- 7.0 Deviation with respect to tender clauses and additional clauses/suggestions in Techno-commercial bid / Price bid shall NOT be considered by BHEL. Bidders are requested to positively comply with the same.
- 8.0 BHEL reserves the right to accept or reject any or all Offers without assigning any reasons thereof. BHEL also reserves the right to cancel the Tender wholly or partly without assigning any reason thereof. Also BHEL shall not entertain any correspondence from bidders in this matter (except for the refund of EMD).

#### 9.0 Assessment of Capacity of Bidders:

Bidders capacity for executing the job under tender shall be assessed 'LOAD' wise and 'PERFORMANCE' wise as per the following:

I. <u>LOAD</u>: Load takes into consideration <u>ALL</u> the contracts of the Bidder under execution with BHEL Regions, irrespective of whether they are similar to the tendered scope or not. The 'Load' is the sum of the unit wise identified packages (refer Table-1) for contracts with BHEL Regions. The cut off month for reckoning 'Load' shall be the month, two (2) months preceding the month corresponding to the 'latest date of bid submission', in the following manner:

(Note: For example if latest bid submission is in Aug 2011, then the 'load' shall be calculated upto and inclusive of June 2011)

i). Total number of Packages

Total number of Packages in hand = P

Where

- 'P' is the sum of all unit wise identified packages under execution with BHEL Regions as of the cut off month defined above, including packages yet to be commenced, excepting packages which are on HOLD due to reasons not attributable to Bidder..
- II. <a href="PERFORMANCE">PERFORMANCE</a>: Here 'Monthly Performance' of the bidder for all the packages (under execution/executed during the 'Period of Assessment' in all the Power Sector Regions of BHEL) <a href="SIMILAR">SIMILAR</a> to the packages covered under the tendered scope, excepting packages not commenced shall be taken into consideration. The 'Period of Assessment' shall be 6 months preceding the cut off month. The cut off month for reckoning 'Period of Assessment' shall be the month two (2) months preceding the month corresponding to the 'latest date of bid submission', in the following manner:

- c) Sum 'S<sub>1</sub> ' of 'Monthly Performance Evaluation' Scores (S<sub>1-1</sub>, S<sub>1-2</sub>, S<sub>1-3</sub>, S<sub>1-4</sub>, S<sub>1-5</sub>,.... Aggregate of months for each of the similar package for which performance should have been evaluated in all the Regions

ii) <u>Calculation of Overall 'Performance Rating' (R<sub>BHEL</sub>) in case 'similar Package/Packages' for the tendered scope ARE NOT AVAILABLE, during the 'Period of Assessment'</u>:

This shall be obtained by summing up the 'Monthly Performance Evaluation' scores obtained by the bidder in all Regions for ALL the packages, divided by the total number of Package months for which evaluation should have been done. 'R<sub>BHEL</sub>' shall be calculated subject to availability of 'performance scores' for at least.6 'package months' in the order of precedence below:

- a) 'Period of Assessment.
- b) 12 months preceding the cut-off month
- c) 24 months preceding the cut-off month
- d) 36 months preceding the cut-off month

In case,  $R_{\text{BHEL}}$  cannot be calculated as above, then Bidder shall be treated as 'NEW VENDOR'. Further eligibility and qualification of this bidder shall be as per definition of 'NEW VENDOR' described in 'Explanatory Notes'

#### III. 'Assessment of Capacity of Bidder':

'Assessment of Capacity of Bidder' is based on the Maximum number of packages for which a vendor is eligible, considering the performance scores of similar packages, as below:

Max number of packages  $P_{\text{Max}}$ = ( $R_{\text{BHEL}}$ - 60) divided by corresponding value of 'L' i.e. ( $R_{\text{BHEL}}$ - 60)/L

#### Note

- i. In case the value of  $P_{\text{Max}}$  results in a fraction, the value of  $P_{\text{Max}}$  is to be rounded off to next whole number
- ii. For  $R_{BHEL} = 60$ ,  $P_{Max} = '1'$
- iii. For  $R_{BHEL} \ge 80$ , there will be no upper limit on  $P_{Max}$

The Bidder shall be considered 'Qualified' as per 'Assessment of Capacity of Bidder' for the subject Tender if  $P \le P_{Max}$ 

(where P is calculated as per clause 9.1)

#### IV. **Explanatory note**:

- a) Similar package means Boiler or ESP or Piping or Turbine or Civil or Structure or Electrical or CI, etc at the individual level irrespective of rating of Plant, and irrespective of whether the subject tender is a single package or as part of combined/composite packages. Normally Boiler, ESP, Piping, Turbine, Electrical, CI, Civil, Structure, etc is considered individual level of package. For example in case the tendered scope is a Boiler Vertical Package comprising of Boiler, ESP and Power Cycle Piping (i.e the 'identified packages as per Table-1 below), the 'PERFORMANCE' part against sl no II above, needs to be evaluated considering all the identified packages (ie Boiler, ESP and Power Cycle Piping) and finally the Bidder's capacity to execute the tendered scope is assessed in line with III above

c) Bidders who have not been evaluated for at least six package months in the last 36 months in the online BHEL system for contractor performance evaluation in BHEL PS Regions, wef July'2010 shall be considered "NEW VENDOR".

A 'NEW VENDOR' shall be considered qualified subject to satisfying all other tender conditions

A 'NEW VENDOR' if awarded a job (of package/packages identified under this clause) shall be tagged as "FIRST TIMER" on the date of first LOI from BHEL.

The "FIRST TIMER" tag shall remain till execution of work for a period of not less than 09 months, from the commencement of work of first package

A Bidder shall not be eligible for the next job as long as the Bidder is tagged as "FIRST TIMER" excepting for the Tenders which have been opened on or before the date of the bidder being tagged as 'FIRST TIMER'.

After removal of 'FIRST TIMER' tag, the Bidder shall be considered 'QUALIFIED' for the future tenders subject to satisfying all other tender conditions including 'Capacity Evaluation of Bidders'.

- d) In the unlikely event of all bidders shortlisted against Technical and Financial Qualification criteria not meeting the criteria on 'Assessment of Capacity of Bidders' detailed above, OR leads to a single tender response on applying the criteria of 'Assessment of Capacity of Bidders' or due to non-approval by Customer, then BHEL at its discretion reserves the right to consider the further processing of the Tender based on the **Overall Performance Rating** 'R<sub>BHEL</sub>' only, starting from the upper band.
- e) 'Under execution' shall mean works in progress as per the following:
  - i. up to Boiler Steam Blowing in case of Steam Generator and Auxiliaries
  - ii. upto Synchronisation in case of all other works excepting sl no (i) and (iii)
  - iii. Upto execution of at least 90% of anticipated contract value in case of Civil & Structures (unit wise), Enabling works and upto 90% of material unloading (in tonnage) as per the original contract in case of MM Package.

Note: BHEL at its discretion can extend (or reduce in exceptional cases in line with Contract conditions) the period defined against (i), (ii) and (iii) above, depending upon the balance scope of work to be completed.

- f) Performance evaluation in CL 9 above is applicable to Prime bidder and consortium partner (or Technical tie up partner) for their respective scope of work.
- 10.0 Since the job shall be executed at site, bidders must visit site/ work area and study the job content, facilities available, availability of materials, prevailing site conditions including law & order situation, applicable wage structure, wage rules, etc before quoting for this tender. They may also consult this office before submitting their offers, for any clarifications regarding scope of work, facilities available at sites or on terms and conditions.
- 11.0 For any clarification on the tender document, the bidder may seek the same in writing or through e-mail, as per specified format, within the scheduled date for seeking clarification, from the office of the undersigned. BHEL shall not be responsible for receipt of queries after due date of seeking clarification due to postal delay or any other delays. Any clarification / query received after last date for seeking clarification may not be normally entertained by BHEL and no time extension will be given.
- 12.0 BHEL may decide holding of pre-bid discussion [PBD] with all intending bidders as per date indicated in the NIT. The bidder shall ensure participation for the same at the appointed time, date and place as may be

- decided by BHEL. Bidders shall plan their visit accordingly. The outcome of pre-bid discussion (PBD) shall also form part of tender.
- In the event of any conflict between requirement of any clause of this specification/ documents/drawings/data sheets etc or requirements of different codes/standards specified, the same to be brought to the knowledge of BHEL in writing for clarification before due date of seeking clarification (whichever is applicable), otherwise, interpretation by BHEL shall prevail. Any typing error/missing pages/ other clerical errors in the tender documents, noticed must be pointed out before pre-bid meeting/submission of offer, else BHEL's interpretation shall prevail.
- 14.0 Unless specifically mentioned otherwise, bidder's quoted price shall deemed to be in compliance with tender including PBD.
- 15.0 Bidders shall submit Integrity Pact Agreement (Duly signed by authorized signatory who signs in the offer), <u>if applicable</u>, along with techno-commercial bid. This pact shall be considered as a preliminary qualification for further participation. <u>The names and other details of Independent External Monitor (IEM) for the subject tender is as given at point (1) above.</u>
- The Bidder has to satisfy the Pre Qualifying Requirements stipulated for this Tender in order to be qualified. The Price Bids of only those bidders will be opened who will be qualified for the subject job on the basis of satisfying the Pre Qualification Criteria specified in this NIT as per Annexure-I (as applicable), past performance etc. and date of opening of price bids shall be intimated to only such bidders. BHEL reserves the right not to consider offers of parties under HOLD.
- 17.0 In case BHEL decides on a `Public Opening', the date & time of opening of the sealed PRICE BID shall be intimated to the qualified bidders and in such a case, bidder may depute one authorised representative to witness the price bid opening. BHEL reserves the right to open 'in-camera' the 'PRICE BID' of any or all Unsuccessful/Disgualified bidders under intimation to the respective bidders.
- 18.0 Validity of the offer shall be for **Six months** from the latest due date of offer submission (including extension, if any) unless specified otherwise.
- 19.0 BHEL reserves the right to decide the successful bidder on the basis of Reverse Auction process. In such case all qualified bidders will be intimated regarding procedure/ modality for Reverse Auction process prior to Reverse Auction and price will be decided as per the rules for Reverse Auction.
  - However, if reverse auction process is unsuccessful as defined in the RA rules/procedures, or for whatsoever reason, then the sealed 'PRICE BIDs' will be opened for deciding the successful bidder. BHEL's decision in this regard will be final and binding on bidder.

- 24.0 The bidder shall submit documents in support of possession of 'Qualifying Requirements' duly self-certified and stamped by the authorized signatory, indexed and properly linked in the format for PQR. In case BHEL requires any other documents/proofs, these shall be submitted immediately.
- 25.0 The bidder may have to produce original document for verification if so decided by BHEL.
- 26.0 The offers of the bidders who are on the banned list as also the offer of the bidders, who engage the services of the banned firms, shall be rejected. The list of banned firms is available on BHEL web site <a href="https://www.bhel.com">www.bhel.com</a>.

27.0 BHEL reserves the right to go for Reverse Auction (RA) instead of opening the sealed envelope price bid, submitted by the bidder. This will be decided after techno-commercial evaluation. All bidders to give their acceptance for participation in RA. Non-acceptance to participate in RA may result in non-consideration of their bids, in case BHEL decides to go for RA.

In case BHEL decides to go for Reverse Auction, only those bidders who have given their acceptance to participate in RA will be allowed to participate in the Reverse Auction. Those bidders who have given their acceptance to participate in Reverse Auction will have to necessarily submit "online sealed bid" in the Reverse Auction. Non-submission of "online sealed bid" by the bidder will be considered as tampering of the tender process and will invite action by BHEL as per extant guidelines in vogue."

Information and General Terms and Conditions governing RA shall form part of the RFQ/ Enquiry.

- 1. For the proposed reverse auction, technically and commercially acceptable bidders only shall be eligible to participate.
- 2. Those bidders who have given their acceptance for Reverse Auction (quoted against this tender enquiry) will have to necessarily submit "online sealed bid" in the Reverse Auction. Non submission of "online sealed bid" by the bidder for any of the eligible items for which techno commercially qualified, will be considered as tampering of the tender process and will invite action by BHEL as per extant guidelines in vogue.
- 3. BHEL will engage the services of a service provider who will provide all necessary training and assistance before commencement of on line bidding on internet.
- 4. In case of reverse auction, BHEL will inform the bidders the details of Service Provider to enable them to contact & get trained.
- 5. Business rules like event date, time, bid decrement, extension etc. also will be communicated through service provider for compliance.

#### 2.0 SCOPE OF WORK FOR SAFETY CONSULTANCY SERVICES

BHEL / Power Sector — Northern Region (henceforth called "BHEL - PSNR") is engaged in the Erection, Commissioning, Service after Sales, Renovation and Modernisation of Power Plants (thermal, hydro, gas and nuclear based) located in Northern India. It proposes to outsource Safety Consultancy Services. The scope of which is detailed in the following paragraphs.

All of what is detailed below shall be done in consultation with and/ or under the guidance of BHEL personnel designated for the purpose.

#### 2.1 Detailed Scope of Safety Consultancy (Site)

The scope of services shall include providing Safety Consultancy Services at site during erection, pre-commissioning and commissioning stages of various packages / equipments in the scope of BHEL as per the general engineering practices so that the work is completed to the complete satisfaction of all concerned w.r.t. the safety aspects.

Safety Consultancy Services (Site) scope shall include but shall not be limited to the following:

- Provide necessary advice to BHEL w.r.t. all Safety aspects at project sites and ensure implementation of the same for an ultimate accident free site.
- Recommend suitable measures to BHEL site in-charge (Construction Manager) or any
  engineer nominated by him to avoid accidents/ incidents. Taking all actions, ensuring accident
  free work at site.
- Shall work as interface between various agencies such customer, package-in-charges, subcontractors on Safety matters for ensuring overall safety at Project Site.
- To conduct/co-ordinate for induction training at site for new workers and other HSE trainings for BHEL/Other agencies working on behalf of BHEL at site including mock fire drill, Tool Box Talk, PEP Talk, Electrical Safety, Radiation Safety etc.
- Preparation of MIR as desired by BHEL site in-charge (Construction Manager).
- To ensure statutory compliance by BHEL/Sub-contractors in respect of BOCW Act / Factory Act.
- To organize Safety Committee Meetings at site (once in a month), prepare and circulate minutes of meeting and follow-up for compliance of action points.
- To report any accident taking place at site to construction manager and Head Quality & Safety at PSNR, Noida-HQ.

- To provide support to BHEL Site for 'periodic health check-up', 'Tree plantation' and other 'Environment management program' being organized by BHEL.
- Carry out safety inspection of Work Area, Work Method, Men, Machine & Material and other tools and tackles.
- Coordinate and ensure timely Third Party Inspection/Certification of Cranes/Hydras/Lifts/Other Lifting Appliances & Gears used at Site.
- Help concerned HOS to prepare Job Specific instructions for critical jobs.
- Conduct investigation of all accident/dangerous occurrences & recommend appropriate safety measures to prevent re-occurrence.
- To ensure implementation of HSE work permit systems and OCPs at site.
- To ensure use of PPE's / Safety Equipments in work area and take necessary action in case of observed violations.
- To prepare Emergency Response Plan and ensure Emergency Preparedness of site.
- Ensure reporting of all accidents/incidents including "Near Miss" and take improvement initiatives to avoid future occurrence.
- Coordinate and conduct campaigns, competitions & other safety promotion programme at site.
- To provide necessary support to site management during Internal/External HSE Audits as and when conducted.
- Apprise Head (Quality & Safety) at PSNR-HQ, Noida on all matters pertaining to site safety.
- Overseeing the total safety functions at site, under the guidance /supervision of BHEL Engineer.
- Any other work assigned from time to time.

2.2 To provide above services at PSNR sites, bidder shall post Safety Engineers possessing minimum Qualification and experience as indicated below:

Such documents shall not be used by the Safety Engineers for any purpose other than for the designated task.
- 2.4.3 All data generated/ used by the Safety Engineers shall be the property of BHEL. These cannot be published/ utilized or taken away by the Safety Engineer or any staff of the Contractor.
- 2.4.4 Credentials of Safety Engineers shall be approved by BHEL-PSNR and/ or its customer prior to their deployment to BHEL sites. Bio-data and copy of all certificates in respect of qualification and experience of the candidate shall be submitted for approval prior to his deployment at PSNR Site. If required, contractor has to arrange for interview of the candidates by BHEL at no extra cost.
- 2.4.5 Safety Engineers shall report to Construction Manager and BHEL HSE Coordinator/Safety Engineer at Site.
- 2.4.6 For any exigencies during execution of the contract or against requirement of services at any location other than place of normal work / site (for outstation locations only), if desired and instructed by BHEL Engineer, the contractor shall have to provide Consultancy services by deputing its personnel from an existing site. In such a case, the contractor will however be reimbursed expenses incurred on such deployment only for the person deputed, as below:
  - a) Travel expenses at actual shall be paid (limited to 2AC to and fro train fare) with reservation / supplementary charges etc. subject to furnishing of details regarding ticket numbers, journey details, amount of fare etc. and submission of proof theirof.
  - b) Local conveyance charges (Actual bus / cycle rickshaw/auto rickshaw/ taxi fare for local journeys at out station) as permitted by the BHEL Engineer.
  - c) Daily allowances @ Rs.200/- per day

- d) Lodging @ Rs.1000/- per day.
- e) Postal / telegraphic / telephones charges, if any, subject to production of proof of having incurred such expenditure only in relation to the official work.

The movement of Contractor's Safety Engineer outside construction site shall be subject to the prior approval of BHEL construction Manager.

- 2.4.7 Safety Engineers shall follow working hours, number of working days per week and holidays as per norms and holiday list of BHEL office where they are deployed.
- 2.4.8 Each man day shall consist of 8 (eight) working hours excluding lunch break. However, at times work may continue round the clock including on Sundays and holidays and services of Safety Engineers may be required beyond the normal working hours as decided by BHEL. No compensation, in any form, shall be given by BHEL for such over stays beyond normal working hours or working on Sundays and holidays.
- 2.4.9 Bidders shall have to provide the Safety Consultancy services on a continuous (daily) basis. In the event of the bidder not providing the required services on any day or for any period, pro-rata recovery shall be made from the contractor's monthly bills for such period. For this purpose i.e. for deduction or for part payment, if any, each month shall be considered to be of 30 days.
- 2.4.10 In case deputed Safety Engineers goes on long leave (> 7 days) or leaves the services without informing BHEL, the contractor will have to make suitable alternative arrangements within 7 days of service interruption at his own cost, including travel expense. In case contractor fails to provide above-mentioned services as desired by BHEL, the latter shall have the right to hire such services from other agencies at the risk and cost of the contractor.

- 2.4.11 Contractor shall ensure that payment and dues admissible to Safety Engineers deployed are made by the last working day of every month, failing which BHEL reserves the right to make such payments and dues to Safety Engineers. Such payments shall be back charged/recovered from bills of the contractor or from security deposit/ bank guarantee. On demand by BHEL, pay roll sheet giving details of all payments made to Safety Engineers, duly signed by contractor shall be furnished by the contractor.
- 2.4.12 BHEL reserves the right to terminate the above contract at any point of time without assigning any reason upon giving 30 days notice to the Contractor.
- 2.4.13 BHEL reserves the right to regulate strength of deployment of contractor's manpower as per requirements and/or to short close the contract. In such eventuality, 15 days notice shall be given by BHEL to the contractor and payment shall be made for the completed months or part thereof on pro-rata basis. No other compensation will be given by BHEL.
- 2.4.14 In case the performance of the Safety Engineers is found to be unsatisfactory, his services shall be discontinued by BHEL and no payment shall be made against deployment of such unacceptable Safety Engineer, from the date Safety Engineer has been notified as unsatisfactory. Replacement of such persons will have to be arranged by the contractor within 15 days.
- 2.4.15 In case Safety Engineers are found to be indulged in malpractices, their services will be terminated with immediate effect without giving any notice. Also, in such cases, BHEL will have right to decide the payment to be given for services provided by such Safety Engineers. Replacement of such persons will have to be arranged by the contractor within 15 days.

- 2.4.16 In case, the contractor fails to provide Safety Engineers in time BHEL will have option to arrange the services by other suitable agency. Additional cost of such agencies together with overhead charges as per BHEL policy will be borne by contractor, which shall be deducted from any sum payable to the contractor.
- 2.4.17 All Insurance and other liabilities of Safety Consultancy Engineer/Engineers posted at sites shall be the responsibility of the bidder. The bidder shall indemnify BHEL against all risks and consequential liabilities that may occur due to the negligence of their Engineer/Engineers.
- 2.4.18 Compliance of all statutory requirements like Workmen Compensation, PF, Minimum Wages etc., as applicable to their Engineers posted at site shall be in bidder's scope and bidders will have to submit the copies of relevant documents to BHEL at the time of or during the deployment of their personnel.
- 2.4.19 Contractor shall fully understand scope of work before quoting. The scope of work and responsibility of the contractor as mentioned under these specifications shall be covered within the quoted rates.
- 2.4.20 It is expected that one or maximum two Engineer / Engineers shall be adequate to provide the safety consultancy services at each site as per the scope defined here. However, depending upon the site requirement, the no. of Safety Engineer(s) to be deployed at site may increase or decrease. Bidder may note this while quoting their rates.

## TECHNICAL CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT (TCC) Chapter – VI: Time Schedule

#### 6.0 Time Schedule

6.1 To provide Safety Consultancy Services, the contractor is required to depute the Safety Consultancy Engineer/Engineers within 15 days from the date of issue of instruction in this regard by BHEL. The schedule/instruction for deployment to be obtained by bidder from Construction Manager of the concern site/Head (Quality & Safety), BHEL, PSNR, Noida. However, BHEL Engineer at concerned site will certify the actual date of deployment of Safety Engineer. Payment shall be made as per the actual deployment made as per BHEL requirement.

#### **6.2** Contract Period:

Safety Consultancy Services are required initially for a period of 02 (Two) years under this contract. However, BHEL has the option to renew the contract on the same rates, terms and conditions for a further period of one more year to be reviewed and renewed at the end of initial contract period of 02 (Two) year. The Contract period can be reduced with prior notice period of (01) one month at sole discretion of BHEL and no compensation shall be paid by BHEL against such foreclosure of contract.

The date of LOI shall be reckoned as the date of start of contract.

#### **6.3** Tentative Deployment Plan:

Tentative deployment plan during the Two Year i.e. 2014-16 shall be around 210 manmonths. The Safety Engineers under this contract may be deployed at any of the BHEL PSNR sites. However, sites where the Safety Engineers are accepted to be deployed during the two years period of the contract (i.e. 2014-16) are as per Annexure –A of this NIT.

Any addition or deletion to the number of projects/personnel specified in the deployment plan shall be intimated to the contractor in advance.

#### Notes:

- 1. Deployment period given above is only tentative/indicative. Actual nos. may vary according to actual requirement of BHEL and the contractor shall provide services as per BHEL's requirement. Additional requirement, if any, shall be met by contractor at the same rates, terms and conditions.
- 2. The deployment of Safety Engineers will vary as per actual requirement.
- 3. At particular site, all Safety Engineers might not be required at the same time.
- 4. Deployment of Safety Engineers shall be done solely at the discretion of BHEL.

## TECHNICAL CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT (TCC) Chapter – VII: Terms of Payment

#### 7.0 Terms of Payment

- 7.1 Based on man months actually deployed and certification by Construction Manager at site, monthly payment will be made to the contractor on pro-rata basis.
- 7.2 Contractor shall submit bills for providing Safety Consultancy Services once in a month, detailing work done by them during the month. The format for billing shall be approved by BHEL site before raising invoices.
- 7.3 It shall be the responsibility of contractor to obtain and submit certificate from BHEL authority regarding deployment of claimed man month.
- 7.4 Payment for the services provided by the bidder under this contract will be made by BHEL Site Office within a month from the date of the submission of clear and correct bill along with details/desired documents by the contractor subject to completion of work assigned to the contractor personal and to the entire satisfaction of the BHEL Engineer.
- 7.5 Period between first day of the calendar month to the last day of calendar month shall constitute to be one month. The contractor shall submit the bill along with certification (as mentioned above) within one week of the subsequent month to BHEL Site office.
- 7.6 Deductions, if any, shall be made by BHEL from the monthly bill and payment made within 30 days by respective BHEL Site Office subject to correctness and completeness of the bill.
- 7.7 Payment shall be released by BHEL on monthly basis against invoices raised by contractor to BHEL with certified time sheets.
- 7.8 Payments shall be made by cheque or bank transfer.
- 7.9 **Mobilization Advance:** No mobilization advance is payable in this contract.
- 7.10 **Price Variation and Overrun Charges:** The accepted rates shall remain firm throughout the execution period including extension period (if any) and no escalation/ revision shall be payable. No overrun charges and price variation shall be payable/recoverable.

## TECHNICAL CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT (TCC) Chapter – VIII: Taxes and other Duties

#### 8.0 TAXES, DUTIES, LEVIES

The contractor shall pay all taxes, fees, license charges, deposits, duties, tools, royalty, commissions or other charges (except service tax as mentioned under clause no. 8.2) which may be levied on the input goods/services consumed and output goods/services delivered in course of his operations in executing the contract. In case BHEL is forced to pay any of such taxes, BHEL shall have the right to recover the same from his bills or otherwise as deemed fit.

However, provisions regarding **Service Tax** on output services and goods shall be as per following clauses.

#### 8.1 Income Tax

Income tax and surcharge and any other applicable tax etc., if any at prevailing rates shall be deducted from the bills unless Exemption Certificate from appropriate Income Tax Authority / Authorities is furnished.

#### 8.2 Service Tax & Cess on Service Tax

Service Tax and Cess on Service Tax as applicable on output Services are excluded from contractor's scope; therefore contractor's price/rates shall be **exclusive** of Service Tax and Cess on Output Services.

Contractor shall obtain prior written consent of BHEL before billing the amount towards such taxes. The Service Tax Rules permit more than one option or methodology for discharging the liability of tax/levy/duty and BHEL will have the right to adopt the appropriate one considering the amount of tax liability on BHEL/Client as well as procedural simplicity with regard to assessment of the liability. The option chosen by BHEL shall be binding on the Contractor for discharging the obligation of BHEL in respect of the tax liability to the Contractor. Contractor shall submit to BHEL documentary evidence of Service Tax registration certificate specifying name of services covered under this contract.

For the purpose of claiming any Service Tax from BHEL, the following procedure shall be adopted:

Contractor shall submit serially numbered Service Tax and Cess Invoices, signed by him or a person authorized by him in respect of taxable service provided, and shall contain the following, namely:

#### Chapter – VIII: Taxes and other Duties

- 1. The name, address and registration number of the contractor
- 2. The name and address of the party receiving taxable service (BHEL)
- 3. Description, classification and value of taxable service provided and
- 4. The Service Tax payable thereon.

All the four conditions shall be fulfilled in the invoice for payment of Service Tax by BHEL. Where more than one nature of Service under Service Tax Rules is involved, the invoice mentioned above shall contain the breakup of all values for each nature of Service.

Name and address of the contractor should be same in the service tax invoice and monthly bill. Any change in the name and address in past should be supported by documentary evidence duly certified by the registering authority.

Purpose of above requirements, interlia, is to enable availment of Cenvat credit by BHEL. As per recent amendments, Time restrictions for taking Cenvat credit is within six months from date of invoice. Wherever Cenvat credit could not be availed by BHEL within statutory time limit of 6 months due to delay in submission of invoices or for any other reasons attributable to contractors, Liability towards loss of such Cenvat credit shall be passed on to contractors.

The bidder who do not accept and comply with above provisions, are liable to be rejected against this tender.

#### 8.2 Modalities of Tax Incidence on BHEL

Wherever the relevant tax laws permit more than one option or methodology for discharging the liability of tax/levy/duty, BHEL will have the right to adopt the appropriate one considering the amount of tax liability on BHEL/Client as well as procedural simplicity with regard to assessment of the liability. The option chosen by BHEL shall be binding on the Contractor for discharging the obligation of BHEL in respect of the tax liability to the Contractor.

#### 8.3 New Taxes/Levies

In case the Government imposes any new levy/tax on the output service/ goods/work after award of the contract, the same shall be reimbursed by BHEL at actual.

In case any new tax/levy/duty etc. becomes applicable after the date of Bidder's offer, the Bidder/Contractor must convey its impact on his price duly substantiated by documentary evidence in support of the same before opening of Price Bid. Claim for any such impact after opening the Price Bid will not be considered by BHEL for reimbursement of tax or reassessment of offer.

## TECHNICAL CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT (TCC) Chapter – IX: Other Requirements

#### 9.0 INSURANCE

- **9.1** It shall be the sole responsibility of the Contractor to take insurance policies for the Safety Engineers against risks of accidents and injury while at work as required by the rules and make compensation if any.
  - 9.1.1 If due to negligence and/ or non-observance of safety and other precautions by Safety Engineers, any accident/ injury occur to any other person(s)/ public, the contractor shall pay necessary compensation and other expenses, if so decided by the appropriate authority.
  - 9.1.2 The contractor will take necessary precautions and due care to protect any material/ equipment/ hardware etc., while in custody of their Safety Engineers, from any damages/ loss till the same is taken over by BHEL/ returned/ handed over to BHEL or customer. BHEL reserves the right to recover loss from contractor, in case the damage/ loss is due to carelessness/ negligence on the part of Safety Engineer of the contractor. In case of any theft, while in custody of contractor's Safety Engineer, matter shall be reported to Police by the contractor immediately and copy of FIR and subsequent police investigation report shall be submitted to BHEL for taking up with insurance.
  - 9.1.3 In case any surrounding property gets damaged due to negligence/ carelessness of contractor's Safety Engineer, the contractor shall submit necessary documents for lodging insurance claim as required by BHEL. BHEL, however, reserves the right to recover deductible franchise and also unsettled portion of insurance claim from the contractor.
- 9.2 **Security Deposit** The contractor shall submit Security Deposit as per clause no. 1.10 of the General Conditions of Contract (GCC).
- 9.3 In case of any contradiction between General Conditions of Contract (GCC) and Special Conditions of Contract (SCC), the latter shall prevail.
- 9.4 The Price Bids of only those bidders will be opened who will be qualified for the subject job on the basis of evaluation of Techno-commercial bids. BHEL reserves the right to reject the bidders with unsatisfactory past performance in the execution of a contract. BHEL's decision in this regard shall be final & binding.
- 9.5 **Liquidated Damages**: Applicable as per clause no. 2.7.9 of the General Conditions of Contract (GCC).

- 9.6 Modification/ Deletion of GCC & SCC clauses:
- 9.6.1 Clause nos. of GCC 2.12 (ORC), 2.14 (Quantity Variation), 2.15 (Extra works), 2.16 (Supplementary items), 2.17 (PVC) shall not be applicable for this tender.
- 9.6.2 Clause nos. of SCC 4.0 (Obligations of Contractors), 5.5 (Providing Urinal), 5.6 (Obtaining Labour Licence), 6.0 (Material Handling, Storage & Preservation etc.), 8.0 (Inspection and Quality) shall not be applicable for this tender.
