BHEL reserves the right to not consider a bidder for further processing of tender in case it is observed that they are overloaded and may not be in a position to execute this job as per the required schedule of the 'NIT'. The decision of BHEL will be final in this regard.

1.11.4. If a tenderer who is a proprietor expires after the submission of his tender or after the acceptance of his tender, BHEL may at their discretion, cancel such tender. If a partner of a firm expires after the submission of tender or after the acceptance of the tender, BHEL may then cancel such tender at their discretion, unless the firm retains its character. In case BHEL resolves to cancel the tender under this clause, BHEL will issue a notice in this regard containing reasons as to the cancellation of tender. The contractor shall be required to furnish his response to such notice within a period of 14 days from the date of receipt of such notice through any means (BHEL reserves the right to decrease the period up to 05 days). BHEL after due consideration of the representation made by contractor shall communicate its final decision within a reasonable period. In case contractor fails to submit any response to the notice issued by BHEL within the period stipulated in the notice, BHEL at its discretion may proceed to cancel the contract. Contractor shall not be eligible for any compensation whatsoever for the cancellation of contract under this clause

1.11.5. BHEL will not be bound by any Power of Attorney granted by changes in the composition of the firm made subsequent to the execution of the contract. BHEL may, however, recognize such power of

Attorney and changes after obtaining proper legal advice, the cost of which will be chargeable to the contractor concerned.

- 1.11.6. If the tenderer deliberately gives wrong information in his tender, BHEL reserves the right to reject such tender at any stage or to cancel the contract if awarded and forfeit the Earnest Money/Security Deposit/any other money due.
- 1.11.7. Canvassing in any form in connection with the tenders submitted by the Tenderer shall make his offer liable to rejection.
- 1.11.8. In case the Proprietor, Partner or Director of the Company/Firm submitting the Tender, has any relative or relation employed in BHEL, the authority inviting the Tender shall be informed of the fact as per specified format, along with the Offer. Failing to do so, BHEL may, at its sole discretion, reject the tender or cancel the contract and forfeit the Earnest Money/Security Deposit.
- 1.11.9. The successful tenderer (Contractor) shall not sub-contract any portion of work detailed in the tender specification undertaken by him without written permission of BHEL's HOD. BHEL, at its discretion, may consider the written request from the Contractor and permit subletting of part scope. However, the Contractor is solely responsible to BHEL for the work awarded to him.
- 1.11.10. The Tender submitted by a techno commercially qualified tenderer shall become the property of BHEL who shall be under no obligation to return the same to the bidder.
- 1.11.11. Unsolicited discount received after the due date and time of Bid Submission shall not be considered for evaluation. However, if the party who has submitted the unsolicited discount/rebate becomes the L-1 party, then the awarded price i.e. contract value shall be worked out after considering the discount so offered.
- 1.11.12. BHEL shall not be liable for any expenses incurred by the bidder in the preparation of the tender irrespective of whether the tender is accepted or not.
- 1.11.13. The nature of contract is Works and this tender is Non-divisible.
- 1.11.14. Technical-bids will be scrutinized on opening of Technical-bid. In case the agency has not satisfied all the above conditions with documentary proof the offer will be rejected and price-bid will not be opened.
- 1.11.15. Tenderer presently working with BHEL R&D should submit requisite documents, even though such documents are submitted by them in previous contracts. All the columns shall be filled with proper information.
- 1.11.16. The contractors are requested to sign and stamp on all pages in the documents.
- 1.11.17. The contractors have to thoroughly understand the Price Break-up Sheet available at Annexure-3 and Annexure-3A before quoting the price bid. Deployment of Supervisor, Tools & Tackles (As per Clause: 3.c.i of Contractor's Obligations under SPECIAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT/Annexure-2), applicable License/Govt. Charges etc. before quoting the price bid as BHEL will not reimburse any of these costs and all these costs shall be borne by contractor only.**
- 1.11.18. BHEL R&D reserves the right to reject or cancel the tender at any stage of the tender process without assigning any reasons thereof.

1.12. INTIMATION OF CHANGE OF NAME/ RE-CONSTITUTION OF THE ORGANIZATION:

In the event of the organization (Proprietorship/Partnership/Company) undergoing any change of name or reconstitution, prior intimation of the same shall be given to BHEL. Upon such changes coming into effect, the same is to be intimated to BHEL immediately with supporting documents as applicable.

2.1 DEFINITIONS: The following terms shall have the meaning hereby assigned to them except where the context otherwise requires

- i) BHEL shall mean Bharat Heavy Electricals Limited, a company registered under Indian Companies Act 1956, having its Registered Office at BHEL HOUSE, SIRI FORT, NEW DELHI – 110 049, and its office at Corporate Research and Development, Vikasnagar, Hyderabad, Telangana- 500042.
- ii) “EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR” or “GENERAL MANAGER (In- charge)” or “GENERAL MANAGER” shall mean the Officer in Administrative charge of the respective UNIT.
- iii) “COMPETENT AUTHORITY” shall mean BHEL Officers who are empowered to act on behalf of BHEL.

Signature and Seal of the Contractor

- iv) “ENGINEER” or “ENGINEER IN CHARGE” shall mean an Officer of BHEL as may be duly appointed and authorized by BHEL to act as “Engineer” on his behalf for the purpose of the Contract, to perform the duty set forth in this General Conditions of Contract and other Contract documents.
- v) “SITE” shall mean the places or place at which the plants/equipments are to be erected or work to be executed and services are to be performed as per the specification of this Tender.
- vi) “CLIENT OF BHEL” or “CUSTOMER” shall mean the project authorities with whom BHEL has entered into a contract for supply of equipments or provision of services.
- vii) “CONTRACTOR” shall mean the successful Bidder/Tenderer who is awarded the Contract and shall include the Contractor’s successors, heirs, executors, administrators and permitted assigns.
- viii) “CONTRACT” or “CONTRACT DOCUMENT” shall mean and includes the Agreement or Work Order, the accepted appendices of Rates, Schedules, Quantities if any, Offer submitted by contractor including acceptance to General Conditions of Contract, Special Conditions of Contract, Instructions to the Tenderers, Drawings, Technical Specifications, the Special Specifications if any, the Tender documents, subsequent amendments /corrigendum to Tender mutually agreed upon and the Letter of Intent/Award/Acceptance issued by BHEL. Any conditions or terms stipulated by the contractor in the tender documents or subsequent letters shall not form part of the contract unless, specifically accepted in writing by BHEL in the Letter of Intent/Award and incorporated in the agreement or amendment thereof.
- ix) “GENERAL CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT” shall mean the ‘Instructions to Tenderers’ and ‘General Conditions of Contract’ pertaining to the work for which above tenders have been called for.
- x) “TENDER SPECIFICATION” or “TENDER” or “TENDER DOCUMENTS” shall mean General Conditions, Common Conditions, Special Conditions, Price Bid, Rate Schedule, Technical Specifications, Appendices, Annexures, Corrigendums, Amendments, Forms, Procedures, Site information etc. and drawings/documents pertaining to the work for which the tenderers are required to submit their offers. Individual specification number will be assigned to each Tender Specification.
- xi) “LETTER OF INTENT/ AWARD” shall mean the intimation by a Letter/Fax/email to the tenderer that the tender has been accepted in accordance with provisions contained in the letter. The responsibility of the contractor commences from the date of issue of this letter and all terms and conditions of the contract are applicable from this date.
- xii) “COMPLETION TIME” shall mean the period by ‘date/month’ specified in the ‘Letter of Intent/Award’ or date mutually agreed upon for handing over of the intended scope of work, the erected equipment/plant which are found acceptable by the Engineer, being of required standard and conforming to the specifications of the Contract.
- xiii) “PLANT” shall mean and connote the entire assembly of the plant and equipments covered by the contract.
- xiv) “EQUIPMENT” shall mean equipment, machineries, materials, structural, electricals and other components of the plant covered by the contract.
- xv) “TESTS” shall mean and include such test or tests to be carried out on the part of the contractor as are prescribed in the contract or considered necessary by BHEL in order to ascertain the quality, workmanship, performance and efficiency of the contractor or part thereof.
- xvi) “APPROVED”, “DIRECTED” or “INSTRUCTED” shall mean approved, directed or instructed by BHEL.
- xvii) “WORK or CONTRACT WORK” shall mean and include supply of all categories of labour, specified consumables, tools and tackles and Plants required for complete and satisfactory site transportation, handling, stacking, storing, erecting, testing and commissioning of the equipments to the entire satisfaction of BHEL.

xxviii) “SINGULAR AND PLURALS ETC” words carrying singular number shall also include plural and vice versa, where the context so requires. Words imparting the masculine Gender shall be taken to include the feminine Gender and words imparting persons shall include any Company or Associations or Body of Individuals, whether incorporated or not.

xix) “HEADING” – The heading in these General Conditions are solely for the purpose of facilitating reference and shall not be deemed to be part thereof or be taken as instructions thereof or of the contract.

xx) “MONTH” shall mean calendar month unless otherwise specified in the Tender.

xxi) ‘Day’ or ‘Days’ unless herein otherwise expressly defined shall mean calendar day or days of twenty-four (24) hours each. A Week shall mean continuous period of seven (7) days.

xxii) “COMMISSIONING” shall mean the synchronization testing and achieving functional operation of the Equipment with associated system after all initial adjustments, trials, cleaning, re-assembly required at site if any, have been completed and Equipment with associated system is ready for taking into service.

xxiii) “WRITING” shall include any manuscript type written or hand written or printed statement or electronically transmitted messages, under the signature or seal or transmittal of BHEL.

xxiv) “TEMPORARY WORK” shall mean all temporary works for every kind required in or for the execution, completion, maintenance of the work.

xxv) ‘CONTRACT PRICE’ or ‘CONTRACT VALUE’ shall mean the sum mentioned in the LOI/LOA/Contract Agreement subject to such additions thereto or deductions there from as may be made under provisions hereinafter contained.

xxvi) ‘EXECUTED CONTRACT VALUE’ shall mean actual value of works executed by the contractor and certified by BHEL. This value shall not include PVC, ORC, Extra Works and Taxes.

xxvii) “COMMENCEMENT DATE” or “START DATE” shall mean the commencement/start of work at Site as per terms defined in the Tender.

xxviii) “SHORT CLOSING” or “FORE CLOSING” of Contract shall mean the premature closing of Contract, for reasons not attributable to the contractor and mutually agreed between BHEL and the contractor.

xxix) “TERMINATION” of Contract shall mean the pre-mature closing of contract due to reasons as mentioned in the contract.

xxx) “DE MOBILIZATION” shall mean the temporary winding up of Site establishment by Contractor leading to suspension of works temporarily for reasons not attributable to the contractor.

xxxi) “RE MOBILIZATION” shall mean the resumption of work with all resources required for the work after demobilization.

xxxii) “OVERRUN CHARGES (ORC)” shall mean and include all the costs incurred by the Contractor during the extended period of the contract, including but not limited to any cost arising out of idle labour, administrative cost, T & P and machinery.

2.2 LAW GOVERNING THE CONTRACT AND COURT JURISDICTION:

This contract shall be governed by the Law for the time being in force in the Republic of India. Subject to clause 3 of this contract, the Civil Court having original Civil Jurisdiction at Hyderabad, shall alone have exclusive jurisdiction in regard to all matters in respect of the Contract.

Signature and Seal of the Contractor

2.3 ISSUE OF NOTICE:

2.3.1 SERVICE OF NOTICE TO THE CONTRACTOR:

Any notice to be given to the Contractor under the terms of the contract shall be served by sending the same by Email/ Registered Post/Speed Post to or leaving the same at the Contractor's last known address of the principal place of business (or in the event of the contractor being a company, to or at its Registered Office). In case of change of address, the notice shall be served at changed address as notified in writing by the Contractor to BHEL. Such dispatch or display posting or leaving of the notice as the case may be shall be deemed to be good service of such notice and the time mentioned to the condition for doing any act after notice shall be reckoned from the date so mentioned in such notice.

2.3.2 SERVICE OF NOTICE TO BHEL:

Any notice to be given to BHEL In-charge of the Unit under the terms of the Contract shall be served by sending the same by Registered/AD or Speed post to BHEL address or changed address as notified in writing by BHEL to the Contractor.

2.4 USE OF LAND:

No land belonging to BHEL shall be occupied by the contractor without written permission of BHEL.

2.5 COMMENCEMENT OF WORK:

2.5.1 The contractor shall commence the work as per the time indicated in the Letter of Intent/Award/Work order from BHEL and shall proceed with the same with due expedition without delay.

2.5.2 If the contractor fails to start the work within stipulated time as per LOI/ LOA/Work order or as intimated by BHEL, then BHEL at its sole discretion shall have the right to cancel the contract. The Earnest Money and/or Security Deposit furnished by the contractor to under this tender will stand forfeited without any further reference to him and without prejudice to BHEL's other rights and remedies under this contract and the applicable laws in this regard.

2.5.3 All the work shall be carried out under the direction and to the satisfaction of BHEL.

2.5.4 Labour License: The Contractor shall have to obtain Labour License (as on date- if the number of workforce deployed is more than 20) from appropriate government by taking up the works on contractual basis under Contract Labour (Regulation and Abolition) Act-1970 and submit the copy of licence to BHEL immediately. No contractor to whom Contract Labour (Regulation and Abolition) Act-1970 applies shall supply or engage contract labours in the establishment or undertake or execute the work through contract labour without a valid labour licence. In case, the number of workforce desired to be deployed by the contractor against the contract during execution exceeds the number of workforce allowed in the license, then the contractor shall obtain prior amended valid labour license for the contract for the requisite number of workforce.

2.6 MODE OF PAYMENT:

All payments due to the contractors shall be made by e-mode only, unless otherwise found operationally difficult for reasons to be recorded in writing and approved by contract executing department.

2.7 RIGHTS OF BHEL:

BHEL reserves the following rights in respect of this contract during the original contract period or its extensions if any, as per the provisions of the contract, without entitling the contractor for any compensation.

2.7.1 To withdraw any portion of work and/or to restrict/alter quantum of work as indicated in the contract during the progress of work and get it done through other agencies to fulfil BHEL's commitment due to emergent reasons.

Where the contractor fails to deploy adequate manpower to meet the contractual target, BHEL reserves the right to deploy manpower to meet such shortfall, through any other agency for expediting activities in the interest of the project. Supplied manpower shall be put on job by the contractor. Fulfilling of all obligations towards payments and other statutory compliances related to such manpower shall be the contractor's responsibility. In case of contractor's failure to fulfil his obligations in respect of such manpower, BHEL shall be entitled to take action as provided herein.

Signature and Seal of the Contractor

2.7.2 BREACH OF CONTRACT, REMEDIES AND TERMINATION:

2.7.2.1 THE FOLLOWING SHALL AMOUNT TO BREACH OF CONTRACT:

- I. Vendor fails to perform as per the activity schedule or fails to supply spare parts material.
- II. Assignment, transfer, subletting of Contract by the Supplier/Vendor without BHEL's written permission resulting in termination of Contract or part thereof by BHEL.
- III. Non-compliance to any contractual condition or any other default attributable to Supplier/Vendor.
- IV. Any other reason(s) attributable to Vendor towards failure of performance of contract. In case of breach of contract, BHEL shall have the right to terminate the Purchase Order/ Contract either in whole or in part thereof without any compensation to the Vendor.
- V. Any of the declarations furnished by the contractor at the time of bidding and/ or entering into the contract for work are found untruthful and such declarations were of a nature that could have resulted in non-award of contract to the contractor or could expose BHEL to adverse consequences, financial or otherwise.
- VI. Supplier/Vendor is convicted of any offence involving corrupt business practices, antinational activities or any such offence that compromises the business ethics of BHEL, in violation of the Integrity Pact entered into with BHEL has the potential to harm the overall business of BHEL.

Note-Once BHEL considers that a breach of contract has occurred on the part of Vendor, BHEL shall notify vendor by way of notice in this regard. Contractor shall be given an opportunity to rectify the reasons causing the breach of contract within a period of 14 days.

In case the contractor fails to remedy the breach, as mentioned in the notice, to the satisfaction of BHEL, BHEL shall have the right to take recourse to any of the remedial actions available to it under the relevant provisions of contract.

2.7.2.2 REMEDIES IN CASE OF BREACH OF CONTRACT:

- i) Wherein the period as stipulated in the notice issued has expired and Contractor has failed to remedy the breach, BHEL will have the right to terminate the contract on the ground of "Breach of Contract" without any further notice to contractor.
- ii) Upon termination of contract, BHEL shall be entitled to recover an amount equivalent to 10% of the Contract Value for the damages on account of breach of contract committed by the Contractor. This amount shall be recovered by way of encashing the security instruments like performance bank guarantee etc available with BHEL against the said contract. In case the value of the security instruments available is less than 10% of the contract value, the balance amount shall be recovered from other financial remedies (i.e. available bills of the contractor, retention amount, from the money due to the Contractor etc. with BHEL) or the other legal remedies shall be pursued.
- iii) wherever the value of security instruments like performance bank guarantee available with BHEL against the said contract is 10% of the contract value or more, such security instruments to the extent of 10% contract value will be encashed. In case no security instruments are available or the value of the security instruments available is less than 10% of the contract value, the 10% of the contract value or the balance amount, as the case may be, will be recovered in all or any of the following manners:
- iv) In case the amount recovered under sub clause (a) above is not sufficient to fulfil the amount recoverable then; a demand notice to deposit the balance amount within 30 days shall be issued to Contractor.
- v) If Contractor fails to deposit the balance amount within the period as prescribed in demand notice, following action shall be taken for recovery of the balance amount:
 - a. From dues available in the form of Bills payable to defaulted Contractor against the same contract.

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b. If it is not possible to recover the dues available from the same contract or dues are insufficient to meet the recoverable amount, balance amount shall be recovered from any money(s) payable to Contractor under any contract with other Units of BHEL including recovery from security deposits or any other deposit available in the form of security instruments of any kind against Security deposit or EMD.

c. In-case recoveries are not possible with any of the above available options, Legal action shall be initiated for recovery against defaulted Contractor.

vi) In addition to the above, imposition of liquidated damages, debarment, termination, de-scoping, short-closure, etc., shall be applied as per provisions of the contract.

Note:

1) The defaulting contractor shall not be eligible for participation in any of the future enquiries floated by BHEL to complete the balance work. The defaulting contractor shall mean and include:

(a) In case defaulted contractor is the Sole Proprietorship Firm, any Sole Proprietorship Firm owned by same Sole Proprietor.

(b) In case defaulted contractor is The Partnership Firm, any firm comprising of same partners/ some of the same partners (but not including any new partner); or sole proprietorship firm owned by any partner(s) as a sole proprietor.

2.7.3 In case Contractor fails to deploy the resources as per requirement informed by BHEL in writing to expedite the work, BHEL can deploy own/hired/otherwise arranged resources and recover the expenses incurred from the dues payable to contractor. Recoveries shall be actual expenses incurred plus 5% overheads.

2.7.4 Whenever any Claim or Claims for payment of any sum of money(s) arises under this or any other contract against the contractor, BHEL shall be entitled to withhold and also have a lien to retain such sum of money(s) in whole or in part from any money(s) payable to contractor and/or security deposits furnished or deducted in cash from the bills of contractor, (if any) under this contract. In the event of the securities or the amounts payable to Contractor, being insufficient to cover BHEL claims, then BHEL shall be entitled to withhold and have a lien to the extent of such claims from any sum or sums found payable or which at any time thereafter may become payable to the contractor under this or any other contract with BHEL.

a) Claim or Claims for payment of any sum of money(s) arising from the Contractor under this or any other contract against the contractor, shall mean, the sum of money(s) actually incurred by BHEL in fulfilling the contractual responsibilities of contractor under the contract, to which he has failed to fulfil plus applicable overheads (@ 5%) along with interest as applicable under the Contract on total amount (i.e. money actually incurred plus overheads)

b) It is an agreed term of the contract that, the sum or sums of money so withheld or retained under the lien by BHEL will be kept withheld or retained as such by BHEL till the claims arising out of this or any other contract are finally adjudicated wither through Arbitration or a Court of competent jurisdiction as the case may be in accordance with the terms of contract. Intimation given by the BHEL Engineer regarding withholding of such money(s) shall be considered as sufficient and relevant date for all purposes. No Interest shall be payable on such sum(s) of money which becomes due or as the case may be adjudged to be due from BHEL to Contractor, whether under contract or otherwise.

c) Where the contractor is a partnership firm, BHEL shall be entitled to withhold and also have a lien to retain towards such claims in whole or in part, from any other money(s) payable to any partner, whether in his individual capacity or otherwise.

d) If any money(s) shall, as a result of any claim or application made under the relevant provisions of any Labour Welfare Act and/ or Rules, including but not limited to Contract Labour Regulation & Abolition Act, Minimum Wages Act, Payment of Gratuity Act, BOCW (RE&CS) Act, Provident Fund Act, Employee State

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Insurance Act, be directed to be paid by the BHEL, such money shall be deemed to be moneys payable to the BHEL by the Contractor.

e) Where the Contractor fails to repay to BHEL such moneys along with applicable overheads (@ 5%) and interest, as aforesaid within seven days of being demanded, BHEL shall be entitled to recover the same from Contractor's bills/ Security Deposit or any other money(s) payable to Contractor under this Contract or any other Contract with BHEL.

2.8 RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE CONTRACTOR IN RESPECT OF LOCAL LAWS, EMPLOYMENT OF WORKERS ETC.:

The following are the responsibilities of the contractor in respect of observance of local laws, employment of personnel, payment of taxes etc.

2.8.1 As far as possible, Unskilled Workers shall be engaged from the local areas in which the work is being executed.

2.8.2 The contractor at all times during the continuance of this contract shall, in all his dealings with local labour for the time being employed on or in connection with the work, have due regard to all local festivals and religious and other customs.

2.8.3 The contractor shall comply with all applicable State and Central Laws, Statutory Rules, Regulations, Notifications etc. such as Payment of Wages Act, Minimum Wages Act, Workmen Compensation Act, Employer's Liability Act, Industrial Disputes Act, Employers Provident Fund and Miscellaneous Provisions Act, 1952, Employees State Insurance Scheme, Contract Labour (Regulation and Abolition) Act, 1970, Payment of Bonus & Gratuity Act, Building and Other Construction Workers (Regulation of Employment and Conditions of Service) Act 1996, The Building and Other Construction Workers' Welfare Cess Act 1996 and other Acts, Rules, and Regulations for labour/workers as applicable and as may be enacted by the State Government and Central Govt. during the tenure of the Contract and having force or jurisdiction at Site. The Contractor shall also comply with provisions of and give all such notices to the local Governing Body, Police and other relevant Authorities as may be required by the Law. The Contractor shall without any fail maintain all the registers/records in proper formats as per all the Acts, Rules and Regulations mentioned in this clause 2.8.3.

2.8.4 The Contractor shall obtain independent License under the Contract Labour (Regulations and Abolition) Act, 1970 for engaging contract labour as required from the concerned Authorities based on the certificate (Form-V or as applicable) issued by the Principal Employer/Customer.

2.8.5 The contractor shall pay and bear all taxes, fees, license charges, cess, duties, deposits, tolls, royalties, commission or other charges which may be leviable on account of his operations in executing the contract.

2.8.6 Contractor shall be responsible for provision of Health and Sanitary arrangements (more particularly described in Contract Labour Regulation & Abolition Act), Safety precautions etc. as may be required for safe and satisfactory execution of contract.

2.8.7 The contractor shall be responsible for the proper behaviour and observance of all regulations by the staff/workers employed by him.

2.8.8 The contractor shall ensure that no damage is caused to any person/property of other parties working at site/company premises. If any such damage is caused, it is responsibility of the contractor to make good the losses or compensate for the same.

2.8.9 All the properties/equipments/components of BHEL loaned with or without deposit to the contractor in connection with the contract shall remain properties of BHEL/their Client/Customer.

2.8.10 The contractor shall use such properties for the purpose of execution of this contract. All such properties/equipments/components shall be deemed to be in good condition when received by the contractor unless he notifies within 48 hours to the contrary. The contractor shall return them in good condition as and when

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required by BHEL. In case of non-return, loss, damage, repairs etc. the cost thereof as may be fixed by BHEL Engineer will be recovered from the contractor.

2.8.11 Also, no idle charges will be admissible in the event of any stoppage caused in the work resulting in contractor's labour and Tools & Plants being rendered idle due to any reason at any time.

2.8.12 The contractor shall not stop the work or abandon the site for whatsoever reason of dispute, excepting force majeure conditions. All such problems/disputes shall be separately discussed and settled without affecting the progress of work. Such stoppage or abandonment shall be treated as breach of contract and dealt with accordingly.

2.8.13 BHEL is a no-smoking zone. This rule shall be observed by all workmen at all times while inside BHEL.

2.8.14 Workers shall not indulge in gambling or consumption of liquor while inside BHEL.

2.8.15 No workmen shall enter BHEL in inebriated condition.

2.8.16 Contractor shall not post any worker at a workplace without instructing him of all safety requirements, technical requirements and all rules of proper conduct in line with Factories Act and BHEL Rules and regulations.

2.9 TIME OF COMPLETION:

2.9.1 The time for completion shall be as mentioned in the LOA/Work order. The time for completion shall be reckoned from the date of commencement of work at Site as certified/notified in writing by BHEL Engineers.

2.10 STRIKES & LOCKOUT:

2.10.1 The contractor will be fully responsible for all disputes and other issues connected with his labour. In the event of the contractor's labour resorting to strike or the Contractor resorting to lockout and if the strike or lockout declared is not settled within a period of one month, it may be considered as 'Breach of Contract' and the remedies may be executed, at the discretion of BHEL.

2.10.2 For all purposes whatsoever, the employees of the contractor shall not be deemed to be in the employment of BHEL.

2.11 FORCE MAJEURE:

2.11.1 "Force Majeure" shall mean circumstance which is:

- a) beyond control of either of the parties to contract,
- b) either of the parties could not reasonably have provided against the event before entering into the contract,
- c) having arisen, either of the parties could not reasonably have avoided or overcome, and
- d) is not substantially attributable to either of the parties

And

Prevents the performance of the contract,

Such circumstances include but shall not be limited to:

- i) War, hostilities, invasion, act of foreign enemies.
- ii) Rebellion, terrorism, revolution, insurrection, military or usurped power, or civil war.
- iii) Riot, commotion or disorder by persons other than the contractor's personnel and other employees of the contractor and sub-contractors.
- iv) Strike or lockout not solely involving the contractor's personnel and other employees of the contractor and sub-contractors.
- v) Encountering munitions of war, explosive materials, ionizing radiation or contamination by radio-activity, except as may be attributable to the contractor's use of such munitions, explosives, radiation or radio- activity.

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- vi) Natural catastrophes such as earthquake, tsunami, volcanic activity, hurricane or typhoon, flood, fire, cyclones etc.
- vii) Epidemic, pandemic etc.

2.11.2 The following events are explicitly excluded from Force Majeure and are solely the responsibilities of the non-performing party: a) any strike, work-to-rule action, go-slow or similar labour difficulty (b) late delivery of equipment or material (unless caused by Force Majeure event) and (c) economic hardship.

2.11.3 If either party is prevented, hindered or delayed from or in performing any of its obligations under the Contract by an event of Force Majeure, then it shall notify the other in writing of the occurrence of such event and the circumstances thereof within 15 (fifteen) days after the occurrence of such event.

2.11.4 The party who has given such notice shall be excused from the performance or punctual performance of its obligations under the Contract for so long as the relevant event of Force Majeure continues and to the extent that such party's performance is prevented, hindered or delayed. The Time for Completion shall be extended by a period of time equal to period of delay caused due to such Force Majeure event.

2.11.5 Delay or non-performance by either party hereto caused by the occurrence of any event of Force Majeure shall not

a) Constitute a default or breach of the Contract.

b) Give rise to any claim for damages or additional cost expense occasioned thereby, if and to the extent that such delay or non-performance is caused by the occurrence of an event of Force Majeure.

2.11.6 BHEL at its discretion may consider short closure of contract after 1 year of imposition of Force Majeure in line with extant guidelines. In any case, Supplier/Vendor cannot consider deemed short-closure after 1 year of imposition of Force Majeure

2.12 SETTLEMENT OF DISPUTE:

If any dispute or difference of any kind whatsoever shall arise between BHEL and the Supplier/Vendor, arising out of the contract for the performance of the work whether during the progress of contract termination, abandonment or breach of the contract, it shall in the first place referred to Designated Engineer for amicable resolution by the parties. Designated Engineer (to be nominated by BHEL for settlement of disputes arising out of the contract) who within 60 days after being requested shall give written notice of his decision to the contractor. Save as hereinafter provided, such decision in respect of every matter so referred shall forthwith be given effect to by the Supplier/Vendor who shall proceed with the work with all due diligence, whether he or BHEL desires to resolve the dispute as hereinafter provided or not. If after the Designated Engineer has given written notice of this decision to the party and no intention to pursue the dispute has been communicated to him by the affected party within 30 days from the receipt of such notice, the said decision shall become final and binding on the parties. In the event the Supplier/Vendor being dissatisfied with any such decision or if amicable settlement cannot be reached then all such disputed issues shall be resolved through conciliation in terms of the BHEL Conciliation Scheme 2018.

2.12.1 CONCILIATION:

Any dispute, difference or controversy of whatever nature howsoever arising under or out of or in relation to this Agreement (including its interpretation) between the Parties, and so notified in writing by either Party to the other Party (the "Dispute") shall, in the first instance, be attempted to be resolved amicably in accordance with the conciliation procedure as per BHEL Conciliation Scheme 2018. The proceedings of Conciliation shall broadly be governed by Part-III of the Arbitration and Conciliation Act 1996 or any statutory modification thereof and as provided in - "Procedure for conduct of conciliation proceedings" (as available in www.bhel.com).

Note: Ministry of Finance has issued OM reference No. 1/2/24 dated 03.06.2024 regarding "Guidelines for Arbitration and Mediation in Contracts of Domestic Public Procurement. In the said OM it has been recommended that Government departments/ Entities/agencies are to encourage mediation under the Mediation

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Act. 2023. The said Act has not yet been notified by the Government. Therefore, the clause “Settlement of Disputes” shall be modified accordingly as and when the Mediation Act 2023 gets notified.

2.12.2 ARBITRATION:

2.12.2.1 Except as provided elsewhere in this Contract, in case Parties are unable to reach amicable settlement (whether by Conciliation to be conducted or otherwise) in respect of any dispute or difference; arising out of the formation, breach, termination, validity or execution of the Contract; or, the respective rights and liabilities of the Parties; or, in relation to interpretation of any provision of the Contract; or, in any manner touching upon the Contract (hereinafter referred to as the ‘Dispute’), then, either Party may, refer the disputes to IAMC (International Arbitration and Mediation Centre, Hyderabad) and such dispute to be adjudicated by Sole Arbitrator appointed in accordance with the IAMC Rules.

2.12.2.2 A party willing to commence arbitration proceeding shall invoke Arbitration Clause by giving notice to the other party in terms of section 21 of the Arbitration & Conciliation Act, 1996 (hereinafter referred to as the ‘Notice’) before referring the matter to IAMC. The Notice shall be addressed to the Head of the Unit, BHEL, executing the Contract and shall contain the particulars of all claims to be referred to arbitration with sufficient detail and shall also indicate the monetary amount of such claim including interest, if any.

2.12.2.3 After expiry of 30 days from the date of receipt of aforesaid notice, the party invoking the Arbitration shall submit that dispute to IAMC and that dispute shall be adjudicated in accordance with IAMC Arbitration Rules. The matter shall be adjudicated by a Sole Arbitrator who shall necessarily be a Retd. Judge having considerable experience in commercial matters to be appointed/nominated by IAMC. The cost/expenses pertaining to the said Arbitration shall also be governed in accordance with the IAMC Rules. The decision of the party invoking the Arbitration for reference of dispute to a IAMC for adjudication of that dispute shall be final and binding on both the parties and shall not be subject to any change thereafter.

2.12.2.4 The fee and expenses shall be borne by the parties as per the IAMC rules.

2.12.2.5 The Arbitration proceedings shall be in English language and the seat and venue of Arbitration shall be Hyderabad.

2.12.2.6 Subject to the above, the provisions of Arbitration & Conciliation Act 1996 and any amendment thereof shall be applicable. All matters relating to this Contract and arising out of invocation of Arbitration clause are subject to the exclusive jurisdiction of the Court(s) situated at Hyderabad.

2.12.2.7 Notwithstanding any reference to the Designated Engineer or Conciliation or Arbitration herein, a. the parties shall continue to perform their respective obligations under the Contract unless they otherwise agree. Settlement of Dispute clause cannot be invoked by the Contractor, if the Contract has been mutually closed or ‘No Demand Certificate’ has been furnished by the Contractor or any Settlement Agreement has been signed between the Employer and the Contractor.

2.12.2.8 It is agreed that Mechanism of resolution of disputes through arbitration shall be available only in the cases where the value of the dispute is less than Rs. 10 Crores.

2.12.2.9 In case the disputed amount Claim, Counter claim including interest is Rs. 10 crores and above, the parties shall be within their rights to take recourse to remedies other than Arbitration, as may be available to them under the applicable laws after prior intimation to the other party. Subject to the aforesaid conditions, provisions of the Arbitration and Conciliation Act, 1996 and any statutory modifications or re-enactment thereof as amended from time to time, shall apply to the arbitration proceedings under this clause.

2.12.2.10 In case, multiple arbitrations are invoked (whether sub-judice or arbitral award passed) by any party to under this contract, then the cumulative value of claims (including interest claimed or awarded) in all such arbitrations shall be taken in account while arriving at the total claim in dispute for the subject contract for the purpose of clause 14.2.9. Disputes having cumulative value of less than 10 crores shall be resolved through arbitration and any additional dispute shall be adjudicated by the court of competent jurisdiction.

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2.12.2.11 In case of Contract with Public Sector Enterprise (PSE) or a Government Department, the following shall be applicable: In the event of any dispute or difference relating to the interpretation and application of the provisions of commercial contract(s) between Central Public Sector Enterprises (CPSEs)/ Port Trusts inter se and also between CPSEs and Government Departments/Organizations (excluding disputes concerning Railways, Income Tax, Customs & Excise Departments), such dispute or difference shall be taken up by either party for resolution through AMRCD (Administrative Mechanism for Resolution of CPSEs Disputes) as mentioned in DPE OM No. 05/0003/2019-FTS-10937 dated 14- 12-2022 as amended from time to time.

2.13 PAYMENTS:

2.13.1 RUNNING ACCOUNT BILLS (RA BILLS):

i) These are for interim payments when the contracts are in progress. The bills for such interim payments are to be prepared by Contractor in prescribed formats (RA Bill Forms).

2.13.2 FINAL BILL:

Final Bill' is used for final payment on closing of Running Account for works or for single payment after completion of works. 'Final Bill' shall be submitted as per prescribed format after completion of works as per scope, along with the following:

- i) 'No Claim Certificate' by Contractor.
- ii) Indemnity Bond as per prescribed format.

BHEL shall settle the final bills after deducting all liabilities of Contractor to BHEL.

2.14 CLOSING OF CONTRACTS:

The Contract shall be considered completed and closed upon completion of contractual obligations and settlement of Final Bill. Upon closing of Contract, BHEL shall issue a performance/ experience certificate as per standard format, based on specific request of Contractor as per extant BHEL guidelines through the online portal available at <https://siddhi.bhel.in> only.

2.15 SUSPENSION OF BUSINESS DEALINGS:

BHEL reserves the right to take action against Contractors who either fail to perform or Tenderers/Contractor who indulge in malpractices, by suspending business dealings with them in line with BHEL guidelines issued from time to time.

The offers of the bidders who are under suspension as also the offers of the bidders, who engage the services of the banned firms / principal / agents, shall be rejected. The list of banned firms is available on BHEL web site www.bhel.com.

If any bidder / supplier / contractor during pre-tendering / tendering / post tendering / award / execution / post-execution stage indulges in any act, including but not limited to, mal-practices, cheating, bribery, fraud or and other misconduct or formation of cartel so as to influence the bidding process or influence the price or tampers the tendering process or acts or omits in any manner which tantamount to an offence punishable under any provision of the Indian Penal Code, 1860 or any other law in force in India, or does anything which is actionable under the Guidelines for Suspension of Business dealings, action may be taken against such bidder / supplier / contractor as per extant guidelines of the company available on www.bhel.com and / or under applicable legal provisions. Guidelines for suspension of business dealings is available in the webpage:

http://www.bhel.com/vender_registration/vender.php

2.16 CARTEL FORMATION:

The Bidder declares that they will not enter into any illegal or undisclosed agreement or understanding, whether formal or informal with other Bidder(s). This applies in particular to prices, specifications, certifications, subsidiary contracts, submission or non-submission of bids or any other actions to restrict competitiveness or to

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introduce cartelization in the bidding process. In case, the Bidder is found having indulged in above activities, suitable action shall be taken by BHEL as per extant policies/ guidelines

2.17 FRAUD PREVENTION POLICY:

Bidder along with its associate /collaborators /sub-contractors /sub-vendors / consultants / service providers shall strictly adhere to BHEL Fraud Prevention Policy displayed on BHEL website <http://www.bhel.com> and shall immediately bring to the notice of BHEL Management about any fraud or suspected fraud as soon as it comes to their notice.

2.18 ORDER OF PRECEDENCE:

In the event of any ambiguity or conflict between the contract Documents, the order of precedence shall be in the order below:

- a. Contract agreement with its Amendments
- b. Clarifications/Corrigenda/Errata etc. issued in respect of the tender documents by BHEL
- c. Notice Inviting Tender (NIT)
- d. Price Bid
- e. Special Conditions of Contract (SCC)
- f. General Conditions of Contract (GCC)
- g. Forms and Procedures

2.19 OTHER ISSUES:

2.19.1 Value of Non-judicial Stamp Paper for Bank Guarantees and for Contract Agreement shall be not less than Rs 200/- unless otherwise required under relevant statutes.

2.19.2 In case of any conflict between the General Conditions of Contract and Special Conditions of Contract, provisions contained in the Special Conditions of Contract shall prevail.

2.19.3 Unless otherwise specified in NIT, offers from consortium/ JVs shall not be considered.

SPECIAL CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT (SCC)

1. SCOPE OF CONTRACT:

Maintenance Works Contract of Annual Maintenance Contract for Horticulture Works For 2 Years (2025-27) In BHEL Corporate R&D, Vikasnagar, Hyderabad-500042 as per Schedule of Work (**Annexure-3 & 3A**).

2. SPECIFICATIONS OF CONTRACT LABOUR/MANPOWER UNIT TO BE PROVIDED BY CONTRACTOR:

The Labour will be provided by the Contractor as per the Schedule of Work (**Enclosed as Annexure-3**) shall include the following:

- a. The contractor to provide Minimum Twenty-One (21) Units of Manpower Personnel [i.e. Skilled Workers (SW-03), Semi-Skilled Workers (SSW-05) & Unskilled Workers (USW-13) as per **Annexure-3A**.
- b. **A SUPERVISOR IS TO BE PROVIDED BY THE CONTRACTOR FOR THE WORKS TO BE EXECUTED UNDER THIS CONTRACT AT THEIR OWN COST.**
- c. The Workers will be provided by the Contractor for 8 (Eight) Hours on daily basis, as detailed in the Schedule of Work (**Annexure-3**), which shall include the following:

List of required manpower is given in the below table.

- d. The Contractor shall provide the required manpower for executing the contracted work. The contractor shall not engage a person who is less than 18 years of age and is not more than 60 years of age. The contractor has to ensure that the labours are physically fit to perform the day to day duties.
- e. The contractor shall have full control over his workmen w.r.t determining service conditions, discharge, dismiss, or otherwise terminate their services at any time. The contractor shall be solely responsible for any claim arising out of employment or termination of employment of his employees and for statutory payments.
- f. The contract labour posted shall be supervised by the contractor/ supervisor provided by contractor as per the requirements during conduct of work at site.
- g. The Contract Labour shall be suitably qualified to operate and carry out the work as mentioned in Annexure-3.
- h. The Contractor shall ensure maintenance of Daily Attendance and all other Registers/Records as per the requirement of applicable Labour Laws / State Government / Central Government / BHEL R&D.
- i. The Contract Labourers may be called to attend emergency maintenance work after the normal shift. The same will be counted as extra unit depending on the number of hours of work and will be certified by the Engineer-in-Charge.
- j. The Contractor should ensure that all the Contract Labourers posted on the jobs shall perform duty maintaining integrity, orderliness and discipline.
- k. The contractor shall ensure that his workers follow and comply with all BHEL safety rules, relevant provision of applicable law pertaining to the safety of workmen, plant and equipment as may be prescribed from time to time without any objection or contest or reservation. In case of any difference between statutory requirement and BHEL Safety Rules referred above, the latter shall be binding on the contractor unless the statutory provisions are more stringent.

3. CONTRACTOR'S OBLIGATIONS:

Towards selection, control and supervision of employees:

- a. Contractor or contractor's supervisor shall supervise the work allotted to him and to be carried out by his employees.

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- b. Contractor to ensure that the employees deployed in the premises of BHEL are physically and mentally fit and do not have any criminal record. Such employees should possess requisite skill, proficiency, qualification, experience etc.
- c. Contractor has to ensure that the contract labours are equipped with necessary tools and tackles, instruments and personal protection kits required for performing their day to day job.
 - i. **Tools & Tackles:** Contractor has to ensure that all contract labours are equipped with necessary Hand Tools and Tackles such as Hedge Cutters, Shear Cutters, Pruning Cutters, Sickle, Brooms & Baskets, Hand Sprinklers, Trowel, PVC Breaded pipe (20mm) for Watering etc., and Personal Protection Kits required for performing their day to day works at his risk and cost. BHEL shall not have any liability for these tools, tackles, equipments or materials.
 - ii. **Tractor:** All vehicles (Tractor /Tippers) brought inside for the work should be not be more than 15 years old, the vehicles supplied should have valid Fitness Certificate from RTO, required Insurance Papers etc., Valid Pollution Certificate, Insurance and Drivers should have valid Driving License.
 - iii. **Machinery:** The machinery such as brush cutter, lawn mower, saw cutter, tractor & earth mover (JCB) should be in working conditions and in case of any breakdown/repair/non-availability of machine operator, vendor shall not claim for payment of breakdown/non-availability of machinery hours/days.
- d. Contractor to maintain appropriate records of his employees deployed to carry out the job(s) and consumption of spare parts.
- e. **Compensation Clause:** For all works having contract value of Rs. 5,00,000/- or above, BHEL shall recover the amount of compensation paid to victim (s) by BHEL towards loss of life / permanent disability due to an accident which is attributable to the negligence of contractor, agency or firm or any of its employees as detailed below.
 - i. Victim: Any person who suffers permanent disablement or dies in an accident as defined below.
 - ii. Accident: Any death or permanent disability resulting solely and directly from any unintended and unforeseen injurious occurrence caused during the manufacturing/operation and works incidental thereto at BHEL factories / offices and precincts thereof, project execution , erection and commissioning , services , repairs and maintenance, trouble shooting, serving, overhaul, renovation and retrofitting , trial operation, performance guarantee testing undertaken by the company or during any works/ during working at BHEL units/offices/townships and premises/Project sites.
 - iii. Compensation in respect of each of the victims:
 - A. In the event of death or permanent disability resulting from Loss of both limbs: Rs 10,00,000/- (Rs Ten Lakh)
 - B. In the event of further permanent disability: Rs 7,00,000/- (Rs Seven Lakh).
 - C. Permanent Disablement: A disablement that is classified as permanent total disablement under the provision to section 2 (i) of the Employee's Compensation Act 1923.
- f. To meet the above eventualities, Contractor, is advised to purchase required Group Personal Accidental Insurance Policy / Policies or Death Cum Personal Accidental Insurance Policy/Policies at his own cost, for both the above sums insured and maintain validity throughout the contract period and extended period, if any, covering all the employees deployed in the work by the Contractor and also covering the third party personnel for the damage(s) / injuries / fatalities caused, for whatsoever reason, either by the Contractor or by the employees of the Contractor or by the machinery deployed by the Contractor.
- g. **Death Cum Personal Accidental Insurance Policy:** The Contractor are advised to buy death cum personal accidental insurance (24x7) policy for all of his workforce to be deployed under the contract before the start of work. Accident Insurance Scheme which will be a yearly cover, offering accidental death & disability on account of an accident. The Contractor will be responsible to pay the premium for all the workforce during the contract. **Note:** If any amount / compensation is required to be paid by BHEL due to failure by the Contractor or due to delay in settlement of compensation, on account of release of such amount by BHEL, same shall be recovered from the Contractor's bills / any amounts lying with BHEL from any contract across pan BHEL, for which Contractor is solely responsible.

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- h. Contractor will ensure that the job is executed through his employees on his rolls and under no circumstances the contractor will deploy any casual employee to carry out the job nor shall sub-contract the job without prior written permission.
- i. Contractor will keep watch on his employees and he will be liable for any pilferage / loss to BHEL due to acts of omission and commission by his employees. Similarly, liability for any compensation to outsiders on account of any act of omission and commission by the employees deployed by the contractor shall lie exclusively with him.
- j. Contractor to ensure that all precautions are taken for safety of his employees and equipment.
- k. In the event of termination of contract for any reason whatsoever, the contractor shall withdraw all his employees from the establishment of BHEL. In case contractor decides to terminate services of his employees, he should settle all terminal dues required.
- l. Contractor to provide PF Pass Book to his employees and ensure payment of PF under EPF & Telangana State Govt.
- m. Contractor shall ensure payment of ESI contribution under ESI Act, 1948 and provide ESI Membership No. / Card of each employee.
- n. The Contractor shall comply with all the guidelines, rules and regulations of statutory requirements under Labour Laws/ Rules/Regulations/Notifications in relation to the employment of its personnel from time to time.
- o. The Contractor will also keep watch on their labour and will be held liable for any pilferage/ Loss to the Company by their labour.
- p. In case of misconduct by any of the employee of the Contractor, the matter shall be reported to the Contractor in writing, who shall take immediate action under intimation to BHEL.
- q. In case of theft or loss of property due to negligence or carelessness of employee/labour, the Contractor will be responsible and shall make good the BHEL's loss.
- r. The contractor, as the employer of his workmen, shall manage them. In the event of any dispute arising between the Tenderer and his employees, the Tenderer alone is solely responsible for resolving the dispute between them and BHEL will in no way be responsible for settling the dispute either statutory or otherwise.
- s. **The contractor will be solely responsible for executing the agreed work and the employees of BHEL will only oversee the proper execution of work. The contractor or his representatives shall be available on all working days in the factory to control and supervise his workers and take down instructions from the designated officials of BHEL. THE COST OF DEPLOYMENT OF SUPERVISOR HAS TO BE BORNE BY THE CONTRACTOR.**
- t. The contractor shall have full control over his workmen w.r.t determining service conditions, discharge, dismiss, or otherwise terminate their services at any time. The contractor shall be solely responsible for any claim arising out of employment or termination of employment of his employees and for statutory payments.
- u. The Contractor shall ensure payment of statutory prescribed minimum wages as applicable from time to time as per the Gazette of Telangana Government on or before **10th of every month irrespective of bill payment by the Company.**
- v. The Contractor will have full and exclusive liability for Wages, PF, ESI, VDA, Bonus, Insurance, Uniform etc.; for the personnel deployed by the contractor and other obligation referred under the law now and thereafter imposed by the Government / Local Bodies. The Contractor shall be fully responsible for the timely payment of wages, provident fund, bonus or any other benefits payable under the aforesaid Acts, Laws and Regulations to the Workforce engaged by him at the work premises of the BHEL. BHEL shall not be responsible for these payments or any other liability on this account. The Contractor shall also indemnify and compensate BHEL for any liability incurred by BHEL, if any, including costs incurred thereon. In that event. the nominated officer of BHEL shall be entitled to recover the amount so paid, from the contractor, including forfeiture of the Security Deposit; and, if the sum so payable and / the Security Deposit is less than BHEL's claim, it shall be lawful for BHEL to recover the balance amount as a debt from the Contractor.
- w. BHEL will have no liability whatsoever concerning the workforce deployed by the Contractor for the purpose. Contractor will ensure that the job is executed through his workforce on his rolls and under no

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circumstances the contractor will deploy any casual workforce to carry out the job nor shall subcontract the job. Contractors are advised that workforce must be employed without any discrimination on caste or creed basis. Whenever it comes to notice that undue influence (external) is exerted to appoint select workforce, the Contractor shall report the same immediately, with necessary details, to Work Order issuing authority. Any complaints received regarding workforce exploitation (i.e. noncompliance of labour laws, release of less payment/perks, delay in payment etc.) shall be viewed very seriously and necessary action, as deemed fit, shall be initiated against the Contractor. Contractor to take due care of this aspect during execution of the Contract.

- x. Continuation of the Contract shall be based on the performance of the Contractor. The following parameters shall inter-alia be considered while evaluating performance of the contractor like Timely rendering of services; Quality of works/services; Compliance with statutory requirements; Safety consciousness; Maintenance of staff in proper uniform, Timely payment of wages, and other terms & conditions of contract.
- y. The Contractor shall perform the work assignments to the best satisfaction of BHEL. In case of continued unsatisfactory performance over a period of time by the Contractor, BHEL shall intimate the same in writing to the Contractor. However, if the performance of the contractor does not improve even thereafter, then, BHEL shall have the right to terminate the contract at the Contractor's risk and cost, by giving one month's notice. In addition, BHEL shall also have the right to forfeit in full, the Security Deposit deposited by the Contractor.
- z. CHARACTER VERIFICATION: The contractor should get the character checked of all the workforce deployed by them at the work premises, before engaging & deploying them in BHEL premises. The contractor needs to provide to BHEL a declaration to the effect that there is no case with the Police/Court/Regulatory Authorities against their employee.
- aa. CARE & TREATMENT: Contractor or his representative should be in regular touch with all his workforce during all work timings. If any member of workforce falls ill or suffers an accident / injury, the contractor or his authorized representative, shall immediately arrange to take him/her for proper medical care. Delay / ignoring will be treated as violation of contractual obligations. Adequate arrangement shall be made for immediate recoupment of the equipment when necessary. In case, while on duty and during the course of engagement in work premises of BHEL under this Agreement, if any of the Contractor's Workforce meet (s) with any injury / indisposition due to accident or other natural calamities, the Contractor shall ensure that immediate and adequate medical aid and subsequent treatment facilities are provided to the person(s) concerned free of cost without fail. First Aid Facility should be provided & maintained by the Contractor so, as to be readily accessible during all working hours. In addition, the Contractor shall also be liable for meeting other statutory liabilities like ESI, Insurance etc. Contractor shall make every arrangement to render all the possible assistance to their workforce in such cases.
- bb. The Workforce deployed by the Contractor will have no right or claim for the permanent absorption in BHEL.
- cc. Contractor has to ensure that the labours employed under him are following the COVID related protocols as per guidelines issued by State / Central Government Authorities from time to time. Contractor has to provide necessary sanitizer, soaps etc. (cost to be borne by contractor) to his labour to maintain their hands hygiene. In case the contract labour has comes into contact with Covid-19 suspect / positive person or develops any symptoms, contractor has to inform the same immediately to the respective Engineer-in-Charge.
- dd. BHEL also reserves the right to instruct the contractor to shift the service from one location to another location of BHEL within Hyderabad during the contract period as per BHEL requirement.
- ee. The duties, responsibilities and obligations of the contractor including statutory responsibilities mentioned in this document are indicative and not exhaustive. Contractors are required to confirm with the concerned authorities for proper and complete compliance.

4. AWARDING OF CONTRACT:

Contract will be awarded on fulfilling the rules and regulations of the BHEL.

5. CONTRACT PERIOD & PENALTY:

- a. The contract execution period will be for Two (02) Years from the date of commencement of contract.

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b. **Penalty:** Time is the essence of the contract, if the contractor fails to start the work from mutually agreed contract start date, contractor is liable to pay penalty at a rate of 0.50% per week or part thereof for the value of undelivered portion of the contract value subject to a maximum penalty of 10% of the total contract value.

6. QUANTITY VARIATION AND EXTENSION OF CONTRACT DURATION:

a. BHEL reserves the right to increase or decrease the unit/spare parts material at the same rates and terms and conditions of this contract during the contract period.

b. **Quantity Variation:** The quantity of item in Annexure-3 may vary on either side i.e. below or above due to prevailing condition at the time of execution of contract. Contractor will be eligible for payment against the actual quantity executed including variation. However, contractor shall not claim any compensation due to quantity variation. Some of the item(s) may not be executed due to prevailing condition, and contractor shall not claim any compensation due to non-execution of any item (s).

c. BHEL reserves the right to extend the contract period after completion of original contract period of two (02) years with same rates and terms and conditions of the contract.

7. PAYMENT TERMS:

- a. Price quoted by the bidder should consider all cost elements like Financing Cost, Cost of Maintenance of Accounts, Insurance-Premium, Overheads, Profit Margins, Conveyance Charges, Statutory Requirements / Obligations like variable DA revised from time to time by Telangana Govt. Minimum Wages , Bonus etc., Contractual Obligations, Tools & Tackles, Supervisor and any other expenditure as deemed relevant by the Bidder or Cost of any other item under its scope and to meet any expenses / exigencies (including bearing of penalty by Bidder as per Tender Document) so as to ensure continuity of services. Quoted price by the bidder must keep in view the prevailing applicable Minimum Wages of the Telangana Government. It is the responsibility of the bidder to educate himself about all obligations to be performed under the contract, the financing cost, administrative expenses, statutory liabilities, etc. in the quoted price.
- b. Contractor shall submit the bills to BHEL as per the actual units (as mentioned in Price Bid/Annexure-3) consumed, latest by the 10th day of each month. BHEL shall release the payments, on calendar month basis, through NEFT within 30 days against the submission of invoice along with certification of satisfactory completion by Engineer I/C and all required/clarification documents. All invoices shall indicate work order Number for processing payment and to be submitted in two copies with original signature
- c. Any clarification sought by BHEL, pertains to respective bill, must be clarified by Contractor at the earliest. Otherwise, the delay in payment will be attributed to the Contractor. Aforesaid timeline shall be applicable from the day on which the last clarification/queries sought by BHEL will be settled by the Contractor.
- d. The Contractor will have to intimate the bank account number, and other details of the bank to enable BHEL to credit the payments into the account. No interest shall be payable for delay in making the payments. The contractor shall not be entitled to any interest with respect to any money which may be due to him from BHEL.
- e. While claiming the payment, the contractor must certify on the bill that the payment being claimed is strictly within terms of the contract and all the obligations on his part for claiming this payment have been fulfilled as required under the contract.
- f. While claiming the payment, the contractor must certify on the bill that the employers' contribution (12% for EPF incl. EPS) has been made/paid by the Contractor himself and he has not availed the benefits under PMRPY (Pradhan Mantri Rojgar Protsahan Yojana) Scheme so that there is no double payment to the Contractor concerned on account of EPF & EPS.
- g. The Contractor shall positively make the payment of the wages to his employees on or before 10th of every month and should NOT depend on BHEL payment for the same including the annual leave with wages as per Factory Act, 1948. However, no interest payment shall be made for delay in making payment.

- h. The Contractor shall submit the monthly bills along with following documents: Separate E-Challan in proof of depositing the salary into the Bank Accounts of personnel deployed, Salary / Wage Register reflecting PF & ESI etc. deductions, GST Payment Certificate, Employee' State Insurance Corporation (ESIC) Contribution, proof of depositing of amounts towards PF, delivery challan of spare parts supplied etc. in respect of Labour deployed at BHEL offices only.
- i. All Invoices shall indicate Work Order Number for processing payment.
- j. All payments shall be released by RTGS/EFT as per Contractor's Bank details within 30 days of receipt of Bills/ Invoices.
- k. No advance will be paid for the Contract by BHEL.
- l. Three copies of INVOICE with original signature to be submitted every Month on completion of work.
- m. BHEL will not be responsible for payments other than the mentioned in Price Bid. Contractor shall be responsible for payment of gratuity and other statutory payments as per labour laws.
- n. No price variations in the Rates as agreed upon will be allowed during the period of Contract except the increase/decrease of D.A/minimum wages due to revised wages as declared from time to time by the State Government and whenever the GST/or any other statutory payments are revised by the Government. The final rates agreed by BHEL will be firm for the contract period or extended period of contract and do not vary even in case of deviation of individual items or whole contract on excess as well as on lower side. No price variation and escalation due to increase in materials cost will be allowed.
 - i. **Price Variation Clause:** Any increase in BHEL Fair wages of BHEL R&D or increase in Variable Dearness Allowance or increase in Minimum Wages by Appropriate Government to the eligible workmen of contractors, will be reimbursed by BHEL R&D to the contractor to that extent of increase on production of proof of payment to the workmen by the Contractor duly verified by the Contract Executing Officer and Finance. In case of decrease in BHEL Fair Wages or in the Variable Dearness Allowance by the Appropriate Government, the same will be deducted from the Running Bills of the Contractor to that extent.
- o. The Contractor should also ensure that the Statutory Dues as per the existing provision of various Labour Laws, Rules and Regulations, issued from time to time, (like ESI/PF, etc.) are deposited within the specified period to the concerned Government Authorities. All payments of these statutory dues in respect of deployed in BHEL are to be settled by Contractor and BHEL shall in no manner be responsible for any dispute in this regard. Any statutory variation in the rates of said deposits shall also be admissible during the tenure of the contract. Further, the Contractor shall submit the evidence of deposit of EPF / ESI on monthly basis during the course of the contract.
- p. Gratuity-The contractor shall be liable for payment of gratuity under payment of gratuity act 1971 and the amendments/rules made there under.
- q. The payment under this contract shall be made on monthly basis as per scope of work mentioned in Annexure-3 after complying / ensuring all the statutory / contractual obligations.
- r. The Contractor shall raise the bill, in triplicate, along with all the necessary documents to BHEL on monthly basis.
- s. The Contractor shall submit the GST compliant invoice to BHEL along with the copy of ESI/EPF Challan & ECR (separate EPF-ECR reflecting names of only those Workforce who are deployed at BHEL premises only) of preceding month generated by EPFO /ESI Portal/Authorities, Wage Register (Form B), i.e. the details of payment of wages to Workforce of the month for which services were provided at BHEL premises & proof of payments (NEFT/RTGS/Bank Statement etc.), Attendance Register (Form D) / system generated Attendance Sheet and any other documents sought by BHEL which will be for the purpose of ensuring that Contractor has complied with all the statutory requirements.
- t. GST: Taxes and duties to be governed by GST acts. Strict adherence to new provisions by the vendors like timely submission of invoices, tax payment, filing of returns-GSTR-I etc. will form base of new regime for release of payment from BHEL. Hence, any financial loss occurred due to non-compliance of the GST provisions would be endured at defaulter's end.
 - i. In case GST credit is delayed/ denied to BHEL due to non/delayed receipt of goods and/or tax invoice or expiry of time line prescribed in GST law for availing such ITC, or any other reasons

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- not attributable to BHEL, GST amount shall be recoverable from vendor along with interest levied/leviable on BHEL.
- ii. In case vendor delays declaring such invoice in his return and GST credit availed by BHEL is denied or reversed subsequently as per GST law, GST amount paid by BHEL towards such ITC reversal as per GST law shall be recoverable from vendor/contractor along with interest levied/leviable on BHEL.
- iii. Vendor to ensure correct applicability of IGST/CGST/SGST/UTGST based on Inter / Intra state movement Supply of goods and services or both. Taxes and duties prevalent on the contractual delivery date or the actual delivery date (in case of delay) whichever is lower shall be applicable paid. Composition Scheme to be addressed.
- iv. Vendor shall note that the Invoice has to be raised quoting HSN Code of Goods or Accounting Code of Services or both wherever applicable.
- v. Invoice should mention GSTIN of BHEL R&D as mentioned in PO/LO Corporate R&D GST Registration numbers: GST compliant invoice shall mention the GST registration number of Corporate R&D: **36AAACB4146P1ZG**
- vi. Supplier shall mention their GSTIN registration number in all their invoices and invoices shall be in the format as specified/prescribed under GST laws. Invoices shall necessarily contain Invoice number (in case of multiple numbering system is being followed for billing like SAP invoice no, commercial invoice no etc., then the Invoice No which is linked/uploaded in GSTN network shall be clearly indicated), item description as per PO, Quantity, Rate, Value, applicable taxes with nomenclature (like IGST, SGST, CGST & UTGST) separately, HSN/ SAC Code, etc.
- vii. A declaration to the effect that all tax liability as per GST rules and regulations shall be discharged.
- viii. Wherever E-invoice is applicable, the tax invoice/CN/DN submitted by the vendor must contain the QR code generated in E-invoice portal & IRN
- ix. Vendor shall inform HSN/SAC code and the breakup of the applicable tariff/taxes (CGST/SGST/IGST/UGST) based on from and to locations with individual components in part 1 bid.
- u. Contractor also have to give undertaking after each month that not only wages have been disbursed but also they have paid their contribution towards ESI & EPF Schemes (with the proof of deposit) and complied with all the Acts (as applicable) which shall be mandatory before the bills are cleared. The EPF-Challan shall be verified/authenticated online through EPFO Portal with the help of TRRN No. by the respective concerned BHEL Unit/ Department.
- v. Contractor have to submit an Indemnity Bond in the prescribed form along with the final bill that No wage payment, bonus payment, statutory payment or any other payment to contract workers under minimum wage act, workmen compensation act, bonus act or any other relevant act is pending. It shall also be declared that all the applicable PF and ESI contributions w.r.t. worker's monthly wage is deposited. BHEL shall not be responsible for these payments or any other liability on this account. The Contractor shall also indemnify and compensate BHEL for any liability incurred by BHEL, if any, including costs incurred thereon. In that event. the nominated officer of BHEL shall be entitled to recover the amount so paid, from the contractor, including forfeiture of the Security Deposit; and, if the sum so payable and / the Security Deposit is less than BHEL's claim, it shall be lawful for BHEL to recover the balance amount as a debt from the Contractor.
- w. The Contractor shall be responsible for providing all statutory benefits to the personnel employed by him including Weekly Off Day(s), National Holidays, PF, ESI, Bonus etc.
- x. BONUS: The contractor shall be liable to pay statutory bonus under The Payment of Bonus Act 1965 and submit proof of disbursement. The contractor shall ensure the payment of Min. Bonus @ 8.33% as per Payment of Bonus Amendment Act 2015. Same is applicable for the Wages up to ₹21,000/-. As per Bonus Amendment Act-2015, bonus is to be computed on ₹7,000/- or the minimum wage for the scheduled employment, as fixed by the Appropriate Government, whichever is higher. The contractor shall strictly

comply with the provisions of The Payment of Bonus Act 1965 and The Payment of Bonus Amendment Act-2015. (Refer Annexure 3 wage structure)

- y. **UNIFORM:** The contractor has to ensure that uniform and turnout of the workforce shall be smart and proper at all times. Thus, it will be the responsibility of contractor to provide adequate uniform and protective clothing items to all workforce deployed by them. It is also to be noted by the contractor that since BHEL is making payment of uniform allowance to the Contractor, BHEL reserves the right to check the same. The contractor will be solely responsible to procure and issue the prescribed uniform and accessories to the workforce deployed by him and details of the same have been appended below. The uniform shall not be similar to any colour/ pattern prohibited by any existing law in force in the country. The Contractor shall ensure that while on duty, his workforce put proper uniforms in distinctive colour code and in neat and clean conditions issued to them by the Contractor (Refer Annexure-3A).

- z. **ACCOMMODATION:** If company quarter/s are provided to the employees of the contractor, the monthly rental/s and other charges will be recovered from the monthly running bill.

8. TERMINATION OF CONTRACT:

- In case, the services rendered are found to be unsatisfactory, BHEL reserves its right to terminate the services of the Contractor at any point of time, without assigning any reason.
- The contract can be terminated by giving **one-month** notice in advance by any party. No notice will, however, be required if the contract comes to end on the specified period and it will stand automatically terminated.
- The contract may be terminated by BHEL, in case the Contractor fails to fulfil the terms and conditions of contract agreement by giving one months' notice to contractor.

9. LEGAL CONDITIONS:

- The information gathered by outsource staff during course of their work shall not be divulged to third parties. In view of this, they shall be required to take oath of confidentiality and breach of this condition shall make the Contractor as well as the person concerned liable for penal action under IPC, Cr. PC or any other relevant provision besides, action for breach of contract.
- The Contractor will be responsible for compliance of all statutory provisions relating to Minimum Wages payable to all workers under the Minimum Wages Act, Provident Fund and Employees State Insurance etc. in respect of the persons deployed by it at BHEL premises. BHEL shall have no liability in this regard.
- The Contractor shall also be liable for depositing all statutory payments etc. on account of service rendered by it to BHEL, to the concerned tax collection authorities from time to time as per extant rules and regulations in the matter.
- The Contractor shall maintain all statutory registers under the Law. The Contractor shall produce the same on demand, to the concerned authority of BHEL or any other authority under Law.
- The Tax Deduction at Source (TDS) shall be done as per the provisions of income Tax Act Rules, as amended from time to time and certificate to this effect shall be provided to the Contractor by BHEL.
- The Contractor should arrange for all required permits, licenses, etc., at his own cost.
- In case, the Contractor fails to comply with any statutory / taxation liability under appropriate law, and as a result thereof BHEL is put to any loss / obligation, monetary or otherwise, BHEL will be entitled to get self-reimbursed out of the outstanding bills to the extent of the loss or obligation in monetary terms.

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- h. BHEL reserves the right to withdraw / relax any of the terms and conditions mentioned, so as to overcome the problem encountered at a later stage.
- i. In case of the death of contractor (under proprietorship), without prejudice to any of the rights or remedies under the contract, BHEL shall have the option of terminating the contract without compensation to the contractor's legal heirs/ successors.
- j. In case of breach of any terms and conditions attached to this contract, the Performance Security Deposit of the Contractor will be liable to be forfeited by BHEL besides annulment of the contract.
- k. In case of violation of any legal and/or contract stipulations, BHEL reserves the right to terminate the contract and forfeit the Security Deposit under the contract in addition to recovery of the monetary impact due to such violation, if any, from any of the payable amount under the contract or any other contract with BHEL.
- l. **RECOVERY FROM CONTRACTOR:** Whenever under the contract, any sum of money shall be recoverable from or payable by the contractor, the same may be deducted from any sum then due or which at any time thereafter may become due to the contractor under the contract or under any other contract with BHEL or from his security deposit, or the contractor shall pay the claim on demand without any terms & conditions.
- m. All the statutory requirement under the
 - i. Minimum Wage Act 1948
 - ii. Factories Act 1948
 - iii. Payment of Wages Act 1936
 - iv. EPF Act and MP Act 1952
 - v. Payment of Gratuity Act 1972
 - vi. ESIC Act 1948
 - vii. Contract Labour (R&A) Act 1970
 - viii. Payment of Bonus Act 1965
 - ix. Income Tax Act, GST Act, Industrial Dispute Act 1947 and the other applicable act and rule there under shall be complied by the contractor and notification issued in relation to the employment of his employees issued from time to time by the concerned authorities. Any penalty or demands by the statutory authorities for non-compliance of any of the applicable laws shall be the responsibility of the contractor.
- n. **REGISTERS AND RECORDS AND COLLECTION OF STATISTICS:** All registers and other records required to be maintained under various Labour Laws Rules, shall be maintained complete and up-to-date, and, unless otherwise provided for, shall be kept with Work Supervisor or the nearest convenient building within the precincts of the workplace or at a place within a radius of fifteen kilometres. Such registers shall be maintained legibly in English and Hindi or in the language understood by the majority of the workforce. In case of any call seeking information or statistics in relation to contract labour at any time by an order in writing, the same should be provided without fail. The contractor shall maintain all Register(s); or alternative suitable Register(s) in lieu of any of the registers prescribed below, may be used with the previous approval of the Competent Authority in order to avoid duplication of work for compliance with the provisions of any other Act or the rules framed thereunder for any other laws or regulation or in cases where mechanized pay rolls are introduced for better administration.

The Payment of Bonus Act, 1962:

- i. Register showing the details of the amount of bonus due to each of the contract workers, the deductions under Sections 17 and 18 and the amount actually disbursed, in FORM- C.
- ii. The contractor shall send a return in FORM – D to the Inspector so as to reach him within 30 days after the expiry of the time limit specified in Section 19 for payment of Bonus.

The Ease of Compliance to Maintain Registers under various Labour Laws Rules, 2017: Ministry of Labour & Employment has since notified “Ease of Compliance to maintain Registers under various Labour Laws Rules, 2017” on 21st February 2017 which has in effect replaced the 56 Registers/Forms under 9 Central Labour Laws and Rules made thereunder in to 5 common Registers/Forms. This will save efforts, costs and lessen the compliance burden by various establishments. - i. Employee Register – FORM A.

- iii. Register of Loan/Recoveries – FORM C.

- o. The contractor should ensure issuing of employment card to his laborers at the time of commencement of work and one-month advance if retrenchment in accordance with section 25F of ID Act.
- p. The contractor will be liable to ensure that the contract labours arranged are physically and mentally fit and do not have any criminal record and such employees possess the requisite skill proficiency, qualification, etc. The credentials of the contract labor employed against this contract shall be verified by the contractor.
- q. The above guidelines are only suggestive and not exhaustive. The contractor will have to comply with all applicable statutory provisions, as applicable under extant legislations/ rules.
- r. The Bidder declares that they will not enter into any illegal or undisclosed agreement or understanding, whether formal or informal with other Bidder(s). This applies in particular to prices, specifications, certifications, subsidiary contracts, submission or non-submission of bids or any other actions to restrict competitiveness or to introduce cartelization in the bidding process. In case, the Bidder is found having indulged in above activities, suitable action shall be taken by BHEL as per extant policies/ guidelines.
- s. The bidder along with its associates/ collaborators/ sub-contractors/ sub-vendors/consultants / service providers shall strictly adhere to BHEL Fraud prevention policy displayed on BHEL website <http://www.bhel.com> and shall immediately bring to the notice of BHEL management about any fraud or suspected fraud as soon as it comes to their notice.
- t. The above guidelines are only suggestive and not exhaustive. The contractor will have to comply with all applicable statutory provisions, as applicable under extant legislations/ rules.

10. DAMAGES, FINES AND RECOVERY OF LOSSES ETC.:

- a. The damages / fines, being in the nature of liquidated damages, would be liable to be imposed on the Contractor for violation/breach of the clauses/obligations under the contract/applicable conditions of contract and shall be notified by BHEL as per the terms indicated in the contract/conditions of contract. The Contractor shall be given 3 days prior notice, to respond and submit representation (if any), by BHEL before levying of damages/fines on Contractor. The representation shall be suitably considered by BHEL and decision taken shall be final and binding.

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If no representation is received from the Contractor, then decision as considered appropriate by BHEL shall be taken, without any further reference to the Contractor. The decision shall be final and binding.

The said damages/fines imposed, shall be deductible/recoverable from payments due to the Contractor and/or from the Security Deposit, as the case may be. In the event the payments due to the Contractor and the security deposit available with BHEL falls short of the total damages/fines/penalty, the Contractor shall, on first written demand by BHEL pay to BHEL without demur or dispute the said sum as per BHEL's demand notwithstanding the pendency of any investigation/inquiry/legal proceedings whatsoever before any Court/Tribunal/Authority, Council, etc. The nature of loss including but not limited to quantum, impact etc., as determined by BHEL shall be final and binding on the Contractor.

- b. Failure to provide services owing to unavailability of requisite number of workforce /work point, unwarranted behaviour / indiscipline of the workforce or any other reason(s) shall attract adverse remarks, which may be included in the Performance Certificate and / or attract any legal /administrative action on Contractor or on Contractor's Workforce or both, as deemed fit.
- c. The Contractor understands and agrees that performing the services strictly as per the qualitative, quantitative and time requirements as stipulated in the Contract. Time is of essence of the Contract and that any non-adherence to the said qualitative, quantitative and time requirements as stipulated in the Contract for performing the services under the Contract shall cause incalculable losses to BHEL. Security Deposit of contractor shall be refunded only upon fulfilment of all the Contractual/Statutory obligations, if any, and based on the certification of successful completion of the contract and payment of PF, ESI and applicable statutory dues by the concerned Officials / department and submission of an Undertaking from the contractor, that in case of Claims from any of the statutory authorities, the same would be indemnified by the Contractor or after 03 (three months) from the date of completion of the contract whichever is later, after deducting all expenses/other amounts due to BHEL under the Contract.

The Security Deposit component like FDR, Bank Guarantee, and other Financial Instruments as per NIT

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should be collected in person from BHEL by the representative who is authorised by the Contractor. The Contractor shall nominate a coordinator/ Single Point of Contact (SPOC) who shall be responsible for regular interaction with BHEL so that optimal services of the persons deployed could be availed without any disruption.

1.4 No interest shall be payable by BHEL on earnest money or security deposit or any money due to the contractor by BHEL.

1.5 “Contract Documents” shall include the Contract Agreement, Scope of Work, Special Conditions of the Contract (SCC), General Conditions of the Contract (GCC), Scope of Work, Commercial Conditions of the Contract, amendments, schedules and any other document specified in the contract agreement. This agreement is the outcome of joint efforts of the parties. Subject to the order of precedence as set out below, all documents forming part of the Contract are intended to be correlative, complementary and mutually explanatory. The Contract shall be read and construed as a whole document. In case of any conflict or contradiction between two or more documents with respect to the terms defined in the said documents, the order of precedence shall be as set out below

- i) Contract Agreement;
- ii) Commercial Terms of the Contract;
- iii) Special Conditions of the Contract; and
- iv) General Conditions of the Contract

Note: Any annexure to any of the above shall be read along with the covering document

1.6 The Contractor shall initially pay the wages, and other statutory payments etc., within the specified time, related to his workmen and then claim bills from BHEL. The contractor would be required to submit their claims / bills along with the proof of payment of wages, PF, ESI etc., to the respective statutory departments. The claims / bills will be scrutinised, certified and processed for payment by the respective user departments and forwarded to Accounts Department along with HR/IR clearance certificate for effecting payment.

1.7 BONUS PAYMENT:

The contractor shall pay bonus to all his workmen as per the applicable provisions of the Payment of Bonus Act, 1965 and its rules & amendments issued from time to time for the contract period and as per the circulars issued by BHEL, Corp. R & D, HR/IR from time to time, before claiming final bill. BHEL shall not reimburse any amount towards this.

1.8 OVER RUN COMPENSATION: Not applicable.

1.9 ADVANCE PAYMENT: No Advance payment shall be made to the Contractor.

1.10 The contractor shall be responsible for safety of his workers while they are engaged for work connected with the contract. The Contractor shall be responsible for the appropriate usage of the Uniform and PPE's by their workmen.

1.11 The contractor shall fully comply with the following enactments / guidelines:

- (i) Contract Labour (R & A) Act, 1970 & applicable Rules thereof
- (ii) Minimum Wages Act 1948
- (iii) Payment of Wages Act, 1936
- (iv) ESI Act, 1948
- (v) EPF & Misc. Prov. Act, 1952
- (vi) Employees Compensation Act, 1923.
- (vii) A.P Labour Welfare Fund Act, 1987
- (viii) Inter State Migrant Workmen (RE & CS) Act, 1979
- (ix) Payment of Bonus Act, 1965
- (x) Payment of Gratuity Act, 1972
- (xi) Equal Remuneration Act, 1976
- (xii) The Company's instructions as issued from time to time in regard to working hours, wages, leave, holidays etc.

1.12 The contractor shall obtain License from the Competent Authority if he engages 20 (twenty) or more workmen in BHEL Corp. R & D under Contract Labour (Regulation and Abolition) Act, 1970. The Contractor shall submit a valid Contract Labour License to BHEL, Corp. R & D, on or before the date of commencement of contract.

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1.13 The contractor shall obtain License from the Competent Authority if he engages 5 (five) or more workmen under Inter State Migrant Workmen (RE & CS) Act, 1979 in case the contractor engages workmen recruited from outside State of Telangana in which BHEL Corp. R & D located. The Contractor shall submit a valid Contract Labour License to BHEL, Corp. R & D, on or before the date of commencement of contract.

1.14 The Contractor shall produce the following Registers and forms (as applicable) before commencement of work, for verification by the Contract Executing Officer / Contract Labour Cell of the company, **without which labour entry permission will not be granted.**

The contractor shall maintain the above and any other registers and forms applicable under various Acts/Rules neatly, completely and legibly for inspection by various statutory authorities and by the company officials even at short notice. All above registers shall be maintained at the place of work at Contractor's own cost.

In addition to the above the following are required to be taken care by the contractor under Contract Labour (R&A) Act 1970

- (a) Copy of license to be displayed at the work spot as required under Rule 25 (2) 9 (ix).
- (b) Rates of wages, hours of work, wage period, date of payment, name and address of inspector, date of payment of unpaid wage in English, Hindi and Telugu are to be displayed as per rule 81 (1) (i).
- (c) Notice showing wage period, place and date of disbursement of wages has to be displayed and a copy of the same is required to be sent to Principal Employer under acknowledgement as per rule 71
- (d) An abstract of the Act and Rules in the form approved by the Chief Labour Commissioner (Central), New Delhi to be displayed in English and Hindi and Telugu as per rule 79.
- (e) Copies of Notices required to be displayed as per Rule 81(1)(i) and any change occur the same shall be submitted as per Rule 81 (2).
- (f) Notice of commencement of work has to be given as required under Rule 25 (2) (viii) in form VIA
- (g) Register of person employed to be maintained as required under Rule 75
- (h) Employment cards were to be issued as per rule 76 (i)
 - (i) Register of wages and muster roll to be maintained as per Rule 78(1)(a)(i)
 - (j) Register of fines, deductions and advances to be maintained as per Rule 78(1)(a)(ii)
 - (k) Register of overtime to be maintained as per rule 78(1)(a)(iii)
 - (l) Wage slips have to be issued as per rule 78(1)(b)
- (m) Half Yearly return for the half year ending _____ to be submitted as per Rule 82(1) to the Licensing Officer
- (n) Latrines and Urinals to be provided for the use of the workers as per rule 51 to 56 read with section 18
- (o) First aid facilities to be provided for the use of the workers as per rule 58 read with section 19
- (p) Crèche facilities to be provided for the use of children of women as per Rule 25(2)(vi)
- (q) The contractor shall observe

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(i) Weekly rest day

(ii) The Company List of Holidays.

- 1.15** Contractor shall obtain complete bio-data of the labour, employment certificate and Antecedent verification (issued by Local Police Dept.,) in the prescribed form for each labour and supervisor engaged by him, and shall submit the same to the Human Resource Department/IR section through the contract executing officers before commencement of the work.
- 1.16** The entry permits are to be issued to the Contract Labour by R & D Security Incharge, based on the requisition submitted by Contract Executing Officer and forwarded by Executive in charge of Contract Labour Cell of HR IR section
- 1.17** Every contractor shall submit a notice regarding commencement and completion of work in Form-VI A&B [Rule 25(viii) & 81(3)] to Contract Labour Cell of HR IR section through his contract executing officer, for forwarding the same to State / Central Labour Department as applicable.
- 1.18** The contractor shall make himself or his representative available at the work spot every day during execution of work, for effective supervision. The Contractor or his supervisor shall submit list of shift wise contract labour engaged by him in duplicate to Security Personnel at J Gate on daily basis.
- 1.19** The Contractors shall pay BHEL fair wages (which consists of State minimum wages and additional payments) whichever is higher to their workers. The Contractor shall pay allowances / incentives as decided and communicated by BHEL, from time to time. Reimbursement of any increase in BHEL fair wages to the Contractor after payment of the same to the eligible workers engaged under the contract shall be as per Price Variation Clause of the Contract.
- 1.20** The Contractor shall comply with all the statutory provisions such as Bonus (% as prevailing in BHEL Corp. R & D), PF (12%), EDLI (0.5%), ESI, Gratuity, Service Tax(Composite) and other applicable taxes, BHEL Fair Wages prevailing at the time of payment or arrears thereof, declared Holidays, leave, AP Labour Welfare Fund etc. The contractor shall submit the documentary evidence of payment on account of submission of statutory payments made to the concerned agencies every month and same may be submitted for clearance of bill.
- 1.21** The contractor shall attend to all inspections notified/conducted by the personnel department, Labour department, P.F. authorities, Factory Inspectors, ESI inspectors or any other such authorities under the Act, failing which appropriate action shall be initiated.
- 1.22** Non-compliance of provisions under any Acts/Rule/instructions/guidelines shall make the contractor liable for penal action including termination of contract.
- 1.23** Contractor shall furnish in a separate letter, his place of residence and postal address. The delivery at the above named place or posting in a Post Box regularly maintained by the Postal Department or sending letters registered for acknowledgement of any notice, letter or other communication to the contractor shall be deemed sufficient service thereof upon the contractor. Change in address shall come into force at any time by an instrument executed by the contractor and delivered to the Company official who has signed the contract.
- 1.24** The contractor must satisfy himself by personal study and examination of the specifications furnished and understand thoroughly the scope of proposed work in detail and all conditions affecting the work before entering into the contract. There shall not be at any time, dispute/complaint of any nature regarding scope of work and interpretation of specifications or any misunderstanding with regard to nature or omission of the work to be done nor shall any application for compensation in terms of time and money shall be accepted by Company regarding the above.
- 1.25** Contractor shall in his absence keep competent agent constantly on the works and any directions or explanations given by the "Contract Signing Officer" or his representative to such agent shall be held to have been given to the contractor himself.
- 1.26** Contractor on the advice of the Company official shall immediately remove any person/s employed by him, who may in the opinion of the Company official is incompetent or misconducts himself and such persons shall not be again employed on the works without written permission of the Company official.
- 1.27** Wherever required, the contractor shall erect and maintain at his own cost temporary weather proof sheds at such places approved by the Company for keeping materials under cover.
- 1.28** The contractor shall give all notices required by the Acts, Regulation, Bye-laws, and pay all fees in connection therewith unless and otherwise arranged and decided in writing with the Company. He shall also ensure that no attachments are made against materials or work forming part of or for the use of the contractor. In all such cases, contractor shall protect and indemnify the Company against any claim or liability arising from or based on the violation of any such laws, ordinances, regulations, orders, decrees or attachment either by himself or by his employees.

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- 1.29** It shall be contractor's sole responsibility to protect the public and his employees against accident from any cause and provide required safety equipment and shall indemnify the Company against any claims for damages for injury to the person(s) or property / properties resulting from any such accidents and shall, where the provisions of the Employees Compensation Act does not apply, take steps to properly insure against any claims thereunder.
- 1.30** In the event of any accident in respect of which compensation may become payable under the Employees Compensation Act. VIII of 1923 whether by the contractor or by the Company as principal, it shall be lawful for the Company to retain out of monies due and payable to the contractor such sum or sums of money as may, in the opinion of the Company shall be final in regard to all matter arising in this clause
- 1.31** No work shall be done on Sundays or on any other declared Holidays of the Company without the written permission of the Company Officer-In-Charge of the work and HR/IR section of Contract Labour Cell. The contractor shall comply with the provisions of the Factories Act 1948 if the same are applicable.
- 1.32** The contractor shall keep his work place clean and safe to avoid injuries to men and damage to finished products / equipment.
- 1.33** On the occurrence of an accident, which results in the death of any of the workmen employed by the contractor or which is so serious as to be likely to result in the death of any such workmen, the contractor shall within 24 hours of the happening of such an accident intimate in writing to the Company official in charge of the work. The Contractor will also pay compensation as determined by the Authorities.
- 1.34** The contractor shall indemnify the Company against all losses or damages sustained by the Company resulting directly or indirectly from his failure to give intimation in the manner aforesaid including the penalties or dues if any and become payable by the Company, as a consequence of failure, the Company to give notice under the Employees Compensation Act 1923 or otherwise confirm to the provisions of the said Act in regard to such accident.
- 1.35** The contractor shall ensure adherence to all statutory requirements applicable to BHEL.
- 1.36** The contractor shall ensure abidance by all the labour laws especially including Contract Labour (R&A) Act 1970, Payment of wages Act 1936, Employees Compensation Act 1923, Factories Act, 1948, Minimum Wages Act 1948, Payment of Bonus Act 1965, Payment of Gratuity Act 1972, ESI Act 1948 and Provident Fund Misc. Prov. Act 1952 etc., as amended from time to time.
- 1.37** The contractor shall fully indemnify the loss if any caused to BHEL due to any default or non-observance of any of the laws, or any omission or commission or inability on the part of the contractor or his representative.
- 1.38** The contractor shall keep and produce for inspection at all times, forms, registers and other records required to be maintained under various statutes in order to enable scrutiny by the Company whenever required.
- 1.39** The contractor shall produce to the Company, the documentary proof of payment of the said statutory dues. Non-observance of the provisions will be construed as default by the contractor in making such payment, and payment of his bill will be deferred despite other legal action.
- 1.40** The Income tax as applicable will be deducted from the bill of the contractor.
- 1.41** The Contractor shall maintain the daily attendance of his labours in the prescribed Pro-forma for accounting payment of wages, deduction towards ESI & PF Contributions, payment of Bonus, leave etc.
- 1.42** The contractor will have to extend paid National Holidays and Festival Holidays to their workmen as per BHEL Corp. R & D direction or as per the provisions of the relevant Act and the Rules thereof. However, if due to exigencies of work the contractor engages his workmen on National Holidays or Festival Holidays contractor shall pay additional wages as prescribed under the provisions of the Act.
- 1.43** In addition to the above holidays mentioned herein above, in the event the Central / State Government declares any other holiday/s and if such Holiday/s is/are applicable to BHEL Corp. R & D, Hyderabad also, then the Contractor shall extend paid Holiday/s to his workmen.
- 1.44** The contractor shall obtain a separate Provident Fund Code for his establishment and ensure implementation of Provident Fund & Misc. Prov. Act 1952 in the case of all eligible Labours engaged by him in the BHEL Corp. R & D (employees) and in the process shall conform to all stipulated conditions under the Provident Fund & Misc. Provisions Act 1952 and rules framed thereunder. The PF contribution i.e., 12% shall be paid on total wages paid to the contract labour.
- 1.45** Notwithstanding the above clause, in case of any financial loss incurred by company on account of contravention of the Provident Fund regulations or any regulations of rule by the contractor, the contractor shall submit an undertaking to indemnify the company to the extent of the loss incurred by the company.
- 1.46** The contractor should engage only those labourers who shall be more than 18 (eighteen) years of age.
- 1.47** उप-अनुबंध | SUB-CONTRACTING:

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The contractor shall not sub-contract or sub-let or transfer or assign the contract in full or any part thereof to any other person or firm or company without written consent from BHEL.

- 1.48** The contractor shall provide the required safety equipment to the labours engaged by him.
- 1.49** Contractor shall issue "Employment Card" to all labour and supervisors covered under the job work contract as prescribed under the Contract Labour (R&A) Acts/Rules.
- 1.50** A copy of the agreement between contractor and his labour shall be submitted to the Contract Labour Cell of HR-IR section
- 1.51** Whenever the term "CONTRACTOR" is used, it shall be understood to refer to the particular person, firm or corporation with whom an agreement has been made by the concerned Company official for executing the work defined in the concerned agreement and for the purpose of instructions regarding compliance with contract conditions, it shall include the contractor's authorised agents, who are entrusted with the work by contractor.
- 1.52** The quantities mentioned in the agreement schedule are worked out from the relevant drawings / estimations of the Company and may or may not be the actuals required for execution.
- 1.53** The Company does not expressly or by implication agree that the actual amount of the work to be done at BHEL shall correspond there with, but reserves the right to increase or decrease the quantity of operations / unit / number of persons deployed etc., or portion of the work as he deems necessary.
- 1.54** All the works shall be carried out in accordance with the directions and to the satisfaction of the Company official in accordance with the drawings, specifications and instructions. Supplementing or explaining the same as may be from time to time shall be done by the Company official.
- 1.55** For all modifications, omissions or additions to the specifications, the Company shall issue revised written instructions and no modifications, omission or addition shall be made unless so authorized and directed by the Company in writing.
- 1.56** The Company shall have the privilege of ordering modifications, omissions, or additions at any time before completion of the work.
- 1.57** All materials, articles and workmanship shall be the best of their respective kinds for the class of work described in the contract specifications and schedule and materials to be obtained by the contractor shall be from sources approved by the Company.
- 1.58** Sample of materials shall be furnished by the contractor at his expense to the Company when called for before executions of any work. On approval of the sample of materials by authorized Official of the Company, the Contractor shall take up the work.
- 1.59** The contractor shall be solely responsible for executing the agreed work and the employees of BHEL will only oversee the proper execution of work. The contractor or his representatives shall be available in the factory to control and supervise his workers and take down instructions from the designated officials of BHEL. The cost of deployment of Supervisor has to be borne by the Contractor.
- 1.60** The contractor shall have full control over his workmen w.r.t determining service conditions, discharge, dismissal, or otherwise terminate their services at any time. The contractor shall be solely responsible for any claim arising out of employment or termination of employment of his employees and for statutory payments.
- 1.61** The contractor shall employ only such personnel who are medically fit. The company has right to direct the contractor to remove from the premises such of his personnel who may be physically, hygienically, clinically or medically unfit.
- 1.62** The contractor shall employ only such personnel who found fit for employment in Organisations such as Central/State/Public Undertakings by the Police authorities. Persons against whom criminal cases are pending or under investigation and persons found guilty of offences involving moral turpitude shall not be engaged for executing work.
- टिप्पणी | Note:** Contractor / Contractor's representatives / Contractor's workers shall be permitted inside Factory only on regular passes which will be issued only after submission of respective persons' original Police Verification Certificate along with PF, ESI, dependent & nominee details.
- 1.63** The Contractor shall comply with all the operational rules and regulations, including safety and security rules framed by the company from time to time wherein the Contractor or his workmen happen to be operating / working. In the event of any of the workmen of the contractor violating any of the said rules and regulations, the Contractor would be required to remove forthwith such workmen from the company's premises.
- 1.64** Out of total manpower to be deployed the Contractor shall to the extent possible deploy 15% scheduled castes and 7.5% of scheduled tribe community.

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- 1.65** All safety equipment such as safety belts, helmets & other equipment (as required for this work) are to be positioned by the contractor and used as per requirement.
- 1.66** Any casualty or damage caused to the property or person by any untoward incidents while executing this contract will be at the contractor's risk & cost.
- 1.67** Violation of applicable safety, health & environment related norms, a penalty of Rs.5,000/- (Rupees Five thousand only) per occasion shall be imposed.
- 1.68** The agency has to produce medical fitness certificate for his workmen for suitability of workers to work on heights
- 1.69** The Company shall have power to reject at any stage, any work which is considered to be defective in quality of material or workmanship and shall not be debarred from rejecting wrong materials by reasons of having previously passed them in an unworked condition. Any portion of the work or materials rejected or pronounced to be inferior or not in accordance with specifications of the Company shall be taken down and removed from the work site at the contractor's expenses.
- 1.70** The decision of the Company shall be final and binding on the contractor on all technical questions which may arise in the contract with respect to material, workmanship, removal of improper work, specifications, notes, procedures etc.
- 1.71** The decision of the "Contract Signing Officer" or any officer deputed by him duly authorized on his behalf, in respect of the rate of progress and the quality of work or material shall be final and binding on the Contractor.
- 1.72** Contractor shall be deemed to have included in his tender price of all the plant, Machinery and appliances required for the purpose of all operations connected to secure a satisfactory quality of work and rate of progress which in the opinion of the Company will ensure the completion of the work within the time specified.
- 1.73** If at any time, during the progress of work or any part of it such methods or equipment appear to the Company official to be insufficient or inappropriate for ensuring the quality of work required or rate of progress, Company Officials may order the contractor to increase their efficiency or to improve their quality of work and the contractor shall comply with such order/s and on failure of which the Company may take such action as it deems fit to improve the quality of work or the rate of progress required from the contractor and all such actions taken by the Company shall be at the cost and risk of the contractor.
- 1.74** It is open to the Company to lend or supply to the contractor any tools, implements, materials and machinery that are needed by the contractor, which in the opinion of the Company is essential to improve the quality or progress of work. The contractor shall pay such deposit or charges that may be fixed or determined by the Company for any such articles or machinery lent or hired to the contractor.
- 1.75** Any electric power required for contractor's machinery for the purpose of work shall be supplied by the Company at the written request of the contractor at one point subject to the observance of rules and regulations of Electricity Board/Company and charges there on shall be recovered from the contractor.
- 1.76** The contractor shall comply to all applicable rules & regulations and laws of Central/State Govt. or any local authority and that of the Company with whose system the machinery is supposed to be connected.
- 1.77** All waste material as it accumulates shall be removed from the site to the point of disposal as indicated from time to time by the Company. If this is not adhered to, the Company shall remove the scrap and recover the cost of these operations from the bills of the contractor.
- 1.78** Any sum due from the contractor on account of tools and plants, stores, or any other items provided by the Company shall be deducted from the respective bills / any other payments due to the Contractor. Any loss or damages caused by the workmen of the contractor arising due to any strike/ stoppage of works/dharnas etc., The Contractor shall be responsible for such actions of their workmen engaged and all such losses or damages incurred to the company shall be recovered from the contractor.
- 1.79** BHEL reserves the right to terminate the contract by issuing Thirty (30) days' Notice on account of failure of the contractor in discharging their respective contractual obligations mentioned in this contract.
- 1.80** BHEL reserves its right to terminate the contract due to any failure on the part of the Contractor in discharging his obligations under the contract or in the event of his becoming insolvent or going into liquidation. The decision of the BHEL about the failure on the part of the Contractor shall be final and binding on the Contractor.
- 1.81** In case of any damage to the existing building, structures, materials, tools, furniture and fixtures, machines etc., caused from contractor's end directly or indirectly, the cost of its repairs or replacement will be recovered from the contractor. If there is any work stoppage in any area of the Plant due to the fault of the contractor, the contractor is liable to compensate the same.
- 1.82** In the event of any failure on the part of the contractor, BHEL shall have the right without prejudice to any other right or remedies, to get the work done through any other agency and the Contractor shall be liable to compensate

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BHEL for any losses on this account. The additional cost, loss, if any incurred by BHEL will be recovered from the bills, security deposits, other dues, directly from the contractor or by initiating appropriate legal action.

- 1.83** In case of breach of any of the terms and conditions of the contract, a claim shall be lodged under the bank guarantee with the guarantor or forfeiture of EMD/Security Deposit at the discretion of the competent authority of the Company. On successful completion of the contract to the satisfaction of the Company, the bank guarantee/SD shall be released after due claim period.
- 1.84** In case of any suit or other legal proceeding arising under this contract, the courts at Sangareddy Dist., only shall have the jurisdiction.
- 1.85** The Company reserves the right to enter into parallel agreement with one or more contractors at their discretion.
- 1.86** Disputes, grievances between the contractor and his labour, will have to be settled by the Contractor only within two weeks.
- 1.87** The labour employed by the Contractor, if found in abetting any fellow labour or Contractors or any BHEL employee, the same shall be considered as an act of indiscipline. Such labourers shall be removed from the services of the contractor, on the advice of BHEL. Further, the Contractor shall initiate every necessary action in accordance with the relevant Laws, Rules & Regulations and enactments of State and Central Government as applicable from time to time.
- 1.88** Wherever BHEL/COMPANY standards are mentioned, copies of which are enclosed shall be strictly followed.
- 1.89** Nothing contained in the contract agreement and its conditions shall be deemed to preclude or render inoperative the service of any notice, letter or other communication upon the contractor personally.
- 1.90** The decision of the "Contract Signing Officer" shall be final and binding on the contractor on all technical questions which may arise touching the contract with respect to the quality of material, workmanship, removal of improper work, interpretation of the working drawings, specifications, notes, procedures etc.

1.91 FORCE MAJEURE:

The following shall amount to Force Majeure conditions:

- (i) Acts of God, Act of any Government, War, Sabotage, Riots, Civil, Flood, Fire, Cyclone, Earthquake, and Epidemic, Pandemic over which the Contractor has no control;

If the contractor suffers delay in the due execution of the contract due to delays caused by Force Majeure conditions, as defined above, the agreed time for completion of the work covered by this contract shall be extended by a period of time equal to the period of delay, provided that on the occurrence of any such contingency, the contractor immediately reports to BHEL in writing the causes for the delay but the Contractor shall not be eligible for any compensation on this account.

1.92 सुलह एवं मध्यस्थता | CONCILIATION & ARBITRATION:

CONCILIATION:

The parties agree that if at any time, any disputes (which term shall mean and include any dispute, difference, question or disagreement arising in connection with construction, meaning, operation, effect, interpretation or breach of the agreement, contract or the memorandum of understanding), which the parties are unable to settle mutually, arise inter-se the parties, the same may, be referred by either party to conciliation to be conducted through independent experts committee to be appointed by competent authority of BHEL from the BHEL panel of conciliators.

The proceedings of conciliation shall broadly be governed by Part-III of the arbitration and conciliation Act 1996 or any statutory modification thereof.

The Annexure together with its formats will be treated as if the same is part hereof and shall be as effectual as if set out herein in this GCC/Agreement/Contract/MOU etc.

The purchaser/contractor/seller etc. agrees that the purchaser/contractor/MOU etc., may make any amendments or modifications to the provisions stipulated in the Annexure-2 to this GCC/Agreement/Contract/MOU etc., from time to time and confirms that it shall be bound by such amended or modified provisions of the Annexure-2 with effect from the date as intimated by BHEL to it.

ARBITRATION:

Except as provided elsewhere in this contract, in case amicable settlement is not reached between the parties, in respect of any dispute or difference; arising out of the formation, breach, termination, validity or execution of the contract; or, the respective rights and liabilities of the parties; or in relation to interpretation of any provision of the contract; or, in any manner touching upon the contract, then, either party may, by a notice in writing to the other party refer such dispute or difference to the sole arbitration of an arbitrator appointed by the Head of BHEL Unit / region / division issuing the contract.

The arbitrator shall pass a reasoned award and the award of the arbitrator shall be final and binding upon the parties. Subject as aforesaid, the provisions of arbitration and conciliation act 1996 (India) or statutory modifications or re-enactments thereof and the rules made thereunder and for the time being in force shall apply to the arbitration proceedings under this clause. The seat of arbitration shall be Hyderabad only at state of Telangana.

The cost of arbitration shall be borne as per the award of the arbitrator.

Subject to the arbitration in terms of clause as stated above, the courts at Sangareddy shall have exclusive jurisdiction over any matter arising out of or in connection with this contract.

Notwithstanding the existence or any dispute or differences and / or reference for the arbitration, the contractor shall proceed with and continue without hindrance the performance of its obligations under this contract with due diligence and expedition in a professional manner except where the contract has been terminated by either party in terms of this contract.

In case of contract with public sector enterprises (PSE) or a Government Department, the following shall be applicable:

“In the event of any dispute or difference relating to the interpretation and application of the provisions of commercial contract (s) between central public sector enterprises (CPSEs) / Port Trusts inter se and also between CPSEs and Government Departments / Organisations (excluding disputes concerning railways, income tax, customs & excise departments). Such dispute or difference shall be taken up by either party for resolution through AMECD as mentioned in DPE OM No. 4(1) / 2013-DPE (GM)/FTS-1835 dated. 22.05.2018”.
