- 2. Any deviation to this tender terms & conditions, and schedules of this tender will lead to total rejection of the offer submitted.
- 3. Should a tenderer find discrepancies or omissions in the tender documents, or should there be any doubt as to their meaning, he should at once address the authority inviting the tender, for clarification well before the due date, so as to submit his tender in time. No extension of time shall be given for submission of the tender on any account.
- 4. Amount should be quoted as per the Work schedule (Price bid/Part –II). Amount quoted in any other form will not be accepted, and will be rejected.
- 5. The tender must be signed digitally / physically by Partner/ Director of the Firm or by the person holding the Power of Attorney on behalf of the Firm concerned. In the latter case, a copy of Power of Attorney, duly attested by a Notary Public must accompany the tender (As per annexure-A2)
- 6. If a tenderer deliberately gives wrong information in his tender or creates conditions favorable for the acceptance of his tender, the BHEL will reject such tender at any stage.

- 2) Conditional, unwitnessed, late Tenders, Tenders containing prima-facie absurd rates and amounts, Tenders which are incomplete or otherwise considered defective and Tenders not in accordance with the Tender conditions herein contained and the Tenders not in original ARE LIABLE TO BE REJECTED
- 3) The contractor shall quote only the lowest possible amount, inclusive of all taxes with Goods & Service Tax which will be paid by BHEL extra as applicable that can be offered for the intended quantity.

- 6) BHEL may reject the bid or in case the contract has been awarded, then terminate the contract apart from taking any other suitable action under the contract or applicable legal provisions or BHEL guidelines including Guidelines for suspension of Business Dealings, without any liability for any compensation to the bidder if, BHEL discovers at any time that any statement made by the bidder in the affidavit cum undertaking is false, fraudulent or Any document submitted by the bidder was fake and forged Or If BHEL determines in the sole discretion that any statement was aimed at deliberately misleading BHEL with a view to ensure award of the subject contract to the bidder.
- 7) The contractor shall follow norms of BHEL security system for movement of men & materials within the complex including biometric system.
- 8) The decision of In-charge for this contract shall be final and binding on the contractor regarding clarification of items of works.
- 9) Lowest prices received against BHEL tenders need not be the technically acceptable one, and in that case, BHEL reserves the right not to consider the same.
- 10) BHEL would negotiate or re-float the Tender opened if L1 price is not the acceptable price to them interalia other reasons. Tenderers shall not increase their quoted rates in case BHEL, negotiates for reduction of rates. Such negotiation shall not amount to cancellation or withdrawal of the original offer.
- 11) In all matters of disputes, the decision of the General Manager, BHEL, Tiruchirappali-14 shall be final and binding on the Contractor.
- 12) No bidder shall be allowed to use any electronic gadgets viz., mobile phones, tablets etc during tender opening/ or at any other meeting with BHEL for the purpose of this tender, which if found would be liable for rejection of their bid.
- The amount offered shall provide for the complete cost towards labour, consumables, tools, plants & machinery, transport, supervision, profits & overheads, and all other incidentals, etc. complete. However, if the GST is applicable for this contract, the same will be reimbursed on production of valid documentary proof for having paid the GST by them.
- 14) The works contract to be entered into with the successful tenderer will be governed by BHEL General Conditions of Contract in force.
- 15) The contractor has to make his own arrangements to provide refreshment for the workmen deployed by him.
- 16) If any of the workers employed by the contractor is found to indulge in acts subversive of discipline, the same will be brought to the knowledge of the contractor and he shall arrange for replacement of such personnel.
- 17) All the consumables, Tools & Plants used in the work shall be of approved quality and will be subject to periodical inspection by BHEL officials.

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- 18) Works shall be carried out as per relevant IS standards and rules adhering to necessary safety precautions.
- 19) The contractor should extend fullest co-operation with the third party agencies engaged, if any by BHEL to adhere the Quality Control Procedures ensuring quality.

#### **20)** Signing the Tender:

- a. The Tender shall be signed by the Authorized Signatory Only. Authorized signatory shall be the person holding 'power of attorney' on behalf of the firm / company / bidder-concerned authorized / empowered to act on behalf for the specific purpose.
- b. Authorized signatory should have Power of Autonomy issued by MD or Board of Directors or authorized person for this purpose for quoting Tender and all procedures connected with, till finalization and execution of the Contract.
- c. In case the Bidder is a Partnership Firm under Partnership Act, the Tender shall be signed by all the Partners of the firm or by the Managing Partner who have Signature and Seal of the Contractor authorized to do so or by a person holding the Power of Attorney on behalf of the Partnership Firm.
- d. A copy of the Partnership Deed and / or a copy of the Power of Attorney, Self-attested shall accompany the Proprietor or Partner of the Company.
- e. BHEL will not be bound by any other Power of Attorney granted or the change in the composition of the firm made, subsequent to the execution of the Contract agreement. They may however recognize such Power of Attorney or change in status after obtaining legal advice and the cost involved in that connection shall be chargeable to the bidder concerned.
- f. If tenderer expires after the submission of his tender or after the acceptance of his tender the BHEL may, at their discretion, cancels such tender. If a partner of a firm expires after submission of tender or after the acceptance of the Tender, BHEL may cancel such Tender at their discretion unless the firm retain its character. The works executed in the own name of the tenderer only will be considered for eligibility criteria.
- 21) Expenses incurred by bidder towards preparation of bid incidental to tender irrespective of whether it is accepted or not, shall be borne by vendor only.
- 22) The offers of the tenderer / bidders who are on the banned list and also the offer of the bidders, who engage the services of the banned firms, shall be rejected. The list of banned firms is available on BHEL web site (www.bhel.com → Tender Notification → List of Banned Firms).
- 23) The Parties who have been suspended or black listed or issued with "Show Cause Notice" by BHEL Trichy-14 or any other BHEL Unit will not be allowed to participate in the Tender and the bidder should declare the same in the Tender. Even during the course of evaluation / finalization of Tender if it is found that some of the parties are black listed / barred from business transactions / under business hold, BHEL will not consider them for further participation in the Tender.
- Similarly, the offers of the bidders who are suspended (under hold/ delist) for business dealings by BHEL shall not be considered. Please note that lifting/ restoration of suspension (Ban/Hold/ De-list) of business dealing is not automatic after expiry of specified suspension period. Hence, vendor shall be considered as suspended for business till suspension is lifted by BHEL in writing on specific request of the vendor as per extant guidelines.
- 25) The contractor should extend full co-operation to the other contractors who may be doing other works in the same areas to enable them to execute their portions of work without any delay or difficulty.
- 26) Contractor has to ensure that the employees deployed in the premises of BHEL are physically and mentally fit and do not have any criminal record. Such employees should possess requisite skill, experience etc. acceptable to concerned department.
- 27) Contractors are advised that contract labours must be employed without any discrimination on caste or creed or religion or gender basis.
- 28) The contractor by submitting the tender undertakes that, they had never been found guilty by a court of law in India for any offence in involving fraud, dishonesty and moral turpitude. If at a later date, if it comes to the notice of BHEL about any such occurrences on the subject bidder, BHEL will have every right to reject the offer of such vendors at any point of time.
- 29) The Contractor shall ensure that his workmen movement is restricted to their relevant work areas only & shall vacate the premises after the shift is over.
- 30) The Bidder declares that they will not enter into any illegal or undisclosed agreement or understanding,

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whether formal or informal with other Bidder(s). This applies in particular to prices, specifications, certifications, subsidiary contracts, submission or non-submission of bids or any other actions to restrict competitiveness or to introduce cartelization in the bidding process. In case, the Bidder is found having indulged in above activities, suitable action shall be taken by BHEL as per extant policies/guidelines.

Apart from this, some other related activities such as (a) Preparatory work for the next day menu (b) Grinding of Rice Flour for Idly / Dosai preparations (c) Grinding of Chutney preparation for Breakfast & Dinner (d) Cleaning of all utensils, Tea Canes and Food Supply Trolley after each serving in TWO shifts operation.

Preparation of Menu list for the day and Diet issue chart on daily basis based on the diet sheet from the wards.

- The contractor is responsible for ensuring quantity and quality, maintaining proper hygiene and cleanliness while handling raw materials, preparation, diet delivery, supply service etc. of diet as per the diet chart in accordance with the parameters specified.
- The contractor shall be responsible for disposing the garbage suitably as per the instructions framed by the company. Licensee shall ensure that all the garbage bins are to be labelled and sanitized periodically by the authorities.
- The contractor shall further responsible for make adequate arrangements in terms of all equipment and manpower, as it own cost.

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- The contractor shall depute a staff who will be required to manage the catering operations including maintenance of Dietary Stores and serve diet to the patients. The contractor should ensure that the staff deputed on the unit should maintain good conduct, etiquette, personal hygiene, politeness and courtesy, issue cash receipts to the patients etc.,
- The contractor is expected to adopt, inter-alia, food safety and hygiene practises as indicated
- The contractor shall keep a suggestion/complaint book at a conspicuous place where the patients can register their suggestions / complaints without any difficulty. The complaint / suggestions register must be serially numbered and pre-authenticated by the competent authority.
- The contractor or a duly authorised and competent manager appointed and paid by the contractor shall remain present in person to manage or supervise the business to be carried out under the provisions of the contractor and to ensure that the obligations of contractor under the license are duly performed and observed. contractor or a duly authorised and competent manager, appointed by the Licensee shall remain available at the location mutually decided between the parties for ease of administration of performance of contractor to the satisfaction of the Medical Administration.
- The contractor shall ensure that the catering staffs should be well groomed, wear proper uniforms, badges displaying their names, carry photo identity cards and displayed at all times.
- The Medical Administrative department shall have the right to inspect / check the services provided by
  the conractor for reviewing its standards, quality and variety of food items, disposal systems, cleanliness
  etc, at any time and may authorise any person or agency for this purpose to access the performance of the
  contractor. In case of unsatisfactory performance or complaint of any nature, the Medical Administration
  will be entitled to initiate the suitable action against the contractor including termination of the contract.
- The Contractor shall adhere to the scope of Work and General conditions at all time during the contract period.
- 4. **BHEL scope**: Maintenance of stores, Issue / Receipt of Groceries, Vegetables and Milk, Indenting, stock recording, Menu preparation, supervision of Cooking activities, co-ordination of activities between the cook and serving employees.

#### 5. ADMINISTRATIVE INSTRUCTIONS:

- a. The contractor shall engage competent employees with indicative manpower of 8 persons (Avg/Day) for medical dietry each day. The workmen deployed for this work should have completed 21 years of age and should not have crossed 55 years and wear while on duty an acceptable uniform & sandak provided by the Contractor to carry out the works contract of cooking services at BHEL Canteens and supervision thereof. Contractor must provide Uniform Minimum One set (Sandal wood track shirt, black color pant), Apron (maroon checked), Kitchen Towel, Chef cap. / Personal Protective Equipment and 1 pair of Sandak chappals and transparent hand gloves and caps for serving food. Contractor should submit the certificate obtained from canteen incharge for issuance of uniforms to contract workers along with first month bill of the contract.
- b. The persons employed shall be physically and medically fit. Also employed persons should be healthy and free from all type of diseases. An amount at the prevailing rate fixed by BHEL per person per day is payable as charges towards the food availed by the contract workmen.
- c. medical dietry being an essential service, contractor shall ensure that the required and stated number of workmen are deployed regularly. The contractor while sanctioning leave to his employees he should also ensure that sufficient employees with PF/ESI numbers are available for deploying them to work to execute the work as per contract terms such that the work envisaged under the contract shall not suffer.
- d. In order to cover up for absenteeism/Leave of his workers the contractor shall keep adequate number of extra workers with PF/ESI numbers such that the work envisaged under the contract shall not suffer.

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C. Payment Terms:

- 1. Payment will be made on monthly basis after completion of work on 15 days from issue of CRAC / SDA on pro-rata basis based on actual work executed as per BOQ after acceptance and certification of Area in charge (BHEL Executive). Payment shall be made as follows on submission of bill complete in all respect.
- 3. No advance will be paid for operational or any other expenses.
- 4. Goods and Services tax will be payable extra by BHEL at prevailing rates and corresponding TDS will be made as per Government norms.

#### D. Liquidated damage/Penalty: NOT APPLICABLE

#### **E. EXTENTION OF CONTRACT:**

- BHEL reserves the right to extend the contract by up to a period of THREE (3) months beyond 1. the original contract period, at the sole discretion of BHEL, upon written notice provided to contractor prior to the expiration of the contract. Such extension shall be on the same rate. terms and conditions as set forth in this contract.
- The rate quoted shall remain firm and valid throughout the contract period (including extended period, if needed) and no extra payment will be reimbursed to the contractor by BHEL. Any increase of DA/ wages to the contract labour shall be absorbed by the contractor themselves during the period of contract.
- Extensions of the Contract beyond three months of original contract period may be done with mutual agreement between BHEL, Trichy and the approved Contractor. Such agreements shall be based on acceptance of the lowest rates and terms & conditions of the corresponding contract.

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GENERAL TERMS & CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT

#### 1.Definition:

In these General Conditions of Contract, the following terms shall have, I meaning hereby assigned to them, except where the context otherwise requires:

- a) The "Contract" means, the documents forming the tender and acceptance thereof, together with all the documents referred to therein including general and special conditions to contract. All these documents as applicable taken together shall be deemed to form one contract and shall be complementary to one another.
- b) The "Work" means, the work described in the tender documents in individual work orders as may be issued from time to time to the contractor by the Officer-In charge within the power conferred upon him including all notified or additional items of works and obligations to be carried out as required for the performance of contract.
- c) The "contractor" means, the individual Firm or Company whether incorporated or not, undertaking the work and shall include the legal personal representatives of such individuals or the persons composing the firm or Company or the successors of the firm or company and the permitted assigns of such individual or firm or Company.
- d) "The Officer-In charge" means, the Officer deputed by the respective area HOD to supervise the work or part of the work.
- e) "Approved" and "Directed" means, the approval or direction of the respective area HOD or person deputed by him for the particular purposes.
- f) "BHARAT HEAVY ELECTRICALS LIMITED" (hereinafter referred to as BHEL) shall mean the Board of Directors, Chairman, Executive Director, General Manager or, other Administrative Officer of the said Company including DGM / WCM authorised to invite tenders and enter into contract for works on behalf of the Company.
- g) The "Contract sum" means, the sum accepted or the sum calculated in accordance with the prices accepted in tender and / or the contract rates as payable to the contractor for the execution of the work during the currency of the contract.
- h) A "week" means, Seven Days, without regard to the number of hours worked or not worked in any day in that week.
- i) A "day" means, the day of 24 hours (TWENTY-FOUR) irrespective of the number of hours worked or not worked in that day.

#### 2. Heading to the Contract Conditions:

The heading to these conditions shall not affect the interpretations thereof.

**3. DEVIATIONS:** The contractor shall not carry out any work not covered by schedule except in pursuance of the written instructions of the respective area HOD/WCM. No such work shall be valid unless the same has been specifically confirmed and accepted by BHEL in writing and incorporated in the Contract.

#### 4. Work to Be Carried Out:

The Contract shall include all labour which may be required for the execution of the work.

The Contractor will be deemed to have satisfied himself as to the nature of the site, local facilities of access and all matters affecting the execution of the work. No. extra charges consequent on any misunderstanding in these respects or otherwise will be allowed.

#### 5. Assignment of Transfer of Contract:

The Contractor shall not, assign or transfer the contract or any part thereof, or any share, or interest thereon to any other persons.

#### 6. Sub-Contract:

The Contractor shall not sublet any portion of the contract.

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#### 7. Compliance to Regulations and Bye-Laws:

The Contractor shall confirm to the provisions of any statute relating to the work and regulations and Byelaws of any local authority. The Contractor shall be bound to give all notices required by statutory regulations or by-laws as aforesaid and to pay all fees and taxes payable to any authority in respect thereof.

#### 8. GOODS & SERVICE TAX (GST) REGISTRATION & COMPLIANCE:

- 1. Response to Tenders for Indigenous supplier will be entertained only if the vendor has a valid GST registration No (GSTIN) which should be clearly mentioned in the offer. If the dealer is exempted from GST registration, a declaration with due supporting documents need to be furnished for considering the offer. Dealers under composition scheme should declare that he is a composition dealer supported by the screen shot taken from GST portal. The dealer has to submit necessary documents if there is any change in status under GST.
- 2. Supplier shall mention their GSTIN in all their invoices (incl. credit Notes, Debit Notes) and invoices shall be in the format as specified/prescribed under GST laws. Invoices shall necessarily contain Invoice number (in case of multiple numbering system is being followed for billing like SAP invoice no, commercial invoice no etc., then the Invoice No. which is linked/uploaded in GSTN network shall be clearly indicated), Billed to party (with GSTIN) & Shipped to party details, item description as per PO, Quantity, Rate, Value, applicable taxes with nomenclature (like IGST, SGST, CGST & UTGST) separately, HSN/ SAC Code, Place of Supply etc.
  - Wherever E-Invoice is applicable, the tax invoice/CN / DN submitted by the vendor must contain the QR code generated in E-Invoice Portal & IRN.
- 3. All invoices shall bear the HSN Code for each item separately (Harmonized System of Nomenclature)/ SAC code (Services Accounting Code).
- 4. Invoices will be processed only upon completion of statutory requirement and further subject to following:
  - a. Vendor declaring such invoice in their GSTR-1 Return/IFF
  - b. Receipt of Goods or Services and Tax invoice by BHEL
- 5. As the continuous uploading of tax invoices in GSTN portal (in GST ANX-1) is available for all (i.e. both Small & Large) tax payers under proposed new GST Return System, all invoices raised on BHEL may be uploaded immediately in GST portal on despatch of material /rendering of services. The supplier shall ensure availability of Invoice in GST portal before submission of invoice to BHEL. Invoices will be admitted by BHEL only if the invoices are available in GSTN portal (in BHEL's GST ANX-2).
- 6. In case of discrepancy in the data uploaded by the supplier in the GSTN portal or in case of any shortages or rejection in the supply, then BHEL will not be able to avail the tax credit and will notify the supplier of the same. Supplier has to rectify the data discrepancy in the GSTN portal or issue credit note or debit note (details also to be uploaded in GSTN portal) for the shortages or rejections in the supplies or additional claims, within the calendar month informed by BHEL.
- 7. In cases where invoice details have been uploaded by the vendor but failed to remit the GST amount to GST Department (Form PMT-08 or Form GST RET-01 to be submitted) within stipulated time, then GST paid on the invoices pertaining to the month for which GST return not filed by the vendor will be recovered from the vendor along with the applicable interest (currently 24% p.a) and all subsequent bills of the vendor will not be processed till filing of the GST return by the vendor
- 8. In case GST credit is denied to BHEL due to non-receipt or delayed receipt of goods and/ or tax invoice or expiry of timeline prescribed in GST law for availing such ITC, or any other reasons not attributable to BHEL, GST amount claimed in the invoice shall be disallowed to the vendor.
- 9. Where any GST liability arising on BHEL under Reverse Charge (RCM), the vendor has to submit the invoices to BHEL well within the timeline prescribed in GST Law, to enable BHEL to discharge the GST liability. If there is a delay in submission of invoice by the vendor resulting in delayed payment of GST by BHEL along with Interest, then such Interest payable or paid shall be recovered from the vendor.
- 10. Under GST regime, BHEL has to discharge GST liability on LD recovered from suppliers/contracts. Hence applicable GST shall also be recoverable from suppliers/contractors on LD amount. For this Tax Invoice will be issued by BHEL indicating the respective supply invoice number.
- 11. GST TDS will be deducted as per Section 51 of CGST Act 2017 and in line with Notification 50/2018 Central Tax dated 13.09.2018. GST TDS certificate which will be generated in GST portal subsequent to vendor accepting the TDS deduction in the GST portal, will be issued to the vendor.

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#### 9. Orders under the Contract:

All orders, notices etc. to be given under the contract shall be in writing, typescript or printed and if sent by registered post to the address given in the tender of the Contract, shall be deemed to have been served on the date, when in the ordinary course they would have been delivered to him. The Contractor shall carry out without delay all orders given to him.

#### 10. Payment to employees engaged by the contractor:

- 1. The contractor has to disburse the salary/wages for their workmen only through Bank. The relevant Bank statement/proof for Bank payment should be produced along with PF and ESI challans to Welfare Section every month. The contractor shall have separate PF and ESI code, BHEL will not allow the contractor to remit the PF and ESI of his employees through codes of others. The contractor shall pay wages to the workmen employed by him at the rate, which shall not be less than the minimum wages declared by Tamil Nadu Government from time to time. A certificate of payment shall be furnished in duplicate by the contractor to the Engineer In-charge for each month. The contractor shall inform the BHEL Management every month the details of contract labour engaged for each contract in the following forms:
  - a) Serial Number
  - b) Location
  - c) Period of Work
  - d) No. of Contract labour engaged during the month
  - e) No. of days worked
  - f) No. of Man # days worked
- 2. The Contractor shall remain liable for the payment of all wages and other payments in connection with the employees engaged by him and with regard to the work.
- 3. The Contractor shall comply with the applicable provisions of Payment of Wages Act-1936, Minimum Wages Act-1948, Employees' Liability Act-1938, Employees' Compensation Act-1923, Payment of Bonus, EPF and Miscellaneous Provisions Act-1952, Employees' State Insurance Act-1948 and other relevant Acts and rules framed, thereunder from time to time.
- 4. Contractor shall be responsible for making payment of wages within 10 days from the last day of wage period and shall obtain the signature at the end of entries in the wage register from area in-charge of contract operating department. If the 10<sup>th</sup> days falls on Sunday or holiday the payment should be made on the previous working day
- 5. Contract labours has to sign the filled in wage register in front of the area in-charge of contract operating department and area in-charge should certify the wage register for payment to the Contract labours only after signed by all the contract labours in filled wage register.
- 6. Contractor shall have/obtain license under the Contract Labour (Regulation and Abolition) Act-1970.
- 7. Contractor should ensure that at least the prevailing minimum wages, as per the rules of Government of Tamil Nadu, which are applicable to General Engineering and Fabrication Industry inclusive of bonus after remitting PF & ESI contributions, are paid to his employees only in their respective nationalized bank accounts by means of NEFT/ RTGS/ IMPS.
  - Any changes in manpower should be informed to the executive in-charge of Contract execution department before engaging them along with the details.

While submitting the bills, the contractor should submit a proof of payment made to employees only through nationalized bank, along with PF and ESI contribution challans to Welfare Section every month for effecting payment by BHEL. Otherwise payment to the bills will not be processed.

In addition, the contractor has to submit wage register as a proof for payment of Minimum wages as per prevailing acts, for getting payment from BHEL.

8. The contractor shall remit the salary/wages of their workmen ONLY through nationalized Bank, directly to the salary/savings account of the employee concerned. monthly clearance will be given in respect of those contractors, only if the salary/wages to the workmen concerned has been remitted. The relevant Bank statement/proof of payment should be produced along with PF and ESI challans every month. If the Contractor employs more than twenty employees, he has to obtain License to this effect from the Factory Inspectorate and renew the same periodically.

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- 9. The Contractor should follow and comply with Minimum Wages, ESI, PF, Bonus, Group Insurance and other statutory regulations as stipulated in Factories Act and other applicable State / Central Governments' rules & regulations.
- 10. Each contract employees must have his own PF and ESI Codes and comply with the relevant Acts.
- 11. The Contract workers should be fully aware of safety measures and observe all safety precautions during work. The Contractor should also make his own arrangements to provide requisite safety devices to the workers, based on the nature of work. Any accident / incident occurring to his workers in Company's premises should be reported in writing by the Contractor to Safety, Welfare and Line Executive concerned.
- 12. Contractor shall maintain proper records of PF, EDLI, Pension, ESI contribution, administrative charges etc., wherever applicable and shall produce proof of deductions as well as remittances. Contractor shall issue wage slips to his employees. Indicative lists as follows, which shall be maintained neatly, completely and legibly for inspection by various statutory authorities and the company officials even at short notice:

  (i) Form XXII Register of advance (Rule 78) (1) (a) (ii)
  (j) Form XXIII Register of overtime (Rule 78) (1) (a) (iii)
- (k) Form XXIV Return to be sent by the contractor to licensing officer (Rule 82)
- (l) any other records/registers required to be maintained by the contractors under statutory provisions applicable to him.

#### 11. Contractor's Supervision:

- 1. The Contractor shall either himself supervise the execution of the contract or shall appoint a competent agent acceptable to BHEL Officials.
- 2. Orders given to the Contractor's agent shall be considered to have the same force as if they have been given to the Contractor himself.
- 3. The Contractor or his accredited agent shall attend when required without making any claim for doing so to the OFFICER-INCHARGE, to receive instructions.
- 4. The respective area HOD shall have full powers and without assigning any reason, requires the Contractor to immediately cease to employ in connection with this contract, any agent, servant or employee where continued employment is, in his opinion undesirable. The Contractor shall not be allowed any compensation on this account.

#### 12. Precautions against Risk:

The Contractor shall be responsible for providing at his own expense for all precautions to prevent loss or damage from any and all risks and to minimize the amount of any such loss or damage and for the necessary steps to be taken for the said purpose.

#### 13. Damage & Loss to Private Property & Injury to workmen:

The Contractor shall at his own expense reinstate and make good to the satisfaction of the respective area HOD and pay compensation for any injury, loss or damage occurred to any property or rights whatever

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including property and rights of BHEL (or agents) servants or employee of BHEL, the injury loss or damage arising out of or in any way in connection with the execution or purported execution of the contract and further the contractor shall indemnify BHEL against all claims enforceable against BHEL (or any agent, servant or employee of BHEL) or which would be so enforceable against BHEL, in respect of any such injury (including injury resulting in death) loss or damage to any person whomsoever or property including all claims which may arise under the Employees Compensation Act or otherwise.

#### 14. Laws Governing the Contract:

The contract shall be governed by the Indian Laws for the time being in force.

#### 15. Cancellation of Contract for Corrupt Acts:

BHEL, whose decision shall be final and conclusive, shall without prejudice to any other right or remedy which shall have accrued, shall accrue thereafter to BHEL cancel the contract in any of the following cases and the Contractor shall be liable to make payment to BHEL for any loss or damage resulting from any such cancellation to the same extent as provided in the case of cancellation for default.

If the Contractor shall:

a) Offer or give or agree to give to any person in BHEL service any gift or consideration of any kind, as an inducement or reward for doing or for bearing to do or for having done or for having borne to do any act, in relation to the obtaining or execution of this or any other contract for BHEL service,

OR

b) Enter into a contract with BHEL in connection with which commission has been paid or agreed to be paid by him or with his knowledge, unless the particulars of any such commission and the terms of payment thereof have previously been disclosed in writing to BHEL,

OR

c) To obtain' a contract with BHEL as a result of ring tendering or by non-bonafide methods of competitive tendering, without first disclosing the fact in writing to BHEL.

#### 16. Cancellation of Contract for Insolvency Assignment of Transfer or Subletting of Contract:

BHEL, without prejudice to any other right or remedy, which shall have accrued or shall accrue thereafter to BHEL, shall cancel the contract in any of the following cases:

If the Contractor,

a) Being an individual or if a firm any partner thereof shall at any time be adjudged bankrupt or have a receiving order for administration of his estate, made against him or shall take any proceedings for liquidation or composition under any bankruptcy Act or assignment of his effects of composition or arrangement for the benefit of his creditors or purport to do so, or if any application made under any Bankruptcy Act for the time being in force for the sequestration of his estate or if a trust deed be granted by him on behalf of his creditors.

OR

b) Being a Company, shall pass a resolution or Court shall make an order for the liquidation of its assets, or a receiver or Manager on behalf of the debenture holders shall be appointed or circumstances shall a rise which entitle the Court or debenture holders to appoint a receiver or Manager.

OR

- c) Assigns, Transfers, Sublets or attempts to assign, transfer or sublet any portion of the work.
- d) Whenever BHEL exercises the authority to cancel the contract under these conditions, BHEL may have the work done /by any means at the Contractor's risks and expenses provided always that in the event of the cost of the work so done (as certified by the respective area HOD) being less than the contract cost, the advantage shall accrue to BHEL and if the cost exceeds the money due to Contractor under the contract, the Contractor shall either pay the excess amount ordered by the respective area HOD or the same shall be recovered from the Contractor by other means.
- e) In case BHEL carries out the work under the provisions of this condition, the cost to be taken into account in determining the excess cost to be charged to the Contractor under this condition shall consist of the

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- cost of the materials, hire charges of tools and plants and / or labour provided by BHEL with an addition of such percentage to cover superintendence and establishment charges as may be decided by the respective area HOD whose decision shall be final and conclusive.
- f) Labour engaged by the contractor should be disciplined & exhibit good behaviour in dealing with employees of BHEL. Any misbehaviour or undesirable conduct of any person engaged by the contractor is reported, contractor shall change that person immediately or else it may even lead to termination of the contract & in such case security deposit will be forfeited as penalty.

#### 17. Cancellation of Contract in Part or Full for Contractor's Default:

If the contractor:

- a) makes default in carrying out the work as directed and continues in that state after a reasonable notice from the respective area HOD or his authorized representative:
- b) fails to comply with any of the terms & conditions of the contract or failure to comply orders after reasonable notice in writing with orders properly issued thereunder:

BHEL, may without prejudice to any other right or remedy which shall have accrued or shall accrue thereafter to BHEL CANCEL the contract as whole or in part thereof or only such work order or items of work in default from the contract. Whenever BHEL exercises the authority to cancel the contract as a whole or part under this condition, BHEL may complete the work at the contractor's risk and cost (as certified by the respective area. HOD which is final and conclusive) being less than the contract cost, the advantage shall accrue to BHEL. If the cost exceeds the money due to the Contractor under this contract, the Contractor shall either pay the excess amount ordered by the respective area HOD or the same shall be recovered from the Contractor by other means. In case BHEL carries out the work or any part thereof under the provisions of the conditions the cost to be taken into account in determining the excess cost to be charged to the Contractor under this condition shall consist of the cost of the materials, hire charges of tools and plant and/or labour provided by BHEL with an addition of such percentage to cover the superintendence and establishment charges as may be decided by the respective area HOD whose decision shall be final and conclusive.

#### 18. Termination of Contract on Death of Contractor:

If the services provided by the agency are not to the full satisfaction of BHEL, the maintenance contract may be terminated by BHEL and the charges shall be payable only up to the period, till whhich the agency has rendered satisfactory services. The decision of BHEL in this regard shall be inal and binding on the agency.

#### 19. Special Power to Termination:

If at any time after the award of contract, BHEL shall for any reason whatsoever not require whole or any part of the work to be carried out the respective area HOD shall give notice in writing of the fact to the Contractor who shall have no claim to any payment of compensation or otherwise howsoever on account of any profit or advantage which he might have derived from the execution of the work in full but which he did not derive in consequence of the foreclosing of the work.

#### 20. Recovery from Contractor:

Whenever under the contract, any sum of money, shall be recoverable from or payable by the Contractor, the same may be deducted from or any sum then due or which at any time thereafter may become due to Contractor under the contract or under any other contract with BHEL or from his Security Deposit unless the contractor pays the claim on demand.

#### 21. Post- Technical Audit of Work and Bills:

BHEL reserves the right to carry out the post-payment Audit and technical examination of the work and final bill including all supporting vouchers, abstracts etc., and enforce recovery of any sum becoming due as a result thereof in the manner provided in the presiding sub- paragraphs. However, no such recovery shall be enforced after three years of passing the final bill.

#### 22. Force Majeure Clause:

If, at any time during the continuance of this Contract the performance in whole or in part by either party of any obligations under this Contract shall be prevented or delayed by reason of any War, Hostile acts of the

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public enemy Civil Commotion, Epidemics, or Acts of God (Floods, Storm/Cyclone, Hurricane, Earthquake etc. ) then provided notice of happening of any such event is given by either party to other within 7 days from the date of occurrence thereof neither of the parties shall by reason of such event be entitled to terminate this Contract or claim for damages against the other in respect of such non-performance or delay for such period. Performance under the contract shall be resumed as soon as practicable after such event has come to an end or ceased to exist. If the performance in whole or part of any obligation under this Contract is prevented or delayed by reason of any such event, claims for extension of time may be granted for periods considered reasonable by the respective area HOD at his discretion subject to prompt notification by the contractor.

- **23. SUBMISSION OF BILLS BY CONTRACTOR:** Bills should be submitted within a week after execution of work during the calendar month. The Contractor shall submit a bill in triplicate detailing the various items of work done during the month supported by the requisitions issued from time to time. The Contractor shall, once in every month, submit to the end user / executing agency, separately details of his claims for the work done by him up to and including the previous month which are not covered by his contract agreement in any of the following respects:
  - a) Deviation from the items provided in the contract documents.
  - b) Extra items / new items of work.
  - c) Items in-respect of which rates have not been settled. He should in addition furnish a clear certificate to the effect that the claims submitted by him as aforesaid cover all his claims and that no further claims shall be raised by him in respect of the work done up to and including the period under report.
  - d) Along with bills, Contractors has to furnish self-attested copy of the following documents for further processing of bills:
    - i. Copy of PAN card.
    - ii. Documentary proof for payment of PF/ESI (for the last month) with respect to the employees engaged by the contractor with payment details to be submitted.
    - iii. Copy of payment challan of previous Month / Quarter as proof of deposit of GST along with a certificate from the Contractor that tax collected from BHEL has been remitted to tax authorities.
    - iv. If the Contractor is not registered for any statutory obligation and not liable there to, then a declaration shall be submitted along with offer that they are within the threshold limit.

Any other relevant document which is required from time to time as per BHEL requirement.

- **24. PAYMENT OF BILLS**: All payments to be made to the contractor, under this contract shall be through Electronic Fund Transfer (EFT) only as per payment terms.
- a) Payment will be made after completion of work as per tender conditions on acceptance and certification of bills by respective area Executive in charge.
- b) Statutory deduction like IT etc. will be deducted from contractor payment as required by Law.

#### 25. Arbitration and conciliation:

The Parties agree that if at any time (whether before, during or after the arbitral or judicial proceedings), any Disputes (which term shall mean and include any dispute, difference, question or disagreement arising in connection with construction, meaning, operation, effect, interpretation or breach of the contract/tender which the Parties are unable to settle mutually), arise inter-se the Parties, the same may, be referred by either party to Conciliation to be conducted through Independent Experts Committee to be appointed by competent authority of BHEL from the BHEL Panel of Conciliators.

The proceedings of Conciliation shall broadly be governed by Part-III of the Arbitration and Conciliation Act 1996 or any statutory modification thereof.

Notes:

- 1. No serving or a retired employee of BHEL/Administrative Ministry of BHEL shall be included in the BHEL Panel of Conciliators.
- 2. Any other person(s) can be appointed as Conciliator(s) who is/are mutually agreeable to both the parties from outside the BHEL Panel of Conciliators.

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The proceedings of Conciliation shall broadly be governed by Part-III of the Arbitration and Conciliation Act 1996 or any statutory modification thereof and as provided in Annexure ... to the Terms and conditions of the tender. The Annexure (as below) together with its appendices will be treated as if the same is part and parcel hereof and shall be as effectual as if set out herein in the terms and conditions of the tender.

Except as provided elsewhere in this Contract, in case amicable settlement is not reached between the Parties, in respect of any dispute or difference; arising out of the formation, breach, termination, validity or execution of the Contract; or, the respective rights and liabilities of the Parties; or, in relation to interpretation of any provision of the Contract; or, in any manner touching upon the Contract, then, either Party may, by a notice in writing to the other Party refer such dispute or difference to the sole arbitration of an arbitrator appointed by Head of the BHEL, Trichy.

The Arbitrator shall pass a reasoned award and the award of the Arbitrator shall be final and binding upon the Parties. Subject as aforesaid, the provisions of Arbitration and Conciliation Act 1996 (India) or statutory modifications or re-enactments thereof and the rules made thereunder and for the time being in force shall apply to the arbitration proceedings under this clause. The seat of arbitration shall be at BHEL premises, Trichy.

The cost of arbitration shall be borne as per the award of the Arbitrator.

Subject to the arbitration in terms of Clause above, the Courts at TRICHY shall have exclusive jurisdiction over any matter arising out of or in connection with this Contract.

Notwithstanding the existence or any dispute or differences and/or reference for the arbitration, the Contractor shall proceed with and continue without hindrance the performance of its obligations under this Contract with due diligence and expedition in a professional manner except where the Contract has been terminated by either Party in terms of this Contract.

### In case of Contract with Public Sector Enterprise (PSE) or a Government Department, the following shall be applicable:

In the event of any dispute or difference relating to the interpretation and application of the provisions of the Contract, such dispute or difference shall be referred by either Party for arbitration to the sole arbitrator in the Department of Public Enterprises to be nominated by the Secretary to the Government of India in-charge of the Department of Public Enterprises. The Arbitration and Conciliation Act, 1996 shall not be applicable to arbitration under this clause. The award of the arbitrator shall be binding upon the Parties to the dispute, provided, however, any Party aggrieved by such award may make further reference for setting aside or revision of the award to the Law Secretary, Department of Legal Affairs, Ministry of Law and Justice, Government of India. Upon such reference the dispute shall be decided by the Law Secretary or the Special Secretary or Additional Secretary when so authorized by the Law Secretary, whose decision shall bind the Parties hereto finally and conclusively. The Parties to the dispute will share equally the cost of arbitration as intimated by the Arbitrator.

**Annexure** 

#### BRIEF PROCEDURE FOR CONDUCT OF CONCILIATION PROCEEDINGS

- 1. The proceedings of Conciliation shall broadly be governed by Part-III of the Arbitration and Conciliation Act 1996 or any statutory modification thereof and as provided herein:
- 2. The party desirous of resorting to Conciliation shall send an invitation/notice in writing to the other party to conciliate specifying all points of Disputes with details of the amount claimed. The party concerned shall not raise any new issue thereafter. Parties shall also not claim any interest on claims/counter-claims from the date of notice invoking Conciliation till the conclusion of the Conciliation proceedings.
- 3. The party receiving the invitation/notice for Conciliation shall within 30 days of receipt of the notice of Conciliation intimate its consent for Conciliation along with its counter-claims, if any.
- 4. The Conciliation in a matter involving claim or counter-claim (whichever is higher) up to Rs 5 crores shall be carried out by sole Conciliator nominated by BHEL while in a matter involving claim or counter-claim (whichever is higher) of more than Rs 5 crores.
- 5. Conciliation shall be carried out by 3 Conciliators nominated by BHEL.

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- 6. The Parties shall be represented by only their duly authorized in-house executives/officers and neither Party shall be represented by a Lawyer.
- 7. The first meeting of the IEC shall be convened by the IEC by sending appropriate communication/notice to both the parties as soon as possible but not later than 30 days from the date of his/their appointment. The hearings in the Conciliation proceeding shall ordinarily be concluded within two (2) months and, in exceptional cases where parties have expressed willingness to settle the matter or there exists possibility of settlement in the matter, the proceedings may be extended by the IEC by a maximum of further 2 months with the consent of the Parties subject to cogent reasons being recorded in writing.
- 8. The IEC shall thereafter formulate recommendations for settlement of the Disputes supported by reasons at the earliest but in any case within 15 days from the date of conclusion of the last hearing. The recommendations so formulated along with the reasons shall be furnished by the IEC to both the Parties at the earliest but in any case within 1 month from the date of conclusion of the last hearing.
- 9. Response/modifications/suggestions of the Parties on the recommendations of the IEC are to be submitted to the IEC within time limit stipulated by the IEC but not more than 15 days from the date of receipt of the recommendations from the IEC.
- 10. In the event, upon consideration, further review of the recommendations is considered necessary, whether by BHEL or by the other Party, then, the matter can be remitted back to the IEC with request to reconsider the same in light of the issues projected by either/both the Parties and to submit its recommendations thereon within the following 15 days from the date of remitting of the case by either of the Parties.
- 11. Upon the recommendations by the Parties, with or without modifications, as considered necessary, the IEC shall be called upon to draw up the Draft Settlement Agreement in terms of the recommendations.
- 12. When a consensus can be arrived at between the parties only in regard to any one or some of the issues referred for Conciliation the draft Settlement Agreement shall be accordingly formulated in regard to the said Issue(s), and the said Settlement Agreement, if signed, by the parties, shall be valid only for the said issues. As regards the balance issues not settled, the parties may seek to resolve them further as per terms and conditions provided in the contract.
- 13. In case no settlement can be reached between the parties, the IEC shall by a written declaration, pronounce that the Conciliation between the parties has failed and is accordingly terminated.
- 14. Unless the Conciliation proceedings are terminated in terms of para 22 (b), (c) & (d) herein below, the IEC shall forward his/its recommendations as to possible terms of settlement within one (1) month from the date of last hearing. The date of first hearing of Conciliation shall be the starting date for calculating the period of 2 months.
- 15. In case of 3 members IEC, 2 members of IEC present will constitute a valid quorum for IEC and meeting can take place to proceed in the matter after seeking consent from the member who is not available. If necessary, videoconferencing may be arranged for facilitating participation of the members. However, the IEC recommendations will be signed by all members. Where there is more than one (1) Conciliator, as a general rule they shall act jointly. In the event of differences between the Members of IEC, the decision/recommendations of the majority of the Members of IEC shall prevail and be construed as the recommendation of the IEC.
- 16. The Draft Settlement Agreement prepared by the IEC in terms of the consensus arrived at during the Conciliation proceedings between the Parties shall be given by the IEC to both the parties for putting up for approval of their respective Competent Authority.
- 17. Before submitting the draft settlement agreement to BHEL's Competent Authority viz. the Board Level Committee on Alternative Dispute Resolution (BLCADR) for approval, concurrence of the other party's Competent Authority to the draft settlement agreement shall be obtained by the other party and informed to BHEL within 15 days of receipt of the final draft settlement agreement by it. Upon approval by the Competent Authority, the Settlement Agreement would thereafter be signed by the authorized representatives of both the Parties and authenticated by the members of the IEC.

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- 18. In case the Draft Settlement Agreement is rejected by the Competent Authority of BHEL or the other Party, the Conciliation proceedings would stand terminated.
- 19. A Settlement Agreement shall contain a statement to the effect that each of the person(s) signing thereto (i) is fully authorized by the respective Party(ies) he/she represents, (ii) has fully understood the contents of the same and (iii) is signing on the same out of complete freewill and consent, without any pressure, undue influence.
- 20. The Settlement Agreement shall thereafter have the same legal status and effect as an arbitration award on agreed terms on the substance of the dispute rendered by an arbitral tribunal passed under section 30 of the Arbitration and Conciliation Act, 1996.
- 21. Acceptance of the Draft Settlement Agreement/recommendations of the Conciliator and/or signing of the Settlement Agreement by BHEL shall however, be subject to withdrawal/closure of any arbitral and/or judicial proceedings initiated by the concerned Party in regard to such settled issues.
- 22. Unless otherwise provided for in the agreement, contract or the Memorandum of Understanding, as the case may be, in the event of likelihood of prolonged absence of the Conciliator or any member of IEC, for any reason/incapacity, the Competent Authority/Head of Unit/Division/Region/Business Group of BHEL may substitute the Conciliator or such member at any stage of the proceedings. Upon appointment of the substitute Conciliator(s), such reconstituted IEC may, with the consent of the Parties, proceed with further Conciliation into the matter either de-novo or from the stage already reached by the previous IEC before the substitution.
- 23. The proceedings of Conciliation under this Scheme may be terminated as follows:
  - a. On the date of signing of the Settlement agreement by the Parties; or,
  - b. By a written declaration of the IEC, after consultation with the parties, to the effect that further efforts at conciliation are no longer justified, on the date of the declaration; or,
  - c. By a written declaration of the Parties addressed to the IEC to the effect that the Conciliation proceedings are terminated, on the date of the declaration; or,
  - d. By a written declaration of a Party to the other Party and the IEC, if appointed, to the effect that the Conciliation proceedings are terminated, on the date of the declaration.
  - e. On rejection of the Draft Settlement Agreement by the Competent Authority of BHEL or the other Party.
- 24. The Conciliator(s) shall be entitled to following fees and facilities:

- 27. The other expenditures/costs in connection with the Conciliation proceedings as well as the IEC's fees and expenses shall be shared by the Parties equally.
- 28. Out of the lump sum fees of Rs 75,000/- for Sitting Fees, 50% shall be payable after the first meeting of the IEC and the remaining 50% of the Sitting Fees shall be payable only after termination of the conciliation proceedings in terms of para 22 hereinabove.
- 29. The travelling, transportation and stay at outstation shall be arranged by concerned Unit as per entitlements as per Serial No. 3 of the Table at para 23 above, and in case such arrangements are not made by the BHEL Unit, the same shall be reimbursed to the IEC on actuals limited to their entitlement as per Serial No. 4 of the Table at Para 23 above against supporting documents. The IEC Member(s) shall submit necessary invoice for claiming the fees/reimbursements.
- 30. The Parties shall keep confidential all matters relating to the conciliation proceedings. Confidentiality shall extend also to the settlement agreement, except where its disclosure is necessary for purposes of

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its implementation and enforcement or as required by or under a law or as per directions of a Court/Governmental authority/regulatory body, as the case may be.

- 31. The Parties shall not rely upon or introduce as evidence in any further arbitral or judicial proceedings, whether or not such proceedings relate to the Disputes that is the subject of the Conciliation proceedings:
  - a. Views expressed or suggestions made by the other party in respect of a possible settlement of the Disputes;
  - b. admissions made by the other party in the course of the Conciliator proceedings;
  - c. proposals made by the Conciliator;
  - d. The fact that the other Party had indicated his willingness to accept a proposal for settlement made by the Conciliator.
- 32. The Parties shall not present the Conciliator(s) as witness in any Alternative Dispute Resolution or Judicial proceedings in respect of a Disputes that is/was the subject of that particular Conciliation proceeding.
- 33. None of the Conciliators shall act as an arbitrator or as a representative or counsel of a Party in any arbitral or judicial proceeding in respect of a Disputes that is/was the subject of that particular Conciliation proceeding.
- 34. The Parties shall not initiate, during the Conciliation proceedings, any arbitral or judicial proceedings in respect of a Disputes that is the subject matter of the Conciliation proceedings except that a Party may initiate arbitral or judicial proceedings where, in his opinion, such proceedings are necessary for preserving his rights including for preventing expiry of period of limitation. Unless terminated as per the provisions of this Scheme, the Conciliation proceedings shall continue notwithstanding the commencement of the arbitral or judicial proceedings and the arbitral or judicial proceedings shall be primarily for the purpose of preserving rights including preventing expiry of period of limitation.
- 35. The official language of Conciliation proceedings under this Scheme shall be English unless the Parties agree to some other language.
