in case of suspicion of serious irregularities requiring legal/ administrative action. IEMs will tender their advice on the complaints within 10 days as far as possible.
- 8.8 The CMD, BHEL shall decide the compensation to be paid to the Monitor and its terms and conditions.



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- 8.9 IEM should examine the process integrity; they are not expected to concern themselves with fixing of responsibility of officers. Complaints alleging mala fide on the part of any officer of the organization should be looked into by the CVO of the concerned organization.
- 8.10 If the Monitor has reported to the CMD, BHEL, a substantiated suspicion of an offence under relevant Indian Penal Code/ Prevention of Corruption Act, and the CMD, BHEL has not, within reasonable time, taken visible action to proceed against such offence or reported it to the Vigilance Office, the Monitor may also transmit this information directly to the Central Vigilance Commissioner, Government of India.
- 8.11 The number of Independent External Monitor(s) shall be decided by the CMD, BHEL.
- 8.12 The word 'Monitor' would include both singular and plural.

Section 9 - Pact Duration

- 9.1 This Pact shall be operative from the date IP is signed by both the parties till the final completion of contract for successful bidder and for all other bidders 6 months after the contract has been awarded. Issues like warranty / guarantee etc. should be outside the purview of IEMs.
- 9.2 If any claim is made/lodged during currency of IP, the same shall be binding and continue to be valid despite the lapse of this pact as specified above, unless it is discharged/determined by the CMD, BHEL.

Section 10 - Other Provisions

- 10.1 This agreement is subject to Indian Laws and jurisdiction shall be registered office of the Principal, i.e. New Delhi.
- 10.2 Changes and supplements as well as termination notices need to be made in writing. Side agreements have not been made.
- 10.3 If the Contractor is a partnership or a consortium, this agreement must be signed by all partners or consortium members.
- 10.4 Should one or several provisions of this agreement turn out to be invalid, the remainder of this agreement remains valid. In this case, the parties will strive to come to an agreement to their original intentions.
- 10.5 Only those bidders / contractors who have entered into this agreement with the Principal would be competent to participate in the bidding. In other words, entering into this agreement would be a preliminary qualification.

 - Group Personal Accident Insurance policy to be provided before the start of the work. Contract workmen will be allowed in Factory Premises only after submission of valid Group Personal Accident Insurance policy.
- (e) The quoted rate shall inclusive of hire charges for the crane to be deployed, cost of fuel/lubricants, standard tools and tackles required for material handling work, repair and maintenance expenditure, road tax, insurance, pollution certificate, statutory payment (Wages, PF, ESI etc.) for crane crew i.e. One Operator cum driver (Skilled manpower) and Two Riggers (Semi-Skilled manpower) for each crane, personal protective equipment's for deployed manpower, Group Personal Accident insurance of deployed manpower etc.
- (f) Minimum wage to be paid for one operator cum driver (Skilled Manpower) and Two Riggers (Semi-skilled manpower) for each mobile crane per shift works out to Rs. 2,452/- (rounded off to next higher integer). Bidder cannot quote less than the Minimum wage of Rs. 2,452/- & Rs. 4,904/- for single shift crane and double shift crane respectively.
- (g) Contract will be finalised by opening e-price bid in NIC portal only and reverse auction will not be conducted. Hence, bidders are requested to quote their best price in first instance.
- (h) Shift means 8 hrs. working duration as specified by the in charge excluding lunch/dinner break 30 minutes.
- (i) The rate per hour will be arrived at by dividing the awarded rate per crane per shift by 8 in case of single shift crane operation and by dividing the awarded rate per crane for two shifts by 16 in case of double shift crane operation.
- (j) GST at actual will be reimbursable against documentary evidence viz. valid GST Invoice.
- (k) Contractor should not claim for any variation in quantity.
- (I) Price quoted shall be Firm throughout the contract period and in case of extension period also.
- (m) At the end of completion, the contract may be extended on mutual agreement.

MOBILE CRANE SAFETY NORMS

Mobile crane safety hazards can potentially lead to some of the most dangerous situations on a work site such as serious injury or death. Hence to ensure Safe Material Handling Operations with mobile cranes, the following Statutory requirements and Safety guidelines must be strictly adhered.

Section.29 of 'The Factories Act 1948' and Rule No. 55A of Tamil Nadu Factories Rules 1950 (The extracts of the same are appended below for ready reference) mandates following requirements on all types of Lifting Machinery and equipment used in a factory for handling materials:

Section.29 of 'The Factories Act 1948'. Lifting machines, chains, ropes and lifting tackles:

- (1) In any factory the following provisions shall be complied with in respect of every lifting machine (other than a hoist and lift) and every chain, rope and lifting tackle for the purpose of raising or lowering persons, goods or materials: —
- (a) all parts, including the working gear, whether fixed or movable, of every lifting machine and every chain, rope or lifting tackle shall be—
- (i) of good construction, sound material and adequate strength and free from defects;
- (ii) properly maintained; and
- (iii) thoroughly examined by a competent person at least once in every period of twelve months, or at such intervals as the Chief Inspector may specify in writing; and a register shall be kept containing the prescribed particulars of every such examination;

Rule No. 55A of Tamil Nadu Factories Rules 1950: Lifting machines, chains, ropes and lifting tackles

Sub Rule:1: No Lifting Machine and no chain, rope or lifting tackle, except a fiber rope sling, shall be taken into use in any factory for the first time in that factory unless it has been tested and all parts have been thoroughly examined by a competent person and a test and examination certificate specifying the safe working load or loads and signed by the person making the test and the examination has been obtained and is kept available for inspection.

Sub Rule:7: Such chains and lifting tackles shall be thoroughly examined by a competent person once at least in every twelve months and particulars entered in the register kept in accordance with sub rule 4.

Sub Rule 9: No person under 18 years of age and no person who is not sufficiently competent and reliable shall be employed as driver of a lifting machine whether driven by mechanical power or otherwise, or to give signals to a driver.

In line with the above mentioned statutory requirements, the minimum competencies of the mobile crane operator / rigger and Examination/Inspection record of Mobile cranes/Lifting tackles are appended below:

1. Competency requirements of Mobile Crane Operator:

- i. Must possess a valid HMV license issued by the State Regional Transport Authority.
- ii. Must be able to Estimate the weight of the load being handled.
- iii. Must be conversant with basic rigging practices.
- iv. Must possess adequate eyesight for recognizing the hand signals given by the Rigger/Signaler*, he also must be able to understand these hand signals.
- v. Must be able to carry out the daily/pre operation checks of the mobile crane as per the check list given in **Anneure.1**.

(*A signal person is required when: The point of operation is not in full view of the operator, the operator's view is obstructed in the direction the equipment is traveling, or because of site-specific safety concerns. During such cases any one of the two mobile crane riggers will act as a Signaler)

vi. Must be conversant with the Safe Material Handling Practices as given in Annexure.3

2. Competency requirements of Mobile Crane Rigger/Signaler:

- i. Must be conversant with rigging techniques.
- ii. must be conversant with standard hand signals
- iii. Shall be able to determine/estimate the weight and center of gravity of the load being lifted.
- iv. Shall be able to estimate the reduction in SWL** rating of slings depending on the sling Angle factor. (**Refer Annexure.2** for calculating the **reduced SWL capacity** of the sling as per sling angle.)
 - (**The SWL rating of mobile crane indicates the maximum load it can lift with minimum boom length and minimum radius so ensure the load is within the load chart rating for boom length and boom radius of the crane.)
- v. must be able to carry out visual inspection of slings each day before use and remove them from service if damaged are defective.
- vi. Must be able to understand the advantages and limitation of different types of lifting tackles and use them appropriately.
- vii. Must be conversant with the Safe Material Handling Practices as given in Annexure.3

3. Examination/Inspection record of Mobile cranes/Lifting tackles:

Every mobile crane and every lifting tackle must be thoroughly examined by a Competent person once in every year and correspondingly a valid certificate must be obtained.

A copy of such valid certificate must be readily available in respective mobile crane for verification by the safety officers.




- 1. In case of any Non-Compliance in any of the aspects mentioned in 'Mandatory requirement' category (SI. Nos 1-11), the respective mobile crane is deemed to be 'Unfit for safe material handling Operations' and the appropriate rectifications must be carried out immediately.
- 2. In case of any Non-Compliance in any of the aspects mentioned in 'Essential requirement' category (SI. Nos 12-22), the appropriate rectifications shall be carried out within a reasonable time limit of not exceeding 03 days from date of observation.
- 3. This same format of check list will be also used by the Safety Officers during the Regular Safety Rounds for ascertaining the Fitness of the mobile crane for Safe Material Handling Operations.

EFFECT OF ANGLE OF LIFT ON A SLING'S RATED CAPACITY

Using slings at an angle can become deadly if that angle is not taken into consideration when selecting the sling to be used. The tension on each leg of the sling is increased as the angle of lift, from horizontal, decreases.

It is most desirable for a sling to have a larger angle of lift, approaching 90°. **Lifts with angles of less than 30° from horizontal are not recommended.** If you can measure the angle of lift or the length and height of the sling as rigged, you can determine the properly rated sling for your lift.


What would be the rating of each sling rigged at this angle (A)?

Reduced SWL Capacity of the Sling = Reduction Factor [RF] x Each of the sling's rated SWL capacity.


Safe Material Handling Practices for preventing the work injuries:

- 1. The mobile crane contract owners shall be appropriately advised to ensure that:
 - a. Crane operator and riggers are having adequate training/experience in material handling activities using mobile crane.
- 2. The mobile cranes and its lifting tackles are thoroughly examined and certified by a competent person, as per statutory requirements.
- 3. On Daily basis (prior to use) the crane operator must inspect the mobile crane as per the checklist in Annexure.1 for ensuring fitness of the crane.
- 4. To enable the crane operator for receiving signals from the rigger and for ensuring labor safety, productivity, all lifting operations must be carried out with adequate illumination.
- 5. Effective communication must be established and maintained between all people involved in loading/unloading activities.
- 6. All other persons who are all not directly involved in the operation must stay away in safe distance.
- 7. Hands should be kept out of pinch points (A pinch point is any point where it is possible for a body part to be caught between moving and stationary objects), while hooking or unhooking.
- 8. No loose items on load or crane before lift.
- 9. Initially lift the load only a few inches to test the rigging and balance.
- 10. Lifting tackles should be adequate to the task, they should be un-kinked and load balanced and secured.
- 11. Do not use slings, eye bolts, shackles, or hooks that have been cut, welded, or brazed.
- 12. Mobile cranes are Unsafe Vehicle and prone to toppling due to variable nature of its center of gravity, hence Mobile Cranes shall be used only for loading/unloading of material and not for transporting materials over long distances (>100mtrs).


 (During operation the center of Gravity of mobile carne will vary depending upon the Load being handled, length of boom extension, boom angle, turning etc.)
- 13. The mobile crane shall be operated in a smooth, controlled, and safe manner.
- 14. The operator shall always to bear in mind that 'As the boom length increases, the less weight the crane can manage without tipping over or collapsing'.
- 15. During loading/unloading of materials to/from the vehicles, the riggers shall ensure that vehicles are parked safely with free/safe working space around the vehicles.
- 16. Slings must be padded or protected from the sharp edges of loads



17. Use two guy ropes/tag lines (one on top & two at the bottom) to avoid swing during lift.



18. Do not permit any workers to move in between the load and the front wheels of the mobile crane



- 19. While loading/unloading materials on to / from any vehicles, riggers must use proper ladder/ stands arrangements for climbing up & down of the vehicles. They must also cautiously avoid any unsafe acts such as walking on the edges of the trailers, jumping down from trailers, taking unsafe positions etc.
- 20. Whether loading materials on to vehicles or unloading materials to the storage yards, the riggers must strictly comply with safe loading/stacking practices for ensuring the safety of other counterparts who will subsequently engaged in handling the loaded/stored materials.
- 21. Majority of the mobile crane operations are being carried out at our Open Yards and since the prevailing road conditions at these yards are of uneven nature, mobile operators & riggers need to be extra cautious for preventing 'tipping of mobile cranes and falling of loads'.
- 22. Open yard conditions pose risk for poisonous insect/reptile bites, hence riggers must be vigilant and exercise adequate precautions.
- 23. During inclement climatic conditions (such as **High speed wind, raining** etc) the mobile crane operations need to temporarily suspended. However, owing to operations requirements, if any open yard activities are planned, additional safety precautions enumerated below need to be strictly complied with:
 - a. The most dangerous part of operating a crane in rain is the reduction in visibility, so the vehicles must be driven at controlled speed by keeping the parking light or headlight in ON condition. Lower visibility requires higher concentration.

- b. Sudden/Hard Braking must be avoided to prevent the vehicle from skidding.
- c. The booms of all cranes shall be lowered and secured, if the wind speed is too high.
- d. Do not work in the close vicinity of Overhead power line.
- e. Do not work outdoors if there is lightening.
- f. Additionally, rain can make the open yard sites slippery which may pose slip, trip and fall hazards, so extra care should also be taken while operating the crane, as well as walking around the jobs and material site.
- 24. When any of the team member is newly joined, other team members must appropriately sensitize the new member regarding the job/site specific safety precautions.
- 25. Strict PPE compliance must be ensured as per the table given below:
