2.0 SERVICE CHARGES:

- 2.1 Service charges shall be quoted as per the Price Bid Form available in e-Procurement portal. Rates quoted shall be firm for a period of one year from the date of issue of work order.
- 2.2 Vendor should quote their rates irrespective of site distance and No. of days and No. of tests to be carried out (Our site are covered in AP, TS, TN, Karnataka, Kerala and part of Orissa).
- 2.3 Contractor should quote their rates including To & Fro Travel charges, Transportation of equipment, local transport and accommodation charges.
- 2.4 GST shall be paid extra on submission of proof. GST remittance proof as per Cl. No. 8.2 (Taxes and Duties) has to be enclosed.
- 2.5 Prices quoted will be taken as the TOTAL PRICE FOR CARRYING OUT THE ENTIRE WORK AS PER THE SCOPE OF WORK SPECIFIED AND ALL THE RELEVANT DETAILS FURNISHED IN THIS TENDER. All corrections to be initialled.

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- 2.6 The rates offered shall be firm inclusive of everything (Manpower, T&P, Machineries, Test kits, consumables etc.,) and no variation will be allowed whether in cost of labour or any other factor affecting the price of the contract.
- 2.7 BHEL does not bind itself to accept the lowest tender. BHEL reserves the right to accept or reject the lowest or any other tender without assigning any reason and the work may be allotted to one or more than one contractors.

3.0 TIME SCHEDULE:

The agency shall provide the services within minimum possible time at sites as instructed by the Site In-Charge/ Resident Engineer and followed by SAS/Secunderabad office.

4.0 TERMS OF PAYMENT:

100% of payment shall be made after completion of work and on submission of GST complaint invoice in triplicate duly certified by Site In-Charge / Resident Engineer of the site along with MOM and submission of test report (5 Copies).

5.0 SECURITY DEPOSIT:

The total amount of security deposit will be 5% of the individual work order value issued at the time of testing. 5% of the work order value shall be retained as security deposit against the invoice raised by the party and same shall be released with the payment of Invoice raised against next work order (released on rotation). In case of payment against invoice raised after expiry of the rate contract period, full invoice amount shall be released.

6.0 TOOLS AND PLANTS:

All the tools and plants required for carrying out Mechanical Non-Destructive Tests shall be arranged by the contractor only.

7.0 TERMS AND CONDITIONS:

- 7.1 Contractors should have qualified engineers with good product knowledge on BHEL products.
- 7.2 Vendors should abide by only BHEL terms & conditions.
- 7.3 <u>Criteria for deciding L-1</u> will be based on % (percentage) of sum of total price mentioned in **Row (D) of** price Schedule **Annexure-"A".**

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Bidders have to mention only the % (percentage) value (both in figures and words) in Row (E), Column-C of price Schedule Annexure- "A".

- 7.4 The lowest % (L-1 bid) shall be considered for working out the individual item rates (rounded to the nearest digit without decimal). The contract will be awarded on L-1 rates to more than one agency (limited to maximum of five parties) whoever agrees to operate at L-1 rates on rotation basis.
- 7.5 Tests shall be distributed on rotation basis to all the parties on per overhauling site basis.
- 7.6 Vendor shall depute their testing team with testing kit immediately (some-times on short notice on minimum 24 hours) as per site requirement, intimated by BHEL.
- 7.7 Two consecutive failures /denials by any party to mobilise their team as per BHEL requirement will enable them to be omitted from considering in next rotation. Overall 4 denials by any party will enable them to be put on hold for the next six months.
- 7.8 Should have valid PAN and GST Registration No.
- 7.9 Agency should provide free access to BHEL for verification of their testing equipment as and when required.

7.10 **Bills submission**:

8.0 TAXES AND DUTIES

8.1 All taxes and duty other than GST & Cess and BOCW Cess

The successful bidder shall pay all (save the specific exclusions as enumerated in this contract) taxes, fees, license charges, deposits, duties, tolls, royalty, commissions, Stamp Duties, or other charges / levies, which may be levied on the input goods & services consumed and output goods & services delivered in course of his operations in executing the contract. In case BHEL is forced to pay any of such taxes, BHEL shall have the right to recover the same from his bills or otherwise as deemed fit.

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8.2 Goods and service Tax (GST) & Cess

Bidder's price/rates shall be exclusive of GST & Cess (if applicable) (herein after termed as GST). Successful bidder shall submit to BHEL the GST compliant tax invoice/debit note/revised tax invoice on the basis of which BHEL will claim the input tax credit in its return.

Agency shall furnish proof of GST registration with GSTN Portal covering the services under this contract. Registration should also bear endorsement for the premises from where the billing shall be done by the successful bidder on BHEL for this project/ work.

Bidder shall note that the GST Tax Invoice complying with GST Invoice Rules wherein the 'Bill To' details as per Clause 7.10.

GST charged in the tax invoice/debit note/revised tax invoice by the successful bidder shall be released separately to the successful bidder only after successful bidder files the outward supply details in GSTR-1 on GSTN portal and input tax credit of such invoice is matched with corresponding details of outward supply of the successful bidder and has paid the GST at the time of filing the monthly return.

In case BHEL has to incur any liability (like interest etc.) due to denial/reversal of input tax credit in respect of the invoice submitted by the successful bidder, for the reasons attributable to the successful bidder, the same shall be recovered from the successful bidder.

In case BHEL is deprived of the Input tax credit due to any reason attributable to successful bidder, the same shall not be paid to the successful bidder. Tax invoice/debit Note/revised tax invoice shall contain the particulars as prescribed in GST law.

TDS under GST is applicable and shall be deducted at prevailing rates on gross invoice value from the running bills. E-way bills / Transit passes / Road Permits, if required for materials / T&P etc., bought into the project site is to be arranged by the successful bidder only.

8.3 **Statutory Variations**

Statutory variations are applicable under the GST Acts, against production of proof. The changes implemented by the Central / State Government during the tenure of the contract viz. increase / decrease in the rate of taxes, applicability, etc. and its impact on upward revision / downward revision are to be suitably paid/ adjusted from the date of respective variation. The bidder shall give the benefit of downward revision in favour of BHEL. No other variations shall be allowed during the tenure of the contract.

8.4 Modalities of Tax Incidence on BHEL:

Where GST law permits more than one option or methodology for discharging liability of tax/ levy/ duty; the contractor shall approach BHEL before choosing any option to discharge his tax liability. BHEL shall have the right to direct the contractor to adopt the appropriate option

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considering the amount of tax liability on BHEL as well as procedural simplicity with regard to assessment of the liability.

The option chosen by BHEL shall be binding on the contractor for discharging the obligation of BHEL in respect of the tax liability to the contractor.

8.5 BUILDING & OTHER CONSTRUCTION WORKERS (REGULATION OF EMPLOYMENT AND CONDITIONS OF SERVICE) ACT, 1996 (BOCW Act) AND RULES OF 1998 READ WITH BUILDING & OTHER CONSTRUCTION WORKERS CESS Act, 1996 & CESS RULES, 1998

In case any portion of work involves execution through building or construction workers, then compliance to the above titled Acts shall be ensured by the contractor and contractor shall obtain license and deposit the cess under the Act. In the circumstances it may be ensured as under:-

It shall be the sole responsibility of the contractor in the capacity of employer to forthwith (within a period of 15 days from the award of work) apply for a licence to the Competent Authority under the BOCW Act and obtain proper certificate thereof by specifying the scope of its work. It shall also be responsibility of the contractor to furnish a copy of such certificate of licence / permission to BHEL within a period of one month from the date of award of contract.

It shall be the sole responsibility of the contractor as employer to ensure compliance of all the statutory obligations under these act and rules including that of payment / deposit of 1% cess on gross payment made for value of work involving building or construction workers engaged by the contractor within a period of one month from the receipt of payment.

It shall be the responsibility of the sub-contractor to furnish the receipts /challans towards deposit of the cess together with the number, name and other details of beneficiaries (building workers) engaged by the sub-contractor during the preceding month.

It shall be the absolute responsibility of the sub-contractor to make payment of all statutory payments & compensations to its workers including that is provided under the Workmen's Compensation Act, 1923.

The contractor shall, however ensure before deposit of any BOCW Cess, that customer is not depositing the same in order to avoid excess deposit of cess.

The contractor shall bear cost of BOCW cess either by way of deposit or through recovery by BHEL in case the same is deposited by the customer.

In case of failure in above mentioned compliances, BOCW Cess @ 1% as well as applicable penalty as specified in BOCW Act/Rules shall be deducted from the contractor.

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8.6 **Direct Tax**

BHEL shall not be liable towards Income Tax of whatever nature including variations thereof arising out of this contract as well as tax liability of the bidder and their personnel. Deduction of tax at source at the prevailing rates shall be effected by BHEL before release of payment as a statutory obligation, unless exemption certificate is produced by the bidder. TDS certificate will be issued by BHEL as per the provisions of Income Tax Act.

9.0 **STATUTORY REQUIREMENTS:**

- 9.1 The tenderer will be required to comply with all the statutory provisions.
- 9.2 The tenderer shall comply with the provisions of the Factories Act 1948, Contract Labour (Regulation and Abolition) Act 1970, ESI Act 1948, Employees Provident Fund and Miscellaneous Provisions Act 1952, Minimum Wages Act 1948, Payment of Gratuity Act 1972, Industrial Disputes Act, 1947, Payment of Bonus (if applicable) Act 1965, Employers Liability Act 1938, Inter State Migrants Workmen (Regulation of employment and conditions of Service) Act 1979 AP Labour Welfare Fund Act, and or any other Laws and Rules that may be applicable from time to time to the workers engaged by him. The tenderer, when required by the Company shall produce the registers and records for verification and comply with other directions issued by the company for compliance of the statutory provisions. (If applicable)
- 9.3 The tenderer shall fully indemnify the loss if any caused to BHEL/customer due to any default or non-observance of any of the laws, or any omission or commission or inability on the part of the Tenderer or his representative.
- 9.4 The tenderer shall, keep and produce for inspection at all times, forms, registers and other records required to be maintained under various statutes in order to enable scrutiny by the Company whenever required.
- 9.5 The tenderer shall produce to the Company whenever asked for, the documentary proof of payment of the said statutory dues. Non-observance of the provisions will be construed as default by the Tenderer in making such payment, and payment of his bill will be deferred despite other legal action.

10.0 **MANPOWER**:

- 10.1 The Contractor shall provide the required manpower for executing the contracted work. The contractor shall not engage a person who is less than 18 years of age.
- 10.2 The contractor shall be responsible for safety of his employees while they are engaged for work connected with the contract. The Contractor shall be

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responsible for the appropriate usage of the Uniform and PPE's by their employees.

- 10.3 The contractor, as the employer of his employees, shall manage them. In the event of any dispute arising between the Tenderer and his employees, the Tenderer alone is solely responsible for resolving the dispute between them and BHEL will in no way be responsible for settling the dispute either statutory or otherwise.
- 10.4 The contractor shall employ only such personnel who are medically fit. The company has right to direct the contractor to remove from the premises such of his personnel who may be physically, hygienically, clinically or medically unfit.
- 10.5 The contractor shall employ only such personnel who have not been found unfit for employment in Organizations such as Central/State/Public Undertakings by the Police authorities. Persons against whom criminal cases are pending or under investigation and persons found guilty of offences involving moral turpitude shall not be engaged for executing work.
- 10.6 Contractor shall be required to submit a list of his employees to be deployed to site giving details regarding Name of contract worker, Fathers Name, permanent and Present Address, Date of Birth, Qualification etc.,
- 10.7 Employees insured under ESI Act only shall be deployed in contract work. For the Persons not covered under the provisions of ESI Act, the contractor shall take required insurance under Employees Compensation Act 1923 with medical benefit.
- 10.8 In case the contractor employs women, he will discharge his obligation under law in respect of such women workers such as prohibition of engaging them during night hours, prohibition of employing them more than 9 hours per day, provision of crèche facility, grant of maternity leave as per rules etc.
- 10.9 Notwithstanding anything contrary to this, in the event of accident, the contractor shall be required to submit accident / injury report to the concerned authorities with a copy of the same to the designated BHEL Executive immediately and ensure the compliance of the ESI Act and rules made therein.
- 10.10 The Contractor shall comply with all the operational rules and regulations, including safety and security rules framed by the BHEL/customer from time to time wherein the Contractor or his

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employees happen to be operating / working. In the event of any of the employee of the contractor violating any of the said rules and regulations, the Contractor would be required to remove forthwith such employee from the company's premises.

11.0 **SAFETY**:

- 11.1 BHEL is not responsible for any accident / injury to the bidder's crew at site.
- 11.2 The bidder has to assume full responsibility for the safety of their crew and to comply with all statutory / safety regulations / security requirements of BHEL / customer.
- 11.3 All safety equipment such as safety belts, helmets & other equipment (as required for this work) are to be positioned by the contractor & used as per requirement.
- 11.4 Any casualty or damage caused to the property or person by any untoward incidents while executing this contract will be at the contractors risk & cost.

12.0 PERIOD OF CONTRACT

- 12.1 This rate contract will be valid for a period of one year.
- 12.2 The parties, if mutually agreed upon, may extend the period of contract for a further period of one year on the same terms and conditions.
- 12.3 BHEL is at liberty to terminate the contract by giving 30 days' notice in writing.
- 12.4 BHEL reserves the right to run parallel orders at its discretion with other Suppliers to expedite the work if considered necessary to do so.

13.0 FAILURE TO COMPLY WITH CONTRACT

- 13.1 Notwithstanding anything contained in any other clause, BHEL reserves the right to terminate the contract due to any failure on the part of the Tenderer in discharging his obligations under the contract or in the event of his becoming insolvent or going into liquidation. The decision of the BHEL about the failure on the part of the Tenderer shall be final and binding on the tenderer.
- 13.2 In case of any damage to the existing building, structures, materials, tools, furniture and fixtures, machines etc., caused from contractor's end directly or indirectly, the cost of its repairs or replacement will be recovered from the contractor. If there is any work stoppage in any area of the Plant due to the fault of the contractor, the contractor is liable to compensate the same.

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13.3 In the event of any failure on the part of the tenderer, BHEL shall have the right without prejudice to any other right or remedies, to get the work done through any other agency and the Tenderer shall be liable to compensate BHEL for any losses on this account. The additional cost, loss, if any incurred by BHEL will be recovered from the bills, security deposits, other dues, directly from the Tenderer or by initiating appropriate legal action.

14.0 SUB-CONTRACTING

14.1 The contractor shall not sub-contract or transfer or assign the contract in full or any part thereof to any other person or firm or company without the previous expressed written approval of BHEL.

15.0 LAWS GOVERNING THE CONTRACT

- 15.1 The contract will be governed by the Laws of India for the time being in force and as amended or made from time to time.
- 15.2 All disputes shall be settled in accordance with the Laws of India for the time being in force and as amended from time to time.
- 15.3 All disputes arising out of or in relation to this contract or Agreement shall be settled by mutual discussions through Conciliation and in the event of failure of conciliation, such disputes shall be referred to Arbitration in accordance with the provisions of Arbitration and Conciliation Act, 1996.

16.0 DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE CONTRACTOR

- 16.1 The duties, responsibilities and obligations of the contractor including statutory responsibilities mentioned in this document are indicative and not exhaustive. Contractors are required to confirm with the concerned authorities for proper and complete compliance.
- 16.2 The liability for compensation on account of injury sustained by an employee of the contractor will be exclusively that of the contractor.
- 16.3 The contractor shall promptly furnish all information and document required by BHEL authorities for the purpose of complying with the responsibilities of Occupier of the factory and shall render all the necessary assistance for the same.
- 16.4 The contractor will maintain proper discipline of his employees and will ensure that his employees do not cause any loss or theft or damage to any BHEL/customer's property. The contractor will also be responsible for the good conduct of his employees. The contractor shall be wholly responsible

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for the behaviour of the employees at the work place and outside at BHEL/customer premises.

- 16.5 The contractor shall ensure and maintain uninterrupted progress of the work in accordance with instructions given to him on behalf of BHEL from time to time.
- 16.6 In case the contractor makes default in commencing the work within the time specified by BHEL without any reasonable cause, disputes any of the terms and conditions of the contract or refuses to execute the contract or any part thereof at any stage, the contract shall, without prejudice to any other right or remedies available to BHEL, be liable to be cancelled / terminated in part or in whole. In the event of such cancellation / termination of contract, the contractor shall be liable; to compensate BHEL for all losses incurred by BHEL including the loss suffered on account of having the work executed through any other contractor or department as may be convenient to BHEL, in accordance with the exigencies of the work. In case only a part of the contract is cancelled, the remaining portion of contract may be allowed be executed by the contractor.
- 16.7 Whenever any sum of money is found to be recoverable from or payable by the contractor, the same will be deducted from any sum that may due or which at any time there after becomes due to the contractor under this contract or under any other contract or from his security deposit. In case the recoveries are not complete even after such deduction, the contractor shall pay the same or the balance thereof from the security deposit. The contractor shall immediately thereafter pay such further sums as may be required to replenish the shortage caused by such recoveries in the amount of security deposit.
- 16.8 BHEL shall have the right to deduct any sum from the bill of the contractor for making good the loss suffered by a worker or workers by reason of non-fulfilment of the conditions of the contract or non-observance of the said contract Labour regulations.
- 16.9 The contractor shall be responsible for safe custody of BHEL's property like materials, tools etc., entrusted to him.
- 16.10 BHEL shall be entitled to recover any payment made on behalf of the contractor under any law or otherwise.
- 16.11 **ARBITRATION**: All disputes arising in connection with the contract shall be settled by mutual consultation. If no agreement is reached the dispute shall be settled in accordance with the provisions of the Arbitration and Conciliation Act, 1996 and the rules made there under. The dispute shall

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be referred for arbitration to any arbitrator to be appointed by the Head of the Unit/his nominee as per the extant rules of the Company read with the provisions of The Arbitration and Conciliation Act, 1996 and amendments thereto. The award of the arbitrator shall be final and binding on both the Parties. The venue of the

- 16.12 Arbitration shall be at Chennai in India. The Award to be given by the Arbitrator/Arbitral Tribunal shall be a speaking award. All questions, disputes, differences arising under, out of or in connection with this contract shall be to the exclusive jurisdiction of Chennai Courts.
- 16.13 Successful tenderers shall enter into an Agreement on stamp paper of Rs.100/- for having accepted the rates, terms and conditions of the contract as per the pro-forma given by BHEL.

17.0 SPECIAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS:

- 17.1 The agency shall submit valid insurance for their testing engineers including vehicle & driver to the BHEL Site In-Charge.
- 17.2 The agency is responsible for repeatability of the results obtained. In case the repeatability of measured values are not available, the agency shall redo the test as per BHEL directions.
- 17.3 In case of any repairs carried out by BHEL as indicated in the test results, agency shall redo the testing as required.
- 17.4 After completion of testing, agency shall submit their recommendations regarding the testing results and also shall clear the machine fit / unfit for further operation based on their experience and expertise before leaving the site.
- 17.5 Testing agency shall carry valid calibration certificates for their equipment's and may submit to BHEL site in-charge before start of the test with traceability to National Standards / OEM.
- 17.6 All the test results / reports thus generated are the property of BHEL and not of the agency. Hence the agency shall abstain from reproducing the results in parts / complete to anyone without written consent of BHEL-SAS.

18.0 <u>DEFECT LIABILITY /WORKMANSHIP DURING THE CONTRACT</u> PERIOD:

18.1 Party shall employ and maintain qualified engineers / Supervisors to carry out the tests. Due to defect in instrument, if any tests found to be leading loss or damage, the responsibility shall lie with the party.

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19.0 SUSPENSION OF BUSINESS DEALINGS:

"BHEL reserves the right to take action against contractors who either fail to perform or Tenderers/Contractor who indulge in malpractices, by suspending business dealings with them in line with BHEL guidelines issued from time to time".

- 20.0 "The Bidder along with its associate/ collaborators/ sub-contractors/ sub-vendors/ consultants/ service providers shall strictly adhere to BHEL Fraud Prevention Policy displayed on BHEL website http://www.bhel.com and shall immediately bring to the notice of BHEL Management about any fraud or suspected fraud as soon as it comes to their notice."
- 21.0 BHEL reserves the right to accept or reject any or all Offers without assigning any reasons thereof. BHEL also reserves the right to cancel the Tender wholly or partly without assigning any reason thereof. Also BHEL shall not entertain any correspondence
