 - b. "Control" shall include the right to appoint majority of the directors or to control the management or policy decisions including by virtue of their shareholding or management rights or shareholders agreements or voting agreements.
 - 2. In case of a partnership firm, the beneficial owner is the natural person(s) who, whether acting alone or together, or through one or more juridical person, has ownership of entitlement to more than fifteen percent of capital or profits of the partnership.
 - 3. In case of an unincorporated association or body of individuals, the beneficial owner is the natural person(s), who, whether acting alone or together, or through one or more juridical person has ownership of or entitlement to more than fifteen percent of the property or capital or profits of the such association or body of individuals.

- 4. Where no natural person is identified under (1) or (2) or (3) above, the beneficial owner is the relevant natural person who holds the position of senior managing official;
- 5. In case of a trust, the identification of beneficial owner(s) shall include identification of the author of the trust, the trustee, the beneficiaries with fifteen percent or more interest in the trust and any other natural person exercising ultimate effective control over the trust through a chain of control or ownership.
- V. An Agent is a person employed to do any act for another, or to represent another in dealings with third person.

- The consulting firm will not look at, examine, or retrieve any document, file, or database, except those to which the consulting firm is authorized to access and which are necessary for him/her to access in order to perform his/her assigned duties.
- The consulting firm will not discuss or share with any unauthorized person, group or department, inside or outside BHEL, any conclusions that the consulting firm or others

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draw from confidential information if discussing or sharing those conclusions would reveal any confidential information.

INTEGRITY PACT

Between

Bharat Heavy Electricals Ltd. (BHEL), a company registered under the Companies Act 1956 and having its registered office at "BHEL House", Siri Fort, New Delhi - 110049 (India) hereinafter referred to as "The Principal", which expression unless repugnant to the context or meaning hereof shall include its successors or assigns of the ONE PART

and

Preamble

The Principal intends to award, under laid-down organizational procedures, contract/s *Engagement of a consulting firm for Project Management Consultancy for timely execution of 2X660 MW NTPC Talcher Project (ETS no.: BHE/PW/PUR/TLRPT-PM-CONSULTANCY/2711*). The Principal values full compliance with all relevant laws of the land, rules and regulations, and the principles of economic use of resources, and of fairness and transparency in its relations with its Bidder(s)/ Contractor(s).

In order to achieve these goals, the Principal will appoint Independent External Monitor(s), who will monitor the tender process and the execution of the contract for compliance with the principles mentioned above.

Section 1- Commitments of the Principal

- 1.1 The Principal commits itself to take all measures necessary to prevent corruption and to the following principles:-
- 1.1.1 No employee of the Principal, personally or through family members, will in connection with the tender for, or the execution of a contract, demand, take a promise for or accept, for self or third person, any material or immaterial benefit which the person is not legally entitled to.
- 1.1.2 The Principal will, during the tender process treat all Bidder(s) with equity and reason. The Principal will in particular, before and during the tender process, provide to all Bidder(s) the same information and will not provide to any Bidder(s) confidential/ additional information through which the Bidder(s) could obtain an advantage in relation to the tender process or the contract execution.
- 1.1.3 The Principal will exclude from the process all known prejudiced persons.

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1.2 If the Principal obtains information on the conduct of any of its employees which is a penal offence under the Indian Penal Code 1860 and Prevention of Corruption Act 1988 or any other statutory penal enactment, or if there be a substantive suspicion in this regard, the Principal will inform its Vigilance Office and in addition can initiate disciplinary actions.

Section 2 - Commitments of the Bidder(s)/Contractor(s)

- 2.1 The Bidder(s)/ Contractor(s) commit himself to take all measures necessary to prevent corruption. He commits himself to observe the following principles during his participation in the tender process and during the contract execution.
- 2.1.1 The Bidder(s)/ Contractor(s) will not, directly or through any other person or firm, offer, promise or give to the Principal or to any of the Principal's employees involved in the tender process or the execution of the contract or to any third person any material, immaterial or any other benefit which he/ she is not legally entitled to, in order to obtain in exchange any advantage of any kind whatsoever during the tender process or during the execution of the contract.
- 2.1.2 The Bidder(s)/ Contractor(s) will not enter with other Bidder(s) into any illegal or undisclosed agreement or understanding, whether formal or informal. This applies in particular to prices, specifications, certifications, subsidiary contracts, submission or non-submission of bids or any other actions to restrict competitiveness or to introduce cartelization in the bidding process.
- 2.1.3 The Bidder(s)/ Contractor(s) will not commit any penal offence under the relevant Indian Penal Code (IPC) and Prevention of Corruption Act; further the Bidder(s)/ Contractor(s) will not use improperly, for purposes of competition or personal gain, or pass on to others, any information or document provided by the Principal as part of the business relationship, regarding plans, technical proposals and business details, including information contained or transmitted electronically.
- 2.1.4 Foreign Bidder(s)/ Contractor(s) shall disclose the name and address of agents and representatives in India and Indian Bidder(s)/ Contractor(s) to disclose their foreign principals or associates. The Bidder(s)/ Contractor(s) will, when presenting his bid, disclose any and all payments he has made, and is committed to or intends to make to agents, brokers or any other intermediaries in connection with the award of the contract.
- 2.2 The Bidder(s)/ Contractor(s) will not instigate third persons to commit offences outlined above or be an accessory to such offences.
- 2.3 The Bidder(s)/ Contractor(s) shall not approach the Courts while representing the matters to IEMs and will await their decision in the matter.

Section 3 - Disqualification from tender process and exclusion from future contracts

If the Bidder(s)/ Contractor(s), before award or during execution has committed a transgression through a violation of Section 2 above, or acts in any other manner such as to put his reliability or credibility in question, the Principal is entitled to disqualify the Bidder(s)/ Contractor(s) from the tender process or take action as per the separate "Guidelines on Banning of Business dealings with Suppliers/ Contractors", framed by the Principal.

Section 4 - Compensation for Damages

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- 4.1 If the Principal has disqualified the Bidder from the tender process prior to the award according to Section 3, the Principal is entitled to demand and recover the damages equivalent Earnest Money Deposit/ Bid Security.
- 4.2 If the Principal has terminated the contract according to Section 3, or if the Principal is entitled to terminate the contract according to section 3, the Principal shall be entitled to demand and recover from the Contractor liquidated damages equivalent to 5% of the contract value or the amount equivalent to Security Deposit/ Performance Bank Guarantee, whichever is higher.

Section 5 - Previous Transgression

- 5.1 The Bidder declares that no previous transgressions occurred in the last 3 years with any other company in any country conforming to the anti-corruption approach or with any other Public Sector Enterprise in India that could justify his exclusion from the tender process.
- 5.2 If the Bidder makes incorrect statement on this subject, he can be disqualified from the tender process or the contract, if already awarded, can be terminated for such reason.

Section 6 - Equal treatment of all Bidders/ Contractors / Sub-contractors

- 6.1 The Principal will enter into agreements with identical conditions as this one with all Bidders and Contractors. In case of sub-contracting, the Principal contractor shall be responsible for the adoption of IP by his sub-contractors and shall continue to remain responsible for any default by his sub-contractors.
- 6.2 The Principal will disqualify from the tender process all bidders who do not sign this pact or violate its provisions.

Section 7 - Criminal Charges against violating Bidders/ Contractors /Subcontractors

If the Principal obtains knowledge of conduct of a Bidder, Contractor or Subcontractor, or of an employee or a representative or an associate of a Bidder, Contractor or Subcontractor which constitutes corruption, or if the Principal has substantive suspicion in this regard, the Principal will inform the Vigilance Office.

Section 8 -Independent External Monitor(s)

- 8.1 The Principal appoints competent and credible Independent External Monitor for this Pact. The task of the Monitor is to review independently and objectively, whether and to what extent the parties comply with the obligations under this agreement.
- 8.2 The Monitor is not subject to instructions by the representatives of the parties and performs his functions neutrally and independently. He reports to the CMD, BHEL.
- 8.3 The Bidder(s)/ Contractor(s) accepts that the Monitor has the right to access without restriction to all contract documentation of the Principal including that provided by the Bidder(s)/ Contractor(s). The Bidder(s)/ Contractor(s) will grant the monitor, upon his request and demonstration of a valid interest, unrestricted and unconditional access to his contract documentation. The same is applicable to Sub-contractor(s). The Monitor is under contractual obligation to treat the information and documents of the Bidder(s)/ Contractor(s) / Sub-contractor(s) with confidentiality in line with Non-disclosure agreement.

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- 8.4 The Principal will provide to the Monitor sufficient information about all meetings among the parties related to the contract provided such meetings could have an impact on the contractual relations between the Principal and the Contractor. The parties offer to the Monitor the option to participate in such meetings.
- 8.5 The role of IEMs is advisory, would not be legally binding and it is restricted to resolving issues raised by an intending bidder regarding any aspect of the tender which allegedly restricts competition or bias towards some bidders. At the same time, it must be understood that IEMs are not consultants to the Management. Their role is independent in nature and the advice once tendered would not be subject to review at the request of the organization.
- 8.6 For ensuring the desired transparency and objectivity in dealing with the complaints arising out of any tendering process, the matter should be examined by the full panel of IEMs jointly as far as possible, who would look into the records, conduct an investigation, and submit their joint recommendations to the Management.
- 8.7 The IEMs would examine all complaints received by them and give their recommendations/ views to CMD, BHEL, at the earliest. They may also send their report directly to the CVO and the Commission, in case of suspicion of serious irregularities requiring legal/ administrative action. IEMs will tender their advice on the complaints within 10 days as far as possible.
- 8.8 The CMD, BHEL shall decide the compensation to be paid to the Monitor and its terms and conditions.
- 8.9 IEM should examine the process integrity; they are not expected to concern themselves with fixing of responsibility of officers. Complaints alleging mala fide on the part of any officer of the organization should be looked into by the CVO of the concerned organisation.
- 8.10 If the Monitor has reported to the CMD, BHEL, a substantiated suspicion of an offence under relevant Indian Penal Code/ Prevention of Corruption Act, and the CMD, BHEL has not, within reasonable time, taken visible action to proceed against such offence or reported it to the Vigilance Office, the Monitor may also transmit this information directly to the Central Vigilance Commissioner, Government of India.
- 8.11 The number of Independent External Monitor(s) shall be decided by the CMD, BHEL.
- 8.12 The word 'Monitor' would include both singular and plural.

Section 9 - Pact Duration

- 9.1 This Pact shall be operative from the date IP is signed by both the parties till the final completion of contract for successful bidder and for all other bidders 6 months after the contract has been awarded. Issues like warranty / guarantee etc. should be outside the purview of IEMs.
- 9.2 If any claim is made/lodged during currency of IP, the same shall be binding and continue to be valid despite the lapse of this pact as specified above, unless it is discharged/determined by the CMD, BHEL.

Section 10 - Other Provisions

10.1 This Integrity Pact is subject to Indian Laws and exclusive jurisdiction shall be of the competent Courts as indicated in the Tender or Contract, as the case may be.

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- 10.2 Changes and supplements as well as termination notices need to be made in writing.
- 10.3 If the Bidder(s)/ Contractor(s) is a partnership or a consortium or a joint venture, this Integrity Pact shall be signed by all partners of the partnership or joint venture or all consortium members.
- 10.4 Should one or several provisions of this Integrity Pact turn out to be invalid, the remainder of this Integrity Pact remains valid. In this case, the parties will strive to come to an agreement to their original intentions.
- Only those bidders / contractors who have entered into this Integrity Pact with the Principal would be competent to participate in the bidding. In other words, entering into this Integrity Pact would be a preliminary qualification.
- 10.6 In the event of any dispute between the Principal and Bidder(s)/ Contractor(s) relating to the Contract, in case, both the parties are agreeable, they may try to settle dispute through Mediation before the panel of IEMs in a time bound manner. Neither of the parties shall present IEMs as witness in any Alternative Dispute Resolution or judicial proceedings in respect of the dispute that was subject of mediation.

- 2. All Statutory Requirements as applicable for this project shall be complied with by the Contractor.
- 3. BHEL Fraud Prevention Policy: "The Bidder along with its associate/ collaborators/ sub-contractors/ sub-vendors/ consultants/ service providers shall strictly adhere to BHEL Fraud Prevention Policy displayed on BHEL website http://www.bhel.com and shall immediately bring to the notice of BHEL Management about any fraud or suspected fraud as soon as it comes to their notice."
- 4. "Pradhan Mantri Kaushal Vikas Yojna: The contractor shall, at all stages of work deploy skilled/semi-skilled tradesmen who are qualified and possess certificate in particular trade from CPWD Training Institute/Industrial Training Institute/ National Institute of Construction Management and Research (NICMAR), National Academy of Construction, CIDC or any similar reputed and recognized Institute managed/ certified by State/ Central Government. The number of such qualified tradesmen shall not be less than 20% of total skilled/semi-skilled workers required in each trade at any stage of work. The contractor shall submit number of man days required in respect of each trade, its scheduling and the list of qualified tradesmen along with requisite certificate from recognized Institute to Engineer-in-Charge for approval. - c. Any private sector banks, with a clause in the text of Bank Guarantee that "<u>It is enforceable</u> by being presented at any branch of the bank".

Note: "Bank Guarantees issued by Co-operative Banks are not acceptable".

9. Conflict of interest

a. In case the Proprietor, Partner or Director of the bidder, or any of the team members proposed to be deployed have any relative or relation employed in BHEL, the authority inviting the bid shall be informed of the fact as and when the bidder/ consultant become

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- aware of them. Failing to do so, BHEL may, at its sole discretion, reject the bid or cancel the contract and forfeit any money due.
- b. The term 'relative' for this purpose would be as defined in Section 2(77) of the Companies Act, 2013.
- c. The consulting firm shall not engage, either directly or indirectly, during the term of this contract, in any business or professional activities that would conflict with the activities assigned to them under this contract.
- d. The remuneration of the consulting firm pursuant to this contract shall constitute the consulting firm's sole remuneration in connection with this contract or the services and the consulting firm shall not accept for its own benefit any trade commission, discount or similar payment in connection with activities pursuant to this Agreement
- e. The Consulting firm agrees that during the term of this Agreement and after its termination, the Consulting firm, or any of its affiliates, shall be disqualified from providing goods, works or services related to the initial assignment (other than the services specifically mentioned in this RFP).

10. Accidents/damages/claims liabilities

- a. In event of any accident or damages while on BHEL's duty, BHEL shall be completely free from any liability of any nature connected with the accident/ damage(s). Selected bidder himself will be fully and exclusively responsible for any personal injury to the deployed personnel or any other person in employment or damage to any property or person, including any third party claims.
- b. Selected bidder may safeguard his interest through insurance at his own cost. Under no circumstances, BHEL will take any liability arising out of or due to the action of the deployed manpower, including third-party claims. Selected bidder will have the sole liability of the damages/injuries caused to the deployed manpower or due to the action of the deployed manpower (including accidents and third-party claims)
- c. Arrangement of alternative/substitute is the responsibility of selected bidder unless otherwise exempted for reasons beyond Service Provider's control.

9. Liabilities

The selected bidder shall be responsible for any financial losses, damages, liabilities arising out of any breach of contract or any other event attributable to the bidder's management of the contract. BHEL can recover all such losses from the unpaid invoices of the selected bidder

10. Safety and statutory requirements

The team deployed by the selected consulting firm shall abide by all Safety Rules and Guidelines of BHEL and ensure the usage of proper Personal Protection Equipment (PPEs) while visiting the manufacturing units/ sites. The consulting firm shall also be responsible for compliance to statutory and government

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regulations as applicable as well as the safety & welfare of all employees deployed at BHEL and payment of salaries to their employees and statutory deductions if any.

11. **Guarantees**: The bidder will indemnify, protect BHEL against all claims, losses, costs, damages, expenses, action suits and other proceedings resulting from infringement of any patent, trademarks, copyrights, etc. in respect of the items or services supplied by them. The bidder will be required to bear all the costs in such cases.

12. Professional liability

- a. The consulting firm is expected to carry out its assignment with due diligence and in accordance with the prevailing standards of the profession. The consulting firm shall provide detailed reports/ presentations in line with deliverables. The reports/ presentations shall be reviewed by BHEL for validation of the suggestions/ progress made. BHEL may also at times engage any other party for validation of the recommendations made by the consulting firm.
- b. In case, any deficiency is observed or the recommendations suggested by the consulting firm is not appropriate, the report/presentations shall not be accepted and the consulting firm would be required to make a fresh report/ presentations. Such delays in the final acceptance of the consulting firm's report/presentation after every stage shall be considered as deficiency in service. To avoid deficiency in service and delays arising out of such events, it shall be the endeavor of the consulting firm to hold mutual discussions with BHEL at every stage in order to complete the activities as scheduled.

13. Use of contract documents, specifications, design

The consulting firm shall not, without BHEL's prior written consent, disclose the contract or any provision thereof or any data, findings etc. or information furnished by or on behalf of BHEL in connection or to any person other than a person employed by the consulting firm in the performance of the work order/contract. Disclosure to any such employed person shall be made in confidence and shall extend only so as may be necessary for the purpose of such performance. The bidder will bind such employees to the secrecy of information.

14. Documents/reports/deliverables

Reports & documents submitted by the successful bidder shall become and remain the property of BHEL. BHEL will be authorized to use the intellectual property contained in the report for its own purposes in accordance with the contract. BHEL can download, make copies, distribute, modify and create derivate works of the reports.

15. Right to implementation

BHEL shall be at its liberty to modify/implement the suggestions/strategies arising out of the engagement of the selected bidder either directly or through any other party.

16. Office at site

The successful bidder shall deploy the resources for this work at BHEL's Site office.

17. Registration

Bidder must be registered on the date of bid submission under relevant applicable Indian/Foreign Laws and in case of foreign business entity, it must be authorized by the global principal to operate in India through its branch office in India.

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Bidder must submit copies of Registration Certificate, Permanent Account No. (PAN), Provident Fund (PF) Registration and GST Registration.

18. Global resource sharing

All the global resources including domain area experts of the bidder should be available to BHEL for this engagement without any additional costs. For this, the bidder must provide (i) Letter of Comfort for sharing the global resources (Annexure-04), (ii) Proof of Arrangement (e.g. shareholding pattern) along with the bid.

- 19. The scope of the work is indivisible and shall be awarded to a single successful bidder. Consortium bidding is not allowed. However, in case, the consulting firm requires the support of another consultant/ agency, for undertaking part of work, viz. market research, etc., the same would be acceptable with prior approval of BHEL based on merit of that consultant/ agency. However, performance and cost of the subject assignment will be the sole responsibility of the consulting firm submitting the bid.
- 20. The bidder may be called for a technical presentation at a notice of minimum of 3 working days, during tendering process. The presentation should be made by the lead partner, proposed to be working with BHEL on this project, who can be preferably accompanied by the proposed team. Bidder may further be called for a Q&A session after a few days.
- 21. At least one partner "Lead Partner" should lead this tendering exercise and should spend significant time (at least once a week) with BHEL along with the consulting firm team on this project & should be available for BHEL on need basis.
- 22. The team proposed to be deployed shall remain unchanged, unless under unavoidable circumstances. In such a situation, whether during the contract execution period or during the bidding process, the change will only be permitted with the prior written consent of BHEL, based on credentials of new members furnished. The new member/s proposed to be deployed shall also meet the minimum experience as defined above.
- 23. BHEL reserves the right to seek changes in the team during the course of the assignment.
- 24. Notwithstanding any other condition/provision in the tender document, in case of ambiguity or incomplete documents pertaining to techno-commercial evaluation, BHEL may give the bidders opportunity with a fixed deadline after bid opening to provide complete & unambiguous documents/ withdrawal of deviations in support of meeting the technical criteria. In case, the bidder fails to submit any document or submits incomplete documents within the given time, the bid will be rejected.
- 25. **Tie Breaker**: In case, combined Technical & Price bid score of two (2) or more bidders are same, then the bidder scoring higher Technical score would be considered as the successful bidder. However, in case of the identical Technical score also, then the bidder scoring higher score in Experience of Bidder (B.3.b of Annexure 1 (PQR)) of Technical evaluation criteria would be considered as the successful bidder. In case of the same score of in Experience of Bidder clause no. 33 of NIT shall be followed.
- 26. **Modality of Award of contract:** A combined technical and price bid evaluation will be done as per the QCBS method to finalize the bidders on the basis of delivered cost. Delivered Cost shall be the optimum cost for optimum quality derived on the basis of Score mentioned hereunder:

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Final result/ranking of the bidder shall be governed by Combined score (S = 70% of $S_T + 30\%$ of S_f) obtained by the bidder. S_T and S_F are the loading factors which shall be applied as 70% of $S_T + 30\%$ of S_f to calculate the combined score 'S'.

A combined Score (S) will be calculated according to the following formula:

Consultant shall place its IT server at site for all activities, including but not limited to, data collection, storage, analysis and reporting purpose.
- xiii. BHEL shall provide workspace at site office to the consultant free of cost.
- xiv. Other facilities such as (Internet) shall be provided by BHEL free of cost.
- xv. After Completion of Contract period, consultant shall handover all the worksheets, framework, dashboard and records to BHEL site office.
- xvi. All Statutory Compliance (as applicable) for execution of the scope of work, shall be in the scope of Consultant. No Extra charges shall be made against any statutory compliance.
- xvii. No extra payment shall be made for any work executed on Sunday/holidays or beyond official working hours.
- xviii. Consultant may have to visit BHEL/NTPC office or manufacturing units for presentation/follow-ups. In case BHEL instruct Consultant to visit BHEL/NTPC office or manufacturing units, transportation (including local transportation) and accommodation charges of the consultant shall be reimbursed at actuals on submission of documentary proof.

Consultant default:

If the Consultant neglects to execute the works with due diligence and expedition or refuses or neglects to comply with any reasonable orders given to him, in writing by BHEL in connection with the works or provisions of the Contract, BHEL may give notice in writing to the Consultant to make good the failure, neglect or contravention thereof. Should the Consultant fail to comply with the notice within fourteen (14) days from the date of service thereof or the date stipulated for compliance, then and in such case BHEL shall be at liberty to employ other workmen and forthwith execute such part of the works as the Consultant may have neglected to do or if BHEL shall think fit, it shall be lawful for him ,without prejudice to any other right they may have under the Contract, to take the works wholly or in part out of the Consultant's hands and re-contract with any other person or persons to complete the works or any part thereof, and in that event, BHEL shall have free use of all Consultant's equipments /facilities that may have been at the time on the site in connection with the works without being responsible to the Consultant for wear and tear thereof, and to the exclusion of any right of the Consultant over the same, and BHEL shall be entitled to retain and apply any balance which may otherwise be due on the Consultant or such part thereof, as may be necessary, to the payment of the cost of executing the said part of the works or of completing the works as the case may be. If the cost of completing the works are executing a part thereof, as aforesaid shall exceed the balance due to the Consultant, the Consultant shall pay such excess in line with relevant clause mentioned in General Condition of Contract.

TECHNICAL CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT (TCC) Chapter – III: Team Deployment Schedule

- 1. Consultant & BHEL Site office shall jointly assess the TEAM DEPLOYMENT SCHEDULE for entire duration of Contractual period.
- 2. TEAM DEPLOYMENT SCHEDULE shall be revised jointly after analysing actual requirement of Consultant at site.
- 3. In case of absence of deployed personals, Consultant shall intimate in advance and shall ensure the replacement of the personal with sufficient overlap period.
- 4. The Contract prices shall be inclusive of all charges, overtime charges, out of pocket allowance, travel (air / train / road) etc. No other claim on account of any other expenses shall be entertained by BHEL.
- 5. In case of non-availability of required personal at site, BHEL shall not make deployed manpower payment for the period of actual absence on pro rata basis (Considering 26 days per month). In addition to above, BHEL shall deduct Rs. 1000 per day as penal action for the period of actual absence of personal.

The following matters shall be outside the scope of the Services:

- 1. Construction supervision, testing & maintenance etc.
- 2. Procurement or Sub-contracting on behalf of BHEL,
- 3. Implementation of recommendations,
- 4. Security/custody of BHEL assets.
- 5. Legal services relating to contracting or any other matter.
- 6. Business Payment Transactions and taxation issues.

TAXES, DUTIES, LEVIES (Rev 14 dated 09/10/2020)

- 1. All taxes excluding GST, GST Cess & BOCW Cess but including, Royalties, fees, license, deposits, commission, any State or Central Levy and other charges whatsoever, if any, shall be borne by you and shall not be payable extra.
- 2. Any increase of the taxes excluding GST, GST Cess & BOCW **Cess**, at any stage during execution including extension of the contract shall have to be borne by the contractor. Quoted/ accepted rates/ price shall be inclusive of all such requirements. Please note that since GST on output will be paid by BHEL separately as enumerated below, your quoted rates/ price should be after considering the Input Credit under GST law at your end.

3. **GST**:

The successful bidder shall furnish proof of GST registration. GST along with Cess (as applicable) legally leviable & payable by the successful bidder as per GST Law, shall be paid by BHEL. Hence Bidder shall not include GST along with Cess (as applicable) in their quoted price.

- 4. GST charged in the Tax Invoice/Debit note by the contractor shall be released separately to the contractor only after contractor files the outward supply details in GSTR-1 on GSTN portal and input tax credit of such invoice is matched with corresponding details of outward supply of the contractor and has paid the GST at the time of filing the monthly return
- 5. E-invoicing under GST has been implemented with effect from 1st October 2020 for all the taxable persons having turnover more than the threshold limit in any preceding financial year from 2017-18 onwards. Therefore, for all the taxable persons falling under the purview of E-invoice, it is mandatory to mention a valid unique Invoice Reference No. (IRN) and QR code as generated from E-Invoicing portal of the Government for the purpose of issuing a valid Tax Invoice. Only an E-invoice issued in the manner prescribed under rule 48(4) of CGST Rules shall be treated as valid invoice for reimbursement of GST amount.
 - If the successful Bidder is not falling under the purview of E-Invoicing then he has to submit a declaration in that respect along with relevant financial statements.
- 6. Bidder shall note that the GST Tax Invoice complying with GST Invoice Rules (Section 31 of GST Act & Rules referred there under) wherein the 'Bill To' details will as below:

- 7. Bidder to immediately intimate on the day of removal of Goods (in case of any supply of goods) to BHEL along with all relevant details and a scanned copy of Tax Invoice to below email ids to enable BHEL to meet its GST related compliances:-
 - Email id ---- to be intimated later on.
 - In case of delay in submission of the abovementioned documents on the date of dispatch, BHEL may incur penalty /interest for not adhering to Invoicing Rules under GST Law. The same will be liable to be recovered from the successful bidder, if such delay is not attributable to BHEL.
- 8. In case of raising any Supplementary Tax Invoice (Debit / Credit Note) Bidder shall issue the same containing all the details as referred to in Section 34 read with Rule 53.
- 9. Bidder shall note that in case GST credit is delayed/ denied to BHEL due to delayed / non receipt of goods and /or tax invoice or expiry of the timeline prescribed in GST Law for availing such ITC, or any other reasons not attributable to BHEL, GST amount shall be recoverable from the vendor along with interest levied / leviable on BHEL, as the case may be.
- 10. Bidder shall upload the Invoices raised on BHEL in GSTR-1 within the prescribed time as given in the GST Act. Bidder shall note that in case of delay in declaring such invoice in your return and GST credit availed by BHEL is denied or reversed subsequently as per GST Law, GST amount paid by BHEL towards such ITC reversal as per GST law shall be recoverable from the bidder along with interest levied / leviable on BHEL.
- 11. Way Bill: Successful Bidder to arrange for way bill / e-waybill for any transfer of goods for the execution of the contract.
 - The Bidder has to make their own arrangement at their cost for completing the formalities, if required, with Issuing Authorities, for bringing materials, plants & machinery at site for execution of the works under this contract, Road Permit/ Way Bill, if required, shall be arranged by the contractor and BHEL will not supply any Road Permit/ Way Bill for this purpose.
- 12. **New taxes and duties**:-Any New taxes & duties, if imposed subsequent to due date of offer submission as per NIT & TCN, by statutory authority during contract period including extension, if the same is not attributable to you, shall be reimbursed by BHEL on production of relevant supporting document to the satisfaction of BHEL. However, you shall obtain prior approval from BHEL before depositing new taxes and duties.
 - Benefits and/or abolition of all existing taxes must be passed on to BHEL against new Taxes, if any, proposed to be introduced at a later date.

In case any new tax/levy/duty etc. becomes applicable after the date of bidder's offer but before opening of the price bid, the bidder must convey its impact on his price duly substantiated by documentary evidence in support of the same before opening of the price bids. Claim for any such impact after opening the price bid will not be considered by BHEL for reimbursement of tax or reassessment of offer.

- 13. For transportation work, bidder shall declare in his quotation whether he is registered under GST, if yes, whether he intends to claim GST on forward charge basis. In absence of this declaration, BHEL will proceed further with the assumption that bidder intends not to claim GST on forward charge basis. However, in case of GST registered transporter, the amount to the extent of goods and service tax will be retained till BHEL avails the credit of GST. Further, transporter shall issue tax invoice which inter alia includes gross weight of the consignment, name of the consigner and the consignee, registration number of vehicle in which the goods are transported, details of goods transported, details of place of origin and destination, GSTIN of the person liable for paying tax whether as consigner, consignee or goods transport agency, and also containing other information as mentioned under rule 46.
- 14. TDS under Income Tax shall be deducted at prevailing rates on gross invoice value from the running bills unless exemption certificate from the appropriate authority/ authorities is furnished.
- 15. TDS under GST shall be deducted at prevailing rates on applicable value from the running bills.
- 16. TCS under Income Tax 1961 has been implemented with effect from 1st October 2020 for every seller having turnover more than threshold limit during financial year immediately preceding financial year in which the sale of goods is carried out, who receives any amount as consideration for sale of any goods of the value or aggregate of such value exceeding threshold limit other than export of goods or who is already covered under other provision of section 206C, collect from the buyer, TCS as per applicable rates of the sale consideration exceeding threshold limit subject to following conditions
 - i. Buyer shall be as per clause (a) of section 206C- (1H)
 - ii. Seller shall be as per clause (b) of section 206C- (1H)

iii. No TCS is to be collected, if the seller is liable to collect TCS under other provision of section 206C or the buyer is liable to deduct TDS under any provision of the Act and has deducted such amount.

If Successful Bidder is falling under the purview of TCS then he has to submit a declaration in that respect along with relevant financial statements before the start of work or if bidder is falling under preview of TCS during the work in progress then bidder is compulsorily required to submit relevant financial statement in the beginning of the respective FY.

ANNEXURE-2

BOCW Act & Cess Act

Bidder may please note that the sub-contractor/bidder of BHEL engaging building or construction worker in connection with building or other construction work, are required to follow the procedures enumerated below:

- 1. It shall be the sole responsibility of the contractor as employer to ensure compliance of all the statutory obligations under the Building and other Construction Workers' (Regulation of Employment and Conditions of Service) Act, 1996 and the Building and other Construction Workers' Welfare Cess Act, 1996 and the rules made thereunder.
- 2. It shall be sole responsibility of the contractor engaging Building Workers in connection with the building or other construction works in the capacity of employer to apply and

- obtain registration certificate specifying the scope of work under the relevant provisions of the Building and Other Construction Workers' (Regulation of Employment and Conditions of Service) Act, 1996 from the appropriate Authorities.
- 3. It shall be responsibility of the contractor to furnish a copy of such Registration Certificate within a period of one month from the date of commencement of Work.
- 4. It is responsibility of the contractor to register under the Building and other Construction Workers' Welfare Cess Act, 1996 and deposit the required Cess for the purposes of the Building and other Construction Workers' (Regulation of Employment and Conditions of Service) Act, 1996 at such rate as the Central Government may, by notification in the Official Gazette, from time to time specify. However, before registering and deposit of Cess under the Building and other Construction Workers' Welfare Cess Act, 1996, the contractor will seek written prior approval from the Construction Manager.
- 5. It shall be sole responsibility of the contractor as employer to get registered every Building Worker, who is between the age of 18 to 60 years of age and who has been engaged in any building or other construction work for not less than ninety days during the preceding twelve months as Beneficiary under the Building and other Construction Workers' (Regulation of Employment and Conditions of Service) Act, 1996.
- 6. It shall be sole responsibility of the contractor as employer to maintain all the registers, records, notices and submit returns under the Building and other Construction Workers' (Regulation of Employment and Conditions of Service) Act, 1996 and the Building and other Construction Workers' Welfare Cess Act, 1996 and the rules made thereunder.
- 7. It shall be sole responsibility of the contractor as employer to provide notice of poisoning or occupation notifiable diseases, to report of accident and dangerous occurrences to the concerned authorities under the Building and other Construction Workers' (Regulation of Employment and Conditions of Service) Act, 1996 and the rules made thereunder and to make payment of all statutory payments & compensation under the Employees' Compensation Act, 1923.
- 8. It shall be the responsibility of the sub-contractor as employer to make payment/deposit of applicable cess amount on the extent of work involving building or construction workers engaged by the sub-contractor within a period of one month from the receipt of payment. It shall also be responsibility of the Contractor to furnish BHEL on monthly basis, Receipts/ Challans towards Deposit of the Cess under the Building and other Construction Workers' Welfare Cess Act, 1996 and the rules made thereunder along with following statistics:
 - (i) Number of Building Workers employed during preceding one month.
 - (ii) Number of Building workers registered as Beneficiary during preceding one month.
 - (iii)Disbursement of Wages made to the Building Workers for preceding wage month.

- (iv) Remittance of Contribution of Beneficiaries made during the preceding month
- 9. BHEL shall reimburse the contractor the Cess amount deposited for the purposes of the Building and other Construction Workers' (Regulation of Employment and Conditions of Service) Act, 1996 under the Building and other Construction Workers' Welfare Cess Act, 1996 and the rules made thereunder. However, BHEL shall not reimburse the Fee paid towards the registration of establishment, fees paid towards registration of Beneficiaries and Contribution of Beneficiaries remitted.
- 10. It shall be responsibility of the Building Worker engaged by the Contractor and registered as a beneficiary under the Building and other Construction Workers' (Regulation of Employment and Conditions of Service) Act, 1996 to contribute to the Fund at such rate per mensem as may be specified by the State government by notification in the Official Gazette. Where such beneficiary authorizes the contractor being his employer to deduct his contribution from his monthly wages and to remit the same, the contractor shall remit such contribution to the Building and other construction Workers' Welfare Board in such manner as may be directed by the Board, within the fifteen days from such deduction.
- 11. Bidders may please note that though the quoted price is exclusive of BOCW (which will be reimbursed by BHEL as per sub-clause 9 above), however, If at any point of time during the contract period, non-compliance of the provisions of the Building and other Construction Workers' (Regulation of Employment and Conditions of Service) Act, 1996 and the Building and other Construction Workers' Welfare Cess Act, 1996 and the rules made thereunder is observed, BHEL reserves the right to deduct the applicable cess (1%) on the contract value and penalty (if any, imposed by Cess Authorities) from the payables on account of non-compliance.
- 12. The contractor shall declare to undertake any liability or claim arising out of employment of building workers and shall indemnify BHEL from all consequences / liabilities / penalties in case of non-compliance of the provisions of the Building and other Construction Workers' (Regulation of Employment and Conditions of Service) Act, 1996 and the Building and other Construction Workers' Welfare Cess Act, 1996 and the rules made thereunder.
