- 5.0 BHEL reserve the right to accept or reject any or all offer without assigning any reasons thereof. BHEL also reserve the right to cancel the tender wholly or partly without assigning any reason thereof. Also BHEL shall not entertain any correspondence from bidders in this matter (except for the refund of EMD). The bidder shall ensure participation for the same at the appointed time, date and place as may be decided by BHEL. Bidders shall plan their visit accordingly. The outcome of pre-bid discussion (PBD) shall also form part of tender.
- 9.0 In the event of any conflict between requirement of any clause of this specification/ documents/drawings/data sheets etc or requirements of different codes/standards specified, the same to be brought to the knowledge of BHEL in writing for clarification before due date of seeking clarification (whichever is applicable), otherwise, interpretation by BHEL shall prevail. 5. Performance Bank Guarantee: Not Applicable

Where ever so required, the Supplier shall arrange to provide a Performance bank guarantee (PBG). Change of PBG terms either by the supplier's Banker or by the supplier, after servicing of the order is not acceptable. Similarly, PBG prepared by the supplier (typed by them) will also not be acceptable to BHEL. The pre-printed form issued by BHEL shall be used for making the PBG.

This will be decided after techno-commercial evaluation. Bidders to give their acceptance with the offer for participation in RA (*as per format enclosed in **Vol-IC Techno-commercial Compliance***). Non-acceptance to participate in RA may result in non-consideration of their bids, in case BHEL decides to go for RA.

Those bidders who have given their acceptance to participate in Reverse Auction will have to necessarily submit 'Process compliance form' (to the designated service provider) as well as 'Online sealed bid' in the Reverse Auction. Non-submission of 'Process compliance form' or 'Online sealed bid' by the agreed bidder(s) will be considered as tampering of the tender process and will invite action by BHEL as per extant guidelines for suspension of business dealings with suppliers/ contractors (as available on www.bhel.com).

The bidders have to necessarily submit online sealed bid less than or equal to their envelope sealed price bid already submitted to BHEL along with the offer. The envelope sealed price bid of successful L1 bidder in RA, if conducted, shall also be opened after RA and the order will be placed on lower of the two bids (RA closing price & envelope sealed price) thus obtained. The bidder having submitted this offer specifically agrees to this condition and undertakes to execute the contract on thus awarded rates.

B Financial Turnover

C Submission of Integrity Pact duly signed

In case of audited Financial statements have not been submitted for all the three years as indicated against Financial Turnover QR above, then the applicable audited statements submitted by the bidders against the requisite three years, will be averaged for three years i.e. total divided by three
- iv. If financial statements are not required to be audited statutorily, then instead of audited financial statements, financial statements are required to be certified by Chartered Accountant
- v. Consortium bidding is not allowed
- vi. After satisfactory fulfillment of all the above criteria/ requirement, offer shall be considered for further evaluation as per NIT and all other terms of the tender.
- vii. **Credentials furnished by the bidder against "PRE QUALIFYING CRITERIA" shall be verified from the issuing authority for its authenticity. In case, any credential (s) is/are found to be spurious, offer of the bidder is liable to be rejected and BHEL reserves the right to initiate any further action as per its internal guidelines.**

II. Techno – Commercial Terms and Conditions:**A. Part - I**

1. Product quoted by bidder must meet the technical specification mentioned.

2. **Inspection & Testing at Suppliers Works:**

BHEL reserves the right to inspect the material during manufacturing and also to get tested the material under dispatch from third party. The test results of third party test shall be final and binding on the vendor.

BHEL will reserve the right to inspect/test the material during/after manufacturing at suppliers' works, and/or at BHEL Site. In case of rejection at any stage, supplier shall be liable to replace the materials at his own cost.

No material shall be dispatched by supplier unless and until Material Dispatch Clearance Certificate (MDCC) issued by BHEL/Site.

3. Quality of cement is associated with shelf life. Shelf life of supplied cement should not exceed the limit as per IS-specification taking into consideration the date of manufacturing, transit time and use of cement at site **within 8 weeks** from the date of receipt at site. Bidder shall ensure supply of cement at site accordingly.
4. The material shall be guaranteed for a period of **three months from the date of receipt at Site** against any manufacturing defects. If any discrepancy noticed during testing, the cement will have to be replaced to Site free of cost and the test results of third party i.e. **3/7/28** days shall be final and binding on the vendor. Removal of defective material from our Site shall be arranged by vendor at their own cost failing which BHEL shall arrange disposal at the risk & cost of bidder and subsequent to replacement with a fresh acceptable material without jeopardizing project schedule and without any additional cost implication.

5. **Site Test –**

Site test for Cement shall be conducted as per BHEL/Customer's field quality plan however BHEL also reserves the right to conduct necessary test at vendor's works, if required.

6. The representative of the vendor should be available at 1X660 MW Bhusawal TPS Site, Unit-6, Bhusawal, Maharashtra whenever required as per BHEL site requirement to provide single window expeditious service and quality checks as per IS codes.

B. Part – II**1. Total Requirement:**

- i. 10,000 MT ($\pm 30\%$) to be supplied through Cement Bulklers.
- ii. 5,000 MT ($\pm 30\%$) to be supplied through original manufacturer's tamper proof sealed packing in non-returnable **50 kg bags only**.

Bidder shall quote single rate for both Bulker and Bags. There will not be separate rate for Bulklers and Bags.

2. Ordering Philosophy

BHEL reserves the right the split the order between L1 and other qualified bidders in the ratio 50:30:20, in the following mode.

2.1 Step-1: L-1 Bidder shall be awarded with acceptable L-1 rate for 50% quantity

2.2 Step-2: For the award of remaining 30%, next bidder in the order of Price Competitiveness (i.e. L-2, L-3 and hence forth) shall be given an opportunity to match the awarded L-1 rate for 30% of the tendered quantity. In case none of the bidders agree to match the awarded L-1 price, then BHEL may consider award of left over quantum to L-1 bidder at the awarded L-1 rate.

2.3 Step-3: **Step 4** will be exercised only if **Step 2** is successful, i.e. awarded L-1 price accepted by bidder other than L-1.

2.4 Step-4: For the award of remaining 20%, next bidder in the order of Price Competitiveness from the bidder who has accepted the 30% tendered quantity shall be given an opportunity to match the awarded L-1 rate for 20% of the tendered quantity. In case none of the bidders agree to match the awarded L-1 price, then BHEL may consider award of left over quantum to L-1 bidder at the awarded L-1 rate.

3. Tenders beyond the scheduled due time cannot be submitted by the bidders in the e-procurement portal.
4. Offer must be submitted in **Two-Part Bid only** i.e. techno-commercial bid and price bid separately. Single bid offer shall be liable for rejection.
5. No Consortium bidding is allowed for the subject tender.
6. Part offer shall be rejected i.e. bidder must quote for the total quantity as per Enquiry.
7. **Price**: Bidders shall quote the prices in Volume – II - Price Bid section in the E-portal

8. Evaluation criteria:

8.1 Price bids of the techno-commercially acceptable offers shall be opened for Price Evaluation.

8.2 Tenders will be evaluated on the basis of delivered cost, i.e. total cost to the BHEL, taking into consideration loadings, if any, and all available financial advantages, including those available from Owner, taxation authorities etc. (i.e. Credit of GST)

9. **Validity of Purchase Order (P.O)**: The validity of the Purchase Order will be till 15/10/2019 '**OR**' the complete delivery of cement tonnage (as mentioned in the PO), **whichever is earlier**.

10. **Validity of Price**: Price submitted shall be valid for (a) **3 (three)** Months from the date of opening of technical bid for the finalization of the tendering processes **and** (b) till the supply of full quantity of cement against

MDCC's (Material Dispatch Clearance Certificate) issued by BHEL site within the validity of the purchase order. Price Variation Clause (PVC) is not applicable against this tender enquiry.

11. **Delivery Terms:** Suppliers shall quote the rates on F.O.R. Destination basis only. Offers other than F.O.R. Destination Basis will not be accepted by BHEL. Destination is **1x660 MW Bhusawal Thermal Power Project, Unit-6, Bhusawal, Maharashtra.**

12. **Delivery Schedule:**

Cement shall be delivered to site within 5-10 Days from the date of receipt of Material Dispatch Clearance Certificate (MDCC) issued from Site. Supply shall be in line with the respective MDCC. Entire ordered quantity shall be supplied to BHEL site at the ordered rate as mentioned in the P.O. The tentative supply of cement to site may commence from **June' 2019** onwards. Tentative month-wise requirement is furnished below for reference purpose.

However actual month-wise requirement may vary based on site requirements and it shall be regulated through MDCC. Each consignment shall be accompanied by BHEL MDCC. The validity of the Purchase Order will be till 15/10/2019. Thereafter, validity of Purchase Order may be extended with mutual consent of both Parties.

Delivery is the essence of the contract for BHEL. Offer deviating delivery schedule may be liable for rejection.

13. **Delivery Medium:**

- 10,000 MT (± 30%)** Cement shall be delivered at site through Cement Bulkiers of sufficient capacity in line with the MDCC (Material Dispatch Clearance Certificate) issued by the Site.
- 5,000 MT (± 30%)** Cement shall be delivered at site through original manufacturer's temper proof sealed packing in non-returnable **50 kg bags** in line with the MDCC (Material Dispatch Clearance Certificate) issued by the Site.

14. **Weighment:** BHEL or BHEL approved third party weighment shall be final and payment will be done accordingly. Variation in weights will be governed by **IS 269.**

15. **Transit Insurance:** Transit insurance from supplier's works/warehouse to BHEL site stores shall be arranged by BHEL. Upon dispatch of material supplier has to immediately intimate underwriter of BHEL failing which transit loss if any would be borne by supplier.

16. Payment Terms:

- ❖ 90% F.O.R. price excluding GST shall be released within 30 days after receipt & acceptance of material at site and submission of following documents: -
 - a) GST Complaint Invoice (1 Original + 2 copies)
 - b) Copy of Intimation to Insurance Company
 - c) Copy of Material Dispatch Clearance Certificate issued by BHEL site.
 - d) Copy of manufacturer's test result in original showing compressive strength of 3 and 7 days results accepted by BHEL/Site
 - e) Guarantee Certificate
 - f) Weighment slip certified by BHEL/site.
- ❖ Applicable GST shall be released upon compliance of following documents:
 - Vendor has declared such Invoice in their GSTR-1 & has paid the tax to the Government by filing GSTR-3B or any other return/form for payment of tax so that Vendor's invoice details appear in BHEL's GSTR-2A. Payment may not be released if above is not complied & invoice details do not appear in BHEL's GSTR-2A.
- ❖ Balance 10% F.O.R. price excluding GST payment shall be released within 30 days on submission of following documents: -
 - a) Copy of Invoice in triplicate along with Delivery challan.
 - b) Copy of Store Receipt Voucher
 - c) Copy of manufacturer's test result in original showing compressive strength of 3, 7 & 28 days results accepted by BHEL/Site.
- ❖ Paying Authority shall be **Construction/ General Manager, BHEL Site Office, 1x660MW Bhusawal TPS**

For any deviation sought in Payment terms by bidder w.r.t. payment term, following loading shall be followed during evaluation of price bids:

- ❖ Base rate of State Bank of India (SBI) (as applicable on the date of bid opening; Techno-commercial bid opening in case of two part bids) + 6%; shall be considered for loading for the period of relaxation sought by bidders.

17. Liquidated Damages/Penalty:

- ❖ LD shall be 0.5% per week or part thereof the total value of undelivered portion of the material for which Material Dispatch Clearance Certificate (MDCC) has been issued by BHEL subject to a maximum of 10% of the total concerned MDCC value.
- ❖ In case bidder is not accepting the penalty clause for delayed supply, the offer of bidder shall be loaded to the extent to which it is not agreed by the bidder during price bid evaluation.

18. BHEL reserve the right to cancel the Contract in case of delay in delivery of cement by vendor and failure to comply with quality requirements. BHEL also reserves the right to place the order on the other bidder who has taken part in this tender, subject to his compliance of procedures of BHEL in terms of price.
19. Bidder should have valid PAN. Relevant document in support of above shall be submitted
20. **Short Closure**: BHEL may short close the contract at any stage without assigning any reasons.

III. Instructions for filling the Price Bid

1. Bidders' shall quote single Rate for both Bulkiers and Bags. There must not be separate rate for Bulkiers and Bags.
2. Packaging and Forwarding charges shall be included in the Cost/MT. Per MT freight charges shall be quoted separately in Vol-II Price bid.
3. Transit Insurance is in the scope of BHEL.
4. Prices to be quoted in INR only (Volume-II). Price bids shall be duly filled and digitally signed.
5. Bidder must quote the price elements mentioned in price schedule, if any element left blank shall be construed as the price is included in all-inclusive F.O.R. price.
6. Bidder shall fill the rates only in the Price format given by BHEL in Volume - II. Other papers or documents along with the price bid inscribing the rates of material shall be liable for rejection.
